Principal fishery: Bait

Rowell Pond is a small, shallow, bog-type pond. A thick mat of both living and dead vegetation covers the pond bottom. Emergent vegetation, mostly pondweeds and water lilies, is thick enough in places to make boating difficult and summer fishing impossible. Water quality is unsuitable for brook trout. The pond is managed for its bait species.
