RE: Notification of Pest Control Treatments

Dear Board Members:

The following is a written summary of my comments made at your May 14th meeting regarding notification of pest control treatments. The Commission is pleased to present initial comments to the BPC regarding the legislative charge to develop a comprehensive registry for notification of pest control treatments and looks forward to working with the Board to develop recommendations requested by the Legislature. Wild Blueberry growers and the Commission have spent much time and resources in outreach and notification efforts regarding pest control treatments over the years and look forward to the day that a single, simple notification system supporting communication between neighbors is finalized.

Since passage of L.D. 1547, this year has been an early, difficult spring for our farmers. We were in good shape until the early spring then field work started early, pest monitoring started early, and it was difficult to get bees in early because of the late spring in the south. We were on pins and needles worried about frost for a month then we had three nights of frost in mid-May right in the middle of our early bloom. 2010 is starting out as another very difficult year for our farmers on top of two very challenging years economically due to the world economic situation and increasingly large cultivated blueberry crops. Considering these realities of farming, **we want any notification system to be simple, effective, and efficient. In short, an effective tool that supports communication and relationship building with neighbors.**

In passing L.D. 1547 this session, the legislature changed specific sections of the statute regarding the aerial and air carrier registry it established in 2009 and directed the Board to begin the process of creating a single comprehensive outdoor notification registry to be used statewide regardless of the type of pest control treatment being made. The Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) Committee carefully considered and amended this legislation after a lengthy public hearing, 4 work sessions, and a language review session. This was an incredible effort by the ACF Committee. The Committee grappled with the issues and worked tirelessly to recraft

the law after weighing input from all stakeholders. It is not often the Legislature gives such full consideration to a bill; the ACF Committee should be commended for their work.

Although, there were 3 separate versions of the bill, called "reports", that came out of committee, it is important to note that all 13 members of the ACF Committee supported directing the Board to develop a comprehensive outdoor notification registry. The Committee members were unanimous in their thinking that the current notification requirements set forth in statute and rule should be overhauled into one notification registry that will be a tool to foster communication between neighbors and applicators before treatments are made. They were also unanimous in charging this Board with making recommendations back to the legislature regarding appropriate notification distances for various types of equipment.

It is also important to note that 12 out of the 13 members of the ACF Committee were in agreement over most of the amendments to the aerial and air carrier registry. The only disagreement that split these 12 members came down to whether to modify the registry notification distance for apple and Christmas tree farmers and whether to exempt forest and horticultural applicators from the registry requirements through 2011 while the comprehensive notification registry was being developed. Ten members felt that these two provisions made sense for a short period until the Board had been able to develop a comprehensive registry and 2 members did not agree with these time-limited exceptions. These 12 members all agreed to remove the preseason notification requirement established last year and to add a provision to allow notice the day of an application where necessary and justified under an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program.

So, although there was much debate and consideration about some of the details of this law, the Committee was largely of one mind on a number of significant issues:

- All agreed that a single comprehensive outdoor notification registry was the right policy going forward;
- All agreed to seek the Board's recommendations on the appropriate distances for notification based on the type of equipment being employed;
- All but one committee member agreed to do away with the preseason notification requirement; and
- All but one committee member agreed that notice may be given under limited circumstances on the same day as a treatment when justified under an IPM program.

Too often, we hear only about the discord, only about those issues where there was disagreement. In this case it is important for all of us to remember the remarkable level of agreement that was reached in the Committee this session. This agreement was reached with significant input from the Director of the BPC and Board members. Equally important, the Committee is clearly deferring to the expertise of this Board to craft a single, comprehensive notification registry.

With this information as background, we offer the following comments in response to the Board's requested information.

The Wild Blueberry Commission has actively pushed for the creation of a single, state-wide notification system for nearly two years now. Our growers use a variety of non powered and powered application methods. **We strongly believe that a single notification system makes sense for the public and applicators.** We support a singular notification system such as a comprehensive notification registry provided that it is the single regulatory mechanism by which interested neighbors can receive advance notice of upcoming pest control treatments on any land using any type of application equipment. Our experience working with neighbors over the years tells us that most of the people who want to know about pest control treatments in their immediate vicinity do not care why the treatment is being made. They want prior notice so they can take specific action such as to close their windows or take in their laundry from the line. A comprehensive registry does not preclude farmers and other applicators from carrying out their current notification efforts. **Central to this policy making effort should be the simplification of notification requirements in rule.**

Since the proponents of changing current BPC notification rules have stated that the core purpose of notification is to meet right to know expectations, from a regulatory policy perspective it is very important to have one system, and one singular expectation of notification regardless of application methods or where applications are made. Once implemented this will clarify right to know expectations regarding pest control treatments.

