On October 25, 2023 around 2000 hours I was made aware of an active shooter situation in Lewiston, Maine and I was being requested to respond to Lewiston PD for assistance. At this time, I was the on call Detective for the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office. I was aware most of the members of the Cumberland County Criminal Investigation Division was responding to assist.

I arrived around 2113 hours where I grabbed my issued rifle and met with other Law Enforcement members outside of the Lewiston Police Department. By this time, I was made aware there were two shooting locations; one at Just-In-Time Recreation and the other Schemengees Bar. I was provided a still frame photograph of a male who had been identified as Robert Card. I was also provided a photograph of a white vehicle which was believed to be a Subaru.

I remained outside securing the perimeter of the Lewiston Police Department until I was requested to respond to 65 Central Ave, Lewiston which is the Lewiston Recreation Building. I was advised a busload of witnesses were being shuttled to this location to be interviewed.

I arrived on scene and stood as a perimeter unit with my long gun, until I was relieved by various uniformed officers. I secured my rifle and entered the building. The main doors opened into a large gymnasium. When I entered the building I saw several people wrapped in blankets, crying and leaning on each other for support. I was made aware the group was spilt into two sections, those who were at Just-In-Time Recreation and those who were at Schemengees. I was directed to an office on the right hand side of the building to conduct interviews.

I was introduced to a female verbally identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I welcomed them into the room and grabbed extra chairs and waters. I thanked [REDACTED] for taking time to speak to me. I asked [REDACTED] if I could record the interview and she advised that was fine. I started my agency issued recorder. The following is a synopsis, see recording for further. While speaking to [REDACTED] I noted her eyes were watery and her hands were shaking.

[REDACTED] are members on a bowling league at Just-In-Time Bowling. They arrived at the location driving their black [REDACTED] around 1730. They entered the building, checked in and were issued [REDACTED] for the nightly league. [REDACTED] met up with their friends [REDACTED] who were also bowling on the same lane.

[REDACTED] stated the night was normal and nothing seemed to be off. She stated a male by the name of [REDACTED] joined the group on lane 16 as he needed a lane to bowl. [REDACTED] was not at the bowling alley, but she called him after the incident and he responded to the scene for support.

[REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] of the building and is fairly close to the front doors. She stated as she was prepping to bowl she heard a loud bang. She stated she originally thought it was a transformer blowing. She heard a second bang and that's when she turned.

She stated she then saw a white male with brown hair and a beard holding what she described to be an AR long gun rifle. She stated [REDACTED]

She remained under the ball return where she estimated a total of 8-10 shots were fired.

She stated after it was quiet she stood up and looked towards the main door [REDACTED] She stated she knew it was not good. She also saw [REDACTED] She described both men lying on the ground injured. She also saw a male who she [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised she then ran down the lane that enters into the maintenance area of the bowling alley. She stated she ran to that location with several other people who were trying to flee the scene. [REDACTED] noted there was fresh blood droplets on the ground as she ran towards the back. She remembers not knowing if she was safe continuing in that direction as she did not know where the shooter went. [REDACTED] stayed in the maintenance area for a short time before exiting through the emergency exit which exits into the rear of the parking lot.

[REDACTED] ran behind the dumpster in the parking lot. They remained there until Law Enforcement Officers arrived on scene and told them to exit from their location.

[REDACTED] advised she did not recognize the suspect. She also advised she was unaware of any problems or issues occurring at the bowling alley and did not know why it would happen there.

While speaking to [REDACTED] I asked if she would be willing to draw out the bowling alley. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Note: see drawing in the files for further.

While speaking to [REDACTED] provided some information. [REDACTED]

was familiar with [REDACTED]

him as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] also confirmed he received a call [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] did not have any further information to provide. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I walked [REDACTED] back out to the gymnasium with [REDACTED]

My recorded interview with [REDACTED] lasted approximately 28 minutes.

I then met with a male verbally identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was walked into the same office space. The interview was recorded, but it should be noted that during my interview my recorder's memory filled up and stopped recording. The length of the recording was 25 minutes and I estimated I spoke to [REDACTED] for no more than 30 minutes. The following is a synopsis, see recording for further.

[REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] He stated he was originally at the business [REDACTED] He then left the establishment and returned around 1830 to play in the league. [REDACTED] advised he arrived at the business alone driving his [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised he entered the building, checked in and was given [REDACTED] [REDACTED] he stated he couldn't remember which lanes he was assigned. He reported he put his stuff down near his lane and walked around, stopping at the bar saying hello to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised at the time of the incident he was standing near a round rack of balls behind his lane. He stated he was turned facing the door when he saw a male between the two vestibule doors. He described the entrance to the bowling alley as being two sets of double doors. He stated he first saw the male in between the two sets of doors and saw him carrying a long gun. [REDACTED] stated he originally thought the rifle was an airsoft or bb gun. He remembers thinking how the male was not wearing a mask.

█████ stated as the male entered the business he turned towards the bar area and fired on round. He then heard another round go off. █████ stated he turned towards the direction of lane 1 and started telling everyone to exit the building. █████ exited the emergency exit that lead to the rear of the building. Once outside he ran towards the wood line on the opposite side of Mollison Way. He stated he remained there until he saw a larger group gathered with law enforcement officers.

█████ stated after realizing the gun was real he thought it was an AR .223 or .556 round. █████ described the shooter as being a white male with a scruffy beard and brown hair. He was wearing a brownish shirt and black cargo pants.

