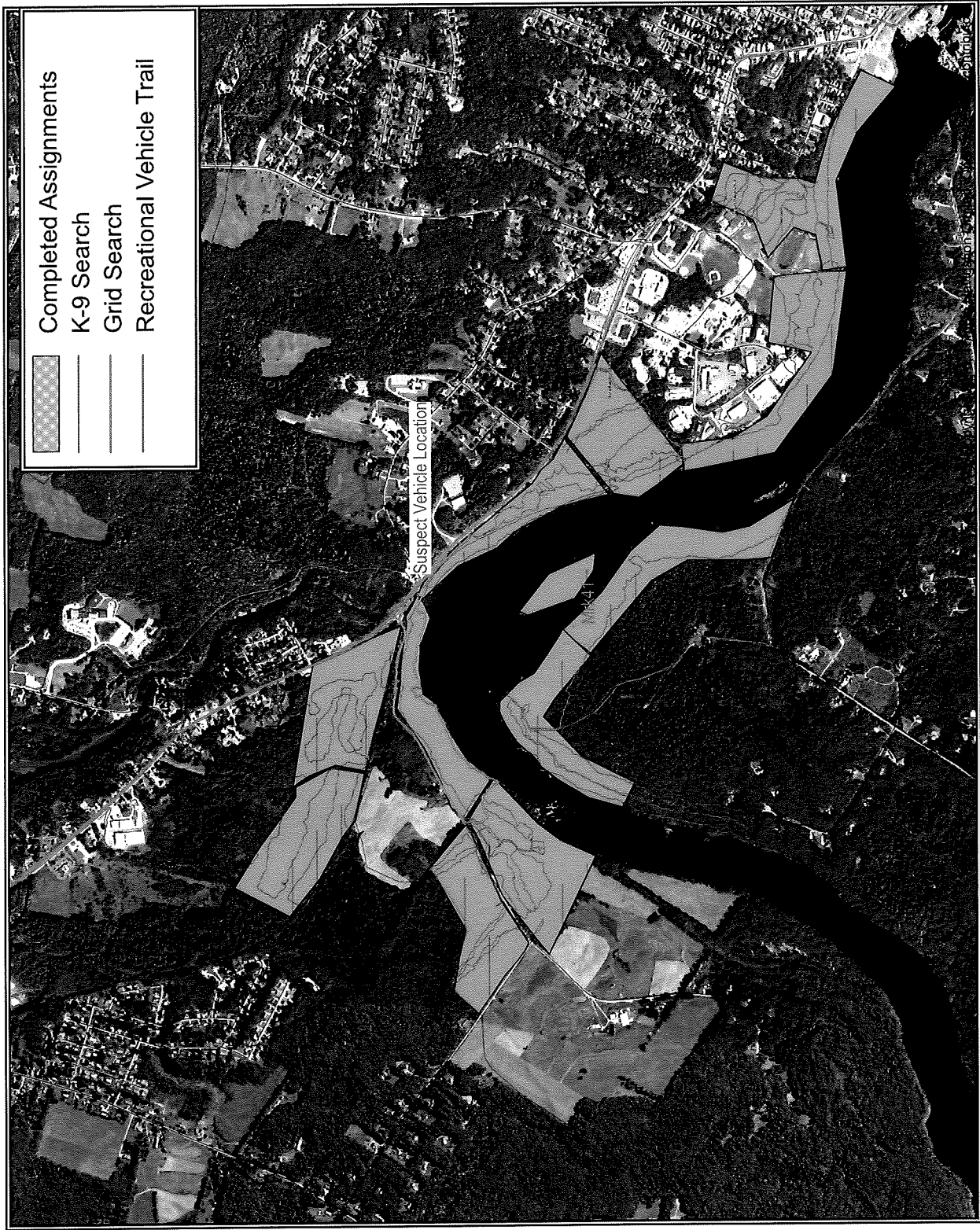
On 10/26/2023, I was asked to make death notifications for Thomas Conrad, William Young, and Aaron Young.

We then went to [REDACTED] to meet with William and Aaron Young's family. We arrived at the address and met with [REDACTED] outside. They were informed of William and Aaron's passing. [REDACTED] was inside the home, and did not come outside. We answered what questions we could and left soon after.

On 10/25/2023 at approximately 1900 hours, I, Game Warden Cody York, accompanied by Game Warden Harrison Wiegman was on fully uniformed patrol in the Turner area when we heard reports of an active shooter at Spare Time in Lewiston through Androscoggin County Dispatch. After hearing this, Wdn. Wiegman and I gathered our shotgun and rifle and responded with lights and siren.

While responding to Spare Time, we heard reports via dispatch of a second active shooter at Schemengees Bar & Grille. We then began responding to Schmengees. Upon arrival, I observed other officers on scene and several civilians standing around the parking lot, and street. I then ran up the roadway in the direction of Schmengees with my shotgun. While running, I observed more officers arrive on scene and several Officers rendering aid to injured victims. I was then stopped by a male individual who was screaming he was shot. I had then grabbed the male individual and told him to lay down on the lawn and show me where he was hit. The male had then pointed [REDACTED]. I had then [REDACTED].

Knowing there is a major artery that runs near the vicinity of the wound, I began to cut off his pantleg to apply a tourniquet, while doing so, I had a second male victim brought to me by a civilian. The civilian stated that he was deaf and had been injured. The civilian had then run off. I then grabbed the male and sat him down next to me and returned to working on the first victim. [REDACTED]. Another officer came over and began helping me. That officer stated that we would not need [REDACTED]. I assisted the first male victim with applying pressure as we got him in a cruiser and transported to the hospital.

I then began working on the second male individual. I noticed quickly that there was [REDACTED]. He then began pointing [REDACTED], indicating the location of the wound. I then laid him down on the grass and I observed him [REDACTED]. I then removed the [REDACTED], I observed the wound to be also plugged with fatty tissue and slightly bleeding. I used the shirt he had and tied it tightly [REDACTED] and placed him in another cruiser, and got him transported to the hospital.

After rendering aid to the two male victims, I returned my attention to the front of Schemengees to assist. I observed all the remaining victims to be already being helped, and those left unattended were deceased. I assisted officers with clearing the parking lot and vehicles for a potential suspect. While doing so, several other officers and EMS were responding. After sweeping the parking lot, a third call came in of an active shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center. I then returned to Wdn. Wiegman's cruiser and we drove lights and siren to the Distribution Center.

Upon arrival, we parked across the road from the building and cleared a small pull off spot behind some structures. During this time, several Law Enforcement Officers were already on scene clearing the center. We then returned to the entrance of the distribution center and remained on scene until command staff gave us the directive to return to Lewiston Police Department which was now the Command Post.

After arriving at Lewiston PD, command staff had Wdn. Mindy Rugg and I respond to St. Mary's Hospital for security. We remained at this post until 0400 hours on 10/26/2023.

On 10/26/2023 at 0700 hours, I returned to the Command Post, which was now Lewiston High School with Wdn. Wiegman. I was assigned to gather equipment as needed and dispatch it throughout the day. [REDACTED]

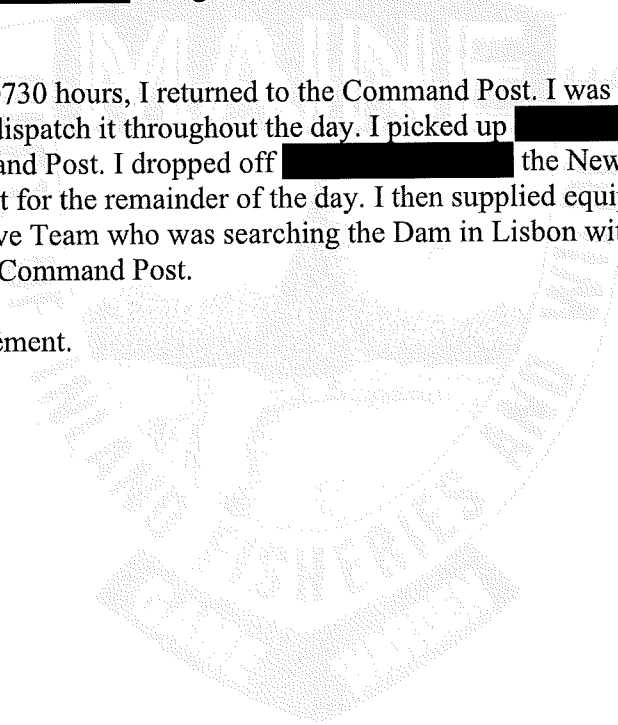
[REDACTED]. All gear was returned to the Command Post and staged there for the evening.

On 10/27/2023 at 0730 hours, I returned to the Command Post. I was assigned to gather equipment as needed and dispatch it throughout the day. I picked up [REDACTED] and staged it at the Command Post. I dropped off [REDACTED] the New Hampshire Tac Team at the boat launch who used it for the remainder of the day. I then supplied equipment and helped the Maine Warden Service Dive Team who was searching the Dam in Lisbon with an ROV. After clearing the Dam, I returned to the Command Post.

This concludes my involvement.

