Make the following changes to the Bid Documents:

In the Bid Book (pages 4 and 5), REMOVE the "SCHEDULE OF ITEMS", 2 pages dated 090212 and REPLACE with the attached new "SCHEDULE OF ITEMS", 2 pages dated 090309.

In the Bid Book, **REMOVE** "General Decision Number: ME080002 1/30/2009 ME2" (pages 36 through 40) and **REPLACE** with the attached new wage rates titled "General Decision Number: ME0800020 03/06/2009 ME2"

In the Bid Book, Prior to page 41, **INSERT** the attached wage rate "General Decision Number: ME080009 07/25/2008 ME9"

In the Bid Book, on page 141, Table of Content, under DIVISION 1 – GENERAL REQUIREMENTS please **ADD** section 01210 – ALLOWANCES

In the Bid Book, SECTION 16000, on page 625, **DELETE** Paragraph 1.4, B. in its entirety. **ADD** in its place Paragraph 1.4, B. to read:

- B. Provide a 208/120-volt, 3-phase, 4-wire secondary service to the building. Provide primary service conduits for use by the utility from the utility pole to the pad-mounted utility transformer. Primary conductors will be by the utility.
 - 1. Carry a \$20,000 allowance for CMP entrance service construction cost as specified in section 01210 Allowances.

In the Bid Book, SECTION 16000, on page 634, **DELETE** Subparagraph 2.1, P., 4. **ADD** in it place Subparagraph 2.1, P., 4. to read:

4. 120/240V, single-phase, 3-wire with 160kA surge current rating.

In the Bid Book, SECTION 16740, on page 655, ADD Paragraph 1.2, B to read:

B. Carry a \$10,000 allowance for Fairpoint entrance service construction cost as specified in section 01210 Allowances.

On Plan Sheet, DRAWING M-500, Detail A1, DELETE Note #6 in its entirety.

The following questions have been received:

Question: Who carries the CMP and Fairpoint costs on this project and who are our contact personnel?

Response: Please ADD Specification "SECTION 01210 - Allowances" attached. The CMP contact person is Van Hobgood (207-490-3075), the Fairpoint contact person is Sady Rancourt (207-797-1776).

Question: The wage determination for this project is classified as Building Construction and does not list all Division 2, Sitework trades. What wage rates should be used for bidding purposes where these trades are involved? Is work outside the building footprint subject to a different wage scale?

Response: Please see the attached wage rates for "Site Work" portion of the project and the new "Buildings" wage rates. Additional wage rates will be requested by the Contractor after Bid Award. The bidder is responsible for determining area practice for missing classifications.

Consider these changes and information prior to submitting your bid on March 11, 2009.

1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

- A. If the Contractor discovers any ambiguity, error, omission, conflict, or discrepancy, Special Provision Section 101.3.6 Priority of Contract Documents shall control.
 - 1. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions and other Division 1 Specification Sections, apply to this Section.
 - 2. State of Maine Department of Transportation, "Standard Specifications," Revision 2002, apply to this Section.
 - 3. State of Maine Department of Transportation Standard Details revised 2002
 - 4. State of Maine Department of Transportation Best Management Practices for Erosion and Sediment control the "table of contents" of the latest version is dated 1/19/00.

Any supplements to any of the above specifications and or standards issued prior to issuance of this specification.

1.2 SUMMARY

- A. This Section includes administrative and procedural requirements governing allowances.
 - Certain materials and equipment are specified in the Contract Documents by allowances.
 In some cases, these allowances include installation. Allowances have been established
 in lieu of additional requirements and to defer selection of actual materials and equipment
 to a later date when additional information is available for evaluation. If necessary,
 additional requirements will be issued by Change Order. Allowance amount shall not
 include overhead and profit but shall include taxes, freight and delivery to the Project
 site.
- B. Types of allowances include the following:
 - 1. Lump-sum allowances.
- C. Related Sections include the following:
 - 1. Division 16 SECTION 16000 –BASIC ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENTS for electrical service entrance requirements.
 - 2. Division 16 Section 16740 TELECOMMUNICATIONS for telephone Service requirements