█████ advised he did not recognize the male.

I asked █████ if he knew of any problems at the business that may help us understand why this location was targeted and he did not know. █████ stated there were no known problems. Note: while speaking to █████ I asked if he could draw out the bowling alley and his route out of the building (see drawing in files for further).

█████ had no further information to provide and he was walked back to the gymnasium.

After realizing my recorder memory was full, I deleted old recordings and activated my recording.

I then met with a male verbally identified as █████.

█████ advised he arrived at Just-In-Time Recreation in his █████. He advised he arrived alone around 1800 hours. He was assigned █████ and was matched up with █████ and four other people 3 males and 1 female.

█████ advised he was standing at the ball rack when he saw his friend █████ walk by. He and █████ engaged in a brief conversation when he heard a pop. █████ advised he did not think much of the first pop, but once he heard the second pop he turned. He then saw a white male with dark hair, dark clothing and a dark beard holding an AR rifle. █████ saw what he described as a green laser coming from the AR.

█████ stated he moved towards the front counter where he ducked down. He stated he did not stay there long and when he stood up he saw the shooter trying to clear a malfunction on his weapon. █████ advised he is familiar with rifles and he described the male racking the rifle as if he was trying to clear a round out of the chamber. He stated as the suspect was trying to get his weapon back into working order, he saw two males running from the area of █████ towards the suspect. As the two males got closer to the suspect, the suspects' weapon was back operational and he turned quickly shooting the two males at a close range. █████ estimated he heard a total of 5-6 rounds.

█████ stated he then ran towards lane 1, exiting the emergency door to the rear of the parking lot. Once outside he and several others ran towards the storage facility where there is a chain link fence. The group made their way around the fence and were escorted into Marcos Restaurant by staff. He remained in the restaurant until the group exited and joined others in the parking lot.

█████ advised he did not know who the suspect was and had no reason why this establishment would have been targets. █████ also completed a drawing of the bowling alley, see drawing for further.

I asked █████ if there was any other information I needed to be aware of and he stated when eh was running towards the storage unit he saw an early 2000's model black pick up truck in the storage lot. He described the truck as facing towards the bowling alley. █████ advised as he moved closer to the fence he saw the truck slowly back up and then slowly pull out of the storage unit. Nickolas advised the truck could not have accessed the bowling alley parking lot from its location, but thought it was strange with how slow the truck was moving.

[REDACTED] had no other information to provide. My interview with [REDACTED] lasted around 29 minutes. I escorted [REDACTED] back to the gymnasium where I was advised all witnesses had been interviewed.

I was requested to provide a list of the subjects I interviewed and provide it to Lt. Paul Thorpe CCSO.

I responded back to the Lewiston Police Department and was later cleared from my duties around 0130 hours.

On October 26, 2023, I assisted LT. Thorpe and Sergeant Ferriter with completing an excel spreadsheet containing all the names, dob, addresses, location of incident and who interviewed them.

On October 25, 2023, around 2000 hours, I was notified by Detective Sgt. Pat Ferriter of a mass shooting in Lewiston and that the Lewiston Police Department was requesting assistance for manpower and for investigatory tasks surrounding interviewing and debriefing witnesses.

I went directly to the Lewiston Police Department for a briefing, and then was assigned to go to the Recreational Center at 65 Central St., where witnesses were waiting to be interviewed. I interviewed four people and recorded the interviews. The following is a synopsis.

I first interviewed a man named [REDACTED]. He had been playing cornhole at Schemenegees Bar and Grill. He played regularly there at least once a week in a cornhole league. [REDACTED] had been playing with him. He said he got to Schemenegees around 1830 hours. He [REDACTED] had just started to play and around 1930 hours he heard a bang. He said that everyone was silent after that first bang, and said "you could hear a pin drop." He saw the [REDACTED] stood up. Following that first shot, however, he then heard more and people started dropping and screaming. [REDACTED] immediately started to run out of the building, heading toward the exit through the arcade room. He saw the shooter and described him as being a male with a beard, brown hair and a "heavy weapon."

[REDACTED] said that as soon as he exited, his first thought was [REDACTED] he turned around and saw [REDACTED]. He said that he then ran to a small grassy, wooded area near the side of the building, where he had a vantage point of the parking lot. He said he noticed a [REDACTED] in the parking lot "parked weird" but did not know if it was the shooter's or not. He instructed [REDACTED] and continue running away. He said he felt the need to see the shooter leave. He said he figured he was in a safe place that the shooter could not see him.

[REDACTED] described seeing the shooter exit the building the same way he had; from the arcade room. At the exit steps there was a deaf man with whom he had played cornhole before in the past. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] said he did not see the shooter get into a car. He did not see a Subaru like he knew other people had been talking about. He thought the shooter must have left only on foot. Once the shooter left, [REDACTED] went back into the building. He said that was a terrible mistake because of the gore and wounded people he saw. He said he did not know why he went back in. His mind was focused on his cell phone and belongings inside. He said he felt selfish, in retrospect.

[REDACTED] described that after seeing photos of the shooter that had been circulating amongst the witnesses, he said he recognized him from being a fellow



cornhole player in the league he had played in last year at Schemengees. He said that they had played together every week last year. He described him as being shy, and "in his own little world," but not in a bad or awkward way. He said they would have a beer now and then after their games but would only make small talk about the game they played. He said he did not get any "bad vibes" from him. [REDACTED] said he believed he had [REDACTED] but did not know any further details.