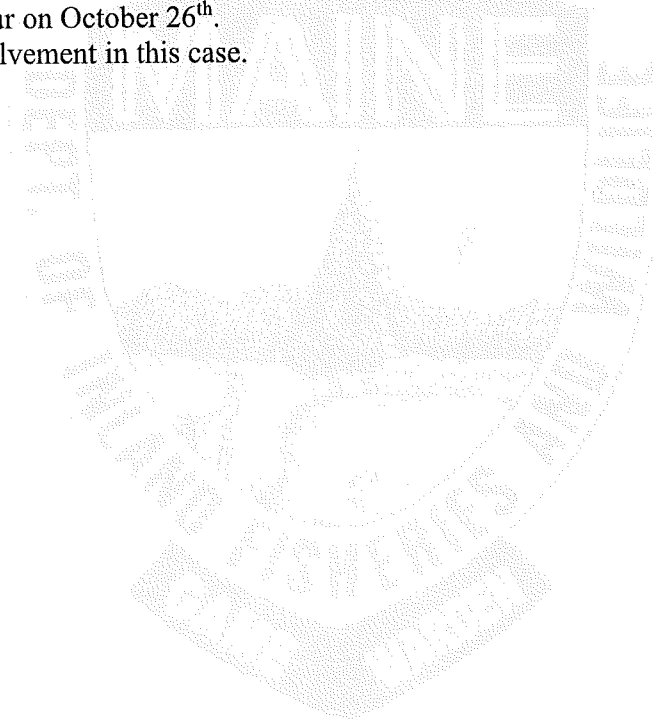

On the morning of 10/26/2023 I awoke at approximately 5:15 AM and began seeing reports of a “mass” shooting in the city of Lewiston and that the suspect was at large. I was contacted by Lt. Dan Menard and advised to respond to Lewiston High School to work within the Command Post.

I worked that entire day within the command post communicating with Lt. Matt Casavant within the State Police IMAT team and Detective Dave Coflesky with the Maine State Police Tactical Team. We deployed members of the Warden Service in areas in the towns of Lisbon, Bowdoin and Lewiston. We also eventually deployed several cellular game cameras in the town of Lisbon and Bowdoin.

On 10/27/2023 I once again returned to Lewiston High School. I worked within the Incident Command, communicating with the State Police IMAT team deploying both game wardens and local, state, county and federal law enforcement to begin further searching wooded areas in the area where the suspect’s vehicle was located.

I also deployed with and lead a search team on an assignment mid-day. I left the command post at approximately 6:30 PM that evening with plans to return the following day.

Later that evening I was advised by Lt. Jason Luce that the suspect had been located, deceased in Lisbon.

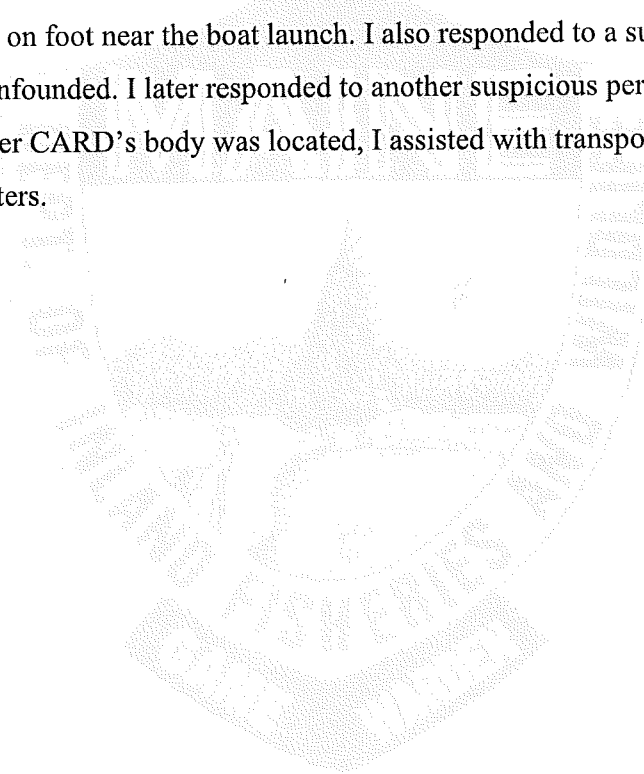

I later responded to another suspicious person call in Bowdoin that was also unfounded. After CARD's body was located, I assisted with transporting equipment back to the Gray IFW Headquarters.

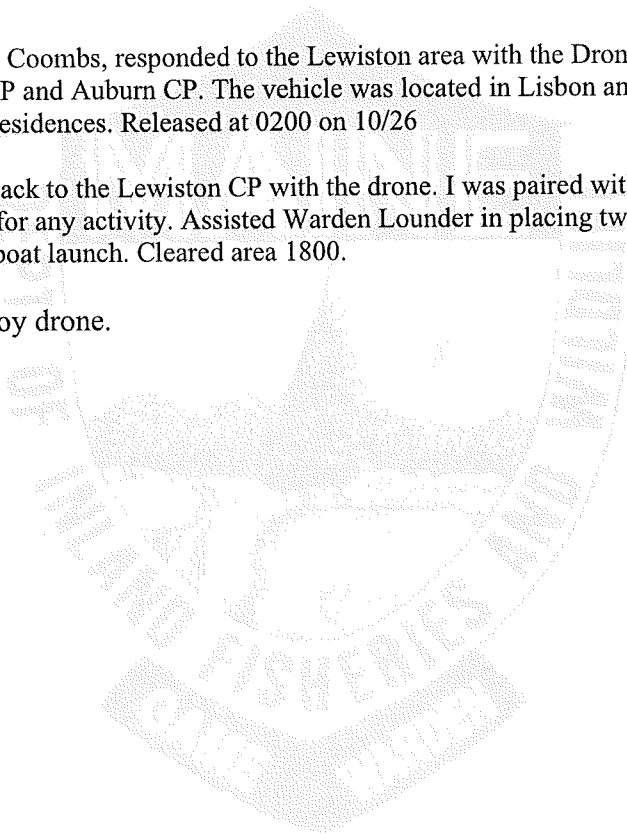

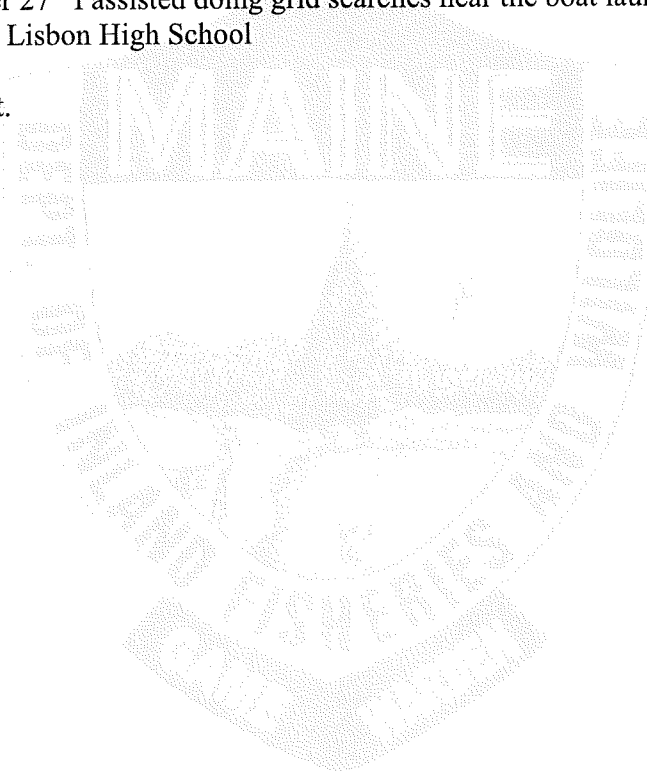

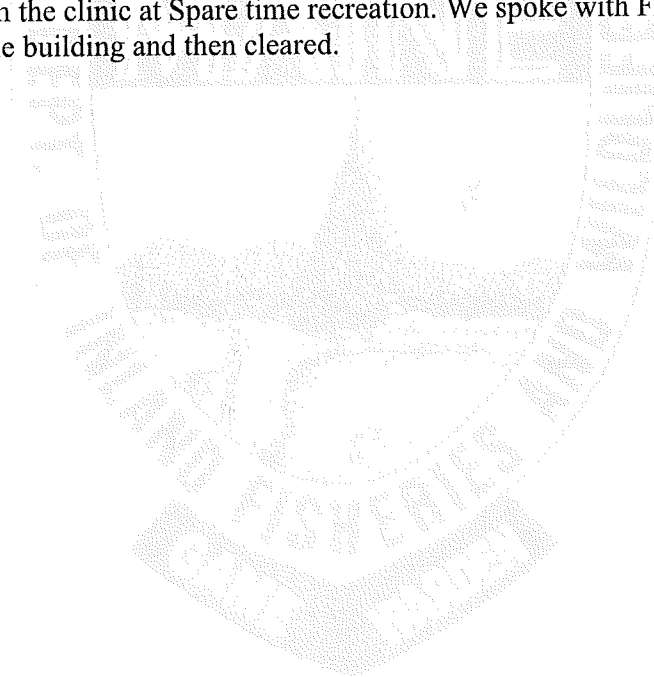

We led a team of Homeland Security Agents through a grid search along the Androscoggin River, near where the suspect left his vehicle. Nothing was found in this search. We later were assigned another block of woods to search but were unable to complete the assignment as our team of Homeland Security Agents left to run out leads their team heard about. Due to this, Corporal MacCabe and I were assigned by the state police to retrieve methadone from the clinic at Spare time recreation. We spoke with FBI agents in charge of the scene before entering the building and then cleared.

On 10/25/2023 at approximately 1930 hours, I, Game Warden Corporal Cody Lounder responded to Lewiston for a report of an active shooter.

As I was responding, a report came in of the active shooter being at the Lewiston Walmart Distribution Center. I responded to the Walmart Distribution Center and observed no activity. I cleared the Walmart Distribution Center and canvased the area. Once I cleared the area, I headed towards Lisbon Falls believing the shooter may have headed in that direction.

I sat in the parking lot across from Food City in Lisbon Falls for approximately 5 minutes when a report of the shooter possibly heading towards Mixers in Sabattus came in. I headed to Mixers and sat in a parking lot overlooking Mixers for a short period of time. A report came over the radio of the suspect vehicle being in Lisbon not far from my residence.

I responded to Mill Street in Lisbon and provided surveillance of the Lisbon walking trail with Warden Evan Franklin and Warden Tim Coombs until 0230 hours on Thursday morning.

On 10/26/2023 at approximately 0800 hours, I canvased the Lisbon neighborhood. At approximately 1130 hours Chaplain Kate Braestrup of the Warden Service asked me if I could assist in a death notification.

