Wassookeag Lake provides good water quality for cold-water fishes, but spawning and nursery facilities for stream spawning salmonids are limited. The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Game began a 5-year lake trout stocking program in 1958. Angler returns from togue stocking have been high.

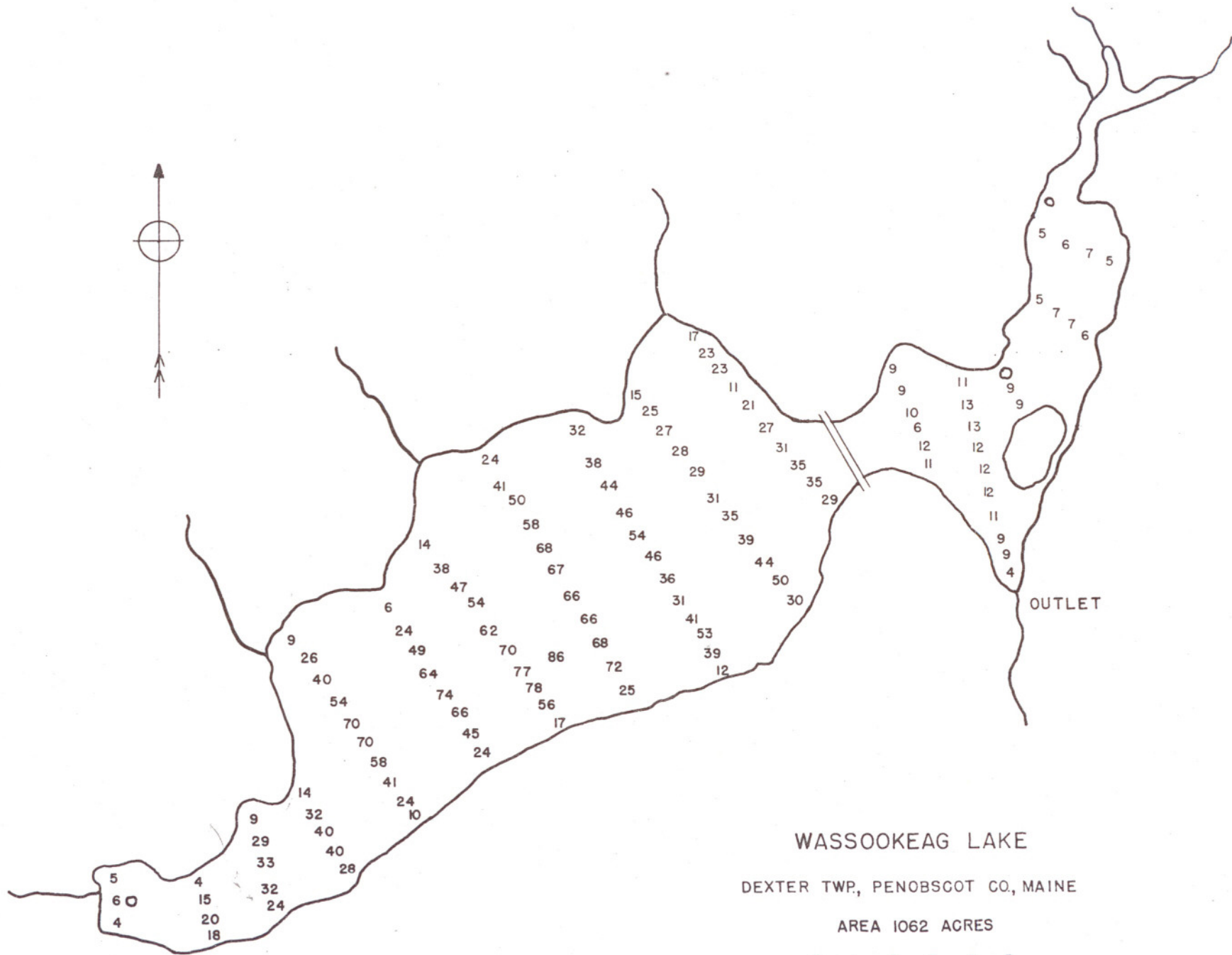
In 1970 the Fish and Game Department undertook the first of several planned experimental stockings of salmon. Results of these stockings will be evaluated by Department biologists.