After speaking to [REDACTED] I interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was playing cornhole at Schemengees. He heard one shot that he recognized to be a gun shot. Shortly after, he heard more shots and then screaming. From where he was positioned near the cornhole tables, there was a small half-wall that he dove over to try to get cover. Someone, he said, turned the lights off. He said there was a man next to him that got shot. He said the [REDACTED]. He said he saw muzzle flashes in the dark of the room and just laid down, hiding. He said [REDACTED] was in the other portion of the establishment. He never got a good look at the shooter and did not know anything about the weapon he was carrying. He said he believed, however, that he must have shot two, 30-round clips.

I then interviewed [REDACTED]. She had been watching [REDACTED] play cornhole at Schemengees. She had been at a table near the bar and heard 2-3 loud bangs. She said, "I'll never forget it." She described ducking under the table and taking a chair and covering her head with it. From there, she saw that [REDACTED]. She heard someone say "shut off the lights." Beside her, [REDACTED]. She saw he [REDACTED]. She described the sounds as being like a firing range. She said the shooter was wearing a brown jacket or hoodie and had brown "messed up" hair and beard with a long rifle. She did not recognize him and did not know who he was. She was unable to estimate the passage of time.

Lastly, I interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] like the others, had been playing cornhole at Schemengees. He said he heard one bang and at first, he thought it was a loud firecracker. He wondered if someone was playing some kind of joke. Then immediately after, he heard two more sets of two-to-three shots in rapid succession. He said everyone around him got down for cover. He described how his first instinct was to run in the opposite direction of the way people were fleeing to try to draw fire from the shooter so that others would not be targeted. He described running toward the pool tables and making eye contact with the shooter, who had his rifled aimed at him. [REDACTED] said he knew he was going to be shot. The shooter pulled the trigger, but was out of ammunition and had to reload. He believed he saw the shooter grab another magazine from his sweatshirt pocket. [REDACTED] used this reload time to duck for cover behind one of the pool tables. He described the weapon the shooter was using as being an older AR-style rifle, similar to the ones used by the US military during Operation Desert Storm.

[REDACTED] said he exited the building and saw the shooter get into a white, 4-door sedan with a hatchback. It had been parked right up to the entrance of the building. He said he did not know the make or model of it. As the shooter drove off, he saw two more white sedans pull up toward the exit of the parking lot. At first, he thought they were police, but realized they were not. He said the lead car pulled up slightly and the second car backed up to let the shooter's vehicle out. All three vehicles then sped off quickly together. He heard them slow down (could not see where they were heading), then speed back up again toward Lisbon St. He saw that at the corner of the intersection where the

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cars were, [REDACTED] He described her as having [REDACTED] He said she would have likely seen the direction of travel of the shooter's vehicle and the others that were also possibly involved.

[REDACTED] described the shooter as having a beard and mustache and what he thought was curly or wavy hair. He said that he operated smoothly, walked in a circle while shooting people, and essentially used what he recognized to be military tactics. He estimated that the shooting lasted for about 45 seconds to a minute.

[REDACTED] said he recognized, after-the-fact, the shooter to have been a regular cornhole player at Schmenegees. He said he believed [REDACTED] Sometimes, the shooter would play cornhole with his [REDACTED] He described the shooter as being very quiet; he would just watch and observe everyone else. He said he did not even know if he ever saw the shooter drink. He pointed out how he [REDACTED] would usually be the only one with beers on the table if he ever was at the same cornhole table as the shooter. He said that when he had seen him playing cornhole, he had been clean-cut to military regulations. He said he had learned from the shooter that he was in the military, after sharing with him that he himself had served in the Navy. The shooter never elaborated on the military, nor did he make any other comments.

I had no further involvement in the case that night.

On 10.25.23 at approximately 2010 hours I responded to Lewiston Police Department to assist with a mass shooting incident. Upon arrival I was briefed on the following information. Law enforcement were actively investigating two crime scenes where the shootings occurred. Multiple casualties and injuries were reported. The person of interest had been identified as Robert Card [REDACTED]. Card's whereabouts were unknown.

I was instructed to respond to 65 Central St Lewiston in order to assist with interviewing multiple witnesses from both shooting locations. Upon arrival Detective Sgt. Ferriter (CCSO) confirmed there were approximately 70-80 witnesses who needed to be interviewed and debriefed.

I interviewed the following subjects. The interviews were audio recorded and have been added to the case files within this report. This report summarizes the information obtained during each interview. Please refer to the audio recordings for full disclosure.

## Interview #1 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] arrived alone at the Just-In-Time bowling alley at approximately 1700 hours. He was driving his [REDACTED]. He arrived at the bowling alley at approximately 1557 hours to meet with friends for their bowling league. While they were bowling he heard a loud noise which directed his attention to the area near the front entrance. He described the noise as sounding as though someone had dropped something. Everyone near him turned and looked in the direction of the noise. He observed a guy with a gun "jammed up into his shoulder". The man started shooting at his "targets." The shooter was wearing all dark clothing. The gun was black. [REDACTED] could not tell whether the shooter was black or white at that time but knew he had dark hair. He further described the shooter holding the gun with two hands. [REDACTED] heard at least two gunshots. [REDACTED] were approximately 25 yards away from the shooter as he began shooting. [REDACTED] did not observe anyone being shot by the shooter. He estimated 35 people inside the bowling alley at the time of the incident. As soon as he realized the suspect was shooting inside the alley, he ran for an exit and remained outside until law enforcement arrived. [REDACTED] had a cell phone on him when they reunited. [REDACTED] confirmed he was able to contact family and advise them of his location and status. I asked [REDACTED] what he had heard since the shooting occurred. [REDACTED] had heard 22 people were dead and there had been four shooting locations.

