



On October 27, 2023 at approximately 1230 hours I, Officer Jeffrey Cook, responded to the Lewiston High School to assist in the search for Robert Card. I responded as part of the York County [REDACTED] team who works in conjunction with the York County [REDACTED]. When I arrived the other team members were already there at the command staging area. We stood by waiting to see if they needed the team to assist in the search.

At approximately 1733 hours we responded to the river and the boat launch in Lisbon where the suspects car had been located. We were tasked with relieving the team from South Portland who had been providing security for the dive team and search jobs. When we arrived were informed that both those groups were clearing for the night so we were not needed. We then returned to the high school to stage. A short time later we were informed that the suspect had been located deceased and I cleared.

Narrative:

On October 25th, I was notified of an active shooter incident in the City of Lewiston. I was notified by Trooper Jason Wing who had been activated to respond to the incident. Trooper Wing, knowing that I had just cleared Lewiston [REDACTED], immediately called me. [REDACTED] I told Trooper Wing I would respond from my residence and began to get ready. I notified Captain Garbarini who is also a [REDACTED]. Captain Garbarini stated he need to call [REDACTED] to get clearance. I received a call back from Captain Garbarini in less than a minute telling me to respond to Lewiston to assist. As I arrived in Lewiston, approximately 30 minutes after the initial call. I staged at Lewiston Police Department awaiting further instructions.

Shortly after I arrived, I assisted Lewiston Police as well as other units, responding to the Walmart distribution center for a call they had received. I staged in this area with several other units awaiting information on this call LPD had received.

As the Walmart call was found to be bad information, I then responded with the Auburn Police Department to assist them in locating a suspect whom they had identified as a person of interest in the shooting. I arrived on scene with Auburn Police who detained a subject for a short period of time until he was cleared as the shooter. I then responded back to LPD awaiting further assignments.

I was assigned to conduct victim interviews of survivors of the bowling alley incident. I learned that LPD had approximately 79 interviews to conduct, and they asked for [REDACTED] to assist. I interviewed several people [REDACTED]. I have completed a summary of interview report on all my interviews and submitted the report as well as my body camera footage of the interviews to Detective Sergeant Ferriter of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office as instructed. (I have also added said report to the Spillman system as an attachment).

The following days I participated in interviews and searches with the FBI at several locations. [REDACTED]

After clearing the third day of operations I was notified that Card had been located, [REDACTED], and that my assistance was no longer needed, other than completing reports.

This agency assistance call is closed. This report has been forward to Maine State Police Detective Sergeant Christopher Farley as requested.

On 10/25/23 I was made aware of a large scale incident in the Lewiston, ME area via social media and numerous other sources. At approximately 2018 hours Sgt. Greg Roy of the Maine State Police Tactical Team contacted me via the phone. He stated that there was an ongoing active threat in the Lewiston Area with possible mass casualties. Sgt. Roy requested that the Bangor Special Response Team be prepared to respond if more resources were needed.

I briefed Chief Hathaway, and Deputy Chief Bushey on the situation and determined that if needed the Special Response Team would respond.

At 2243 hours Sgt. Roy requested the Bangor Police Departments Bearcat armored vehicle and a partial team to operate it / provide support. I along with the Special Response Team members listed above responded to the station, prepared the truck, and then departed for Lewiston. We were instructed by Sgt. Roy to report to the Lewiston Colisee.

Upon arrival at the Colisee we were redirected to the Lewiston High School where a permanent command post was being established. At approximately 0130 hours on 10/26/23 we had arrived at the high school, prepped our equipment for a response, and had checked in with the command post.

We stood by at the Lewiston High School staging area until Sgt. Roy arrived and briefed us on known information and our task for the night. We were to work in conjunction with the Southern Maine Regional SWAT team and HSI's tactical team during the overnight hours. If an emergency situation arose were to respond otherwise we were asked to stage until specific tasks were assigned. Our operational period would extend until approximately 1000 hours on 10/26/23.

Sgt. Roy later tasked the Bangor Special Response Team and HSI with a building clearing operation in Auburn. We were to respond to the area of FirstFleet Inc. [REDACTED] Upon arrival in the area we were to meet with Deputy Chief Cogle who would brief us on specifics. Prior to departure we coordinated communications, medical response, and responsibilities between our teams. We then department to meet with officers on scene.

Upon arrival in the area we met with DC Cogle. He stated that the building we were to clear was the suspects currently employer, and that the suspect had prior conflicts with current employees. When the shootings happened the business had all employees leave the property, and then diverted all incoming trucks. The concern was that the suspect had possibly returned to the workplace, or was using it as a location familiar to him to hide out.

We determined that HIS would conduct and interior clear of the residence and that we would take up positions on the exterior. Our mission was to provide perimeter security, but to also search the numerous large trucks and storage containers in the parking lot. We stayed on scene until the property was cleared.

During the process we did not locate anyone, conduct any interviews, or damage any property.

We returned to the command post at Lewiston High School at approximately 0535 hours. We stood by until other tactical units arrived and were briefed. We were cleared to return to Bangor at 0930 hours.

This ends our involvement with this incident.

Details: On September 15, 2023 I was made aware of a threat that was made towards Cpl. Kelvin Mote and the Saco National Guard Training Facility by a Robert Card who is part of Cpl. Mote's guard unit.

As part of the investigation I made contact with the Sagadahoc County Sheriff's Office and requested a well being check be done on Robert Card to see what his state of mind is and if he needs to be taken in for an evaluation.

When I contacted Sagadahoc County I spoke with Sgt. Skofield and forwarded him all of the information that I had been provided by Cpl. Mote.

I also explained to Sgt. Skofield that the request for the well being check is from the National Guard and not Cpl. Mote if anyone asks.

At approximately 1630 hrs. Sgt. Skofield advised me that he had been to the residence and the vehicle is not there and there was no answer at the door. Sgt. Skofield has since sent out a teletype Missing Person/Endangered Person for Robert Card.

Robert Card

works for a trucking company that delivers bread to their warehouse at:

Country Kitchen

██████████ stated Card is employed by First Fleet Trucking and delivers bread to Country Kitchen daily. ██████████ stated further Card has been delivering to this location for approximately 6 months. ██████████ stated when Card first began delivering he made a strange comment to ██████████ stating "I'm not gay or a pedophile, but just show me where the bread goes".

██████████ advised last Thursday October 19 Card stated he knew ██████████ and ██████████ were talking about him and stated "maybe you will be the ones I snap on". ██████████ said it seemed Card may have been hearing voices as neither he or ██████████ had said anything about Card. ██████████ stated Card did "get in his face" but also advised that no direct threats were made. ██████████ advised the last time he saw Card was the day prior which was October 24, 2023 at approximately 2330 hours.

██████████ advised **Card may have access to a First Fleet truck** and also advised the business should not be receiving any shipments tonight as Lewiston is locked down.

I made contact with the building manager and advised him of the situation.

After a brief time at the High School I along with Chief Caton and Corporal Sage went to Frost Hill Road in Lisbon to relief the Androscoggin Deputies that were there. We stood watching an open field to the North of the Roadway. Shortly after noon I began roaming patrols with Deputy McNally and Detective Mejia. We assisted as cover officers for several suspicious incidents in Lisbon during the afternoon that were unfounded.

On October 26th, I went to Lewiston to assist with the man hunt for Robert Card after the mass shooting in Lewiston the night prior. After signing in at the Lewiston High School I met with Deputies from the Androscoggin County Sheriff Office and assisted with a perimeter detail on Frost Hill Ave. After this area was searched we patrolled Lisbon and assisted with calls along with Lisbon Police Department. Area patrolled were along the walking path that was suspected to be used by Robert Card.

DETAILS:

1. On the above date, I was notified of an active shooter in the city of Lewiston. The Androscoggin County Regional Communication Center advised they were looking for all available officers to help as the gunman had already killed multiple people and had not been located. I responded to the Lewiston High School where the staging area had been determined. After several moments we received word the Card's vehicle had been located at the boat landing at the end of Frost Hill Avenue. Myself along with multiple other officers responded to this location and found Card gone on arrival but his vehicle was there and had been in a crash. The area was secured with a perimeter and ultimately taken over by State police and officers moved to mobile patrols in an attempt to locate Card. After several hours, I joined a perimeter watch at the other end of Frost Hill Ave. I remained there until relieved.

2. On 10/26/2023, I responded to the Lewiston High School with Chief Caton and Sgt. Adams. There we were asked to assist with a perimeter watch on Frost Hill Ave overlooking a field. We responded to this location and watched the field without incident. We were disbanded from that detail and assisted the Lisbon Police Department by backing up their units which were investigating possible sightings of Card, phoned in by the community. Card was ultimately not located this day and we ended our assistance at approximately 1600hrs. No further involvement.

On October 25, 2023, while working for the Kennebec Sheriff's Office, I was made aware of a critical incident in the City of Lewiston reference an active shooter and mass casualty event. After hearing of the incident, I contacted Lt Read to ensure he was aware of what was occurring, which he was.

2133hrs- I spoke with Lt Theiss from the Lewiston Police department, Lt. Theiss requested if we could have a couple units respond to the command post at the Lewiston police department to assist in any way with the incident.

2136- I informed Lt Read of the request and after a conversation it was determined to have 4 deputies respond to the command post.

Between 2141hrs and 2154hrs I requested additional units on top of what units were already working, those units were Deputies Theiss, Boudreau, Gaudet, Day, and Dixon.

As the incident was unraveling, information about the suspect was being disseminated. The suspect was Robert Card [REDACTED] out of Bowdoin, and was possibly driving a white Subaru Outback [REDACTED]. MSP requested a unit check a residence in Wayne for the subject, so Deputy Wood and I started to respond to the Town of Wayne to check the address. As I was responding, the suspect vehicle was located at a boat launch in the town of Lisbon. I responded to Lisbon along with all units mentioned above and Lt Bill Johnson.

I initially responded to the intersection of Frost Hill Ave. and Rt. 9 where there were multiple other agencies already on scene. After some time there, the Sgt from Lisbon requested a few teams go mobile in their vehicles to check the surrounding area. Deputy Gaudet and I drove on Rt. 196 to Capital Ave. and checked a few parking lots to include the Maine Recycling Corporation parking lot. At the request of Lt Johnson, we responded to the location where the majority of KSO units were at the River Rd./ Rt. 196 intersection area. The information at this time was not well organized since the situation was a fluid one. Lt Johnson contacted the command post in Lewiston and the CP requested our units to respond to the Schemengees bar and grill to conduct scene security/preservation and relieve the units that were currently there.

All units arrived at 551 Lincoln St. Lewiston at approximately 0100hrs to take over the security and preservation of the scene. KSO units maintained a safe perimeter at the bar to include shutting down the roadway, having ground units on the outside of the premises, a roof unit, and units floating to assist other units. Deputy Theiss was tasked with keeping the log for all individuals entering and leaving. While on scene, members of the Maine State Police [REDACTED] along with the FBI and Maine Warden service were starting to process the crime scene. The overall scene was secured until members of MDEA took over the post at 0730hrs on October 26, 2023 in which time all units cleared the incident.

