Hi, Mary-

Although it is not a requirement spelled out in the regulations, we would appreciate seeing an expiration date on the submitted 24(c) SLN labels. Our preferred location and language was provided on the sample label template provided with the annual state letter (sent by e-mail 10/31/2011).

When the 24(c) SLN reaches this expiration date, the date can be extended by a simple amendment request to the current section 24(c) SLN label. When a registration is issued with a label which does not have an expiration date, that label is essentially valid, whether scientific changes have developed following the issuance of the registration that would require mitigation of the use rate, or addition of WPS measures that were absent on the original label. The original 24(c) label is essentially valid despite changes that should be made until the product is no longer available.
