This letter will serve as Falmouth Country Club's Chapter 29 variance permit for your 2009 pest management program. The staff is authorized to approve Chapter 29 variance requests for golf courses. Board members are comfortable with allowing broadcast pesticide applications within 25 feet of water on tees and greens, but they have not approved broadcast pesticide application within 25 feet of water on the roughs and fairways.