On October 25, 2023 at approximately 2000 hours, I learned about a possible active shooter in Lewiston via a news alert. Suspecting that the Lewiston Police Department (LPD) would request assistance from neighboring jurisdictions, I donned my olive drab field uniform and departed my residence intending to stage on route 126 at the intersection of the Hallowell Rd in Litchfield.

While enroute, I encountered three on duty Kennebec County Sheriff's Office (KSO) Deputies (Scott Dumas, Elijah Curtis, and Eric Theiss) traveling southwest toward Monmouth. All units briefly staged at the gas station located at the intersection of route 126 and S. Monmouth Rd. There, the deputies provided me with additional information, such as the suspected vehicle description.

As we waited at the gas station, Deputies Curtis and Theiss departed the area to check a separate location while Deputy Dumas and I remained in the parking lot. A few minutes later, I received a telephone call from Sgt. Michael Dutil of the KSO. Sgt. Dutil informed me that he had received a request for assistance from the Lewiston PD and asked if I would respond. I informed Sgt. Dutil that I would respond to Lewiston and instructed him to send three additional deputies with me. Additionally, I asked Sgt. Dutil to call in additional deputies to cover calls for service in the county. Before hanging up the phone, Sgt. Dutil informed me that the Lewiston PD requested that we respond to the Lewiston PD in Lewiston.

Upon arrival at the Lewiston PD, I observed a significant uniformed police presence, including [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] members ringed the exterior of the building and had established an entry control point. Upon entering the building, Deputy Eric Theiss and I met with Lt. James Theiss of the Lewiston PD and I told him about the manpower I had enroute. Lt. Theiss provided me with a suspected vehicle description and showed me a photograph of a potential suspect. He then stated that the vehicle had been located near a boat launch in the area of Lisbon St. and River Rd. in Lisbon ME. Lt. Theiss asked that I take my team to that location and provide assistance with the search for the suspect.

Upon leaving the Lewiston PD, I instructed, via radio, all KSO deputies responding to Lewiston to proceed to the boat launch area. Several of the deputies informed me that they had already arrived but were providing assistance at a different staging area southeast of the boat launch. Given this information, I instructed them to remain at their location whist Deputy Theiss and I responded to [REDACTED].

When I arrived near the intersection of Lisbon St. and River Rd., I observed several marked and unmarked police cars parked along Lisbon Rd. I parked on the right side of the roadway and walked the remaining 100 or so yards to the intersection. As I walked toward the intersection, I could see flashing amber lights emitting through the trees from a location in which I presumed the boat launch to be located. From my vantage point, I could not see the car from which the lights were flashing.

Once at the intersection, I met with several members of a police [REDACTED] but do not know from which agency the originated. Once I identified the team leader, I asked if this was the [REDACTED] area but he told me that it was not. I then asked for the location of the [REDACTED] but again, he said that there wasn't one. I told the team leader that Lewiston PD sent my team to this location to provide assistance and asked what he needed. [REDACTED]

██████████ I then left the immediate area and Deputy Theiss and I began providing security toward the tree line.

After about 20 minutes or so, two civilian cars pulled up behind us. Upon contacting the occupants, I learned that that they contained television crews from two separate news outlets. The reporters exited their vehicles and began setting up cameras. As Deputy Theiss and I were the only two providing security, I met with the tactical team leader again and told him about the reporters. The team leader asked that I move the reporters out of the area and back past the school.

I then returned to the location in which the reporters were located and asked them to move northwest along Lisbon St. and to location northwest past the school. Both reporters were receptive to my request and quickly relocated northwest along Lisbon St. to a location out of my view.

At around 0045 hours, I contacted Sgt. Dutil and asked him what the KSO deputies positioned to the southeast were doing. According to Sgt. Dutil, the deputies located on the south side of the boat launch did not have any specific assignments and were standing near a group of other police officers. Given the lack of assignments and poor interagency communications, I instructed Sgt. Dutil to collect all KSO deputies and proceed to my location on the northwest side. Sgt. Dutil informed me that Deputy Jeffery Beaudreau and his K9 were also on scene. Since Deputy Beaudreau and his K9 were not being utilized for any search efforts, I instructed Sgt. Dutil to relieve Deputy Beaudreau and send him home, as I suspected that fresh relief would be needed the following day or days.

A few minutes later, Sgt. Dutil, along with Deputies Jeremy Day, Elijah Curtis, Jordan Gaudet, and Sean Dixon arrived at my location. I posted the deputies ██████████ along the south side of Lisbon St. so as to provide security.

At about 0115, I spoke with Lt. James Theiss of the Lewiston PD. Lt. Theiss asked if I had the manpower to relieve the crime scene perimeter team located at Schemengess Bar & Grille (551 Lincoln St. in Lewiston). He then asked me to attend a 0200 briefing that was scheduled to be held at the Lewiston High School. After receiving the request, I collected all remaining KSO deputies that were in the Lewiston area and proceeded to Schemengess Bar & Grille.

Upon arriving at the Bar & Grille, I contacted a Lewiston PD sergeant. The sergeant asked that KSO deputies relieve his officers in five locations around the building. Consequently, I posted Deputy Sean Dixon ██████████ to provide overwatch and cover to the officers ██████████. Deputy Curtis was posted to ██████████ the parking lot. Deputy Gaudet was posted ██████████ on Lincoln St. ██████████. Deputy Dumas was posted ██████████ on Lincoln St. at the intersection of South Avenue. Deputy Theiss was assigned to take over the crime scene entry/exit log. Deputy Day was assigned ██████████ and was tasked with providing relief to the static posts. Sgt. Dutil was assigned as the team supervisor. Once all

KSO deputies were in place, Lewiston PD officers departed the scene. I then left Sgt. Dutil in command and proceeded to Lewiston High School as requested.

I remained at Lewiston High School until approximately 0240 when I was met by Lt. Theiss and a MSP detective. The MSP detective said there was not going to be a briefing and asked if KSO could maintain the crime scene perimeter until sometime in the morning when relief would arrive. I agreed to the request and returned to Schemengess on Lincoln St.

Once back at the Bar & Grille, I took note of the scene. I saw that Schemengess Bar & Grille is a single-story structure with the main entrance facing northwest. Multiple vehicles remained in the parking lot, assumedly unoccupied. I saw that yellow crime scene tape had been placed along the parking lot entrance at the edge of the roadway. Another strip of crime scene tape was hanging between the railings upon the stairway leading to the main entrance to the building. From the roadway, I could see [REDACTED] the parking lot. [REDACTED]

On the roadway, just outside the parking lot entrance and the crime scene tape, I observed an expended taser cartridge. The cartridge still had the taser probes attached but appeared to be more than several hours old. Additionally, a silver-colored police style whistle was found on the ground next to the cartridge. On the opposite side of Lincoln St., and the Bar & Grille, I observed a single hiking shoe in the roadway. The shoe did not appear to exhibit any signs of weathering, looked dry, and unmolested from vehicular traffic. The taser cartridge, whistle, and hiking shoe were all brought to the attention of the crime scene technicians.

At approximately 0730 hours, the perimeter relief team began arriving. As they arrived, I swapped out KSO deputies with the relief officers. Once all deputies were relieved, they cleared the scene, went out of service, and proceeded back to Kennebec County. I remained on scene manning a traffic control post until I was relieved at around 0800. I then went out of service and returned to Kennebec County. Nothing further.

On 10/25/2023, I was working my normal scheduled patrol shift (1600-0400) at the Kennebec County Sheriff Department. During my shift, I was made aware of a possible active shooter situation that was ongoing in the City of Lewiston Maine. At around 2000 hours, Deputy Curtis, Boivin and I began to travel towards Lewiston via Rt 126 in Litchfield. While en-route, a vehicle description for a possible suspect was announced via radio and it was found that the suspect, Robert Card [REDACTED] lived in Bowdoin Maine [REDACTED]. Card was possible operating a white Subaru that was registered to him.

I pulled over on Rt 126 and while parked, a Ram Pickup pulled over in front of me. This vehicle was currently being operated by Lt. Johnson of the Kennebec County Sheriff's Department. I met Lt. Johnson and we agreed to stage at a nearby gas station (South Monmouth Market). Lt. Johnson, Deputy Curtis, Boivin and I then went over the minimal details we had of the incident and informed Lt. Johnson of the vehicle description. Deputy Curtis and Boivin left this location to check another call.

While standing by with Lt. Johnson, I was directed to meet with Deputy Curtis and Boivin at Gowell's Shop and Save on the corner of Richmond Road and Huntington Hill Rd to be on the lookout for the suspect vehicle. I then met with Deputy Curtis and Boivin at this location and remained there for approximately 10 minutes. Soon after our arrival, all police units were made aware of the suspect vehicle being located at a boat launch in Lisbon of Rt 196. It was not immediately known of the suspect was in the vehicle at this time so I responded directly to this location along with Deputy Curtis and Boivin.

Soon after my arrival in the town of Lisbon, I observed a heavy police presence from various police agencies around the state. I responded directly to the boat launch area and observed the suspect vehicle parked. At this time there was several hundred police units congregated on the vehicle which was presumed to be unoccupied from my understanding. Deputy Curtis, Boivin and I then cleared from this scene to create a larger perimeter in hopes of containing the suspect.

I began to check locations east of the boat launch on Rt196 to include Lisbon High School and Philip W. Sugg Middle School. After several minutes of searching, Deputy Curtis was advised of a trail that leaves from the boat launch where the vehicle was found and ends in the area of Davis St. Deputy Curtis, Boivin and I then drive to the end of the trail and exited our patrol vehicle to maintain a perimeter in this location. After several hours on scene, I was directed by Lt. Johnson to respond to Lincoln St in Lewiston to assist in scene security of Schemengees Bar and Grille.

On October 25, 2023, I was working my regular scheduled patrol shift (1600-0400) and field training Deputy Boivin. During the shift, I was made aware of a possible active shooter situation that was happening in the city of Lewiston. At approximately 2000 hours, Deputy Dumas, Deputy Boivin, and I traveled toward Lewiston via Route 126, Litchfield/Monmouth as we were attempting to be as close to the call as possible in case law enforcement at the scene requested backup while also staying near our assigned area. While in-route, we received a vehicle description for a possible suspect (Robert Card) who was possibly operating a white Subaru [REDACTED].

We met with Lt. Johnson at the South Monmouth Market and staged there while we went over the minimal information we had of the incident and gave Lt. Johnson the description of the suspected vehicle. While we were at the gas station, Deputy Boivin and I received a call in Litchfield and responded to that call as it was for shoots fired in the area. After clearing this call, we met with Deputy Dumas at the Gowell's Shop and Save Center Road, Litchfield to be on the lookout for the suspect as he lived [REDACTED], Bowdoin.