At approximately 1300 hours, I, along with interpreters and Chaplain Roger Labbe of the Maine State Police provided a death notification in Lisbon Falls to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was notified that [REDACTED] Joshua Seal was dead.

At approximately 1600 hours, Warden Coombs and I set up cellular game cameras on both ends of the walking trail in Lisbon/Lisbon Falls. We both cleared the area shortly after.

On 10/27/2023 I conducted two separate grid searches in areas along the Androscoggin River in Lisbon. I also kept in contact with the command center during the day. I cleared the area for a final time around 1600 hours.

On October 26th I Corporal Kris MacCabe was assigned to security detail at CMMC Hospital in Lewiston Maine at the Emergency entrance. I covered this area from 0830 to 2030 hours when I was relieved. We removed one reporter who had snuck in the ambulance entrance and he was trespassed by Lewiston PD.

On October 27th I was assigned to lead a search team along the shores of Androscoggin River near where the suspect Robert Card had left his vehicle. The team was made up of Warden Garrett Moody and several other law enforcement officers from Homeland Security. After clearing our search area, we went back to the command post to download GPS information and receive a second assignment. After receiving our second assignment several of the members from HSI were either reassigned by their staff or wanted to follow up on other leads that they had received and did not feel were being looked into.

Warden Moody and I then received an assignment from State Police to go to Sparetime Recreation and escort two individuals from the methadone clinic in and out of the building to retrieve the methadone that they would distribute to clients. They were moving the methadone to the Portland office for distribution to patients. We met with the two representatives and before entering the building met with two FBI agents who were working the scene. They cleared with their supervisors and the command post before we entered the building.

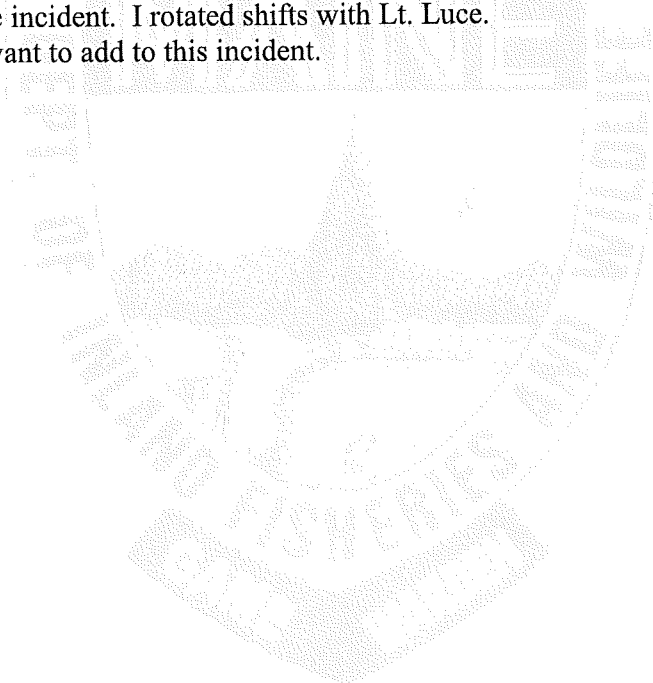

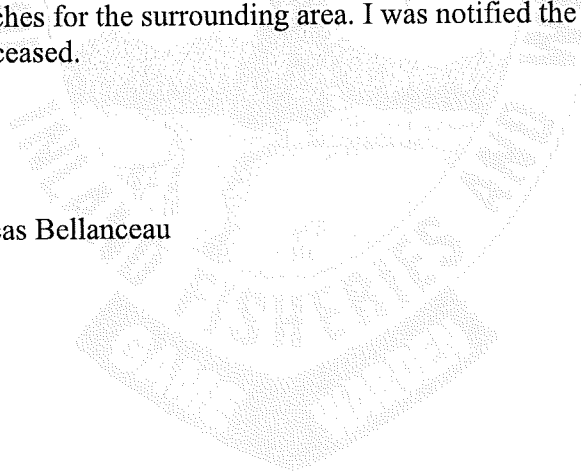

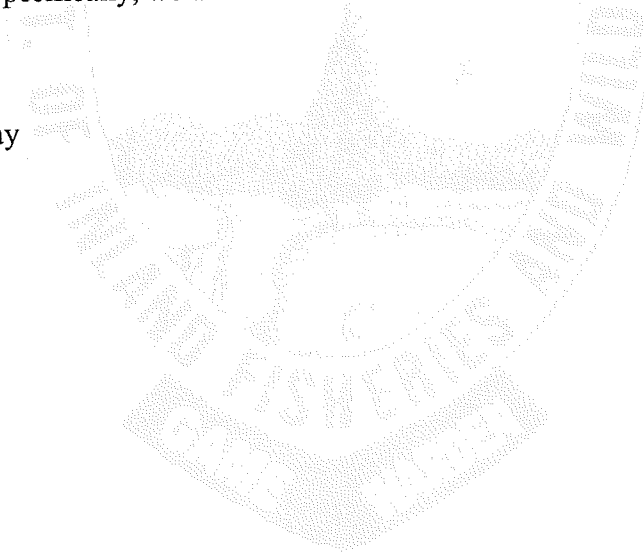

I responded to Lewiston High School where I was assigned a block of roads to patrol for the day. I was paired with Game Warden Luke Bellanceau, and we were asked to patrol roads south of the Maine Turnpike and west of the Androscoggin River.

On October 27, 2023 I again assisted with the search for Robert Card. I was paired with other Game Wardens and ATF Agents. We searched a six-acre island on the Androscoggin River in Lisbon near the boat launch. After, I worked with other members of the Warden Service Dive Team and conducted underwater searching. Specifically, we used the ROV to search the Androscoggin River at the Lisbon Dam.

On 10/25/2023, I was working as a Lieutenant in the Maine Warden Service assigned to Division A (southern Maine). While on my home that evening at approximately 1900 hrs, I heard Game Warden Harry Wiegman advise dispatch that there was an incident occurring in the City of Lewiston. Within a few minutes dispatch advised that there was an active shooting incident occurring. Warden Wiegman and Warden Investigator Joshua Smith told dispatch that they were responding. Within minutes dispatch advised of second shooting occurring in the City of Lewiston.

I then responded towards Lewiston from the town of Sebago. As I was enroute, I heard dispatch advise there was a shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center. I was in Auburn and responded towards that scene, but diverted to the Lewiston Police Department when I heard that there was no shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center.

The rest of that evening I stayed at the Command Post located at the Lewiston Police Department and offered assistance and resources.

On 10/26/2023, I went to the new CP located at the Lewiston High School. I stayed in the CP and again offered assistance and resources. During this time Game Wardens in the CP worked on areas to be grid searched. I left the CP at approximately 1800 hrs.

On 10/27/2023, I returned to the CP at approximately 0730 hrs. I again oversaw any Warden Service Operations throughout the day. I left the CP at approximately 1900 hrs. On my way home I was informed that Robert Card's body had been located.

This ended my involvement with the incident.

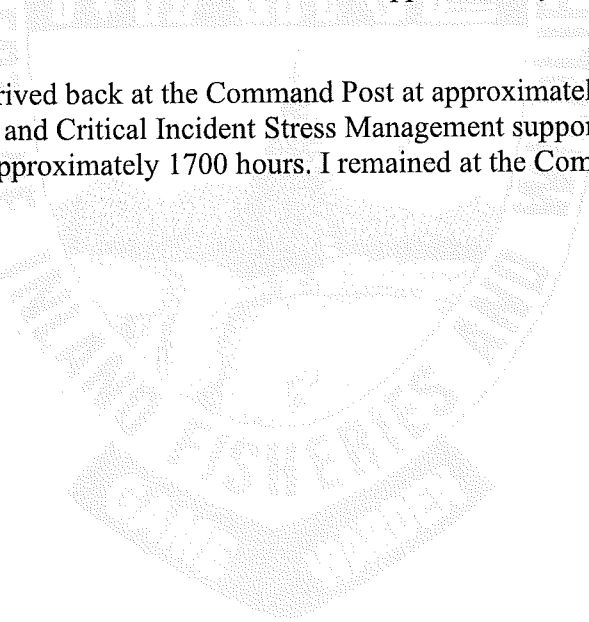

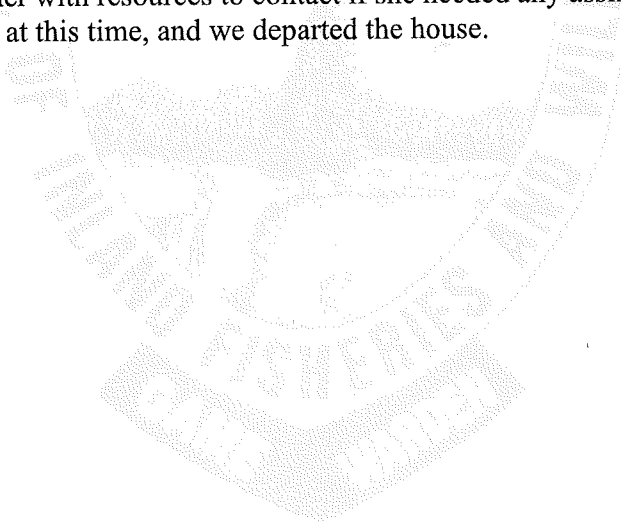

DETAILS:

On the evening of Wednesday, October 25, 2023, I was working as a Game Warden Investigator. I was in the town of Hartford, in Oxford County, shortly before 1900 hours, when I overheard radio traffic on the Androscoggin County RCC channel about an incident happening in Lewiston. I learned that there were reports of an active shooter incident taking place at Sparetime Recreation at 95 Mollison Way in Lewiston. There were reports of multiple shooting victims inside the bowling alley.

Upon hearing the information about a possible active shooter incident, I immediately responded towards Lewiston, via Route 219 to Route 4, with my blue lights and siren activated. I advised the State Police Dispatch Center to attach me to the call, indicating that I was responding. Once on Center Street in Auburn, I got behind an ambulance (possibly Turner rescue), responding to the same scene.