We believe the new registry for aerial and air carrier equipment provides a good example to follow on a couple of fronts. First, the comprehensive registry should be readily accessible to registrants. Second, there should be a well-publicized deadline for registering each year so that the list can be updated and distributed to applicators for use throughout the year. There should also be a mechanism to ensure annually that the notification registry is current and that all on the registry have confirmed their interest and contact information.

The Legislature also asked the Board to determine the appropriate notification distance. **We support notification distances that focus on neighbors.** Recently the Board opined that it likely has heard and thought of most all the issues and options regarding notification. The Board has a range of distances in Chapters 28 and 51 that were selected for a range of pragmatic reasons, however; they were determined over a range in time and have not been looked at in terms of a single, seamless notification system. **We recommend that the Board start with the distances in their current rules and evaluate these distances with the goal of determining appropriate distances across uses and focusing on the neighbors to application sites.**

The feasibility and advisability of requiring land managers to post signs on the perimeter of properties on which pesticides are applied came from a floor amendment that was proposed by MOFGA at the end of the session. The actual charge directs the Board very specifically to report back to the legislature by February 1, 2011 on the **"feasibility and advisability of requiring land managers to post signs on the perimeter of properties on which pesticides will be applied using aircraft or air-carrier equipment"** (emphasis added). The proponents of this language outlined a very specific assessment by the Board.

When it comes to fostering communication between neighbors in rural settings, the posting of signs on the perimeter of properties is not practical or an effective use of time and energy. The vast majority of signs posted along a perimeter will be somewhere out in the woods not ever seen by neighbors. Often a farmer has many fields, over many parcels. It would take considerable effort for farmers to maintain perimeter signs with very little achieved regarding communication with neighbors. Perimeter signs cannot provide the direct notice to neighbors of upcoming treatments and they will not be able to provide the specific information regarding treatments that neighbors seeking notification typically want. A lot of time and effort would be required to maintain perimeter signs.

Additionally, the Committee was clear that they wanted a comprehensive notification system for all application equipment. **This perimeter posting directive relates only to specific application equipment and would again lead to a system that has needless complication with applicators following certain rules for certain equipment and different rules for other equipment.** The result would be some farm fields posted because of the type of application equipment used and neighboring fields treated with the same pest control materials not posted. This proposal just does not make much sense. **We encourage the Board to report to the legislature that the Legislatures' first policy directive was the correct one: The establishment of a single notification system for all applications.**

The feasibility of developing an automated, Internet-based system for land managers to use in notifying registry participants also came from a floor amendment proposed at the end of the session and was not determined by the Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry Committee. **Once again this directive only applies to air carrier and aerial equipment by its reference to a section of the statute which applies only to these equipment types. As we have stated for a couple years, the right policy direction is to establish a single comprehensive notification system to ensure that interested neighbors receive prior notice of pest control treatments.** Wild blueberry growers want to communicate directly with their neighbors in the same manner regardless of the application method. They certainly do not want to call or email directly when using certain equipment, but be forced to use an automated system when using other equipment. **Multiple systems is the wrong policy direction as it creates unnecessary complication.**

The Commission believes strongly that an automated, internet-based system will serve to decrease real and productive communication with their neighbors. The proponents of changing the notification in recent years have stated the goal is promoting better communication. An automated notification system is the antithesis of true communication. We believe the intention of Representative Pieh, who mentioned this concept during the committee deliberations, was that such an automated system would relieve farmers of the administrative burden of directly calling or emailing their neighbors. Although we appreciate the sentiment of reducing administrative burdens, wild blueberry growers value directly communicating with neighbors wanting advance notification of treatments. These direct communications sometimes lead a grower to alter the timing of a treatment based on a neighbor's request due to an upcoming outdoor party or other function that is planned.

We urge the Board to recommend to the legislature that a single notification system such as the comprehensive registry that allows for direct communication with neighbors is the best policy for notification. We do not believe automated notices result in true communication between neighbors.
