### Physical Characteristics




The shoreline of this pond is well developed with seasonal and year round homes, typical of ponds in York County. Although the pond thermally stratifies during the summer months an oxygen deficiency develops which potentially limits the success of cold water fishery management efforts. Swan Pond is managed for cold and warmwater fisheries.

Brown and brook trout are stocked annually to maintain a coldwater fishery. Brown trout caught by anglers generally do not exceed 18 inches. The presence of competing warmwater fish and somewhat limited water quality compromise efforts to manage trout fisheries. The fish forage base should be enhanced to improve brown trout growth and survival.

White perch are relatively abundant and average 10 to 11 inches in length.