At approximately 1911 hours, just as I was about to turn onto the Veterans Memorial Bridge from Auburn to Lewiston, I overheard additional radio traffic about another active shooter incident, now occurring at Schemengees Bar and Grille on Lincoln Street in Lewiston. Dispatchers were asking for units to respond to the new scene at Schemengees, so I continued on to that scene instead of the bowling alley.

I arrived at Schemengees at approximately 1919 hours. There were several law enforcement officers and first responders on scene already. I pulled up next to Warden Harry Wiegman, who had pulled in just ahead of me. He was parked on the side of the road several hundred feet prior to the parking lot entrance of Schemengees. I met with Warden Wiegman and a first responder, possibly with Lewiston Fire, who was dealing with a male [REDACTED]. The man was [REDACTED]. I returned to my truck and drove closer to the bar, parking just north of the entrance to the bar's parking lot on the side of the street.

I walked through the front door of the bar and was surprised to find that the lights were out, and it was dark inside. I saw Lewiston Police Sergeant Joey Brown just inside the front door and asked him what he needed.

He stated that they were still trying to triage victims and needed to get them to hospitals. I then saw Lewiston Police Corporal Jeremy Somma, who pointed out a victim [REDACTED]. Corporal Somma told me that this victim needed to get to a hospital, but they were still waiting on ambulances to arrive. I advised him that Warden Harry Wiegman and I both had our Game Warden pick-up trucks on scene and would transport victims via Warden Trucks to the hospitals until ambulances arrived.

I returned outside and contacted Warden Wiegman and told him we needed to get our trucks cleaned out and to the front door of the bar to transport victims. We dumped items from the back of our trucks onto the lawn and attempted to get them as close to the building as possible. This was difficult due to so many police vehicles blocking the parking lot entrance. Warden Wiegman and I attempted to go across a field and up a steep embankment to get into the parking lot. I observed that Warden Wiegman did not make the hill, so I went around and got closer to the parking lot entrance. I got the attention of Trooper Ryan Phillips and asked him to move a couple of State Police vehicles so that we could get our trucks into the parking lot.

As soon as I pulled into the parking lot and got out of my truck, I observed victims being carried out of the bar across the lot. I hollered for the victims to be loaded into my truck and advised I would take them to the hospital. A victim who was being carried, was lifted into the back of my truck. This victim [REDACTED]. A first responder, possibly named Chris, was helping to carry this victim outside and I asked him to get in the back of my truck and ride with the victim to the hospital. The [REDACTED] had been playing cornhole at the bar at the time of the shooting. I also later learned that [REDACTED] was [REDACTED], a Corporal with the Maine Warden Service.

I left Schemengees with one victim (Ben Dyer), and headed to Central Maine Medical Center, using my blue lights and siren. I advised my dispatch that I was enroute to the hospital with one victim in the back of my truck.

I arrived at Central Maine Medical Center and pulled into the emergency entrance. While moving the victim to get him out of the truck, I observed that he [REDACTED]. He had been [REDACTED]. Hospital Staff brought out a stretcher, the victim was loaded onto it and taken into the emergency room.

I then returned to Schemengees with the first responder to get more victims. Once back at the scene, I heard that all of the wounded victims had been taken to hospitals and the remaining victims were all deceased. I

provided my business card to the first responder who had ridden with me, but I did not write down his name as I did not have my pen or notebook on me.

I noticed three men standing outside of an apartment building just south of the bar parking lot entrance. I walked over to them to ask them to go inside where it was safer. One of the men told me that he had heard the shooting and had observed three cars come flying out of the parking lot at the time of the shooting. He told me that one of the cars was white and he believed that someone had been shooting from the car, at the bar, as the vehicle fled from the scene. I flagged down Warden Evan Franklin and Warden Harry Wiegman and advised them to get this man's name and phone number as I did not have my pen or notebook on me.

I remained on scene at Schemengees as reports of more shooting and victims in the area caused confusion and Officers to run and drive, responding towards different reported scenes nearby. To my knowledge no other shooting scenes or victims were located and all of these reports were unfounded. Eventually, all Officers without a current assignment were asked to respond and stage at Lewiston PD. I went to Lewiston PD briefly, but another report of an active shooter was called in at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. This report sounded very legit [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. I responded with dozens of other Law Enforcement Officers to the distribution center. I checked on a white car at a business just shy of the distribution center entrance. This car did not appear to be involved. This report of an active shooter at the distribution center was unfounded, and to my knowledge, no victims were located here.

A suspect photo (from the shooting incident at the bowling alley) and vehicle information (white hatchback) was given out to law enforcement. I patrolled around Lewiston and Auburn looking for white hatchbacks. The vehicle description of a white hatchback was consistent with the white vehicle that the witness had reported to me at the bar. After about an hour and a half, a suspect name was provided to law enforcement. The name was Robert Card of Bowdoin, Maine, and the vehicle was better described as [REDACTED], a white 2013 Subaru Outback.

I was eventually advised to muster at Great Falls Plaza with the other responding Game Wardens. While at Great Falls Plaza in Auburn, I learned that the suspect's vehicle had been located at a boat launch in Lisbon. I went to Lisbon High School and met with Androscoggin County Deputies- Sergeant Lovering and Deputy Barr, who were watching over the sports fields behind the high school in an area about one mile from where the vehicle had been located. We learned that the suspect had not been located in the vehicle. A walking trail from the where the suspect's vehicle had been found led to the area of the sports fields behind the high school. I remained at this location until around 0230 hours watching the fields [REDACTED] for Card. I then returned to Central Maine Medical Center and checked in with Game Wardens providing security at the hospital. I retrieved food for them from Lewiston PD and was advised by my Lieutenant, Jason Luce to go home for the night and return in the morning to the Lewiston High School. I arrived home at about 0400 hours on 10/26/2023.

On Thursday, October 26, 2023, I returned to the command post at Lewiston High School at about 0930 hours. I signed in and volunteered myself for an assignment assisting the Androscoggin County Sheriff's Department with Law enforcement calls in the Turner/ Livermore area. I did not assist with the investigation or search for Card on this date.

On Friday, October 27, 2023, I returned to the command post at Lewiston High School at about 0730 hours. I was given the assignment of being a team leader for a grid search. Warden Franklin and I took a team of five ATF Agents to an area in Durham across the river from where Card's vehicle had been located. We grid searched out assigned area along the Androscoggin River. We did not locate anything.

While enroute back to the command post, Warden Wiegman advised me that I was needed by evidence techs at Schemengees to clarify my response and actions on the night of the shooting. I went to the scene and met with State Police Sergeant Jonah Oroak. I signed into the scene at 1203 hours and left at 1218 hours. I pointed out where I had driven across the lawn and also showed where I had gone inside and seen [REDACTED]. I was asked about a particular truck parked near the entrance of the parking lot but could not say for sure if I had seen it or specifically remembered it being there on the night of the shooting incident.

I returned to the command post and was given another grid search assignment. Game Warden Sergeant Scott Thrasher and I took a group of 6 U.S. Marshalls to [REDACTED] River Road in Lisbon. We grid searched the woods in our assigned area and we cleared every vehicle [REDACTED]. We did not locate Card or any evidence that he had been there. I cleared the command post to go home at about 1800 hours on 10-27-2023. I was advised to return at 0800 the next day.

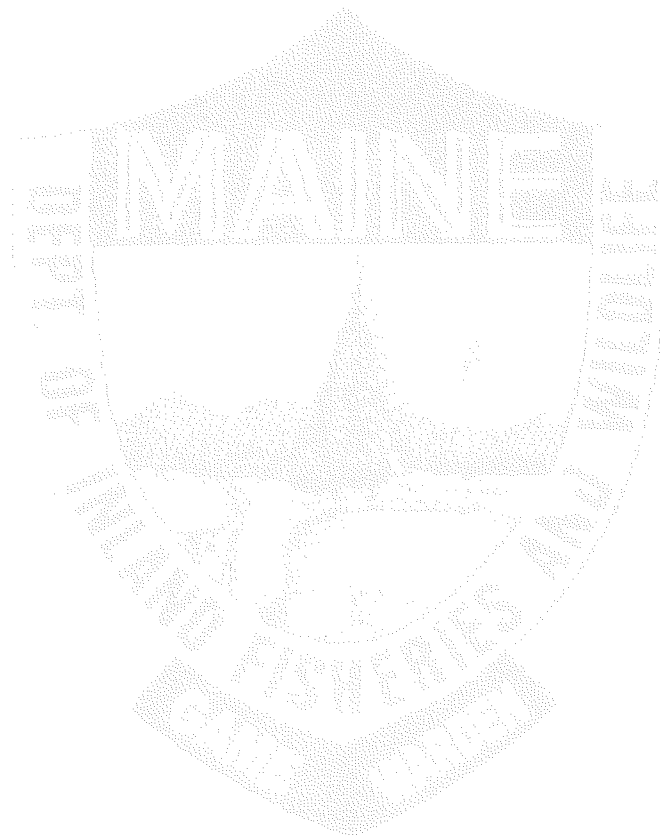
Later in the evening (around 2030 hours), I was advised by Game Warden Lieutenant Jason Luce that Card had been located deceased in Lisbon. I did not return to the command post the following day.

On October 29, 2023, I provided scene security at the bowling alley from 1500-1700 hours, for the workers who were inside cleaning the building. I spoke with a couple of people who were arriving to pick up vehicles from the parking lot. I cleared the bowling alley when the workers finished for the night and my involvement with this incident ended.

On the early morning of Oct 26, 2023, I (Sgt Bruce Loring) received call from Sgt Hladik of the Warden Service. I had been monitoring the traffic in reference to the mass shooting incident in Lewiston the previous evening. He requested I bring the jet boat to Lewiston in case it was needed to assist with the search for the gunman.

