Registered Professional Nurse Licensure by Examination

State of Maine Licensure Requirements

The following information is the general information needed for licensure and does not reflect other information that may be requested based on review of an application.

APPLICATION AND FEE

- 1) **Apply online** on the <u>Maine State Board of Nursing website</u>. Select *I want to "apply for a license"* and follow the instructions.
- 2) The non-refundable application fee is \$75.00
- 3) Upload a recent color **photograph** that displays a clear, recognizable full-face view. This MUST be a self-portrait with no filters or additions, edits, and no other people in the photo or background. Copies of a driver's license, passport or passport-style photos, and copies of ID/badge photos will NOT be accepted.
- 4) Upload a signed and dated **application signature page**. Go to Maine State Board of Nursing website and the form is located in the <u>Licensing section</u>.
- 5) Send in **supporting documentation**. All "*yes*" responses to questions in the disciplinary section of the application require a signed explanation, as well as court documents for any incidents that occurred <u>less than</u> 10 years ago. These forms can be uploaded to your checklist, or:

NURSE LICENSURE COMPACT INFORMATION

- ❖ A legal resident of another compact state cannot apply for registered professional nurse licensure by examination in the state of Maine.
- ❖ If moving to Maine, a legal resident of another compact state is required to provide a Declaration of Primary Residence Form when the applicant relocates to Maine. The form can be found on the Maine State Board of Nursing in the <u>Licensing section</u>.
- Maine state law authorizes the Board to request any or all documents that provide proof of legal residency in Maine, including but not limited to:
 - Driver's license
 - Tax forms
 - Validation of residence
- For compact purposes, the primary state of residence/legal state is not related to property ownership, school location, or work location; it is the state in which a person holds legal documents.

TRANSCRIPT(S)

Applicants graduating from out-of-state programs must have the school send or e-mail a **final transcript** with degree and date conferred to:

SCHOOL CERTIFICATION

The school must complete the **School Certification Form** located on the <u>Maine State Board of Nursing website</u> within the Examination section.

- This form must be completed by the nursing program administration, not the registrar nor the applicant.
- It must be completed thoroughly and accurately, stamped with the school's official seal, and sent by the school.
- This document must be mailed to Maine State Board of Nursing, 158 SHS, Augusta ME 04333. We cannot accept electronic versions of this form.

FOREIGN OR CANADIAN-EDUCATED APPLICANTS

- The applicant is required to have a transcript review by the Commission of Graduates of Foreign Nursing Programs (CGFNS), and that information must be submitted to the Maine Board of Nursing by CGFNS or posted for review on the CGFNS website.
- CGFNS is the only credential evaluation organization that Maine Board of Nursing accepts.
- ❖ Effective May 22, 2023, applicants who have been educated at a Foreign (Country other than the United States) educational facility, and who are seeking licensure in Maine from the Maine Board of Nursing, must report ALL foreign (outside the United States) licenses to be verified/validated through CGFNS and reported in the CES report.
- If an applicant's education was taught in any language other than English, the applicant must complete a TOEFL English language proficiency test. Maine accepts ONLY the TOEFL for English language proficiency test.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK

Maine state law authorizes the State Board of Nursing to require an applicant to complete the **fingerprinting** process for a criminal background check upon initial licensure.

- <u>IdentoGO</u> is the exclusive vendor that is responsible for processing your fingerprints. There is a fee associated.
- Go to the <u>Maine State Board of Nursing website</u>. Select "I want to obtain a criminal background check" and follow the instructions.
- The criminal background check results are only valid for 90 days.
- The Maine Board of Nursing cannot accept fingerprint cards or criminal background results mailed by you, or results that were completed for another facility, even if the previous check was completed through the Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- Please pay careful attention to IdentoGO instructions.

UNITED STATES (US) SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

The applicant must be issued a **US Social Security Number** before they can be issued licensure by the Maine Board of Nursing.

PEARSON VUE

Pearson VUE is the exclusive company that provides the computer based **NCLEX examination**, which is offered in both domestic and international authorized test centers.

- 1) Go to www.nclex.com to register.
- 2) There is a non-refundable \$200 registration fee.
- 3) Once the Board of Nursing makes the applicant eligible to receive an Authorization to Test, they are able to schedule the NCLEX exam to be administered at any test center.
- 4) Authorization to Test is only valid for **90 days** and cannot be extended for any reason.
