Bourgoin Lake is a relatively small, shallow lake with a very muddy bottom. It is surrounded by a border of floating heath bog partly broken away from shore, along with an abundance of dri-ki and dead standing trees.

The water level in Bourgoin Lake may periodically be raised by beaver dams on the outlet. Spawning and nursery habitat for brook trout is lacking in the outlet, and therefore trout must depend solely on spring areas within the lake for spawning.

A brook trout fishery does exist although there is an abundant population of redbelly dace and hornpout present in the lake.
