This is accomplished through: (1) direct grants of support; (2) group training of homeless and domestic violence shelter staff in Maine; (3) direct consultation to individual non-profits on improving their operation, policies, efficiencies and staff training; (4) support of research efforts on homelessness and its causes for the benefit of agencies throughout Maine; and (5) publicizing the facts of homelessness and advocating for solutions. These efforts, while they vary from year to year, have provided valuable and otherwise unavailable advocacy, assistance and support to numerous non-profit agencies and their personnel.

For the period covered by this tax return, the Foundation did not engage in any consulting services or fund any non-grant activities; instead, the Foundation chose to utilize its resources to increase the amount of grant awards and payments made directly to qualified charitable institutions that are providing direct relief to those suffering from homelessness, domestic violence, and/or substance abuse.