I arrived at the command post at approximately 0900hrs. I parked the boat and was eventually given an assignment to team up with Warden Joe Bailey for a roaming patrol. We were assigned to patrol the Lewiston, Sabattus and Lisbon areas. We did not observe any suspicious activity and was not assigned any other duties that day. We were relieved of our duties and I returned home that evening.

The following morning (Oct 27) I returned to the command post and was given an assignment with 3 other wardens and 4 ATF agents. We were assigned to clear the island across from the parking lot where the suspect vehicle was located. We deployed two boats and cleared the island and returned.

I was then assigned with Sgt Hladik, Cpl Gray and Wdn Bailey to take the ROV and attempt to look near the dam with it to see if we could locate a body. We cleared the dam with it then got it stuck on one of the open grates. We were eventually able to free it and left the area.

We then met with Sgt Stedman from the MSP Underwater Recovery Team. We made plans for several other teams from New England to join us the following day to clear about a mile of river downstream to the dam. Plans were finalized and we left.

As I was driving home that night word had come out that the suspect was found deceased. I returned to the boat landing and loaded the jet boat and returned home.

On the evening of October 25th, 2023, at approximately 20:15 hours I received a phone call from Lieutenant Mike Joy. Lt. Joy informed me that there had been a mass casualties' event in Lewiston Maine and the Maine State Police were seeking assistance from any available ERT's (Evidence Response Team.) When I received this call, I was also with Maine Warden Service ERT Steven Milton. I told Lt. Joy that both Warden Milton and I would respond. As I was driving south, I contacted Maine State Police Sergeant Scott Bryant and asked where he would like us to respond to. Sgt. Bryant informed me to drive to a hotel in Augusta and get some sleep to arrive fresh the following morning.

On the morning of October 26th, 2023, at approximately 06:35 hours, I contact Sgt. Bryant and asked where he would like me to respond, and he told me 553 Lincoln Street in Lewiston. At approximately 07:16 hours I arrived on scene where I located Sgt. Bryant and Game Warden Dave Simmons.

At approximately 09:13 hours I began assisting with removal of the eight bodies from the scene. We started with [REDACTED] inside and removed the other seven.

At approximately 10:07 Warden Milton and I were tasked with locating evidence on and around the cars in the parking lot.

At approximately 10:16 hours I located a red brown swipe on a [REDACTED] on the rear passenger side door. We labeled this swipe with placard #1.

At approximately 10:18 hours I located a red brown swipe along with a fingerprint in red brown stain on the driver's side rear door of [REDACTED] 1609YZ. We labeled this swipe and fingerprint with placard #2.

At approximately 10:29 hours Warden Milton discovered two AR style rifles in [REDACTED].

At approximately 10:32 hours we discovered multiple red brown stains on the front bumper/grill area of [REDACTED]. We labeled these stains with placard #4.

At approximately 10:35 hours we located a red brown stain on a white line in the parking lot labeled with placard #5

At approximately 10:38 hours we located red brown stain on the hood and front passenger side fender of [REDACTED]. We originally labeled this with placard #6 but later changed it to placard #10 after locating more red brown stains that made sense to placard with 6 prior to [REDACTED].

At approximately 10:48 hours we located red brown stain on the ground in proximity of the designated walking area and [REDACTED] mentioned above. We used placard #6 to label the red brown stain.

At approximately 10:50 we located more red brown stain and used placard #7 to label it.

At approximately 10:54 we located more red brown stain and used placard #12 to label it.

All red brown stains placarded 6 through 13 were in proximity of the front door leading to different directions in the parking lot.

At approximately 11:05 hours we placarded a red brown stain along with what appeared to be bone fragments that led to BR-1 [REDACTED] with placards #s 14, 15, and 16.

At approximately 11:08 hours we discovered a red brown flesh like substance near the arcade exit in close proximity to BR-1 and used placard #17 to label it.

At approximately 11:21 hours [REDACTED] hiking shoe was discovered outside of the scene tape along Lincoln Street in front of 540 Lincoln Street. We used placard #18 to label it.

At approximately 11:27 hours a silver whistle was located on the northwest side of the entrance to Schemengees Bar & Grille. We used placard #19 to label it.

At approximately 11:28 hours a taser cartridge was located near the whistle. We used placard #20 to label it.

At approximately 11:30 hours taser probes were located. We used placard #21 to label it.

At approximately 11:30 hours a taser plate were located. We used placard #22 to label it.

At approximately 11:54 we began searching for bullet defects on the outside of the building and marking them with small sticky scales.

At approximately 11:55 we locate a perforating defect on the northwest side door that appeared to have come from the inside out. We marked the defect with a sticky scale.

At approximately 11:57 hours we located two perforating defects on the southwest outer wall that also appeared to be from the inside going outside.

At approximately 12:03 hours it was pointed out to me that a .308 caliber shell casing was located beneath the front tire of [REDACTED]. We used placard #23 to label it.

Ultimately the evidence I have listed above as placards 1-23 was later changed to small sticky scales without numbers upon the request of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Sgt. O'Roak. These items were again placarded with numbers 1- 26 by the FBI with our assistance and photographed.

Later that evening starting at approximately 18:28 hours I assisted with packaging of the evidence in the parking lot.

I cleared the scene at 20:03 hours.

On October 27th, 2023, at approximately 09:50 hours I returned to Schemengees Bar & Grille. When I arrived, I was contacted by a member of the FBI's ERT and was told that they had located a [REDACTED] near the main electrical breaker in the utility room. I shared this information with Maine State Police Sergeant Jonah O'Roak.

At approximately 10:24 hours we were told that a .9mm .223 cartridges were located further down the road northwest of the scene. I assisted with collection of these items.

At approximately 12:35 hours I began assisting with searching the [REDACTED] for items listed on a search warrant [REDACTED].

In the front passenger side quadrant, we located; two boxes of 5.56 caliber ammunition, one box of 7mm Mag Hornady brand ammunition, one box of .308 Winchester brand ammunition, one

empty bag for a pmag 30 AR/M4. In the rear passenger quadrant, we located; four 5.56 pmags 3 of which had cartridges in them, one bag containing miscellaneous hunting supplies and assorted hunting ammunition, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. In the rear passenger quadrant one Viking brand butt pad. In the center console two boxes of 5.56 ammunition, one box of 45 auto Federal Premium brand ammunition, one box of .380 Auto Sig Sauer brand Ammunition, one 20-gauge shell, one .300 American cartridge, one 5.56 pmag, one gun snake, and one small caliber handgun magazine. All of which was returned to the pickup soon after.

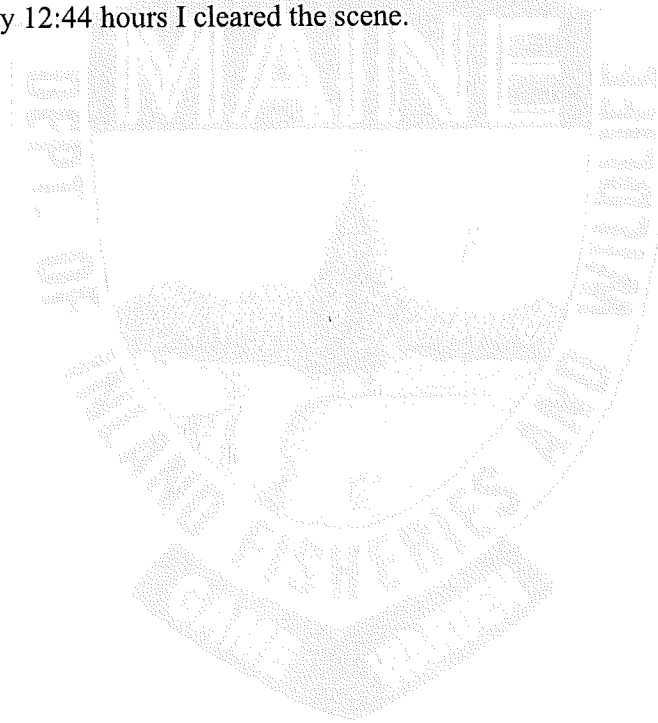

At approximately 20:20 hours I began assisting with the collection evidence within Schemengees Bar & Grille.

On October 25th, 2023, I, Game Warden Melinda Rugg responded to the area of Lewiston at approximately 2000 to an active shooter. When I arrived in Lewiston, I heard over Gray RCCA that a potential sighting of the suspect had been seen at Wayfield street in the town of Lewiston. I turned onto that street and checked the surrounding area and did not see anyone or any suspicious activity. I cleared the area and went to the command post at Lewiston Police Department. Shortly after I arrived, I was instructed to meet at The Colisee in Lewiston and then at a local hotel. At that time, I was instructed to perform security at St. Marys hospital where I did not encounter any suspicious activity. At 0300 I was instructed by Lieutenant Luce to clear the area after additional security arrived.

On October 27th, 2023, I performed overnight security with Game Warden Tyler Harthart at Central Maine Medical Center. At approximately 0530 a security guard in the hospital told us that someone was attempting to get in the parking garage with a large stick. I arrived at the parking garage and did not see anyone at the front, so I went along the back side of the garage, where I observed [REDACTED]. I followed the vehicle until it turned onto another street. I returned to the front of the building where I met one of the security guards who reported that she had not seen anyone and then stated that she could see two individuals over by parked cars. I approached and asked the two males what they were doing there, and they stated that they were here for the Wi-Fi. I told them that this building was on lockdown and that they needed to leave. Both complied and left. After searching the building, we observed that they had used a stick to break the rear left window of an [REDACTED]. The security guard reported the incident to Lewiston Dispatch. I cleared the garage and went back to the hospital. We did not encounter any further suspicious activity and cleared the hospital at 0800 on October 27th, 2023.

That concludes my involvement.

On 10-26-23 I was directed to respond to the Lewiston High School Command Center to aid in searching for a male suspect involved in a Mass Shooting in Lewiston. I met there with Sgt. Kyle Hladik and partnered up with him for the day to stay in the area of Riverside Rd. in Auburn. We remained positioned there till the evening as a Quick Reaction element incase any of the TAC teams searching the area located the suspect in the woods and/or needed evacuation from the area if an arrest or gun fight occurred.

