ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTEENTH MAINE LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION 71st Legislative Day Saturday, July 6, 1991

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1991, June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993 (H.P. 1379) (L.D. 1967) (H. "A" H-738; H. "B" H-740; H. "C" H-741)

Was reported by the Committee on **Engrossed** Bills as truly and strictly engrossed.

On motion of Representative Chonko of Topsham, under suspension of the rules, the House reconsidered its action whereby L.D. 1967 was passed to be engrossed as amended.

On further motion of the same Representative, under suspension of the rules, the House reconsidered its action whereby House Amendment "A" (H-738) was adopted.

On further motion of the same Representative, House Amendment "A" (H-738) was indefinitely postponed.

On further motion of the same Representative, under suspension of the rules, the House reconsidered its action whereby House Amendment "B" (H-740) was adopted.

The same Representative offered House Amendment "A" (H-749) to House Amendment "B" (H-740) and moved its adoption.

House Amendment "A" (H-749) to House amendment "B" (H-740) was read by the Clerk.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Topsham, Representative Chonko.

Representative CHONKO: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: Just a brief explanation of what this amendment does.

H-1443

This is the budget, it removes the video lottery which left a \$32 million hole. It changes the quarterly payment of the insurance company taxes from 25 percent each quarter to 35 percent in April, 35 percent in June and 15 percent in the remaining two The change would be sunsetted once the quarters. 1992-1993 budget has been completed. To make up the rest of the \$92 million, we have across-the-board one percent cut in the first year and two percent cut in the second year exempting the General Purpose Aid and all the entitlements, Maine Health Care, Foster Care and Rehab programs.

Subsequently, House Amendment "A" House Amendment "B" (H-740) was adopted. House Amendment "A" (H-749) to

House Amendment "B" (H-750) to House Amendment "B" (H-740) was read by the Clerk.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Topsham, Representative Chonko.

Representative CHONKO: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: A brief explanation of what This is Representative this amendment does. Manning's amendment and it puts a sunset provision on it ending on the first year of the biennium.

Subsequently, House Amendment "B" (H-750) to House Amendment "B" (H-740) was adopted. House Amendment "B" (H-750) as amended by House Amendment "A" (H-749) & "B" (H-740) thereto was adopted.

Representative from Topsham, Representative Chonko. Representative CHONKO: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: A brief explanation as to what this amendment does - it is an errors bill for errors that were found in the Revisors Office and it corrects those errors.

Subsequently, House Amendment "E" (H-744) was adopted.

Representative Chonko of Topsham offered House Amendment "G" (H-748) and moved its adoption.

House Amendment "G" (H-748) was read by the Clerk. The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Topsham, Representative Chonko.

Representative CHONKO: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: A brief explanation to House Amendment "G." The amendment offsets the appropriations and allocation made earlier this week from Cycle A and Cycle B state employees and to keep the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery open. If we are to the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery open. If we are to enact a budget, L.D. 1967 before you, and it is signed into law by the Governor, this amendment is needed to keep the budget balanced. The amendment recognizes the passage of the 1992-93 budget and already includes funding for Cycle A and Cycle B and the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.

Subsequently, House Amendment "G" (H-748) was adopted.

The Bill was passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "B" (H-740) as amended by House Amendment "A" (H-749) and "B" (H-750) thereto and House Amendments "C" (H-741), "E" (H-744) and "G" (H-748) in non-concurrence and sent uр for concurrence.
