How do I use my farmers' market benefits?

- It is all digital!
- Download the BNFT App or go to www.mybnft.com and create an account
- Use the barcode in the BNFT App or print your barcode from <u>www.mybnft.com</u> and use it at the market or farm stand

What can I buy with the farmers' market benefits?

- Fresh, unprepared, Maine grown fruits and vegetables
- You can also use your fruit and vegetable benefits (CVB) at the market and farm stands year-round using the BNFT App bar code

What am I not allowed to buy with the farmers' market benefits?

 Honey, maple syrup, eggs, cheese, meat seafood, baked goods or other prepared items, dried herbs and fruits/veggies/herbs that are not Maine grown.

October 31st, 2024 is the last day to use your Farmers' Market benefits!




Need Help?

Important

- You can purchase more than the face value of the farmers' market benefit(s) by using the Cash Value Benefit (CVB) if available.
- If the total exceeds the sum of the farmers' market benefit the additional charge will be deducted from your available CVB balance automatically by the point of sales system.
- You can use another form of payment if the total is more than your WIC benefits.
