in consideration of one dollar and other valuable consideration paid by CENTRAL MAINE POWER COMPANY, a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Maine and having an office and place of business at Augusta, County of Kennebec, said State of Maine, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Central Maine Power Company, its successors and assigns, forever, certain lot(s) or parcel(s) of land in the town (\*\*\*\*) of Wiscasset , County of Lincoln State of Maine, bounded and described as follows:

Being a strip of land 85 feet in width extending from land of the Grantee, formerly of Joseph G. Boivin, on the south in a northeasterly direction to land of Graydon F. Foye at the Boulder Road, so called, on the northeast.

Said strip is bounded northwesterly by the southeasterly line of a strip of land 200 feet in width conveyed to the Grantee by Horace E. Colby, et al, by deed dated December 31, 1940 and recorded in Lincoln County Registry of Deeds in Book 439, Page 495; and southeasterly by a line parallel with and 85 feet distant southeasterly of the southeasterly line of said 200-foot strip.

The above described 85-foot strip being a portion of the premises conveyed to Earl B. Colby by Horace E. Colby, et al, by deed dated January 10, 1944 and recorded in said Registry of Deeds in Book 450, Page 268. The Grantors herein being the sole surviving heirs at law of the said Earl B. Excepting and reserving to the Grantors herein, their heirs and assigns, the right to cross the above described strip on foot and with vehicles at such times and such places as will not in any way interfere with any use that the Grantec, its successors and assigns, may hereafter make of said strip in connection with carrying on its business as a public utility.
