




Population of Maine (1960-2040)




Population of Piscataquis County, 1960 -2020



Population of Somerset County, 1960 -2020




Components of Population Change, Maine



- •Population Increase from 2010-2020: 2.6% (42nd in the U.S.)
- •Population increase from 2020-2023: 2.4% (14th in U.S.)
- •2023 net migration: 8.2/thousand (9th in the U.S.)


Looking Ahead to 2030 and Beyond

- Current projections show population decline from 2020-2030:
 - Piscataquis County: -5%
 - Somerset County: -1.2%
- Reasons:
 - Age distribution of population: high median age, high percentage of population 65+
 - Longer term migration patterns (pre-2020)
- Questions: Will recent migration patterns continue? How will the new residents affect the overall age distribution in the counties?






Piscataquis County, 2020, Observed population









Piscataquis County, 2030, Projected Population




Median Age by County 2020 - 2022




Median Age by County, 2022




Share of 2020 Population by Race/Ethnicity Excluding Non-Hispanic White Alone

Educational Attainment of Population Age 25+








5-year Socioeconomic Trends


- Poverty rate: Piscataquis saw the largest decline in the state, from 18.7% to 15.0%
- Median household income:
 - Piscataquis saw the most growth statewide 11.5%
 - Somerset saw 7.6% growth (state growth of 7.5%)
- Educational attainment 25+:
 - Both counties had modest gains in bachelor's degrees
 - Somerset had largest increase in the state for high school diploma/equivalency from 87.7% to 91.8%.




Employment by Industry, Piscataquis County, 2019-2022




Employment by Industry, Somerset County, 2019 -2022




Moving Four Quarter Average Wage Per Job




Moving Four Quarter Average Wage Per Job




Measures of inflation, Year-Over-Year Percent Change




Total Nonfarm Employment Maine (seasonally adjusted)




Annual Average Unemployment Rate

30-Year Fixed Rate Mortgage Average


