Part 70 Air Emission License  
Amendment #1**

After review of the Part 70 Administrative Revision application, staff investigation reports and other documents in the applicant's file in the Bureau of Air Quality, pursuant to 38 M.R.S.A, Section 344 and Section 590, the Department finds the following facts:

**I. Registration**

B. Description of Part 70 Administrative Revision

Currently, Condition 39(A) of Part 70 License A-252-70-A-I states the following:

“Each semiannual report shall include a summary of the periodic monitoring required by Special Condition (36).”

However, Condition 36 refers to the use of HVLP spray guns. The intent of Condition 39(A) was the reporting of periodic monitoring required by Special Condition 38.

C. Application Classification

The application for Irving Tanning does not violate any applicable federal or state requirements and does not increase the source's potential to emit by significant emissions. The application only clarifies one condition. Therefore, the license amendment is considered to be an Administrative Revision of a Part 70 source issued under Section 5 of Chapter 140 of the Department's regulations for a Part 70 source.

**ORDER**

The Department hereby grants Part 70 Administrative Revision A-252-70-B-A, subject to the conditions found in Part 70 License A-252-70-A-I, and in the following conditions:

**The following shall replace Condition (39) of Part 70 License A-252-70-A-I:**

(39) **Semiannual Reporting** [MEDEP Chapter 140]

The licensee shall submit semiannual reports every six months to the Bureau of Air Quality. The semiannual reports are due on July 31<sup>st</sup> and January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year with the initial semiannual report due **January 31, 2005**. The semiannual report shall be considered on-time if the postmark of the submittal is before the due date or if the report is received by the DEP within seven calendar days of the due date.

- A. Each semiannual report shall include a summary of the periodic monitoring required by Special Condition (38).
- B. All instances of deviations from license requirements and the corrective action taken must be clearly identified and provided to the Department in summary form for each six-month interval.