Deputy Dumas, Deputy Boivin, and I were at Gowell's Shop and Save for approximately 10 minutes when we were made aware of the suspect vehicle being located at a boat launch in Lisbon on Route 196. We responded directly to this location as it was not known if the suspect was in the vehicle. Soon after arriving in Lisbon a heavy police presence was observed from multiple law enforcement agencies throughout central Maine and Federal agencies. We responded directly to the boat launch area where I observed the suspect vehicle which appeared to be parked with its hazard lights on. At this point there was a large number of law enforcement officers congregated on the vehicle was believed to be unoccupied. Deputy Dumas, Deputy Boivin, and I then cleared the scene to create a larger perimeter in the hopes of containing the suspect.

We began to check locations east of the boat launch on Route 196 to include Lisbon High School and Philip W. Sugg Middle School. After a few minutes, I was advised there was a trail that goes from the boat launch where the suspect vehicle was found and ends in the area of Davis Street. Deputy Dumas, Deputy Boivin, and I then drove to the end of the trail and exited our cruisers to maintain a perimeter in the location. After several hours on scene, we were directed to respond to Lincoln Street, Lewiston to provided scene security of the Schemengees Bar and Grille.

Upon arriving in Lewiston I was directed to the East Corner of the parking lot at Schemengees to secure the corner of the parking lot until I was relieved by MDEA at approximately 0730 hours.

This ends my involvement in this case.

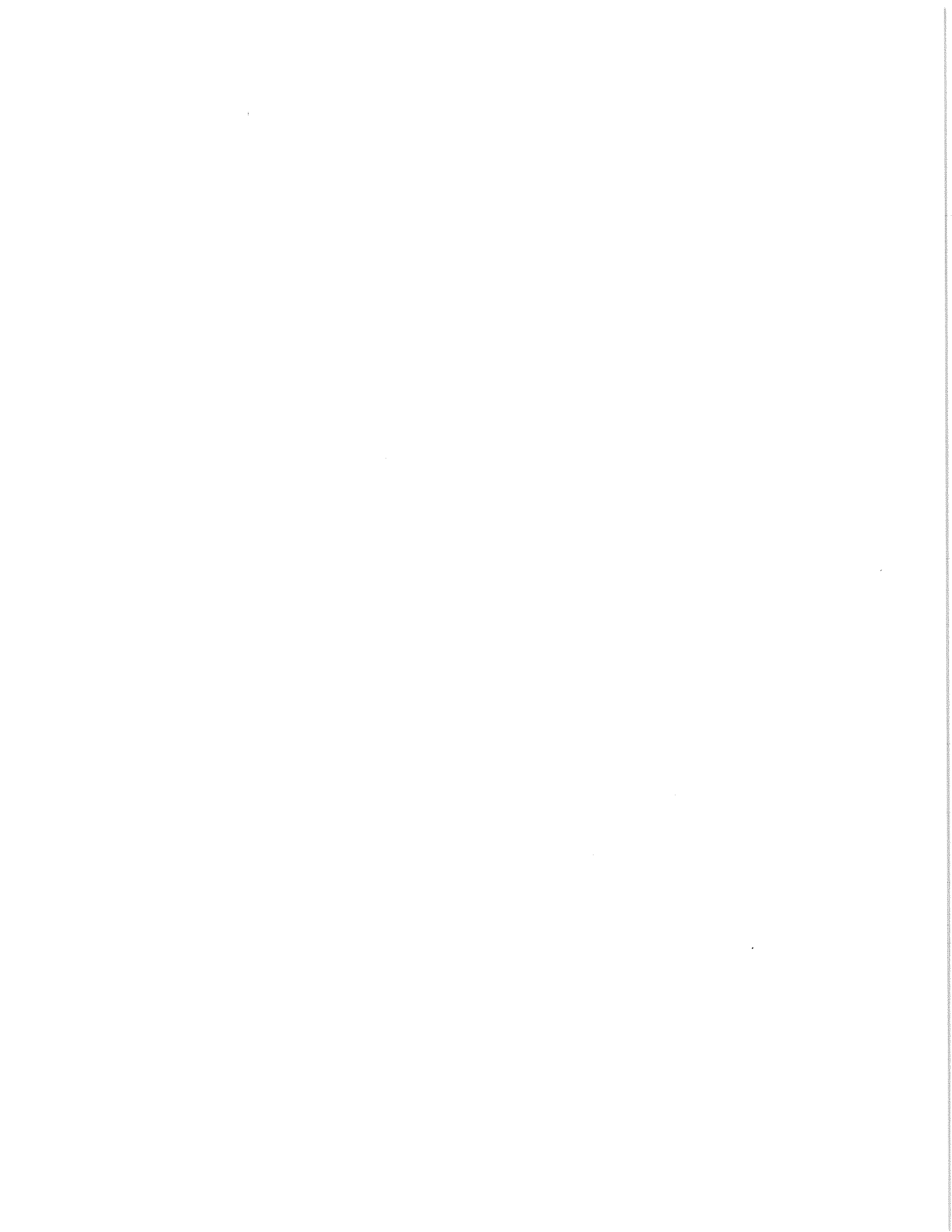

On 10-25-23 at approximately 2100 hours I became aware of a reported active shooter type incident involving multiple locations had occurred in Lewiston. After confirming this information with Sgt. Michel Dutil I volunteered to respond to the Lewiston area to provide additional support in the incident.

I had learned there was at least one suspect described from a security video. The suspect was described as a white male with dark hair, beard and wearing a brown sweatshirt and dark pants. The suspect was armed with a rifle and additional secondary weapons based on the image from the security video.

While en route I was notified that the suspect's vehicle was located at a boat launch/ramp area in Lisbon. I was directed to respond to the area of Lisbon. I was directed to the area of an establishment known as Big Dipper Ice Cream located at 501 Lisbon Street.

Upon arrival I connected up with Kennebec Sheriff's Office personnel which included Dep. Jordan Gaudet, Dep. Jeff Boudreau, Dep. Sean Dixon and Sgt. Dutil. I was advised Deputies Dumais, Curtis and Thiess were also in the area as well as Lt. William Johnson.

Initially I was part of a perimeter unit, but was directed to connect with Lt. Johnson near the area where the vehicle was located. I was informed I would be part of a perimeter unit set up around a wooded area where the vehicle was located. I took a position along the roadway which ran parallel with the tree line. I was in this area with Sgt. Dutil, Deputies Dixon, Gaudet and Theiss as well as Lt. Johnson.

I remained in this area until I was directed to respond to 551 Lincoln Street at Schemengees Bar & Grille. The bar was one of the crime scenes involved in the incident. On 10/25/2023, I was off duty and learned of a mass casualty, active shooter incident in the City of Lewiston; I learned that the shooter, who was later identified as Robert R. Card [REDACTED] had shot multiple people at two different locations, causing numerous fatalities and others who were critically injured. I also obtained information that CARD was still at large and he had an unknown whereabouts.

I called the on-duty supervisor for Kennebec County Sheriff's Department, Sergeant Mike Dutil. I advised Sergeant Dutil that I was off duty and available to respond to any area if needed. At approximately 2155 hours, I spoke with Sergeant Dutil; he advised me that Lieutenant Johnson was headed to Lewiston and advised me to head down and meet him and Deputy Eric Theiss, who was on his way also. A very short time later, I heard traffic that CARDS vehicle had been located at the Lisbon Boat launch.

I started down to the Lewiston area. While en route, I was advised by Sergeant Dutil to hang back in the Town of Litchfield in case on-duty units needed any assistance instead of responding directly to Lewiston. Moments after, Lieutenant Johnson came over the air and asked Sergeant Dutil for a roster update for our agency. Lieutenant Johnson advised that he was headed to Lisbon to assist there. He asked for all his units to redirect to the area. I acknowledge this transmission over there air and diverted to Lisbon.

I arrived on the scene in Lisbon at the intersection of Frost Hill Ave and Ridge Road; I met with Deputy Jeffery Boudreau, who was already on the scene. Deputy Boudreau and I set up our patrol vehicle across Frost Hill Ave facing South, as this was the last known area of where CARD would be coming from. Sergeant Dutil arrived on the scene. We were all advised by Lisbon Police Sergeant that their Chief had requested units to start sweeping the area in vehicles. Sergeant Dutil and I entered one vehicle and began canvassing the immediate area. We were advised that CARD used to work at "Maine Recycling Corporation" [REDACTED]. Sergeant Dutil and I started down to that location. We drove into and around the recycling center and did a cursory search of the area. As we were doing so, Sergeant Dutil was contacted by Lieutenant Johnson, requesting we respond to the boat launch area to link up with all of the agency units, during our search we observed nothing suspicious.

Sergeant Dutil and I left the area and responded to the area of the boat launch. We arrived and met with other units, Lieutenant Johnson, Deputy Day, Deputy Dixon, and Deputy Theiss. Lieutenant Johnson was trying to obtain updates and direction for our team but could not establish any command post for the area, as our team had no orders and we were not receiving any information about operations and our responsibility moving forward. Lieutenant Johnson called the Lewiston command post, and we received direction that our team would relocate to 551 Lincoln Street in Lewiston (Schemengess Bar & Grill) to relieve Lewiston officers from the scene and provide scene security.

Upon my arrival at 551 Lincoln Street at approximately 0100 hours, I was given the assignment to block the road [REDACTED]. I placed my cruiser across the street and held this post until Lieutenant Johnson directed me to switch positions with Deputy Dixon, who was currently assigned to scene overwatch [REDACTED]. I relieved Deputy Dixon and provided scene overwatch until approximately 0700 hours on 10/26/2023. While on [REDACTED], I did not observe any other notable evidence.

After approximately 30 minutes Lt. Johnson advised us that we would be moving our location to Schemengees Bar and Grill in Lewiston.

When we arrived at Schemengees Bar I was instructed to provide overwatch [REDACTED] while investigators processed the scene. I stood this post until being relieved a short time after 7:00 AM.

DETAILS:

On October 25th, 2023, I, Detective David Davol was off duty when I spoke with Detective George Cayer of the Rumford Police Department. I learned of an active shooter in Lewiston and was activated [REDACTED]. I was instructed to the Colisee in Lewiston which is where the command was. I met with other members [REDACTED] there. After some time of waiting for instruction we went to the armory in Lewiston to interview witnesses. Due to sickness, I did not do any interviews.

After that, we were instructed to go to the Lewiston High School which is where the new command post would be. I was instructed to go home and come back in the morning.

I returned to the command post the next morning. Members of the [REDACTED] and I followed up on leads including talking to Card's family. We then set a perimeter for family member's residences while the [REDACTED] conducted searches of the respective residences. I cleared that evening and did not return to the area before Card was found.

At approximately 2130 hrs while off duty at my residence I became aware of the active shooter situation that had taken place in the greater Lewiston area via the local news media. They stated that a number of people had been killed and a large number of subjects were also injured.

I took my portable radio and turned it on, to find that our department had located the suspects vehicle in our town and a search for the suspect was underway. I immediately geared up and headed to the station to assist in attempts to locate the suspect.

