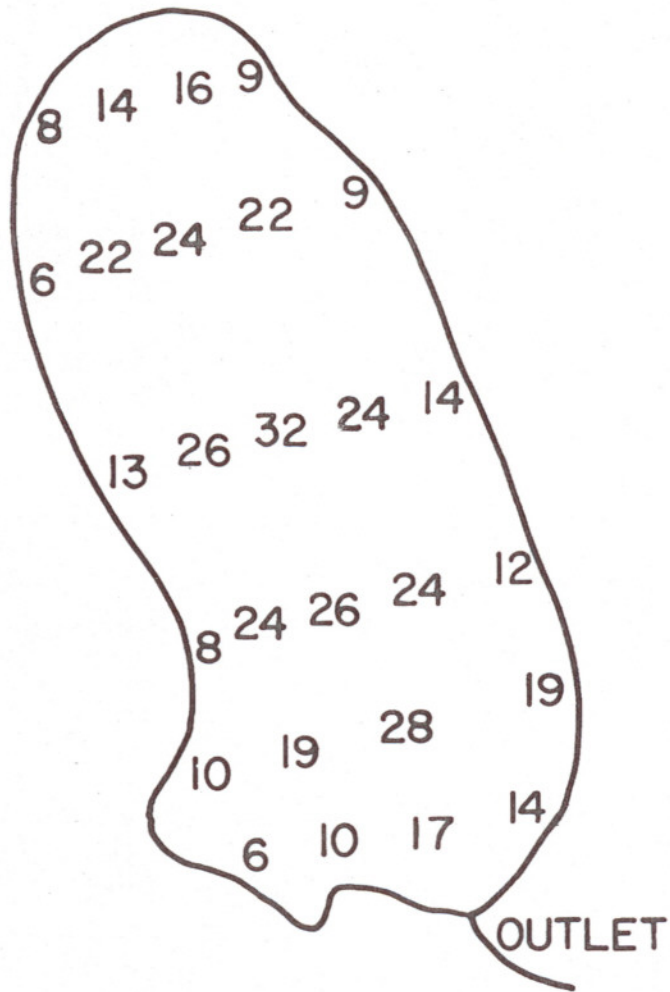

Bracey Pond is one of several tiny ponds that flow into the Narraguagus River in eastern Hancock County. To get there, take the Beddington "CCC" road off Route 9 at Beddington and proceed northwest. The pond is located right beside the road. A small but pleasant picnic site is maintained by the Maine Forest Service. A canoe or small boat can be launched with some difficulty.

The pond's water quality is marginal for trout. Legal-sized trout were stocked throughout the late 1960's in an attempt to provide a fishery for this species. Returns to the angler were sparse and fishing pressure remained at a low level despite the introduction of trout. Several other ponds in the area provide much better trout habitat. As a result of these factors, stocking was discontinued.