On 10-27-23 I again was directed to meet at the Command Center. In the morning I worked security flanking the paved road and keeping civilians / media out of the woods as Sgt. Andy Glidden lead a search team that worked the walking trail along the Androscoggin River south from the suspects parked car location at a boat ramp. This area of woods was in the aera of ██████████ Lisbon Falls ME.

After that team had completed their search, Lt. Jason Luce directed me to stay in the area in a security role while Sgt. Josh Bubier's team was searching the same section of woods but just south of Sgt. Glidden's team. I located Sgt. Bubier's team trucks parked at the Lisbon Falls Baptist Church @ 555 Lisbon St. I patrolled the area by truck till they emerged from the woods at conclusion of their search.

I drove back to the Command Center- and received a search area to sweep. This section of woods was located ██████████ ██████████ in Lisbon ME. I searched the woods with Wardens Robertson, Loudner, Tibbetts, Bartholomew, and 2 members of Homeland Security out of the Portland ME Office.

After concluding this search- I returned to the CP and ██████████ to Wdn. Weigman for archiving. I was dismissed from the search and told by Sgt. Richardson to return the next day at 8 am. I later was informed that night by Lt. Luce the suspect had been located deceased at Recycling Center in Lisbon Falls. This location was adjacent to Sgt. Bubier's assigned woods search area. I had driven by this location several times that day while doing roving security patrol by truck.

On October 25th, 2023 at approximately 1850 hours I, Warden Harrison Wiegman, was on patrol in full uniform with Deputy Game Warden Cody York. I overheard radio traffic on the Androscoggin County Sheriff's Office channel about a shooter, and numerous casualties at Mollison Way in Lewiston. I had not heard any traffic over the State Police channel. I contacted the Augusta State Police Barracks via radio and requested that they find out what was happening.

Shortly thereafter I was advised that there was an active shooter at 'Spare-time Recreation' at 24 Mollison Way in Lewiston. I am familiar with the location and immediately responded to the scene. I copied radio traffic reporting that the shooter's location was unknown, and that there were multiple casualties. Deputy York and I were in North Turner and responded toward the scene.

At approximately 1911 hours I was approaching 24 Mollison Way, I was advised that there was now a second shooting occurring at Schmengees Pool hall at 554 Lincoln Street. I am familiar with the location, and overheard radio traffic directing law enforcement to the second seen. While enroute I observed rescue vehicles traveling toward Central Maine Medical Center.

Deputy York and I continued our response and arrived at 554 Lincoln Street at 1919 hours. As I arrived, I observed numerous civilians in the roadway, and shoulder of the road. Emergency vehicles were blocking the entrance to Schmengees, I parked approximately 150 feet back to allow there to be a path into the scene. Game Warden Investigator Joshua Smith arrived just as I was getting on scene.

I approached the building and observed numerous law enforcement officers, firefighters, and rescue personnel actively working to remove patients from the pool hall. I heard information that the shooter had possibly left towards the Androscoggin River. I am familiar with the area and know that the riverbank is within sight of the pool hall.

The scene was very chaotic, and dark. I did not fully realize until after that none of the lights in the parking lot were working and the building itself was very dark. I was initially concerned that the shooter may attempt to ambush law enforcement and rescue personnel, especially given how dark the area surrounding the pool hall was. After briefly checking the area around the parking lot I observed numerous officers searching the periphery of the property, I felt that there were a suitable number of officers searching this area and looked to identify the next biggest need on scene.

I approached Lewiston Police Officers who were near the entrance to the pool hall and asked what they needed. They were still assessing what was needed. An unidentified fire/rescue person advised me

that they were out of ambulances and had a need to get injured persons transported. I told him that we had two warden service trucks on scene and asked if the beds of the trucks would work, and he asked me to bring them up to the entrance if possible.

As I stated before the entrance was blocked by cruisers and fire vehicles, additionally I observed injured persons being worked on the edge of the parking area further limiting access.

I returned to my vehicle and decided to cross the curb and get onto the lawn. I attempted to access the parking lot through a gap in the vehicles on the back side of the lot. The embankment around the parking lot proved too steep for my vehicle to get up, even while in 4-wheel drive. I then backed up and pulled up the other banking near Lincoln Street near the curb. I saw Investigator Smith there and advised him that we needed to get trucks ready to bring patients.

I emptied gear out of the bed of my truck in preparation for multiple patients. I then returned to the entrance of the pool hall. Two rescue personnel brought an injured male out to me, and we brought him to my vehicle and placed him in the front seat. I asked the rescue personnel if they wanted to bring more people out to my vehicle, they directed me to immediately bring the patient to Saint Mary's. One of them stated that they were concerned that Central Maine Medical Center may be filling up. The darkness of the scene initially prevented me from seeing the male's injuries, but he was more or less being carried by the rescue personnel.

Once in my vehicle I attempted to ask the male where he was injured, and or how badly he was injured. [REDACTED]

I saw a significant amount of what appeared to be blood [REDACTED]. I considered stopping to further assess [REDACTED].

When we arrived at Saint Mary's I assisted the male out of the vehicle and brought him into the Emergency Room. When I walked in everyone appeared surprised, and it did not appear that they were aware that there was a mass casualty event. I looked at the nurse at the intake desk and told her that there was an active shooter, and that the male with me [REDACTED]. I told them to get ready for more patients to be inbound.

When I returned to my patrol vehicle, I contacted the State Police Barracks and asked them to reach out to Saint Mary's and ensure that they were fully aware of the situation and were preparing.

I left shortly thereafter to return to the scene. I was not able to identify the male that I transported, due to our inability to communicate with one another.

I returned to the scene and ensured that no other individuals needed transport, by this time other rescue units had arrived to take the remaining victims.

I located Deputy York to ensure that he was all set and had him remain with me for the remainder of our time at the scene. While standing by at the scene a report of another active shooter came in, first in the boat launch just north of Schmengees. As that report came in, I overheard Trooper Jason Wing advising dispatch that he was almost out at the scene. I wanted to ensure Trooper Wing knew the updated information about a potential new scene and advised him on the radio.

Shortly thereafter another report of a shooting near DaVinci's Restaurant came in. Investigator Smith advised that we were going to remain at the scene at Schmengees to assist with security and be prepared for response to other areas if needed.

Both of those shooting scenes were determined to be unfounded.

Shortly thereafter a report of a man with a rifle attempting to gain entry to the Walmart Distribution Center. Investigator Smith, Deputy York and I responded to Walmart Distribution Center. After a short time on scene, no suspect could be located. I received an image of the suspect on my phone. I assisted Lewiston Police Officers with clearing vehicles near the scene. I stood by until I received directions to respond to the Lewiston Police Department for staging.

I remained at LPD until I was told to rove in the area until further information came in.

Late that night Sergeant Kyle Hladik and I were directed to assist with security at an address [REDACTED]. Sergeant Hladik and I met with Corporal Eric Paquette at the residence, and he requested that we watch the driveway to ensure that the suspect did not sneak in behind them.

Sergeant Hladik and I stood by there until approximately 0200 hours. I then returned to my residence at the direction of Lt. Jason Luce.

October 26th

I worked at the command post for the day. I am a member of the Maine Warden Service Incident Management Team, and frequently plan and execute large scale searches. I prepared important information and data that would assist in searching while we awaited direction and approval from the Maine State Police.

Late that night after I had returned home, I was contacted by Sergeant Carleton Richardson, and advised that he needed me to respond early October 27th to plan for searching the woods around where the suspect's vehicle was located.

October 27th

I made search assignments and briefed team leaders on their search areas. I was directed by the Maine State Police to focus on the riverbanks north and south of the boat launch, and on the island and opposite shore of the river.

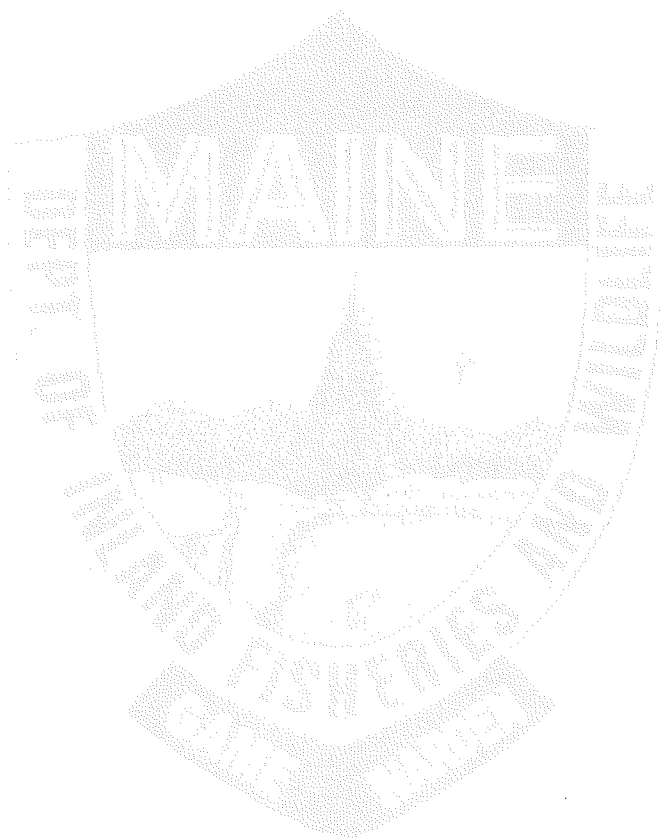
I documented search activities for groups with GPS's activated. I will provide the data, and maps from the incident to the Maine State Police with this report.