## Interview #2 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] arrived at the Just-In-Time bowling alley alone at approximately 1800

hours. He was driving [REDACTED]. He met his friends for their bowling league. [REDACTED] heard what he described as the "first pop" and he stood up. People began running away from the location where he heard the noise. He estimated 50-60 people inside the bowling alley at the time of the incident. He ducked down and hid behind chairs in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] recalls making sure he was behind metal chairs. He then heard approximately 6-8 more gunshots. He estimated being approximately 60 feet from the shooter as the incident unfolded. He described the shooter as a white male with black hair. The shooter was holding a black AR-15 style rifle with a scope on it. He described the scope having something green on the front of it. He did not observe where the shooter came into the bowling alley from. He estimated the incident lasting approximately 3-5 minutes. After the shooter left building, he observed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] began walking toward the front entrance of the building. He observed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

## Interview #3 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] arrived at the Just-In-Time bowling alley alone at approximately 1800 hours. He arrived in [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] They began bowling around 1830 hours and the incident occurred at approximately 1900 hours. He heard the first "round" and headed for the direction of the noise. He described typically carrying his firearm but was not on this particular date and time. He took approximately four steps away from their table and heard 4-5 more "rounds." He saw people kneeling down and some were running. He did not observe the shooter. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] After a short period time he heard people yelling for help inside. [REDACTED] described himself as a retired [REDACTED]. He entered the building and began assessing the wounded. He described [REDACTED] Someone was [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He described [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] As he passed through lanes 12-13 he saw [REDACTED] exit the kitchen area and lock the front door. He described observing [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and believed she was stable. He moved toward the front door where he observed [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He further described [REDACTED] He described [REDACTED] There was another [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] It appeared the victim [REDACTED] also took [REDACTED] This particular victim [REDACTED]

Law enforcement began to arrive and [REDACTED] was begging them for first aid supplies in order to help more victims. Law enforcement searched and cleared the building for the shooter. As rescue personnel arrived, [REDACTED] helped carry [REDACTED] male enter the bowling alley with an AR-15. [REDACTED] estimated there was 45 seconds between the first "round" and the other "rounds" to follow.

Interview #4 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He arrived at the bowling alley alone [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] He was [REDACTED] at the alley when the shooting occurred. There was one group [REDACTED] in the far right lanes and another in the far left lanes. At approximately 1900 hours, he heard a "loud bang." He then recalled he was on his cell phone talking [REDACTED] when the first gunshot occurred. He checked his cell phone and confirmed that the time was 1851 hours. He had never heard a noise like that inside a bowling alley. He has been in bowling alleys for most of his life and knew right away something wasn't right. He went toward the noise and looked around the corner. He observed the "gunman fumbling with an AR-15." It appeared the gun was jammed and the shooter "kept racking the gun." He immediately [REDACTED] and exited the building. He remained at the door and expected to see the shooter again. He called to a friend, [REDACTED] who had been in the area of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] answered and said he was ok. [REDACTED] went back inside where he observed approximately 10-12 bodies on the floor. He was able to identify [REDACTED] He described [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] estimated approximately seven gunshots and the incident lasting approximately 3-4 minutes. He was unable to confirm what race the shooter was but was quite confident it was a male from the "body type." He recalled the shooter wearing black from the neck down. He described the black AR-15 as long with an "M-lock for end and sling." He also advised the shooter dropped a magazine when attempting to fix the gun malfunction.

On 10.26.23 Detective Sgt. Ferriter requested I respond to [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] Lewiston Police Department CID learned [REDACTED] was present at Schemengees at the time of the shooting. Detective Schaffer was also present for the interview. The interview was audio recorded and has been added to the case files within this report. The following is a summary of the information provided by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] arrived at Schemengees just prior to 1900 hours. She alone and parked [REDACTED] She recalls parking behind [REDACTED] but could not recall what the make and model was. She met her [REDACTED] for dinner and drinks. They were seated near the pool tables in close proximity to the front door entrance. Shortly after arriving, at approximately 1905 hours, a male entered the front door and began shooting a gun into the ceiling of the establishment. [REDACTED] described the shooter firing the gun three times into the ceiling before reloading and beginning to fire in the direction [REDACTED] [REDACTED] described the shooter possibly wearing a black hat with blond hair down to his chin. She described the gun as one similar to a shotgun and not what she had seen the shooter holding in the media releases. She was adamant it was not the same gun seen in the media releases. She described the shooter shooting and then manipulating the gun to shoot again and again. She demonstrated the act very similarly to the way one would fire a pump action shotgun. The shooter did not say anything and he was "straight to the point." He entered and began shooting. [REDACTED] got to the ground as soon as the shooting started. She began crawling toward a side exit. She recalls entering a dark room and seeing [REDACTED] She [REDACTED] She described a heavy [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED]. She recalled the male was smiling and found this to be very strange considering the situation. She located [REDACTED] and drove away fearing the shooter was following them outside. She did not know where [REDACTED] once they made it outside. She noticed the [REDACTED] she originally parked behind was no longer there. She remembered this because she was able to drive straight ahead when she fled the area. She called 911 at 1908 according to her cell phone and reported the incident. She did not know or recognize the shooter. [REDACTED]

On above date I responded to the Lewiston Police Department at the request of Sgt. Ferriter. I was advised that I was to report there to stage and would be given orders once our Criminal Investigation Team arrives on scene as a group. A short time later I was directed to report to 65 Central Avenue in Lewiston and once there I would be one of a team of investigators assigned to interview the incoming witnesses and victims of the incident.

