

Risk Factors:



Were people who injected drugs



Were hospitalized



Were people with multiple sex partners



Were people who used non-injection drugs

Contact Investigations:

- 97% of patients had symptoms
- 100% of patients had elevated liver enzyme lab results
- 73% of patients had jaundice
- · None of the patients were fully vaccinated



Prevention:

- · Get vaccinated against hepatitis A and B
- Do not share syringes or injection kit equipment
- · Practice safer sex
- Do not share razors, toothbrushes, or tattooing or piercing needles
- Get tested for hepatitis B, especially if you are a person who injects drugs, were ever incarcerated, were born between 1945-1965, or received an unlicensed tattoo
- · If you have hepatitis B, seek medical care
