<b>DTaP:</b>	<b>Any child younger than age 7.</b>
<b>IPV:</b>	<b>Any child through age 18.</b>
<b>MMR:</b>	<b>Any child age 1 through age 18.</b>
<b>1st dose Varicella:</b>	<b>Any child 1 through age 18.</b>
<b>2nd dose Varicella:</b>	<b>VFC eligible child through age 18.</b>
<b>Hib:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children through age 18.</b>
<b>Hepatitis B:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children up through 18.</b>
<b>Pneumococcal Conjugate:</b>	<b>VFC eligible Healthy children up to age 5. VFC eligible High risk children up to age 6.</b>
<b>Hepatitis A:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children age 1 through age 18.</b>
<b>Rotavirus:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children up through 32 weeks of age.</b>
<b>Tdap:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children age 10 up through age 18.</b>
<b>HPV</b>	<b>VFC eligible children age 9 through age 18.</b>
<b>Meningococcal:</b>	<b>VFC eligible children age 11 up through age 18.</b>
<b>Pneumococcal Polysaccharide:</b>	<b>VFC eligible High risk children, age 2 up through age 18.</b>
<b>Influenza:§</b>	<b>VFC eligible children 6 months and up through age 18.</b>

**Underinsured children in Maine do not need to be sent to a FQHC or RHC to receive VFC vaccine. They can be vaccinated at your provider office.**