I was placed in a quiet section in the building and was assigned a total of five (5) people to interview. All of my interviews were recorded on my digital pocket recorder and those interviews were later added to the "files" section of this Spillman case record.

I began my interviews starting with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that she arrived at Schemengees Bar and Grill at approximately 6:06:15 and was [REDACTED]. She stated they sat and ate some food and had a drink and had been there about an hour when the shooting started. She said she was sitting at the back of the bar at a table when she heard one (1) shot, looked up and over towards the bar but did not see anything or anyone alarming but heard a second shot so she got up and ran out the back door and into the parking lot. She said other people followed her running out of the bar. Once outside she stated she called 911 and then waited in the parking lot. [REDACTED] said a moment later [REDACTED] came out so she started running into the back field behind the bar while [REDACTED] stayed behind in the parking lot hiding behind some cars. Once in the field [REDACTED] stated she was with others and noted [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] appeared in the field with her carrying her purse and told her that the shooter had left the scene. [REDACTED] stated she never did see the shooter and only heard the shots and saw the injured. She was not able to provide a description of the shooter nor any vehicles he may have been driving. I obtained a written statement from [REDACTED] which was turned over to Lt. Thorpe.

I then interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he arrived at Schemengees at around 5:20/5:30 and was by himself. He was there to play Corn Hole and does so every Wednesday night at 6:30 pm. [REDACTED] said he was on Court 6 with [REDACTED] when he heard a loud bang followed by another and then a large amount of what he later determined to be gunfire. He said the gunshots were too many to count. At that time he said he and many others around him dove to the ground behind a ft wall while the gunshots continued and sounded like they were getting closer. When the gunfire stopped [REDACTED] looked up over the wall he was hiding behind but his view of the shooter was partially blocked and he could only see a portion of the shooter's face. He said he appeared to have brown hair. [REDACTED] said he thinks the shooting stopped because the shooter was reloading and he heard what he thought was a magazine being removed and reinserted into the

firearm so he left his location and ran towards the restrooms where he did. While there he stated the lights went out and he was in darkness but could still hear some shots being fired. A short time later he heard someone holler that the shooter had left so he began to make his way out and while leaving he encountered [REDACTED] on the ground [REDACTED]. He stated [REDACTED] said he [REDACTED] to comfort him and [REDACTED] said a short time later a police officer arrived and advised [REDACTED] was not able to provide much/if any description of the shooter and was not aware of any vehicle the shooter was driving or how he left the scene. [REDACTED] also completed a written statement that was provided to Lt. Thorpe.

Next I interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] arrived there to meet [REDACTED] to eat and play some corn hole together. [REDACTED] said he heard a gunshot and didn't initially know what it was but then saw the shooter fire another round before he then hid behind a halfway in the middle of the corn hole area. He said he laid there and "played dead" out of fear but peaked up and saw the shooter fire a few rounds towards where the arcade was located and during that time he saw the shooter either drop the magazine out of the rifle or he might have put the magazine into a pocket. He said he saw the shooter load another magazine and at that point [REDACTED] and thought he might have been looking for him. Just after [REDACTED] the lights to the building went out and the place was in total darkness so [REDACTED] to where he last saw [REDACTED] and once he met [REDACTED] way out of the building. [REDACTED] described described the shooter as about 6 foot tall, skinny with scruffy facial hair. He thought the shooter was wearing a black hat, sweat shirt and black pants. [REDACTED] believes the shooter was carrying an AR15 style rifle and used at least one (1) magazine and possibly shot a few more rounds from a second magazine. [REDACTED] was given a statement form to complete which he later turned over to Lt. Thorpe.

I then interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he heard the first shot and did not know what it was until after a second shot was fired and people started running and ducking so he ran to a storage unit nearby to hide. He then realized he did not know where [REDACTED] as he was not with him so he peaked out and saw [REDACTED] hiding behind a half wall in the corn hole area. [REDACTED] said that he called 911 and while in the storage room he noted an electrical panel on the wall so he pulled the circuit breaker to cut the lights to the building and once the lights went out, [REDACTED] ran to his location and the [REDACTED] escorted them out of the building. [REDACTED] said he never saw the shooter but heard around 30 shots being fired inside the building. [REDACTED] also completed a written statement which was handed over to Lt. Thorpe once completed.

Lastly, I interview [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he was outside at the time of the incident smoking and on his cell phone when he heard someone walking up the stairs headed into the building. He looked up and saw a white male wearing a dark hooded sweat shirt with the hood up, black pants and a possible weapon in his right hand as he was entering the building. [REDACTED] said he started up the ramp following the shooter who was now inside when he heard the shooting start so he stopped from entering the building himself. [REDACTED] said he saw numerous people running out the rear door of the building so he ran to the far side of the parking lot, hid behind a dumpster and called 911. [REDACTED] said after several minutes he no longer heard gunfire and the screams from inside the building stopped/it got quiet so he peaked out from behind the dumpster and saw [REDACTED]



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[REDACTED] by the steps to the building so he ran over to assist and

[REDACTED] said he observed what appeared to be [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] also completed a written statement which was ultimately turned over to Lt. Thorpe.

