*Any candidate collecting or spending more than \$500 in 2009 must file a campaign finance report on January 19, 2010 showing all contributions and expenditures (including obligations) through December 31, 2009.

24-HOUR REPORTS

REPORT PERIOD	WHAT TO REPORT:	
	CONTRIBUTIONS	EXPENDITURES
For Primary Election: May 26 – June 7, 2010	Any single contribution of \$1,000 or more.	If you <u>have not</u> filed a Trigger Report, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> any single expenditure of \$1,000 or more
For General Election: October 20 – November 1, 2010	These can only be made by the candidate, the candidate's spouse or domestic partner.	If you <u>have</u> filed a Trigger Report, any single expenditure of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> \$500 or more for House candidates; or \$750 or more for Senate candidates.

When to File. Within 24 hours, including weekends and holidays, of receiving the contribution or making the expenditure, incurring the obligation, or placing the order. Orders placed with or obligations made to vendors for goods or services are considered expenditures at the time the obligations are made.

HOW TO FILE REPORTS

Using the Commission's Website. Candidates who receive or expect to receive at least \$1,500 for their campaigns must file reports electronically on the Commission's website. Candidates or treasurers must enter the required information and click "File Report" by 11:59 p.m. on the filing deadline. Candidates who lack access to the technology or the technological ability to file reports on the internet may request a waiver by April 15, 2010. The Commission will grant all reasonable requests.

Using Paper Forms. For candidates who are not required to file electronically, each original campaign finance report signed by the candidate and treasurer must be properly filed with the Commission by the filing deadline, except in two circumstances. A properly signed report may be faxed to the Commission office at (207) 287-6775 by 11:59 p.m. on the deadline, provided that the Commission receives the original report within five calendar days. A report mailed to the Commission by certified or registered mail and postmarked at least 2 days before the filing deadline will not be considered late, even if it is received after the deadline.
