Re: Request for a Virtual Public Comment Opportunity for the Public Meetings on July 16, 2024 for the Public Benefit Determination Application for Juniper Ridge Landfill (DEP# S-020700-W5-CV-N)

Dear Commissioner Loyzim & Specialist Knuuti:

Pursuant to 38 M.R.S. § 1310-AA(2), the Maine Department of Environmental Protection ("MEDEP") is hosting in-person public meetings for the public to comment on the Public Benefit Determination Application ("PBD") for Juniper Ridge Landfill ("JRL") (DEP# S-020700-W5-CV-N). The meetings will take place on July 16, 2024, from 1:00 to 3:00 pm and 5:30 to 7:30 pm at the Wells Conference Center, located at the University of Maine, 131 Munson Road, Orono, Maine. MEDEP has stated that there will be an opportunity for the public to attend these meetings virtually, but without the opportunity to provide comment. We write this letter to request that MEDEP provide virtual attendees with the ability and option to provide oral comments.

Conservation Law Foundation ("CLF") protects New England's environment for the benefit of all people and uses the law, science, and the market to create solutions that preserve our natural resources, build healthy communities, and sustain a vibrant economy. Through its

Zero Waste Project, CLF aims to protect communities from the dangers posed by unsustainable waste management practices.

The JRL PBD application is of significant interest to many members of the community and state. Even though MEDEP is currently accepting written comments on the application, many members of the community have a strong desire to have their voices heard at MEDEP's public meetings. However, there are various circumstances and hurdles (e.g., health, financial, geographic location, etc.) that certain members of the community, particularly those in environmental justice communities, face that inhibit their ability to attend the meetings inperson.

The relevant Maine statute governing a PBD defines "environmental justice" as "includ[ing] the equal protection and *meaningful involvement of all people* with respect to the development, implementation and enforcement of waste management laws, rules, regulations and licensing decisions." CLF believes that the "meaningful involvement of all people" includes the ability for the community to provide virtual comments at the July 16th meetings. Such an option is entirely consistent with other government proceedings within the state and around the New England region that have offered this option. Doing so is not technically difficult and will allow the meetings to be accessible to many and fulfill the spirit of what "meaningful involvement of all people" means.
