Dear Mr. Palmer,

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) needs to dismantle several monitoring wells associated with the Hooper Sands Road Site, located in South Berwick, Maine. These monitoring wells were installed as part of an environmental clean-up conducted by DEP and the federal Environmental Protection agency in the 1990's. Soil and groundwater contamination resulted from hazardous chemicals and waste oil disposed of in drums and unlined lagoons. A clean-up occurred in the early 1990's and public water was supplied to the area in 1995.

There are approximately 50-60 monitoring wells that need to be abandoned according to the ME DEP guidance for well and boring abandonment.

If you are interested in doing this work, please submit an estimate to me by 5 PM, December 1, 2010. I am looking for the total cost to complete the job and when you would be available to start. Estimates are being requested from three contractors we have on retainer and the work will be awarded to the contractor with the lowest bid.


