The application contains a list of names credited as "additional contributors via video or major citations" and does not contain any additional information as to the specific contributions of these individuals.

- d. The applicant must describe its screening process for domestic abuse and violence. There does not appear to be any affirmative screening for DV because it is not a live class and portions of the program attempt to address families who have experienced IPV
- e. The applicant must include information on the program's Board of Directors. Application provided information on the Board of Directors.

To the extent the applicant has provided co-parent education programming in prior years, the applicant must provide the number of parents served and the number of courses offered broken down by year for federal fiscal years 2017-2021. Applicant claims 125,335 parents served in two courses for the reporting period stated in the RFA but did not break it down by year as required by the RFA.

Q Since this is self-directed, it is not clear if it meets the minimum of 4-hours in duration, and meet monthly requirement. It does say that the participant cannot move forward until they have spent an anticipated requisite amount of time on a section.