Upon arriving at the station I found that a majority of the staff were already deployed and actively searching for the suspect. I assisted dispatch with locations and directions to assisting outside agency officers from the incoming calls from residents. Residents were aware of the activity and attempting to provide information as to where the suspect might be or suspicious activity that they believed was taking place near their homes during this time.

At approximately 2330 hrs I made use of our [REDACTED] to patrol as other units were answering numerous calls. I assisted in several calls of suspicious activity to find that the vehicle which I was using was not suitable to the calls we were handling.

I returned to the station and awaited Det. Richard St. Amant and SRO Renee Bernard to come in and pick me up to continue with the search of buildings / business properties in which the suspect may be attempting to conceal himself in.

At approximately 0145 hrs Det. St Amant , SRO Bernard, and I left the station to continue to check the Capitol Ave area in Lisbon Falls. Information had been passed on that the suspect had been an employee of Maine Recycling which is located there. The area of Capitol Ave is roughly one mile from where the suspect's vehicle was located and would have been very accessible via the walking path by traveling east from the boat launch area.

Once on Capitol Ave we passed the exit of the transfer station and checked a vacant business building just beyond L&B Electric. We checked all access points of this building to find the building secure. Next we drove into the lot across the street which houses Blue OX Brewing. The front of the building appeared secure and we checked the rear as well. While at the rear of the building we checked for any recent activity leading into the main portion of the Maine Recycling building as there is a open gap in the security fencing at this location. No activity appeared to be present in the wet dew of the grass and there was no disruption in any other materials.

Upon leaving that location we entered the trailer storage lot and employee parking area of Maine Recycling facility. We circled the area with the cruiser and exited a number of times to check unlocked trailers. I noted at this time that we were not in a safe environment based on the lack of cover and inadequate resources of manpower, as well as a lack of firepower. (no long guns). We continued to check as safety would allow and moved on. It should be noted that there was approximately 40 trailers on this storage lot.

We then moved on to the former ETTI Building and Enterprise Electric facility and both appeared secure as they are alarmed as well. As we moved to the southwest corner of the Capitol Ave circle we moved to the Kelly Brothers building. At the rear of this building I located and unsecured door. The time now was 0242 hrs. We notified dispatch of our location and started the clearing process for this building while other units were enroute to our location. With the assistance of a number of cover units we completed the clearing process for this location.

After this clearing process we were notified by dispatch to stop working in the area as the command post wanted to secure the perimeter and felt it would be safer to do the clearing process during the daylight hours Thursday. We cleared the area and took up a position at the intersection of Rt 196 and Capitol Ave. by blocking access to the business park.

At approximately 0400 hrs we were relieved from this location and told to secure for the night and return at 1030 hrs on Thursday 10/26.

On 10/25/2023 at approx 1920 hours, I was off duty and came to hear of the report of potentially two active shooters in the Lewiston area. I inquired with our dispatch supervisor who requested I respond, as it was later learned, all available area resources were being called in.

I arrived at the police department shortly after and quickly checked in with dispatch to find there were mass casualties and injuries being reported from two scenes in Lewiston, with the suspect being unaccounted for. I suited up, acquired a vehicle, and performed a function check of my department issued rifle. Contact was made with Ofc. T. Blais and we left the station, paired up in a marked Lisbon Police cruiser.

While monitoring multiple police channels, we initially responded to the area of the over pass, near Lisbon Street and Quimby in Lewiston for the report of a motor vehicle accident, with initial reports indicating the possibility of it being the suspect vehicle. As we arrived in the area, Lewiston units had already arrived and confirmed it to be a separate incident and an unrelated vehicle. During this time, numerous reports were being received from area agencies regarding suspicious vehicles, suspicious person, and sound of gun shots heard. The calls were addressed by Lisbon units as quickly as possible.

After clearing several calls in the Lisbon area, all determined to be unrelated to the incidents in Lewiston, Ofc. Blais and I took a position at the town line and awaited more information. Within minutes, radio traffic was overheard regarding an armed subject at the Walmart Distribution Center, located at Goddard Road and Alfred Plourde Parkway in Lewiston. Assuming there would be a large response, we opted to take an alternate route, avoiding traffic and putting ourselves in a possible escape path that would not be heavily traveled. Upon arrival, the cruiser was left at Alfred Plourde and River Road, taking up a position on a nearby hill for a better vantage point. This area was held until it was determined to not be related or even accurate. The large amount of police cruisers on scene were observed leaving the area. No information was heard via State Wide Car to Car. This area is problematic for our radios as it seems to received poor reception. Once more units moved out, it was summized the area was clear and our presence there was no longer needed. It was at this time information had been received from a contact at Lewiston Police of the identity of the suspect, Robert Card. Card was confirmed to be wearing cargo pants and a brown hooded sweatshirt. He was confirmed to be armed with a high power rifle with after market optics and what appeared to be numerous magazines. He was said to be driving a white Subaru with a black front bumper and roof rack. This was acquired from video from the second crime scene. This was forwarded to dispatch and shared with the other officers. There was no reason to believe Card was not still armed. Rumors of additional weapons systems were heard.

Upon returning to Lisbon, we remained mobile, checking any alternate routes and possible parking areas. A call was received for a residential area in Lisbon where a white Subaru was observed loitering in the area. Several units responded and it was found the vehicle was no longer in the area. The caller was spoke with prior to clearing. No additional information was attained.

With the Lisbon area being heavily patrolled, we opted to move to Lisbon Falls to expand the coverage of patrol units. While traveling east on Lisbon Street and passing by the intersection with Frosthill Ave, a glimpse of something was observed in the parking area of the boat launch. The object was at the back of the lot, where the is no lighting. This lot is checked during regular overnight patrol and what was seen was not typical. We pulled to the side of the road and reversed direction. Upon pulling into the lot using the first entryway, spot lights were activated and a white Subaru wagon with a black front bumper and roof rack was observed. Dispatch was notified of the findings while Ofc. Blais provided cover. With the entryway blocked, we exited the cruiser and took up positions of cover, keeping the vehicle and riverbank area in sight while additional support responded. Upon the arrival of additional units, Chief McGee used the second entryway of the lot and was able to confirm the license plate, which was the BOLO'd vehicle. These are the only two entry ways into the lot. At no time did any vehicle or officer enter the parking area of the lot, only blocking the entry ways and setting up a perimeter. Upon arrival of the Maine State Police [REDACTED]

Shortly after clearing the area of the boat launch, a report from an employee at Springworks advised of suspicious activity with a warehouse on the property. Several units, including Ofc. Blais and myself responded. Several units were already on scene and a plan was made to have [REDACTED] make entry and clear the building. A perimeter position was taken up to monitor [REDACTED] the warehouse. The concealed position was held until Chief McGee alerted perimeter units that the building was clear with no suspect or evidence of him being there was located. We continued to patrol the town throughout the night and address complaints as they were received. Card was said to have been employed at Maine Recycling, located on Capital Ave, but employment had recently ended. It was known management had been contacted and instructed to not open the upcoming morning, as a cautionary measure.

Information was received from the command post of several addresses in Lisbon Falls that Card would have connections to and could be areas of interest. After checking several other areas where suspicious activity was reported, the residence at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I am familiar with the address and the renters. Numerous calls were made to the renter but all went to voice mail. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Card was not located, nor was there knowledge of him being in the area.

With all available Lisbon units on duty and many having worked during the previous day, command staff cleared numerous officers, leaving about half on duty and advised we would remain activated until 1100 of 10/26/2023. This would create two shifts and allow everyone time to rest.

These functions continued heading towards the weekend. State police checked numerous addresses out of town with no success in locating Card. While units continued to patrol during the morning hours of 10/27/2023, Ofc. S. Kelly had arrived and was in the area of Maine Recycling. Ofc. Kelly observed the interior seat of a commercial truck, owned by the business, pushed forward and knew this was not typical and notified dispatch. Most of these trucks are equipped with sleeper cabs, or an extended passenger area behind the front seats. With the seat moved forward, it presented the possibility someone had entered the truck, moved the seat forward and was concealed with the sleeper area. Multiple units converged on the area, with several clearing the one truck of interest, while other units provided area coverage. During the inspection, it was noted all trucks were not locked. All trucks were confirmed to be unoccupied.

Further inspection of the property yielded two unsecured doors on the main facility. Additional assistance was requested from the sheriff's office. Once sufficient support arrived, an entry team was assembled and the building was cleared, while remaining officers held the outside perimeter and kept media representatives at a safe distance, pending an armed confrontation ensued. The building was confirmed to be clear. Officers were not able to secure the building as one door latch was previously damaged and one key pad equipped door latch was malfunctioning. Business management was contacted and already aware of this. Units cleared the facility.

Upon return to duty on the evening of 10/27/2023, the oncoming shift was briefed on the events of the day and plans for the upcoming shift, leading into the weekend. After briefing, numerous patrol tasks were addressed and the shift readied for continued search and support efforts. At approx 20:34, Dispatch Supervisor Roy advised Chief McGee was on his way back to town and requested I call him immediately. Upon calling, Chief McGee advised Card had been located in a rear lot at Maine Recycling, deceased, and was on his way to Lewiston for a briefing. I notified duty officers and called several who were off duty, who were able to return to work to assist with security functions. Officers converged on the area, providing perimeter security, while the search team processed the newly located scene. Patrol and security functions continued throughout the night for the remainder of the shift.

Sgt. Nathan Morse

On Wednesday, October 25th at 1941 I received a call from Lisbon PD telling me to report to work due to a critical incident happening in Lewiston.

I arrived at the PD by 2000 hours and grabbed the only cruiser left, cruiser 4. Officer Kenney, rode with me as we immediately heard a report of an active shooter scene at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. LT Picard told us to start that way.

Officer Kenney and I responded and set up at one of the exits from the Distribution Center. We had no actionable intel at this point, but sought to control the flow of civilian traffic in and out of the facility.

Shortly after arriving I noticed a silver SUV coming from the direction of the facility. I stepped up to the vehicle directing it to stop. When I shown my flashlight into the vehicle I noticed an AR-15 style pistol laying in the front seat next to the driver. After ordering him to not touch the weapon and turn the car off, he was placed in handcuffs for our safety until we could figure out what was going on. The firearm was loaded with the safety off when I secured it. I made the weapon safe and stored in the back of my cruiser.

Officers at this scene started sharing images of a suspect and his white vehicle. They were getting texts from their network and sharing information with each other. It became clear that the person I was detaining was not involved. The scene was moving away from Walmart and Officer Kenney and I needed to get back to Lisbon to answer calls and deter this suspect from striking in Lisbon. I released [REDACTED] and told him that I was keeping the firearm until this was over. I told [REDACTED] would be at Lisbon PD [REDACTED] pick it up at some point in the future. Officer Kenny and I returned to Lisbon and started working local calls for service.

