- Self Help includes peer-run services to support the development or maintenance of self help and/or mutual support groups and similar services. This service may include such activities as peer companion programs, one-to-one support, clearing house for mental health information, training and meeting places, empowerment skills, and volunteerism.

Community Support services are rehabilitative services, treatment services, and daily living support services provided pursuant to an individualized rehabilitation/service plan for a person with severe and disabling mental illness or a class member. These services promote the integration of the person into the community, sustain the person in his or her current living situation or another living situation of his or her choice, and enhance the quality of his or her life.

Community Support Services include the following:

- Assertive Community Treatment involves a self-contained service with a fixed point of responsibility for providing treatment, rehabilitation and support services to people for whom other treatment approaches have been unsuccessful. It is provided by multidisciplinary teams on a 24 hours per day, 7 days per week basis. The multidisciplinary teams must include a psychiatrist, psychiatric nurse, certified rehab counselor or certified employment specialist, and a substance abuse counselor; the team may also include an occupational therapist, registered MHRT/C, psychologist, and LCSW. Staff to recipient ratio is not more than 1:10.
- Adult Intensive Community Integration is similar to ACT but not provided on a 24 hour per day 7 days per week basis. Services are provided by a multidisciplinary team, including a psychiatric nurse, MHRT/C, and psychiatrist.
- Adult Community Integration includes the identification, assessment, planning, linking, monitoring, and evaluation of services and supports needed by a person with severe and disabling mental illness or a Class Member. These services require the active participation of the person or guardian. These services are provided by a social services or health professional, or other qualified staff, to identify the medical, social, educational and other needs of the eligible client, to perform intake/assessment, to develop an individual support plan, to identify the services necessary to meet those needs, to facilitate access to those services, to provide coordination/advocacy, to conduct monitoring, and to perform evaluation.
- Daily Living Supports are designed to assist an individual to maintain the highest level of independence possible through personal supervision and therapeutic support in order to maintain skills of daily living. The services are provided in the individuals' own homes or temporary living quarters consistent with an individualized support plan.
- Respite involves planned or unplanned temporary care of a consumer for the purpose of providing relief to the primary caregiver or consumer.
- Wraparound or Flexible Funds includes funding used to purchase one time or very short term items not available through existing resources.
- Warm Lines is a service distinct from a crisis service and may be consumer or agency operated. Warm lines are designed for the purpose of offering support to consumers to reduce impact on crisis service to help consumers better cope with their issues.
- Skills Development includes teaching based services that assists individuals with increasing their independence by learning new skills and accessing the community resources, including connecting with natural supports.

Crisis Services include the following:

- Crisis Stabilization-In Home provides personal supervision and therapeutic support services to an adult during a psychiatric emergency. These services are provided primarily in clients' homes or in the community.
- Crisis Stabilization-Mobile Response are those services that include outreach crisis intervention to home, work, street, emergency shelter or other setting, available on a 24-hour, seven-day a week basis. Covered services include direct telephone contacts and face-to-face contact with consumers, to include assessment, evaluation, referral and follow up if needed.
- Crisis Stabilization-Residential Facility provides short term, highly supportive, and supervised residential settings where an individual in psychiatric crisis can become stabilized and readjust to community living. Components of service include monitoring of behaviors, therapeutic

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interventions, supportive counseling, coordination with other community-based services, and supervision to assure personal safety.

- Telephone services are the point of entry for emergency mental health services. Mental health professionals and trained volunteers supervised by clinical staff provide crisis intervention, suicide prevention, supportive counseling, information and referral, advocacy, and emergency financial assistance.

Other Supports and Services include the following:

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- Alternative Dispute Resolution includes mediation services to help individuals in conflict.
- Rental Subsidies include contracts to the Central Administrative Agent administering tenant rental assistance programs known as the Bridging Rental Assistance Program and Shelter Plus Care. The service may also include other rental assistance supports as specifically identified in contracts.
- Transportation includes the provision of or reimbursement for transportation services for consumers to access medical, educational, and social services. This would include transportation to and from counseling, therapy, support groups, appointments, etc. For those in MH residential placement settings, MH transportation services are requested in advance and the consumer must have no other means of transportation. MH transportation is covered when it is to a MaineCare covered service, and the MaineCare consumer is in the vehicle. Transportation to treatment services for parent and/or child is an allowable cost to access service.

Outpatient and Professional Services include the following:

- Day Treatment/Day Support services are designed to assist the individual in the acquisition, retention, or improvement of self-help, socialization and adaptive skills. These are provided in an agency environment and most often in a group setting.
- Diagnosis and Evaluation includes comprehensive evaluation to provide recommendations for treatment and service needs.
- Outpatient Services shall mean professional assessment, counseling and therapeutic services, the purposes of which are to promote positive orientation, relief of excess stress, and growth toward more integrated and independent levels of functioning. Services are delivered through planned interaction involving the use of physiological, psychological, and sociological concepts, techniques and processes of evaluation and intervention. Components of service may include diagnosis and assessment, psychometric evaluation, intervention services by psychological examiners, individual, group, family therapy, medication review and chemotherapy, and similar professional therapeutic services, which must include a direct client encounter.
- Medication Services are directly related to prescription, administration, education and/or monitoring of medications.
- Specialized Direct Services include specialized professional services such as diagnosis and evaluation, consultation to treating teams or caregivers, and direct services provided only to the extent permitted by licensure and approval to practice conditions.
- Specialized Group Services include education and peer and family support provided in a group setting to assist the individual focus on recovery, wellness, meaningful activity, and community tenure.

Residential Services include the following:

Mental Health Services Summary

- Residential Treatment includes providing or arranging for comprehensive treatment to include psychiatric and other specialized services, training and support (including housekeeping/home maintenance and meal planning/preparation); transportation; interpersonal relationships, self advocacy, and assertiveness training; health maintenance and safety practices; financial, personal and legal affairs management, contingency planning and decision making; basic academic, work and recreational skills; and utilization of community services and resources. Services are provided by specific levels of credentialed staff. Service is typically provided in a group home living arrangement.
- Community Residential includes providing or arranging a supervised living arrangement for comprehensive treatment, training, and support, including housekeeping/home maintenance and meal planning/preparation; transportation; interpersonal relationships, self advocacy and assertiveness training; health maintenance and safety practices; financial, personal and legal affairs management, contingency planning and decision making; basic academic, work and recreational skills; and utilization of community services and resources.
- Supported Housing involves a supported living arrangement with support provided in limited amounts, duration, or period of availability.
- Other Residential Services and Supports provide funding for other services not covered by PNMI or MaineCare as specified by the Department. These services and supports include funding for individuals in special circumstances who need residential support.
- Nursing Homes involves a Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) in the Medicare program or a Nursing Facility (NF) in the Medicaid program which meets State licensing and Federal certification requirements for nursing facilities and has a valid agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services. Mental Health Geriatric Nursing Facilities provide NF services for older people with mental illness. These NFs receive a higher than usual NF level of reimbursement through state funds to maintain a higher staffing level and provide necessary enhanced training for those staff.