I received a text message from Detective Sergeant Patrick Ferriter informing me that the State Police and Lewiston Police Department have requested our assistance with an active shooter event in their city. I responded to Lewiston Police Department along with my entire Criminal Investigation Division.

I arrived on scene and met with Sgt. Ferriter and Captain Brian Ackerman. I received a briefing by Sgt. Ferriter and Captain Ackerman. Cpt. Ackerman assigned me to take my unit to the Lewiston Armory to meet with witnesses of the event.

When we arrived at the Armory Lewiston Police units, who were setting up security of the area met us.

A short time later, a bus arrived with Survivors/ Witnesses of the incident. The people were escorted into the armory and separated by Incident locations.

I assisted in coordinating the interviews. I made a list of all those present and who conducted interviews of whom. Cumberland County CID units assisted by FBI, ATF and Lewiston P.D. investigators interviewed 76 individuals.

Upon completion of the interviews individuals were bused to Auburn Middle school as a make shift reunification site.

We were released at approximately 0130 hours.

This investigation continues.

On 10-25-2023 at approximately 2010 hours I was briefed by Detective Sgt. Patrick Ferriter of an Active Shooter in the city of Lewiston. I was advised there were two shooting locations, Schemengees Bar and Grill and Just-In-Time-Recreation. I was advised to get the Crime Scene van and respond to staging at Lewiston Police Department.

I arrived at the staging location at Lewiston Police Department and was immediately requested to respond to 65 Central Ave in Lewiston, The Lewiston Recreational Center / Armory. I arrived at that locations and was advised people who witnessed the events at Just-In-Time-Recreation and Schemengees Bar and Grill were inside and needed to be interviewed.

A Lewiston Police representative assigned me to a room across the hall from the basketball courts where the witnesses were located. I was asked to pick a table of witnesses and begin interviews. All interviews were recorded and placed in the files section of the call.

I met with [REDACTED] who was visibly upset, crying and shaking. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated she was at Just-In-Time-Recreation and was bowling with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated they arrived at the Bowling Alley around 1730 hours. [REDACTED] stated they were bowling in the lanes to the right of the front door.

[REDACTED] stated they were bowling their last game (3rd Game) . [REDACTED] stated she did not recall who was up. [REDACTED] stated she heard a "loud pop" and everyone looked up. [REDACTED] stated she saw a male with gun with a green light on the end. [REDACTED] stated she thought it was fake but he kept shooting. [REDACTED] ran at him to try to take him down [REDACTED] stated she hid under that table as [REDACTED] stated she saw the male leave and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] laying on his back and [REDACTED] was lying next to him. [REDACTED] stated they went out the back. [REDACTED] stated she saw [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] bowling next to them [REDACTED] stated she does not recall what the male looked like but felt like she remembered he was wearing something black. [REDACTED] described the firearm the male was carrying as "long" and she felt like it had a strap on it. [REDACTED] stated it had a green light at the end. [REDACTED] stated she heard more than 10 shots from the male. [REDACTED] stated she could see "smoke" coming out of the gun.

[REDACTED] stated the male fired his first shot from right inside the door. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated the male then started shooting more people further down on the right side of the building. [REDACTED] stated she was not how far down he went because she was under the table but she did see him walk past and leave. [REDACTED] stated the male did not say anything as he was shooting.

[REDACTED] provided me with [REDACTED] in case we could not reach her [REDACTED] stated at the time of the shoot she was not aware of anyone near her taking photos, video or using social media.

I then interview [REDACTED] stated she is the owner of Just-In-Time-Recreation. [REDACTED] stated she was in the kitchen when she heard a "pop". [REDACTED] stated she opened the kitchen door and saw a guy with a "rifle" like an "AR". [REDACTED] stated the male looked through it and started shooting. [REDACTED] stated she turned around and told [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated she turned back around and began peeking through the kitchen doors. [REDACTED] stated the male looked at her, and walked out the doors.

[REDACTED] stated the male entered through the front door and stop him. [REDACTED] stated the male went right down towards [REDACTED] about 20 yards and came back toward the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated the male's firearm may have gotten jammed because he dropped a "clip".

[REDACTED] stated the male did not say anything and described him as being "calm, calm as can be". [REDACTED] stated he started shooting as soon as he came in.

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] him and he shot them.

[REDACTED] stated the male was a white male in his 40's, medium build with a scruffy beard that had some gray. The male was wearing a brown sweatshirt and black pants. [REDACTED] stated the firearm was "military grade". [REDACTED] stated he had extra "clip". [REDACTED] stated she thinks he had a backpack with extra stuff but she was not certain.

[REDACTED] stated after the male left the establishment she told someone to call 911 as she went to the front door and locked it. [REDACTED] stated she went around the building to try to see if she could help anyone but "they were all dead".

[REDACTED] stated she did not recognize the male shooting from any pervious encounters.

I then spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he arrived at Justin-In-Time-Recreation at around 1745 hours. [REDACTED] stated he was bowling with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated they were bowling in lanes [REDACTED] entrance closer to the front desk.

