MOTION TO CONTINUE APPEAL HEARING

Licensee/Appellee Jeffry Spinney hereby moves that the Board of Environmental Protection continue the hearing scheduled for August 20, 2020 regarding the above appeal for at least 60 days. Licensee is considering and discussing with DEP staff the option to install a seasonal, removable ramp surface instead of the permitted permanent ramp resurfacing. The ramp resurfacing work is the only portion of this project which remains subject to appeal as the Licensee has opted to relinquish the portion of the Permit allowing for installation of a permanent dock (see attached letter of even date). The proposed continuance would allow Department staff to take its time to consider the Licensee's request for the temporary ramp surface as an alternative to the permitted work. If the temporary ramp surface is allowed, with or without further Department permitting, the Licensee may relinquish his DEP permit entirely, thus rendering all of the issues on appeal moot.

Hi Kristin,

Yes, I can confirm that the use of granite in the upland to anchor the seasonal ramp and floats, in lieu of the permanent pilings approved in the permit, would not require a formal modification of the permit, provided the granite is not in a fixed location for more than 7 months out of the year. It can be stored elsewhere on the property, in an upland location, during the off season.

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As we discussed this morning, there is the potential that Mr. Spinney may, instead of connecting his temporary ramp and floats to permanent piers in the upland, choose to connect them to a 500lb slab of granite located in the upland. The granite slab would be removed and replaced at the same time as the other dock components.