On 10/25/23 at approximately 1917 hours, I responded to Schemengees Bar and Grill on Lincoln Street in Lewiston regarding an Active Shooter in progress. Upon my arrival, multiple police units had already arrived on scene. I exited my cruiser with my rifle and made my way down to the entrance of Schemengees. As I was approaching the door, another officer (unknown) was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]

I grabbed the [REDACTED]. I transported him directly to Central Maine Medical Center, and then headed back to Schemengees. I believe on or around 1950 hours, I arrived at Schemengees and met up with Sgt. Levesque. Myself, Sgt. Levesque and ASO K9 Deputy Barr posted ourselves on the roof of Schemengees so we could try and cover the units on the ground as we still did not know where the shooter was.

At approximately 2025 hours, we received information that there were two suspects, and one with a gun at the Walmart Distribution Center. Myself, Sgt. Levesque and Deputy Barr exited the roof and separately drove to that location. Upon arrival, there were multiple agencies on scene, so I joined up with a group of 5-6 ASO Deputies, and we entered through the east side of the Walmart facility. At that time, the only information we had was "possibly two suspects, middle eastern decent, and one having a gun".

There were other "teams" that were heading into the facility, but I cant recall who they were. Together we cleared the building, but did not locate any suspects. Units started to disperse from Walmart, and I came back to Lisbon. At approximately 2153 hours, the suspects vehicle was located at the Lisbon boat ramp located on the corner of Rt.196 and Frost Hill Ave. I responded to that location and upon arrival, I could see Sgt. Morse and Ofc. Blais had taken a position 30-40 feet away from the suspect vehicle. I pulled in several feet behind their cruiser, and took a position behind my cruiser with my rifle.

Other units were pulling in, and also taking up positions. We were instructed by State Police not to approach the vehicle, and wait [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The suspects name was confirmed as Robert Card. As State Police arrived, [REDACTED]

Throughout the evening and into the early morning hours, we all responded to different locations as new information was being relayed to us. Card had not been located, and at approximately 0800 on thursday, I was relieved of duty, and went home to get some sleep. I returned at approximately 1800 on Thursday, and the search continued. We began working in pairs and responding to calls for service. On or about 0517 hours, myself and Ofc. Kelly located an open door at Maine Recycling. We requested more units and upon their arrival, we cleared the building. On or around 0800 Friday morning I was relieved from duty.

I returned Friday evening at approximately 1800 hours where I was paired up with Officer Cusson. We responded to calls for service at the beginning of our shift, and then we were sent to Capital Ave to block the entrance onto that street. On or around 2030 hours, we recieved information that State Police had found Card's body, deceased [REDACTED] in one of the tractor trailers located outside of Maine Recycling.

Myself and Ofc. Cusson remained on Capital Ave to secure the area while State Police investigated. Myself and Ofc. Cusson remained on Capital Ave until around 0200 hours where we were told to move further down Capital Ave. where reporters could get closer to the scene. We remained down by Public Works until we were cleared to leave the area. We finished our shift at approximately 0600. Nothing further.

SYNOPSIS

Robert Card committed multiple homicides by gunfire at two Lewiston, Maine establishments on October 25, 2023. After the mass shooting, Card drove to his vehicle to Lisbon, Maine, where it was located by Lisbon Police officers.

DETAILS

1. On October 25, 2023, at approximately 1916HRS, I was off-duty and in Lewiston on my way to Auburn. I received a phone call from Sgt. Andrew Levesque of the Lisbon Police. Sgt. Levesque explained that Lewiston had a situation and that we may need to call people in. Sgt. Levesque said that there were reports of an active shooter. I told him that I would be on my way. I turned around and was headed back to Lisbon when I made phone contact with Dispatcher Cathy Roy of the Lisbon Police. Dispatcher Roy confirmed that Lewiston was dealing with an active shooter. She also advised that Dingley Press had just called reporting a dark colored SUV in their lot that looks like it was all smashed up, and had all four of its doors open. No one was around the vehicle according to Dingley Press staff. As I passed by Dingley Press I stopped in to check on this vehicle, unsure at this time if it was related to the Lewiston incident. I quickly determined that it was unrelated. I told this to the Dingley Press worker that I saw outside, and also advised him to tell his management to lock their facility, as there was an active shooter in the area. I continued on to the police department. By now, I learned that the shootings had taken place at Just In Time Recreation and Schemenges. A white SUV or station wagon was a vehicle of interest. I learned that two Lisbon officers (Sgt. Levesque and Ofc. Jeff Williams) were en route to help out in Lewiston. I grabbed a cruiser and was accompanied by Tactical Medic Jeff Carr. Shortly after he and I paired up, we were dispatched to a report of an active shooter at the Wal-Mart Distribution Center in Lewiston. This report ended up being unfounded.
 2. After clearing from the Wal-Mart Distribution Center, I was sent to the Colisee in Lewiston, as this is where law enforcement was gathering up. Once there, I was assigned to roam the Lewiston area, looking for the white vehicle of interest. While out patrolling, I think this is when we learned that the vehicle in question was a white Subaru Outback with a dark colored bumper, and possibly driven by Robert Card, who I believe (at this time) was now identified as the shooter.
 3. As Carr and I were roaming Lewiston, I heard radio traffic from Lisbon PD Officers saying that they were going out with a vehicle matching that description at the boat launch on Frost Hill Avenue. The registration plate called out confirmed that it was the vehicle. I headed that way. While en route, we learned that the State Police [REDACTED] didn't want anyone to approach the vehicle. Knowing that, Carr and I headed to the area of the Lisbon Community School, which is where one section of the walking path near the boat launch dumps out. We were joined by several other units from surrounding agencies. By now, the vehicle had been cleared, and it was unoccupied. At one point, myself and three member of the Lewiston Police Department made contact with the on-duty janitor at the Community School. When asked what time he had locked the doors, he wasn't completely sure. With that information, we decided to clear the school, since it was unknown just where the shooter had gone. We cleared the entire school and secured it when done.
 4. By now, most of our PD had been called in and was on scene, serving in one capacity or another. Calls for service were coming in one right after another, and units were responding to and addressing those.
-

5. My roles for the next couple of days were to facilitate staffing to ensure we had proper coverage at all times, and to respond to calls of service that were coming in. I also coordinated having perimeters, barricades, and police line tape in place for both vehicle and foot traffic, in the search areas, to keep the public and media out of those areas. These areas were fluid and were changing frequently, but were in place in the area of the Lisbon Papermill Trail, Lisbon Falls Industrial Park, and Lisbon High School area throughout the event.
6. On the afternoon of Friday, October 27, 2023, I spoke to Michael Martin of Maine Recycling. Martin wanted us to be aware of concerns that he had of Card potentially hiding in one of the box trailers that are in the overflow lot of their business on Capitol Avenue. Martin stated that most of the trailers there are full of returnables (plastic bottles, aluminum cans, etc.) that are bagged in commercially-sized bags. He stated that it would be possible for Card to move some of those bags and hide-out in those trailers. I told Martin that I would pass this information along. After ending the phone call, I met with Chief McGee in his office. I briefed him on Martin's concerns. Chief McGee placed a phone call to the Command Post and gave them the information that Martin had shared.
7. That evening, after I had left for the day, Sgt. Levesque came to my residence to inform me that Card had been located, deceased, in one of those box trailers. I responded back to work so that I could coordinate a perimeter and ensure the area and access to Capitol Avenue was secure and off limits to the public and media.

See the reports of the other Lisbon PD officers for their involvement in this incident.

On 10/25/2023 at about 1919, I heard Lewiston PD getting dispatched to Schmengees Bar for an active shooter. I had just shortly before been notified of the active shooter at the Just in Time Bowling Alley in Lewiston. I advised dispatch to send Officer Williams and that I would be responding too. While en route, I called Lt Picard and Chief McGee and made them aware of the situation.

I arrived on scene to find multiple Police, Fire, and EMS workers performing various tasks. I spoke with Lewiston Officer Simoneau who stated that he needed cruisers to transport injured people to the hospital. I ran back to my cruiser and moved it closer to the building. Once parked, I was informed that there were no more living patients needing transport.

After several minutes, things started to get organized and assignments were being given. I saw Corporal Barr from Androscoggin County talking with firefighters preparing to ladder the roof. He stated that he was going to the roof to provide overwatch in case the shooter was still in the area. Officer Williams and I joined him. I used my department-issued [REDACTED]. At one point, I moved [REDACTED]

We provided overwatch until there was a report of an active shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center. Cpl Barr, Officer Williams, and I climbed off the roof and responded. I made my way to the front entrance and observed several officers there. One stated that he did not believe this was an active shooter. I went back to my cruiser to locate the Lewiston unit in charge to find an assignment. After the building had been cleared, officers were asked to head to the Colisee in Lewiston to muster there and devise a plan.

Once at the Colisee, it was requested that officers perform [REDACTED] and be on the lookout for the white Subaru with a black bumper that was believed to be operated by Robert Card. Officer Cusson joined me in my unmarked cruiser and we headed out towards Sabattus Street.

Around 2230 hours, Sgt Morse from Lisbon PD reported that he had located the vehicle at the boat launch on Frost Hill Ave. Officer Cusson and I responded from Lewiston. We arrived and took cover while aiming rifles at the suspect vehicle. The MSP Tact team was called and arrived to take over the scene. [REDACTED]

Throughout the night, we responded to multiple suspicious condition calls which turned out to be nothing. [REDACTED] assisted in clearing multiple buildings in town, which I was not present for. During the early morning hours, it became clear that this may be an extended search, and units were sent home to get rest in order to come back in the late morning.

10/26/2023

During the course of this shift, Lisbon units responded to more suspicious incidents that uncovered no new information. In the early morning hours of 10/27/2023, Officer Kelly located a Tractor Trailer Truck with a sleeper cab and noticed that the driver's seat was leaned forward, which he found odd. Multiple Officers responded and helped clear the area. Chief McGee then walked to the doors of Maine Recycling and noticed that two were unlocked. Chief McGee called the command post and was told that they would like us to clear the building. We called for more officers and once they arrived, we cleared the building, not finding the suspect

inside.

10/27/2023

I came in for my shift at 1730 hours and prepared assignments for the evening. Lt Picard's shift was ending around 1800 hours and Chief McGee was also working on finishing some tasks before ending his shift, though he planned to remain on-call should we need anything or had any new developments. I was the on duty supervisor for the night shift.

Officer Brushwein was assigned to the boat launch to keep the media back while units were searching the river. At about 2015 hours, he called saying that the teams searching the river had left and he was wondering if he needed to remain at his post. I called the command post and spoke with someone asking if we still needed to man the boat launch. The sergeant advised me that we were all set to clear.

A little after 2030 hours, Chief McGee signed on the radio and asked me to call him. He advised me that Robert Card had been located in a trailer at an overflow lot for Maine Recycling. Officers were assigned to take positions to block all access to Capitol Ave and keep people out of the area. I was positioned at the High School entrance. After a few hours, the area needing to be blocked off was brought closer in. I assigned units to stay with the media and then had units spread around the Capitol Ave loop ensuring scene integrity. As media interest dwindled, I slowly released officers from their posts over the course of the night.

