An oxygen deficiency exists in the deeper cooler water of Togus Pond. Even though brown trout growth is probably comprised due to the low oxygen, a very good fishery is maintained through annual stockings.

There is also a very good smallmouth bass fishery.

Because brown trout are not highly depended on rainbow smelt as a forage species and because of the high smelt population, Togus Pond is opened to the commercial harvest of smelt.

There is no improved public boat launch facility on Togus Pond but hand carried watercraft may be launch at the causeway along route 105.
