

Family Day Care Homes

The USDA Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) provides reimbursement for nutritious meals and snacks served to infants and children (ages 12 and younger) in licensed family day care homes.

Reimbursement is based on the income level of the local geographic area, the child care provider or the children in care.

Family day care homes can be reimbursed for up to two meals and one snack, or one meal and two snacks per day for each child enrolled in care.

To participate in the CACFP, day care providers must sign an agreement with a sponsoring organization. Please see the link below to find sponsoring organizations that administer the CACFP in your county. Sponsors are responsible for recruiting, training, monitoring and reimbursing day care providers.
