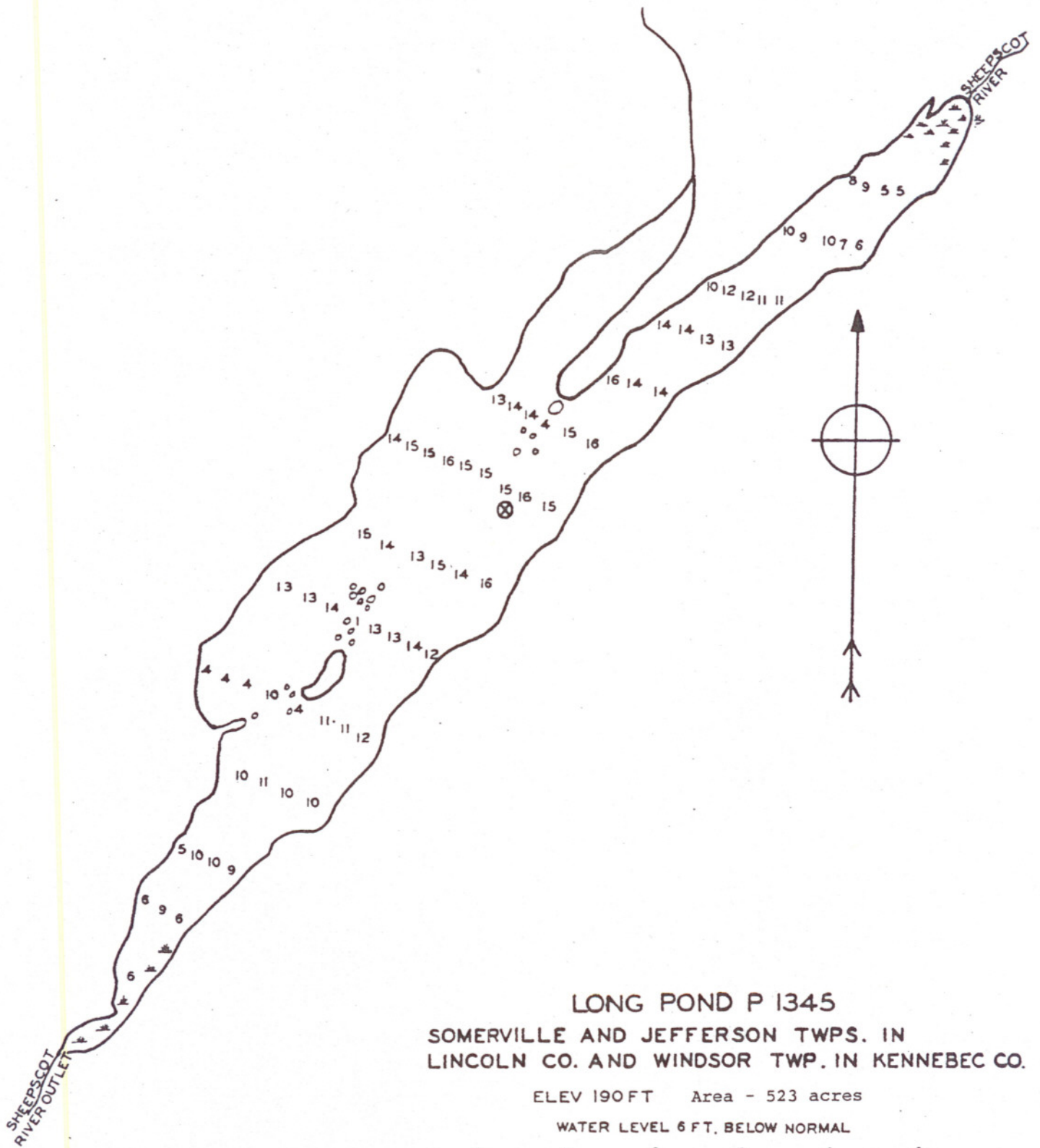
Long Pond is large, shallow pond in the  
Sheepscot River drainage. A fishway at  
Coopers Mills dam permits anadromous  
alewives to enter Long Pond to spawn in  
the spring. The fishway is also used by  
Atlantic salmon and other coldwater  
fishes.

Long Pond provides excellent habitat for  
smallmouth bass. Smallmouths were  
established as the result of an

unauthorized introduction elsewhere in the  
drainage. The presence of largemouth bass  
has been recently confirmed - also the  
result of an illegal introduction.  
Largemouths are now distributed throughout  
the Sheepscot River drainage.

Long Pond supports good fisheries for white  
perch and chain pickerel. Salmon and other  
salmonid fishes are occasionally caught as  
they migrate from other waters in the  
drainage.