[REDACTED] and was facing the pins when he heard a loud sound like a balloon popping. [REDACTED] stated he turned around and everyone was looking at each other. [REDACTED] stated soon after he heard a second sound. [REDACTED] stated he looked to his left and saw a male with his back to him and what looked like the butt end of a rifle.

[REDACTED] stated it clicked what the sounds were [REDACTED] the exit that was located further down on the lanes. [REDACTED] stated he could not tell me what the male was wearing or what he looked like but he is certain he saw the butt end of a rifle.

█████ stated he is not certain how many shots her heard beside the two. █████ stated when he saw the butt end of the rifle it looked like the rifle was pointed down as if the male shooting was trying to "clear" it. █████ stated the shots were not as quick as he would have expected for an Assault Rifle. █████ stated he does not know if the shooter's weapon malfunctioned since when he saw the male from behind the firearm was pointed down.

█████ stated they exited the building and people were scattering all different ways. █████ stated █████ stated he did not see anything suspicious once outside the building or anything that stuck out.

█████ was not able to provide me with any contact information as his phone was still at the Bowling Alley. █████

I then spoke with █████ █████ stated █████ stated the doorway. █████ stated she heard a noise that sounded like a balloon popping and she ignored it. █████ stated she heard it out of her left ear off to the side. █████ stated she heard another one and stood up. █████ she █████ stated she saw a male with a firearm that had a blue light on the end of it. █████ she was unsure if it was a flashlight or a laser. █████ described the firearm as an automatic rifle "AR-15 style". █████ stated the shots were not fired back to back. █████ stated the male was about 30 feet from them and she heard clearly three shots. █████ stated the shots were about 30 seconds apart.

█████ stated the male was facing with his gun facing toward where █████ █████ stated she ran █████ towards a fire escape exit. █████

█████ stated they got to a Medical Office and saw █████ and pounded on the window however he would not open the door. █████ stated the █████ did █████

█████ stated they went to Subway and used one of the employee's cell phone to call █████ to let her know they were ok. █████ told her they were not going to stay inside a building and be locked down so they left.

█████ stated they went outside and waited until they saw fire trucks, Police and a crowd of people they recognized before walking over to them. █████ stated she did not see anything suspicious while outside the buildings when trying to get help.

█████ provided me contact information to call if we could not get a hold of her and her social media accounts. █████

I then spoke with █████ █████ stated she arrived at Just-in-Time-Recreation at around 1815 hours. █████

█████ stated she heard a loud noise like someone had dropped a ball. █████ stated people began running towards her and the exit. █████ stated she went to the exit and left the building. █████ stated she did not see the person shooting.

█████ stated she left the building and went to the right were she located a chain linked fence but she could not get up it so she followed down towards the main road. █████ stated she could hear siren and began backing up towards

the trees to hide and fell into a ditch. [REDACTED] stated she could not see anything else from the ditch and could not get out of it.

[REDACTED] stated she had [REDACTED] who had arrived on scene and knew a Police Officer that was on scene. [REDACTED] stated they were able to receive her location and the Police Officer went to where she was and assisted her in getting out of the ditch.

[REDACTED] provided me with contact information for who we could call if we needed to talk with her and could not get in touch as well as her social media accounts.

I then interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he arrived at Just-In-Time-Recreation at 1810 hours. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated he was paying attention to monitors and the game. [REDACTED] stated he was standing next to the ball return when he heard what sounded like a ball being thrown to early and hitting the pin guard or the reset machines. [REDACTED] stated about 2 or 3 seconds later he heard another shot and people screaming "that's a gun". [REDACTED] stated he ran for the nearest exit and recalls hearing approximately 3 shots. [REDACTED] stated he never saw the male shooting.

[REDACTED] stated he ran out the Fire Exit. [REDACTED] stated he ran towards a fence out back and slid under the fence. [REDACTED] stated he came upon a chain linked fence and found an opening. [REDACTED] stated he met a group of people and they made their way to Marco's. [REDACTED] stated he told [REDACTED] about what had happened and waited there until Police arrived. [REDACTED] stated while he was outside running he did not observe anything suspicious.

I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he arrived at Just-In-Time-Recreation at around 1810 hours. [REDACTED] stated he was bowling in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he

was on the lanes during the fourth string and as he threw a ball he heard a crack and thought something broke.

[REDACTED] stated when he looked over he saw the male with the firearm. [REDACTED] stated the male was white and had a beard with dark green clothes. [REDACTED] stated he told [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] toward the fire exit. [REDACTED] stated he heard 4 to 5 shots as he was exiting the building.

[REDACTED] stated he ran and hid in the woods between the Bowling Alley and Marcos. [REDACTED] stated while he was hiding in the woods there was "something that was really weird". [REDACTED] stated a White Subaru Hatchback came from behind the Bowling Alley where everyone parks and drove out towards Main Street. [REDACTED] stated the speed of the vehicle was really weird and felt if you were getting shot at you would drive faster to leave.

[REDACTED] stated he remained in the woods until Police arrived.

[REDACTED] provided a sketch of the inside of the bowling Alley and where he saw the car coming from behind the building and its route as it exited (see files).

I concluded my interviews and met with Det. Sgt. Ferriter and Lt. Paul Thorpe and turned in a list of the witnesses mentioned above and their contact

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information.

I then stood by and was relieved shortly after. I had no other involvement in this case.

