PUBLIC MEETING ON PUBLIC BENEFIT DETERMINATION APPLICATION FOR JUNIPER RIDGE LANDFILL

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection (Department) will hold a public meeting on July 16, 2024, from 1:00 to 3:00 pm and 5:30 to 7:30 pm at the Wells Conference Center, located at the University of Maine, 131 Munson Road, Orono, Maine, pursuant to 38 M.R.S. § 1310-AA(2). There will be an opportunity for the public to attend virtually; however, this option is available for viewing purposes only. The link to view the meeting virtually will be posted on the Department's website at <u>https://www.maine.gov/dep/waste/juniperridge/index.html</u> at least five days prior to the meeting date. The purpose of the meeting is to provide the public an opportunity to offer comments on the public benefit determination application filed with the Department by the State of Maine, Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of General Services (BGS), as owner of the Juniper Ridge Landfill.

In accordance with Maine laws and rules, the Department may not act upon any application to expand a solid waste disposal facility owned by the State prior to January 1, 2007 until the facility has applied for and received a public benefit determination. BGS requests a determination of public benefit for a proposed expansion of the Juniper Ridge Landfill. If approved, the proposed expansion will provide an additional 11.9 million cubic yards and approximately 11.3 years of additional disposal capacity.
