Katie Beckett Benefit:

MaineCare for children with serious health conditions



The **Katie Beckett benefit** is a MaineCare program for children with serious health conditions who are not otherwise eligible for MaineCare. If your child meets the Katie Beckett eligibility rules, your child will receive full MaineCare benefits.

Families must pay monthly premiums to receive the Katie Beckett benefit.

To qualify for the MaineCare Katie Beckett benefit, your child must:

1. Be under age 19
2. Not be eligible for MaineCare under any other category
3. Meet criteria for physical or mental disability, according to Social Security Disability guidelines
4. Be living at home, not in a medical institution, as defined in the MaineCare Eligibility Manual
5. Require the same type of care provided by a hospital, nursing facility, psychiatric hospital, or intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disability (ICF-IID), but not reside in one of those facilities
6. Have an initial face-to-face medical assessment by an agent of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to determine the level of care required
7. Meet financial eligibility criteria as required by the MaineCare Eligibility Manual

What happens after we apply for MaineCare?

1. An eligibility specialist will decide if your child qualifies for MaineCare based on financial rules.
2. If your child does not meet the regular MaineCare financial rules, the Medical Review Team will review your child's medical and/or psychiatric records and decide if your child meets the Social Security's disability guidelines.
3. A nurse will then meet with you and your child to do a medical assessment. This assessment will identify the level of care your child needs.
4. An eligibility specialist will send you a letter to let you know if your child meets all the rules.

What if I am paying both private insurance and Katie Beckett premiums?

The Private Health Insurance Premium (PHIP) benefit may help you save money if you are paying both a private health insurance and a Katie Beckett premium.