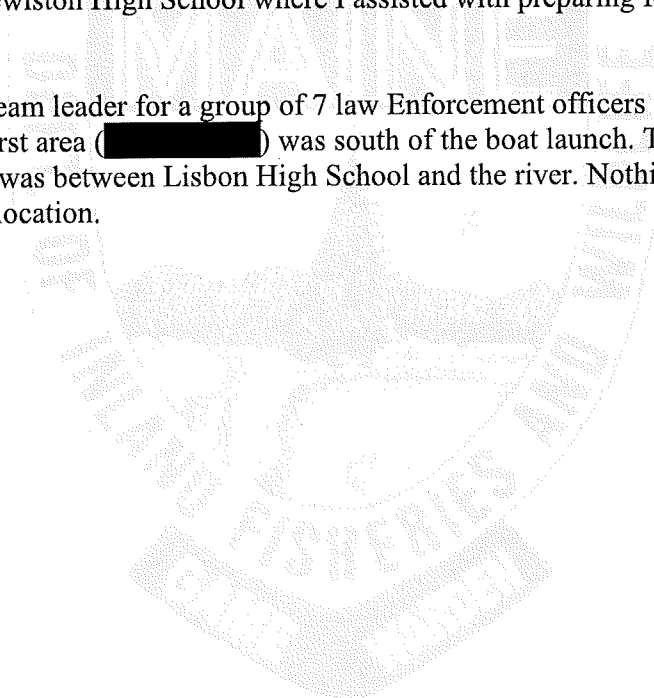

On 10/25/23 at approximately 2000 hours I responded to the Lewiston PD and met with Lt. Jason Luce. Lt. Luce briefed me on the situation and assigned me to the security detail at CMMC. I arrived at CMMC and met with Warden Pete Haring. I remained at CMMC until approximately 2000 hours on 10/26/23 when I was replaced by other Game Wardens. After being relieved from the CMMC detail I went to the CP at the Lewiston High School where I assisted with preparing for the search efforts on 10/27.

On 10/27/23 I was the team leader for a group of 7 law Enforcement officers and assigned to grid search two areas. The first area ([REDACTED]) was south of the boat launch. The second area ([REDACTED]) my team searched was between Lisbon High School and the river. Nothing significant was located at either search location.

On 10/25/2023, I learned of an active shooter situation in Lewiston through text message while I was at home on a day off. I spoke with Lt. Jason Luce, who initially advised me to stay home. However, after learning more about the extent of the incident, I responded to assist at approximately 22:00 hours. I assisted Lt. Luce with coordinating Warden Service resources at Lewiston Police Department. Later, Warden Wiegman and I responded to [REDACTED]. We maintained security at the end of the driveway there for a while, and then we patrolled up the west side of the Androscoggin River. I cleared from the incident at approximately 03:00 hours.

On 10/26/2023, I responded to the Command Post at the Lewiston High School at approximately 08:00 hours. I helped coordinate Warden Service resources, and then I patrolled in the Auburn area to provide Warden Service resources there as the incident and search developed further. I cleared from the incident at approximately 19:30 hours.

On 10/27/2023, I responded to the Command Post at approximately 07:30 hours. I was assigned to be a search team leader, and I conducted a search of a 6-acre island in the Androscoggin River, along with three other game wardens and 4 ATF agents. I then patrolled the river by boat and conducted a remote underwater vehicle search at the Lisbon dam with other dive team members. I assisted with planning for the following day's operations, and I then learned that the subject had been located. I worked on getting accountability for Warden Service resources that were deployed, including boats, ATV's, and cameras. I then cleared from the incident at approximately 23:00 hours.

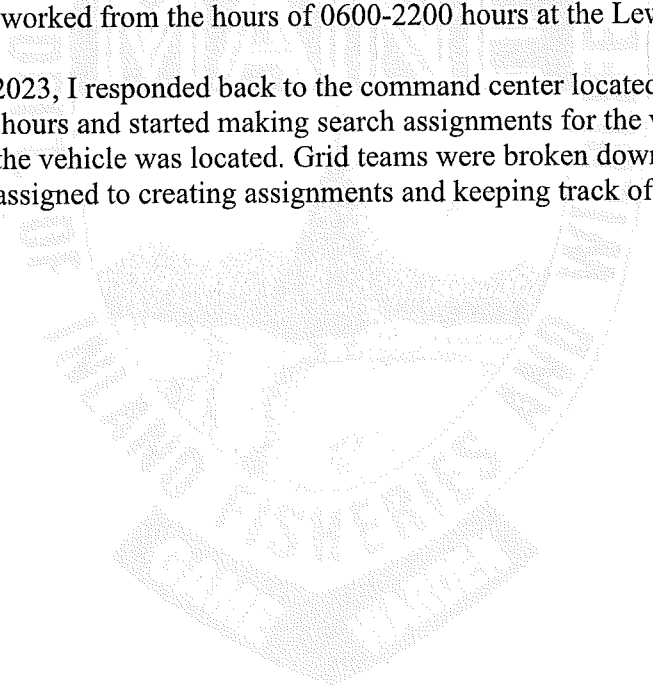

I worked with Warden Harry Wiegman creating maps of the area including trails, snowmobile and ATV routes and marking known locations on the map. For wardens deploying, we broke up in sectors of the area and remained in standby as search efforts were not being deployed into the woods at this point. I worked from the hours of 0600-2200 hours at the Lewiston High School.

On Friday October 27th, 2023, I responded back to the command center located at the Lewiston High School. I arrived at 0330 hours and started making search assignments for the woods area surrounding the river and area where the vehicle was located. Grid teams were broken down to teams of approximately 10. I was assigned to creating assignments and keeping track of the units deployed.



We were sent the address of the Command Posts and started that way. When I arrived at the command I was directed to a staging area where Game Wardens were meeting to assist.

Along with other Wardens and several Fire Marshals I was placed on a security detail of St. Mary's Hospital from the hours of 2130 on 10/25 to 0330 on 10/26. The security detail consisted of patrolling around the building as several other units were located stationary at the major entrances.

At 0330 on 10/26 I was relieved from the detail by a Lewiston PD officer and two Portland PD officers. Lt. Luce was contacted to see how he would like us to respond and he advised us to return home for rest and we were placed on standby for further assistance.

Synopsis:

On October 25, 2023, I responded to the Lewiston Mass casualty incident to assist the Maine State Police Evidence Response Team (ERT). I was assigned to the crime scene located at “Just-in-Time”, located at 24 Mollison Way, Lewiston. I was present at the crime scene on October 26th and 27th. I worked with other ERT members to search for, document, and collect items of evidence located inside the bowling alley, and in the parking area of the business.

Narrative:

On October 25, 2023, I, Warden Paul Mason, responded to Lewiston for the report of an active shooter in the city. I was requested to assist the Maine State Police Evidence Response Team (ERT) in processing the scene.

I arrived at the Lewiston Police Department at approximately 2300hrs. I was briefed on the situation and left at approximately 0130hrs on October 26, 2023.

On October 26, at approximately 1135hrs, I arrived at “Just-In-Time”, located at 24 Mollison Way, Lewiston. I was briefed by Maine State Police ERT members already present, conducting a walkthrough of the scene. I waited while other ERTs finished scanning the crime scene with “Faro” scanners.

At approximately 1430hrs, I worked with FBI resources and other ERTs to conduct a line search of the parking lot area. We methodically searched the entire parking lot for additional evidence, including plain view searches of the vehicles located within it. I found no further evidence. I am unaware that any was located during the line search.

At approximately 1800hrs, I was advised by Cpl. Jason Fowler that there was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]. Fire Marshall Investigator Larry Morrill and I searched the crime scene for any identifications indicating someone fitting those criteria. I found none.

I cleared the area at approximately 1835hrs.

I returned to 24 Mollison Way on October 27, at 0715hrs.

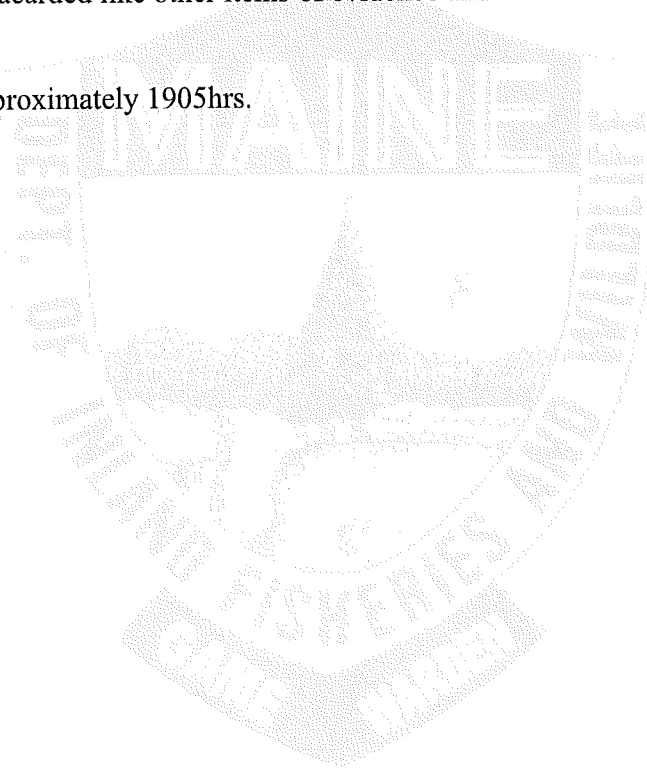
At approximately 0830hrs, I began placarding identified items of evidence with other ERT members. FM Morrill documented the items of evidence and their placard. We also labeled bullet fragments located in the wall behind the bowling lanes.

I assisted. Tpr. Mickael Nunez photograph items of evidence with placards in place by holding his flash as he took photographs.

At approximately 1500hrs, I assisted Detective Desiree Hurd collect the identified, and placarded items of evidence.

I assisted Detective Desiree Hurd collect DNA evidence from the red/brown stains located by each body. The stains were placarded like other items of evidence and denoted in the same way as other pieces of evidence.

I cleared the scene at approximately 1905hrs.