On 25 October 2023 at approximately 1940 hrs I began receiving numerous text messages about an active shooter in Lewiston. I was off duty and with a group of other law enforcement who also were getting similar information. I contacted a detective colleague at Lewiston PD and he informed me that they needed all hands on deck. I notified Captain Brian Ackerman of what I had learned and confirmed and that we had been requested to rally at Lewiston Police Department.

I responded directly [REDACTED] to Lewiston Police Department. From the time I got the first call to the time I arrived at the police department I had heard of a multiple casualty, multiple scene active shooter. I am familiar with the two scenes: Schemengees Bar and Just-in-Time Bowling and knew they were on opposite sides of the city of Lewiston. I was concerned that the incident may involve more than one shooter. I learned of possibly 20 plus fatalities and that an active situation was evolving at the Wal Mart Distribution center.

On arrival I went directly to a classroom on the second floor. There were several individuals in the room and I stood by waiting for an assignment. At some point, Captain Ackerman arrived. There was a briefing and CCSO CID was tasked with coordinating the interview/catalogue of several victims who were medically cleared and going to be staged at the Armory. I took our CID and responded to the Armory at 65 Central Ave, Lewiston.

On my arrival there, I recognized that there was a significant lack of site security. I deployed the units from our CID and 3 uniformed personnel from various agencies to establish a hard perimeter around the area before the bus arrived carrying the victims. I requested more uniformed personnel so that my detectives could be released to begin debriefing the victims. As soon as site security was established, the CID were released from their positions on the perimeter and we met inside the armory.

I was told there were approximately 70 people who needed to be identified, debriefed and reunified. We got people situated and as comfortable as possible. They were divided up by which crime scene location they had come from. I met with my CID staff and other detectives from LPD and eventually ATF, FBI, HSI and other local agencies. Before beginning the process of assigning to investigators I briefed the investigators on my expectations, that in addition to the basic and expected line of questioning they seek information regarding the following:

- Description of firearms or potential co-conspirators
- Which site the victim was at
- Whether their victim/witness was recording/on social media/ or video communicating during the incident.
- If their victim/witness knew of any other victims/witnesses who fled prior to first responders arriving.
- All basic contact information and 2 other alternate contacts in the event we could not reach the particular victim/witness.

I asked all investigators to check in with myself or Lt. Thorpe at the head table to obtain their next interviewee as opposed to self-assigning. Additionally I asked each subject to



check in at the head table to confirm they had been interviewed and by whom before they left the building.

I asked all investigators to turn over their biographical notes so I could check those against a master list of all person in the holding area; both to ensure victim accountability and to be sure each victim had been interviewed.

The group of investigators grew from 5-6 to 20-25 as the night progressed. I made sure all investigators got the same information and were recording their interviews.

Once the the victims had been checked out, they were boarded onto a city bus and taken to the reunification site. Some of them asked to walk to nearby homes and others had been in contact with family and had rides nearby.

Once the Armory appeared to be free of victims, I requested two uniformed LPD Officers along with Armory staff to ensure there was no one left in the building by clearing each room. Once this was complete, we secured and returned to the CP. We were debriefed there and directed to get home and get rest in the event of this becoming a pro-longed incident.

On Thursday 10/26 the entire CID met and briefed. I compiled a complete list of the subjects who were interviewed on the previous night.

At around noon time I received a call from Detective Wade, LPD asking if I could assign someone to go meet with [REDACTED] who was identified as a victim who had fled before first responders arrived. Detective Wade informed me that she had been in phone contact with [REDACTED] and she was willing and able to meet with detectives at her home. I assigned Detectives Schaeffer and Therriault.

**SYNOPSIS** (Active Shooter): On October 25, 2023, I, Operator Kipp Bleicken, responded to the Lewiston Police Department (designated staging area), in response to an active shooter(s) at large in the greater Lewiston area. I was ultimately assigned to a security detail at the Lewiston Police Department, 171 Park Street, Lewiston.

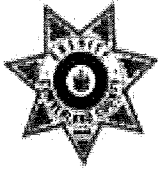
**DETAILS** (Operators narrative in chronological order):

1. 4. After a few minutes on-scene, TL Tufts advised our element to board [REDACTED] and that we would be returning to Lewiston High School for another assignment.



I was assigned this task in partnership with Southern Maine Response Team (SMRT) Operator Markellos. I remained in this post for the remainder of the call out holding security of the Police Department. Operator Markellos went with the rest of the SMRT

team shortly after we got to the perimeter. I was assigned other various ESU team members as partners.

6. At approximately 01:36 hours, I cleared from the Command Post, and cleared from this call out with nothing further to add.

Myself and other operators were assigned to providing external security to the Lewiston PD building. Specifically, I was assigned to secure the [REDACTED] building and began doing so at approximately 2100 hours.
2. Over the course of the next several hours we received additional updates regarding the incident to include a picture of the suspect, his name and the registration of a vehicle that he was possibly driving. Later into the evening / early morning, I learned via radio traffic that the suspect's car had been located on a boat launch in the Town of Lisbon, however it was unoccupied.
3. Myself and the other operators assigned to the security detail remained at our posts until approximately 0130 hours on the morning of 10/26. We were relieved by members of

Southern Maine Regional Swat. Shortly after being relieved, I left the scene ending my involvement in the incident that night / morning.



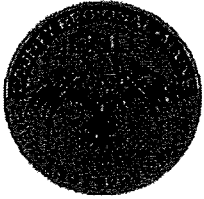