It should be noted that during this event, Capitol Ave was routinely checked and monitored. I made multiple patrols in that area over the course of my shifts.

Wednesday 10/25/2023

On Wednesday 10/25/2023 at approximately 1940 hours, I received a phone call from dispatcher Krista Beaumier. Krista informed me that Lewiston was dealing with at least two active shooter incidents and it was believed the shooter was unaccounted for. I live in Lewiston and had been hearing heavier than normal sirens for a while. Krista stated that all Lisbon units were being called in to assist. I told her I was on my way.

I changed and headed in to the police department, which usually takes approximately ten minutes. When I arrived, Det. Richard St. Amant was in the hallway outside of the locker rooms. I asked if he knew where the shooting had taken place. I understood him to say "Davinci's", but later learned that it was the former Spare Time Recreation bowling alley and Schmengee's.

Once I had dressed in my uniform, I made contact with Det. St. Amant. He advised he had his unmarked car and I told him I would jump in with him. He was dressed in civilian clothes (similar to what he would be wearing as a detective) and he had his external vest carrier on over these clothes.

I grabbed extra medical gloves, a flashlight, and a notebook and we headed west on Rte. 196. We stopped at Dingley Press where other units had responded to check a suspicious vehicle. We would learn that Special Agent Tim Blais had previously checked the vehicle and it was not connected. I was informed that a photo of the suspect had been shared. I checked my phone - text & email - and didn't have any information. We briefly stopped and asked Lt. Picard to send us that information. I received a photo of the suspected shooter which was taken from surveillance footage at one of the locations. As Det. St. Amant and I were leaving Dingley Press, we took a left and headed west again on Rte. 196, this time in the direction of the Lewiston line.

We received notification of an "active shooter" at the Walmart Distribution Center. This is located on the eastern side of Lewiston on the Alfred Plourde Parkway. Det. St. Amant activated his emergency lights and we headed in that direction. Lisbon units were advised to assist Lewiston. As we made our way down Alfred Plourde Parkway from the area of Pleasant St., we noted heavy police traffic all headed toward the Walmart DC. I radioed other responding units of the increased, heavy police traffic. Det. St. Amant advised we would stop at Goddard St. and Alfred Plourde to set up a perimeter. I radioed other units and advised of our position once we arrived. Other units arrived and Ofc. Drake and Ofc. Kenney were on Goddard St. I observed them stop an SUV and detain the operator. He was found in possession of a weapon and the identity of the shooter was unknown.

Shortly after arriving, it was determined that staff at Walmart were locked down but there was no active threat at that location. The law enforcement units that responded were clearing the building. At one point, a supervisor from Lewiston arrived and stated the suspect might be [REDACTED]. I believe dispatcher Cathy Roy was able to locate a DMV photo [REDACTED] and sent it out to us. Det. St. Amant and I stood by near the armory on Alfred Plourde until approximately 2100 hours. Units at the Walmart DC appeared to be clearing and we heard a command post was being established at the Colisee in Lewiston. I briefly spoke with a subject in an unmarked police cruiser who advised he was the Deputy Chief of Portland. He asked if any of the Portland [REDACTED] guys had arrived. I explained that I didn't have any of that information. He stated he would make his way to the command post.

Det. St. Amant and I left our post in Lewiston and headed back to Lisbon. We were starting to get reports of

"shots fired" or suspicious condition calls all around town. News had started to break of the active shooter events.

On our way back to Lisbon, two Topsham P.D. units who were sent to assist in covering Lisbon, were dispatched to the [REDACTED] Moody Rd. There was also a call for a suspicious vehicle on Cotton Rd. [REDACTED], and a third call in the same general area on Poplar Cr. Det. St. Amant and I responded to [REDACTED] to assist the Topsham units. We arrived and they had located an open door and had searched [REDACTED] dio. Nothing was found. Chief McGee and Ofc. Drake & Ofc. Kenney also arrived at our location. Another call was received regarding a suspicious male on Lisbon St. [REDACTED].

We were sent to Cotton Rd. to check on the suspicious vehicle and Chief McGee advised he would check on Poplar Circle. The Topsham units were cleared. Ofc. Drake & Ofc. Kenney were sent to check on the [REDACTED] call.

The area of Cotton Rd. and [REDACTED] was quiet. I noted that [REDACTED] had parked at least three vehicles across the access road/driveway to enter [REDACTED]. We did not see any suspicious vehicles or conditions on Cotton Rd.

As we exited Cotton Rd., we headed down Pinewoods Rd. It was around this time that dispatch informed us of a possible vehicle description, a white Subaru Outback with a black front bumper. We also heard - whether from dispatch or the chatter on the radio - that the vehicle may be out of Bowdoin. A short time later, we heard a possible name of the suspect to be Robert Card. The address in Bowdoin [REDACTED]. This road intersects with Rt. 125 which becomes our Main St. It is very likely that the suspect would travel through Lisbon to return to Bowdoin.

We set a course for the back roads such as Webster, Upland, Gould, and Main St. When we arrived to Main St., we could hear Sagadahoc radio traffic of units headed to Meadow Rd. and units headed to Quarry Rd. in Bowdoinham. Once we had reached the Bowdoin/Lisbon Falls town line, dispatcher Cathy Roy [REDACTED] Robert Card's [REDACTED]

I checked GPS for the location [REDACTED] in Bowdoin, [REDACTED]. This is also near the on ramp for Interstate 295. Prior to arriving at that location, we were informed the property had been checked and Robert Card was not there. We stopped at the intersection of Rte. 125 and Rte 201 in Bowdoin. From this position we could see north and south bound traffic on Rte. 201 and traffic exiting from Rte. 125 from Lisbon Falls/Bowdoin. This was approximately 2149 hours.

A short time after we were posted here, a Richmond P.D. cruiser pulled up. We decided that it wasn't necessary for both of us to be there so we cleared to head back to Lisbon. As we were headed back on Rte. 125, we heard radio traffic that Lisbon units had located the suspect vehicle at the boat launch. The boat launch, near the Paper Mill Trail, is located on Frost Hill and Rte. 196.

We made our way to Frost Hill and entered from Rte. 9. It was approximately 2200 hours. We stopped in the area [REDACTED]. We briefly cleared to check on a report of people in someone's yard that had weapons. When we checked it out, it was determined to be the homeowners who had just arrived home and they had flash

lights and were trying to secure their dog.

We cleared and went back to our previous position. Det. St. Amant positioned the vehicle so the headlights could illuminate the field adjacent to the house where we were parked. Other units arrived and took position between us and the boat launch.

A short time after returning, I could hear a helicopter approaching. The helicopter was assisting with a searchlight to locate the suspect. I initially was told it was a New Hampshire State Police helicopter. While parked on Frost Hill, we were made aware the suspect had recently been employed at Maine Recycling. This area is approximately a half mile or so, via the walking path or train tracks, from the boat launch.

Around 2230 hours, news was shared that school was canceled for Thursday. Lewiston schools had also been canceled due to the active shooter incidents. Around 2330 hours, Det. St. Amant and I cleared Frost Hill. It was believed that State Police, who had responded after the vehicle was located, had determined the vehicle was unoccupied. We headed to the police department. I suggested we grab some water and snacks and that people may need something to hold them over. It was unknown how long we would be looking for the shooter.

From approximately midnight until 0145 hours, Det. St. Amant and I made contact with other units and handed out water and snacks. We also assisted in investigating several complaints - Josephine St., Perillo St., and Woodland Ave. These were all unfounded. Ofc. Glenn Darby had come in, and he was alone in an unmarked unit. We discussed having him jump in with us. He went back to the station to park the unit he had. We went to the station to pick him up. We left the station around 0145 hours. As we passed the boat launch, I believe there was a tow truck there picking up the suspect vehicle.

We headed to the area of Lisbon Falls and eventually, we headed down Capitol Ave. We checked the school field area and then headed to the old Symquest building. We drove out behind and spot lighted the area, as this goes near the schools fields and that area leads to the walking path. We then checked the Blue Ox, old scrap metal, building. We drove out behind and the doors were checked, as well as the area behind the building that goes to Maine Recycling. We pulled into the 'overflow' lot where numerous tractor trailers were parked. Most of them were open and a quick check did not reveal anything. Once we checked this lot, we checked ETTI (the gates were secured) and then around Enterprise Electric. There are no gates and we did a complete check around the building. As we pulled out, another cruiser was in the area of Kelly Bros and the entrance to the walking path/parking area.

Det. St. Amant pulled into Kelly Bros and almost immediately, Ofc. Darby located an unsecured door. We were parked out behind the building. We radioed dispatch that we had an open door and then the three of us made entry. We searched the building and did not locate anyone or anything that appeared out of sorts. Other units arrived and they assisted in checking the grounds - trailers, vehicle, sheds. Nothing else was found to be amiss. We secured the door upon leaving the building. It was approximately 0242 hours.

Chief McGee asked to meet with us in the area of Bill Stevens. We went to the area of Bill Stevens and Walgreens on Capitol Ave and waited for the other units. Chief briefed us with what information he had and then explained that some of us would be going off duty while others stayed to finish working. Those of us who would be going home, included me, and we were asked to report back in for 1030 hours on Thursday 10/26/2023.

Rte. 196 had been shut down between Lisbon St. (Rte. 196) and Village/Webster St. & Lisbon St. and Rte. 9.

Thursday 10/26/2023

I reported for duty at 1030 hours. I was paired up with SRO Brianna Kenney. We were informed that we were going to work 2 person cars and that we would ensure to have a long gun with each pairing. The suspect still had not been located. The boat launch was still an area being processed. SRO Kenney and I were asked to relieve units that had been on Rte. 196 near the entrance to St. Matthew's Church. Ofc. Shawn Kelly and Ofc. Dan Ouellette were at the intersection of Rte. 196 and River Rd.

When we arrived, we realized a small group of media had been allowed to set up closer to the Big Dipper Ice Cream shop and St. Matthew's Church. We were just west of their location. We had some local traffic come through but otherwise, it was uneventful. Approximately an hour or so after we arrived, the SP units at the boat launch left. Once they left, it seemed the media were not as interested and most of them cleared the area. A short time later, we were advised we could clear from our location.

At 1256 hours, SRO Kenney and I responded to Pine St. for a Check the Well Being call. We made contact with the subject [REDACTED]. At 1328, we checked on a suspicious activity call on Parillo St. I did not locate the truck and checked the surrounding area. At 1337 we were dispatched to EZ Mart for a reported domestic disturbance. At 1402 hours, a call was received in the area of Zamore St. regarding a suspicious male in the woods with a firearm. We quickly cleared EZ Mart to respond to assist Det. St. Amant on Zamore St.

After clearing Zamore St., we heard that Maine Recycling was being searched [REDACTED]. We were asked to stand by in the area of the athletic fields and tennis courts behind the high school. Ofc. Kenney and I went to that area and Chief McGee and SA Tim Blais were there as well. A couple drones were flying around as well as a news helicopter.