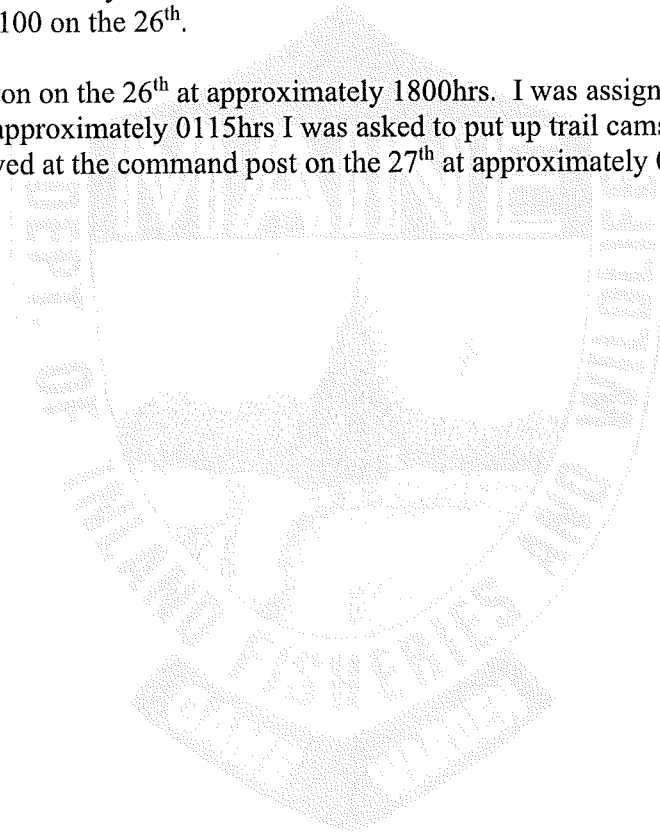

On the evening of 10/25/23 I received a text message ([REDACTED]) indicating there was an active Shooter in Lewiston at Schmengees. I was currently in a store [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] While enroute, I overheard traffic of units responding to Schmengees, and the possible suspect vehicle of a white hatchback, possibly a Volvo. I responded via Rte. 196 and advised dispatch I was inbound and would keep an eye out for the vehicle. While enroute, I notified Sgt. Richardson that I was responding, and that I thought Inv. Smith and Wdn. Wiegman were already on scene. I also called Wdn. Louder [REDACTED].

I arrived at Schmengees at approximately 7:40. I produced my medical bag and issued rifle, and ran down to the parking lot to try and assist. I found Wdn. Wiegman and asked him for an assignment. He informed me that the building was clear and only deceased people were left inside. I stood-by to await direction from on-scene supervisors.

Just then, a report of several dead bodies was received in the field north of Schmengees. I took a position of cover while uniformed officers searched the field.

I was then called to the brown apartment building across from the parking lot. I spoke with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] of the buildings. They told me they heard the shots and looked out to see several vehicles leaving the scene, and one white vehicle shooting as it left. I called over Wdn. Wiegman to assist. He documented their names and they were told to stand-by to speak with arriving detectives.

I was then assigned to report to Lewiston Police Department where I stood-by in the parking lot as directed. A call came in indicating an active shooter at the Walmart distribution center. I responded with dozens of other units and assisted in clearing the parking lot until it was determined it was a hoax.

I was assigned to respond to the Colisee to stage with other law enforcement units. Upon my arrival there, I overheard on the radio another mass shooting at the Rusty Lantern in Sabattus. [REDACTED] Officer Mayer was working in Sabattus and I called him. He told me he was at the Rusty Lantern and there was no shooting there. I radioed Augusta and told them I had spoken to a Sabattus unit and that report was a hoax.

After some time, Wardens were assigned to report to the Great Falls Plaza to stage for an assignment. I communicated with Lt. Luce who assigned me to take all available Wardens and Fire Marshalls and

make two teams to deploy for hospital security. I formed two groups and communicated those names to him and Wdn. Wiegman. As I was preparing to depart to CMMC (where I assigned myself) I was notified by Wdn. Lounder that the suspect vehicle was located at the Sabattus River Boat Launch [REDACTED]

I received permission from Lt. Luce to respond to Wdn. Lounder's [REDACTED]. Prior to leaving, I spoke with (friend) Sgt. Levesque of the Lisbon Police Department. He informed me the suspect vehicle had crashed. This began my train of thought that the suspect was fleeing, and ending up at the boat launch was not in the original plan.

On the morning of 10/26/23, I was asked to respond to Gray HQ and pick up a jet-drive boat and stage it at the command post (LewHS). I did so, and later received an assignment to work with a US Fish & Wildlife Agent in placing a trail camera in Bowdoin. Upon responding to the area, we determined this would be a poor location to place a camera for monitoring purposes (trail flooded). I communicated this to the command post and then we drove out the roads the immediate area to familiarize ourselves. We came upon the FBI at [REDACTED] as they prepared to execute the warrant. We later returned to the command post with no further assignments for the day.

On the morning of 10/27/23, I was asked by the command post to check out an area on the Durham side of the river. I met with Wdn. Lounder and we drove into [REDACTED] and towards the river. We spoke with [REDACTED] who advised they did not see the suspect, and they gave permission for us to search their property. I then responded to [REDACTED] Cedar Pond Road and scouted a location for search teams to drive close to the river.

I then responded to the command post and got my search assignment and team. Warden Service Inv. Josh Smith, myself, and several ATF Agents responded back to Cedar Pond Road and searched an assigned piece of woods for the morning. We did not locate anything.

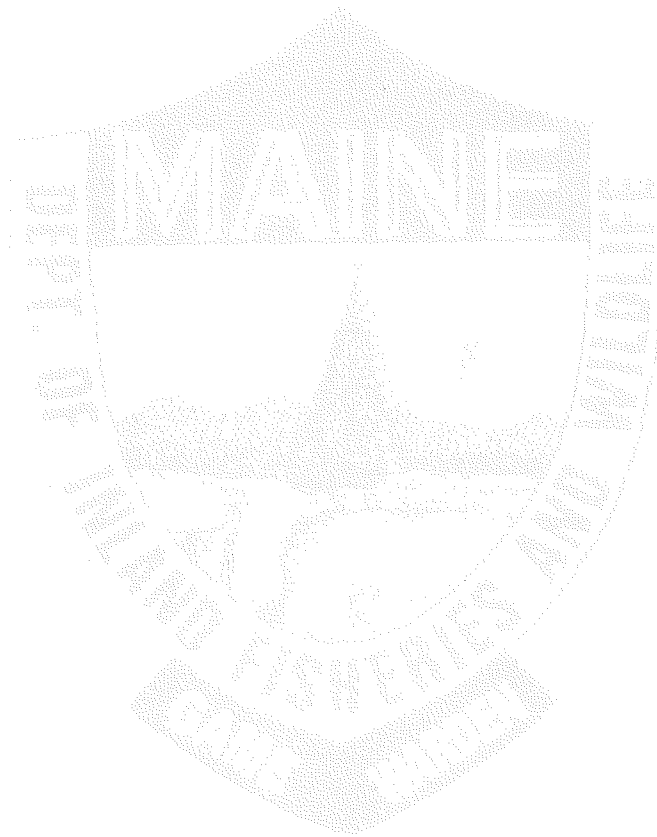
In the afternoon, we received another search piece along the river and behind the industrial park. We searched between the [REDACTED] back of the high school track. We searched in a line with my GPS and OnX track with me, and my team toward the river on the first pass. When we got to the end of the pass by the track / football field, and I gave my GPS to Mike (from ATF) and we lined up again to do another pass.

We re-arranged again to go down and back to finish covering the assigned piece (blue highlight on map) with Mike still in possession of my GPS. When we got to the parking lot with all the box trailers, I told the group that it was out of our block, but to check them. I continued on as there was two small pieces I felt we missed as we arced around the river on the first pass. I went to that location by myself and met the group back at our vehicles when done. I retrieved my GPS and the team went back to the command post while I checked the far upper corner by myself, and then I returned to the command post.

I was then called by Cpl. Gray who indicated that he needed assistance in getting several dive boats in the river in the morning. I responded to Cedar Pond Road and met with the road commissioner of Durham, and Sgt. Hladik to make a plan. I then returned to my residence for the day and was later notified the subject was located deceased.

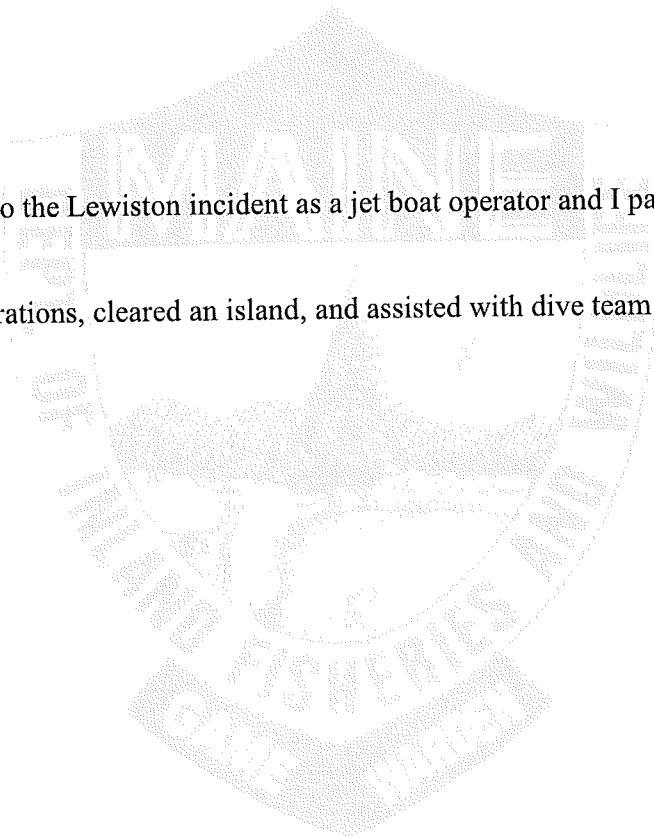
