PROGRAM: Title IA – Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

For Title IA eligible students:

- supplemental instructional support in reading and mathematics
- summer school services for these students,
- Professional development to enhance teaching strategies for Title IA students can be provided to classroom teachers who have Title IA students in their classrooms.
- Educational support for homeless students.
- Parent involvement support

PROGRAM: Title II, Part A – Improving Teacher Quality State Grants

Uses:

- High Quality Professional Development
- Supplies/materials for Professional Development
- Class Size Reduction
- Recruitment and Retention of Teachers
- Parent training to enhance involvement in child's education

PROGRAM: Title IID Enhancing Education through Technology

The funds **cannot** be used for administrative purposes, developing a local technology plan or to supplant existing programs.

Title IID funds can be used for the following:

- Professional Development
- Classroom Integrators
- Hardware/Software
- Assessment Software / training on electronic assessment systems
- Data Management including SIS
- Parent Community Outreach
- Technology program to increase achievement
- Networks / Infrastructure
- Distance Learning

PROGRAM: Title III: Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant students

Uses

- develop high-quality language instruction educational programs;
- assist schools to build their capacity to establish, implement, and sustain language instruction and development programs for LEP students;
- Promote parental and community involvement.

PROGRAM: Title IV-A –Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities Act (SDFSCA)

Uses: in effective programs that may include:

School safety strategies

Violence prevention activities

Alcohol, tobacco, and other drug prevention initiatives.

Related staff and parent training initiatives

Equipment related to school safety

Counseling