At 1518 hours, Ofc. Darby called for assistance in dealing with someone from the media who had not listened to him. We responded to that area, however the media party had realized there was nothing to see and had self evacuated.

Ofc. Kenney and I made contact with Det. St. Amant and Det. Sibley and we headed to the Knights of Columbus picnic area on Rte. 196 to check that area. We were supposed to have a state trooper respond but he did not arrive so we checked the location ourselves. We did not find any evidence that anyone had been there. The time was approximately 1545 when we cleared the picnic area.

Around 1758 hours, there was a suspicious conditions call at Dollar General. Someone reported that the front door was locked but all the lights were on. We responded, as well as a Game Warden, and the outer doors were secured but the inside vestibule doors were locked open.

After clearing Dollar General, we stopped to assist an officer with a [REDACTED] at Napa Auto Parts. I don't believe a call for service was started. [REDACTED] had a samurai sword and was seated next to the building. [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. After being counseled about how this was not a good idea, SRO Kenney called [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]

At 1821 hours, SRO Kenney and I went off with approximately 4 -6 other Lisbon officers to search the Left Hand Club. Information was received that the shooter, Robert Card, had been wearing a Left Hand Club t-shirt. Nothing suspicious was found at that location.

Friday 10/27/2023

On this day I was scheduled for a 12 hour day shift. At 0545 when I came in, I was advised that an open door had been located at Maine Recycling. Units coming on shift were being directed there to assist in searching the building. I jumped in the detective car with Det. Chris Sibley, who was in uniform and also working day shift. We responded and met up with other Lisbon officers and Androscoggin County Sheriff's units. We assisted in securing and watching the perimeter while other units searched and cleared the building.

A call for service was received regarding suspicious activity near the Dube Gravel pit on Pinewoods/Ferry Rd. Units went there and searched [REDACTED]. Det. Sibley and I went to the area and stayed mobile in the area. Nothing was located and the call was unfounded.

We then met at the station for a shift briefing. We discussed the trail cameras that were put out by the Rec department behind Enterprise Electric. We discussed plans to split up and search, via the UTV, the walking path area. Before we were able to assemble and coordinate this, we received word that the State Police units were returning to the boat launch to check the river and the walking path (do a grid search). Det. St. Amant, SRO Kenney, and I went to the area of the walking path and retrieved the cameras.

I was then assigned a solo patrol vehicle (w/o a rifle) and posted at Frost Hill Ave. by the boat launch entrance. Ofc. Glenn Darby was at the Frost Hill and Rte. 196 entrance. No traffic could enter Frost Hill at that intersection and no one was to enter the boat launch. Numerous tactical teams were dispatched to this area - including Border Patrol & Southern Maine Regional.

I was dispatched to the Lisbon Community School at 1431 hours for a building alarm. Ofc. Brown from Sabattus P.D. was dispatched to assist. The rear OT room door was not properly secured.

At 1530 hours, I was dispatched to Pleasant St. for a report of a disturbance (parties fighting). Upon arrival, it appeared that both parties were having a verbal disagreement. Again, Ofc. Brown arrived as a cover unit.

After clearing the Pleasant St. call, Det. Sibley was dispatched to the area of Gould Rd./upper Main St. for a report of gun shots. I responded but he cleared the call before my arrival. I did not note anything suspicious. He was then dispatched to Bickford Dr. for an Assist Citizen call. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] As I arrived, Det. Sibley was just clearing from speaking with [REDACTED], who was out raking his leaves. Det. Sibley advised his Trac Fone was not functioning.

I returned to the boat launch, however shortly after arriving, I was dispatched to Mill St. to check a "secured door" at a residence. I located the residence and also made contact with the complainant. When I returned, Ofc. Kenney asked me to relieve her at the intersection of River Rd. and Rte. 196. I parked on Rte. 196 and stood by to prevent pedestrians from accessing the bridge over the Sabattus River.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I was called away to assist Ofc. Daniel Ouellette so I was not able to get the video footage. I later shared [REDACTED].

Ofc. Ouellette was at the Frost Hill & Rte. 196 intersection, as he relieved Ofc. Darby hours before. He requested assistance around 1745 hours in dealing with a woman who showed up running down Rte. 196. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Ofc. Ouellette had learned that a border patrol agent had [REDACTED] dealt with her earlier in the day.

[REDACTED]

Ofc. Williams was able to provide [REDACTED]. At that time I was going off duty and he took over the call.

Later that evening, after arriving home from work, I learned that Robert Card's body had been located deceased. It was approximately 2130 hours when I first heard this news, via text messages from friends and family. When I reached out to dispatch, it was confirmed.

Due to being on the day shift, I was not called in the evening of 10-25-23. I was informed of the situation and advised to come in at 0600 to have fresh bodies to replace people with.

On 10-26-23 at approximately 0600 Hrs, I reported for duty. At approximately 0700 Hrs, Officer Kelly and I were stationed at Rt 196 and River Rd to detour all Eastbound travel on Rt 196. We also kept the media out of restricted places and ensured they were not interfering with the investigation at the boat launch on Frosthill Ave. We received word to open rt 196 at approximately 1330 Hrs. I assisted Officer Darby with calls from 1330 until the end of my shift at 1800 Hrs. I was instructed to return to work at 0600 Hrs.

On 10-27-23 at approximately 0600 Hrs, Officer Blais and I were stationed at the boat launch on Frosthill and Rt 196 to assist with a grid search of the area. While stationed there, a call came in as shots were fired at 347 Lisbon St (Springworks Farm). Officer Blais and I drove to Springworks with a couple of Lewiston Officers who were also waiting at the boat launch. Once at Springworks, we began to clear the facility. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] We cleared Springworks and returned to the boat launch to wait for the grid search. After a few hours of waiting, LT Picard picked Officer Blais and I up and had us help him with calls. At approximately 1500 hrs, I replaced Officer Darby on Frosthill Ave and Rt 196. While teams searched the area, I blocked Frosthill Ave. I ensured the boat ramp and parking lot were closed to the public and kept the media in their designated spot. I was stationed there until I was replaced at approximately 2000 Hrs. I was instructed to return to work at 0600 Hrs. Robert Card's body was found that night at Main Recycling in one of the trailers.

On 10-28-23, I reported for duty at 0600 Hrs. I was on patrol from 0600-1800 Hrs. At 1800 Hrs, Officer Darby and I went to a vigil that was held for the victims and their families.

Nothing further.

10/25/23

19:48 hrs. I spoke with Lisbon Police Dispatch, at which time I was informed that all personnel were being called in to assist Lewiston Police Department with an active shooter situation involving two separate scenes.

I first deployed from the Lisbon Police Department in an unmarked cruiser with Lisbon Police School Resource Officer Renee Bernard. Our first assignment was to Dingley Press Corp. located at 105 Lisbon St in Lisbon to assist officers at that location with the investigation into an abandoned vehicle on the lot that may somehow be involved in the shooting incidents. Shortly after our arrival, we learned that the vehicle, a black Lincoln SUV, had been present on the lot before the Lewiston incidents. While at the location, I learned that a possible vehicle involved in the Lewiston incidents might be a white colored hatchback style vehicle.

As we were departing the lot at Dingley Press, Lisbon PD dispatchers advised of a new possible active shooter incident occurring at the Walmart Distribution Center on Alfred Plourde Parkway in Lewiston. We proceeded to the distribution center via Rte. 196, with Lisbon Police Lt. Jeffrey Picard following behind. Upon our arrival in the area (20:17hrs), Officer Bernard and I took up a position at Alfred Plourde and Goddard Rd as an initial step in setting up a perimeter to the north of the involved location. Lisbon Police Officers Kenney and Drake positioned themselves nearby as well.

While present at the distribution center incident, images of the shooting suspect began to be shared amongst LEOs. I heard radio traffic indicating a person of interest in the shooting incidents may be a subject by the name of [REDACTED] of Lewiston. I also heard comments that there may be a maroon sedan or a maroon colored truck involved.

After being present for some time at the intersection, it was identified that the distribution center incident was deemed an unconfirmed incident and we were cleared to depart the area.

Immediately after clearing the area, we began responding to calls in Lisbon related to suspicious conditions, sounds of gunshots and other calls from citizens expressing concerning matters they felt possibly related to the possible location of the involved party. While investigating these calls, the identification of shooting subject was reported with high confidence as Robert Card [REDACTED] of Bowdoin.

Having knowledge that Card and his vehicle, described as a white colored Subaru Outback wagon with a black front bumper were still unaccounted for, Officer Bernard and I proceeded toward the Bowdoin town line as I was hearing radio traffic identifying that Card had a residence [REDACTED], which initiates very near the Lisbon/Bowdoin town line. While in route to the town line, additional radio traffic identified that the Card family property was located [REDACTED] in Bowdoin and later, additional traffic identified that Card may be heading to [REDACTED] Bowdoinham. With this updated information I proceeded toward the [REDACTED].

Upon learning that Sagadahoc County Deputies had reached [REDACTED] ahead of us and confirmed that neither Card's vehicle nor he were located there, we assumed a position at the intersection of Rte. 125 and Rte. 201 in Bowdoin to monitor vehicle traffic in the area. Upon the arrival of a Richmond PD unit to the same location, Officer Bernard and I cleared and began to return to Lisbon. While in route, we heard radio traffic from Lisbon Police Chief Ryan McGee that units had located Card's vehicle parked at the boat launch on Frost Hill Ave in Lisbon Falls, adjacent to the Paper Mill Trail walking paths. At 21:59 hrs. Officer Bernard and I arrived on Frost Hill Ave. and positioned ourselves along with other units approximately 1/3 mile northwest of the boat launch area in order to establish a perimeter.

At 23:58 Officer Bernard and myself cleared the Frost Hill area, our first response was to the area [REDACTED] for a report of subjects outside of a residence with flashlights. Checking this location would identify that it was homeowners who had just returned to the address. We were then dispatched to check for a report of an on/off road style motorcycle reportedly heading inbound from Topsham. At this time it had been identified that Card owned one or more similarly described motorcycles. A check of the area did not reveal the related vehicle. We returned to the Frost Hill Ave perimeter and remained there until approximately 00:37 hrs. where it had been determined the vehicle was unoccupied.

Immediately after clearing our post, Officer Bernard and I responded to the intersection of Parillo and Grove Street in Lisbon Falls related to information received from [REDACTED], identifying that the residence [REDACTED], Card may go to the location to hide out. After coordinating surveillance of the identified location, Lisbon PD Sgt. Morse advised he had familiarity to the [REDACTED] and that he was not aware of any affiliation with Card. Officer Barnard and I cleared this location at approximately 00:53 hrs. to assist in investigating a suspicious condition call [REDACTED] St related to a possibly occupied vehicle, the location being relatively close to the previously referenced boat launch. After determining the vehicle involved was clear of occupants, we returned to the Parillo St. location where we stood by until State Police [REDACTED] made contact with the occupants [REDACTED] and deemed the address to be clear and unrelated.

