KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

That I, WILLIAM L. STINSON of Wiscasset, County of Lincoln and State of Maine, in consideration of one dollar and other valuable consideration paid by CENTRAL MAINE POWER COMPANY, a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Maine and having an office and place of business at Augusta, County of Kennebec, said State of Maine, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Central Maine Power Company, its successors and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land in the town of Wiscasset, County of Lincoln, State of Maine, bounded and described as follows:

A strip of land 200 feet in width extending from land now or formerly of Marion S. Warland southerly to the South Dresden Road at land of the Heirs of John E. Hutchins. Said strip being bounded northerly by said Warland lot; easterly by a line parallel with and 115 feet easterly of the survey line now staked out across this lot and the Warland lot; southerly by said South Dresden Road and westerly by a line parallel with and 85 feet westerly of the survey line above described.

My title to the above property was derived as follows:

As sole living heir of John R. Stinson and Lettie Stinson.

Reserving to the grantor herein, an easement or right of way across the above described parcel of land for lumbering and agricultural purposes not to exceed 20 feet in width and to be located by the grantee in some location convenient for the said grantor and which will not, however, interfere with the use of the said above described parcel in connection with the transmission of electric energy.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforegranted and bargained premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereof to the said Central Maine Power Company, its successors and assigns, to its and their use and behoof forever. And I do covenant with the said Grantee, its successors and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the premises; that they are free of all incumbrances; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Grantee to hold as aforesaid; and that I and my heirs, shall and will warrant and defend the same to the said Grantee, its successors and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the said WILLIAM L. STINSON

and MARY B. STINSON, Wife of the said WILLIAM L. STINSON,

joining in this deed as Grantor, and relinquishing and conveying her rights by descent and all other rights in the above described premises, have hereunto set our hands and seals this 31st day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty.