Officer Bernard and I assisted in clearing two other suspicious condition calls, one at [REDACTED] and the other at [REDACTED]. After clearing the calls at 01:28 hrs., we returned to the Lisbon Police Department. While at the Lisbon Police Department I received information that the Card subject was reported to have been a previous employee at Maine Recycling Center [REDACTED] Capitol Ave in Lisbon Falls.

When departing Lisbon PD, Lisbon Police Officer Glen Darby joined us in our unmarked cruiser to continue patrols and efforts to locate and or secure the Card subject. As part of our patrols, we conducted lot checks on Capitol Ave., passing through the lot at Maine Recycling Center and illuminating the exterior of the building as well as several company vehicles and trailers on the lot. Part of the checks included checking the security of buildings and lots at 32 Capitol Ave, 42 Capitol Ave, 46 Capital Ave. The satellite or overflow lot at 38/40 Capitol Ave, where several of Maine Recycle center company's enclosed semi-trailers are parked, was also part of a cursory search.

The cursory search consisted of illuminating the exteriors and undersides of nearly every trailer on the lot. Visual inspection of the interiors of some trailers with fully open or partially open swing style doors was also conducted, mostly utilizing the cruiser's spot light however some trailers with partially opened doors were more thoroughly checked by widely opening the doors to facilitate inspection. The realization that a complete inspection of every trailer on the lot was not a tactically sound procedure, given our units limited manpower and lacking adequate safety/protective gear in relation to the armament the Card suspect was known and rumored to possess. After completing our illumination of the trailers, we proceeded to other facilities within the industrial park.

02:42hrs. Upon locating an unlocked door at [REDACTED], other Lisbon PD and sheriff's department assets arrived and assisted in clearing the building, vehicles and storage trailers on the property. Immediately upon securing the property, it was announced via radio traffic that all personnel were being directed to depart the area of the industrial park on Capitol Ave, as Maine State Police [REDACTED] would be responding to the area to perform searches of the area. At this time I along with Officer's Bernard and Darby departed that industrial park area.

I temporarily secured from search and investigation activities at approximately 04:00 hrs. on 10/26/23.

10/26/23

At approximately 06:00 hrs. I resumed patrol and investigation activities related to the search for the Card suspect. One of my initial responses was to the area [REDACTED] Lisbon St, [REDACTED], to investigate the report of person(s) heard walking in the woodline near the complex. After thoroughly checking the property, no persons were located. My first post assignment was with Lisbon PD Detective C Sibley where we were assigned to a perimeter roadblock on Frost Hill Ave just north/east of the Paper Mill trail parking lot/boat launch while tactical teams conducted a walk through the wooded area to the north, proceeding toward that Lisbon Community School. While present at this post I was contacted by detectives from the Lewiston Police Department as well as agents from Homeland Security regarding their attempts to identify and obtain surveillance footage from cameras in the area.

Throughout the day, I participated in the investigative actions related to calls of suspicious sounds, conditions and persons throughout the daytime and evening hours. I secured from patrol/investigation activities at approximately 22:00 hrs.

10/27/23

At approximately 06:00 hrs. I resumed patrol and investigation activities related to locating the Card suspect. One of my first calls for service was to assist in the investigation of an open door, discovered at Maine Recycling Center [REDACTED]. I took a position on the northeast corner of the property, more specifically at the intersecting points of the Capital Ave circle where I monitored the property and kept approaching vehicles/persons out of the area until it was deemed safe. The building was cleared and I departed my post at 06:50 hrs.

At some point mid-day, [REDACTED] Maine Recycling Center and his contact phone number from Lisbon PD dispatcher Roy. It was identified that [REDACTED] had expressed concern regarding company trailers on their overflow lot on Capitol Ave. I was able to speak with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I informed [REDACTED] that I was aware that police, to include [REDACTED], had conducted previous searches of at least the Maine Recycling Center's main property, in part related to the discovery of an open/unsecured door at the facility on this date.

Immediately after speaking with [REDACTED] I contacted Lisbon Police Lt. Jeffrey Picard at which time I relayed to him the expressed concerns identified by [REDACTED]. Lt. Picard advised that he would relay the information to Lisbon Police Chief Ryan McGee, and it is my belief that Lt Picard relayed the information directly after our conversation ended.

Upon returning to patrol/search functions, I participated in several calls for service related to investigation of suspicious conditions, persons and unsecured properties/out-buildings throughout the day, with no discovery or

indication that Card had been located/apprehended I was cleared from duty at 18:00 hrs.

20:40 hrs. Lisbon Police Detective Chris Sibley contacted me by phone and informed me that [REDACTED] had located Card in a box trailer on the overflow lot of Maine Recycling located on Capital Ave. Det. Sibley advised that he had little information on the discovery other than that Card was found previously deceased.

I returned to duty at 21:20 hrs. to assist in maintaining a perimeter on Capital Ave. in order to keep unauthorized persons from entering the involved scene. My assignment was along Sugg Drive, near the intersection of Capital Ave and the Lisbon Public Works buildings. I remained in this area until Lisbon Police Lt. Jeffery Picard authorized me to secure from the post.

10/28/23

06:00 hrs. I returned to Capital Ave and Sugg Drive to assist State Police in restricting vehicle and foot traffic into the area of Capital Ave related to the discovery of Card's body. I remained on site until 09:00 hrs. at which time I was relieved by Lisbon Police Officer Tim Blais.

10/30/23

I was asked to assist Maine State Police with collecting video surveillance evidence from Lisbon area businesses along with Lisbon Police Department cruiser and body camera footage for units that had responded to the Lewiston scenes. The initially identified properties for video footage were; Lisbon Cannabis, Maine Recycling Center and Lisbon Fuel Co., all of which were located on Capital Ave. I was able to collect two downloaded video recordings on this date, One from Lisbon Cannabis and the other from [REDACTED] Maine Recycling Center. As part of my contact with [REDACTED], I conducted a brief interview with him related to his previous knowledge and involvements with Robert Card.

11/01/23

I was able to obtain a copy of the requested business surveillance footage from Lisbon Fuel Company. After compiling the requested business surveillance footage, the Lisbon PD cruiser videos, related Lisbon PD call and statement reports and the audio recorded interview with [REDACTED] 10/30, the items were separately packaged and transferred to Sgt. Chris Farley of the Maine State Police Major Crimes Unit at approximately 13:00 hrs., where he

was operating out of the temporary command center in the Lewiston Police Department.

After meeting with Sgt. Farley, I traveled along Lincoln, River and Cotton Roads in Lewiston to the Lisbon line. My purpose for doing so was to look for residential camera's along this route as it was a possible path of travel for Card during his flight from the shooting scenes to where his vehicle was later located in Lisbon Falls. I visited [REDACTED] in Lewiston, having observed a camera facing toward the roadway. [REDACTED] would advise that [REDACTED] capture passing vehicles and he advised that he had already reviewed the footage from the related date.

11/06/23

I was asked to assist Maine State Police further in obtaining relevant surveillance footage from locations in Lisbon. I received a list of locations from T. Pickering of the Maine State Police. Over the next several days I contacted residents or businesses on the list where I checked on the availability of surveillance footage. Videos were obtained from the following locations: 207 Edibles of Canal Street in Lisbon Falls, Androscoggin Bank of Lisbon Street Lisbon Falls, Bootleggers Beverage store of Lisbon St in Lisbon, Five County Credit Union of Lisbon Street in Lisbon, K&M Tires and L&B Electric of Capital Ave. in Lisbon Falls. Video requests have been submitted to EZ Mart convenience store and Walgreens Pharmacy of Lisbon Falls, these locations were having difficulties in downloading the requested video footage.

10/25/2023

1537 Hours

On the above date and time, I was at home when I received a call from Dispatcher Beaumier asking if I could come into work early because of an active shooter situation.

I arrived at work and was quickly briefed on what was going on and then took an unmarked cruiser. As I was pulling out of the PD parking lot, Chief McGee went over the air and asked for every Lisbon unit to respond to the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston.

I responded to the Walmart DC and several other Officers for several other agencies were already on scene. After a period of time, Lieutenant Picard, Sergeant Levesque, and I went to the Colisee in Lewiston where the command post was. We were directed to start driving around and looking for a white Subaru Outback that matched the suspects cars description. I got into a cruiser with Sergeant Levesque and began driving around Lewiston searching. After a short period of time driving, it came over the air that the suspect car was found at the Lisbon boat launch. It also went out that the suspect we were searching for was Robert Card [REDACTED]

We arrived at the Lisbon boat launch and I took my rifle and drew down on the lone car at the boat launch. Myself and multiple other officers held that position until Maine State Police arrived [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] After a short period of time I moved positions with Sergeant Levesque to the intersection of Frost Hill Ave and Ridge Road. For the remainder of the night and into the morning we continued to search for Card in Lisbon.

10/26/2023 & Morning of 10/27/2023

I came back into work the same night at 1900 Hours and we continued to search for Card and respond to other calls. We patrolled routinely through Capitol Ave and other areas as well. Officer Kelly noticed a tractor trailer truck with the sleeper cab forward parked in the parking lot of Maine Recycling. We headed down there and searched the trailers in the parking lot of Maine Recycling. After searching the trailers it was noticed that two of the doors at Maine Recycling were unlocked. We waited for backup from other agencies and cleared Maine Recycling, but did not find the suspect.

10/27/2023

1800 Hours

I came in for my shift on the above date and time and got my gear ready. Sergeant Levesque advised me that I would be partnered up with Officer Williams. OFC. Williams and I responded to a call on Gould Road for a person walking in the woods. We did not locate anyone in the woods and continued to Patrol. A little after 2030 we were notified that Robert Card had been found and were then asked to position ourselves at Lisbon Street and Capitol Ave to block off the road from people going through.

Throughout the night we continued to stay in the area of Capitol Ave and contain the area. Morning watch arrived and I finished my shift at approximately 0700.

On 10/25/23, at around 1930 hrs, I was at the Police Department off duty in my office, I heard a knock on my door and it was Jeff Carr, who I know is a medic and retired Police Officer. He said that there was an active shooter in Lewiston where two businesses had been hit and numerous casualties.

As I stepped out into the hallway, I was met by Chief McGee and soon after, Lt Picard. I got dressed in my uniform and went out to my assigned cruiser (#8). I left the Police Department as multiple units were arriving and started listening to the Police radio for updates.

There had been a suspicious vehicle at Dingley press that had a lot of damage to it and possibly doors open as if someone exited in a hurry. I responded to Dingley press as did LT Picard, Ofc Blais and others. The car ultimately ended up not being involved with the shooting in Lewiston.

I started hearing radio traffic about a possible shooting at the Walmart distribution center in Lewiston. It was decided that multiple Officers would respond to that area to help as needed. Most units took Route 196 to get to the address. However, Det St Amant asked me to go in via our Moody road which then allowed me to travel alternate roads into Lewiston in case the suspect had fled that way.

When I arrived at the distribution center, there were numerous Police units already. After some initial discussion, I ended up parking along the roadway and staging until we received further intel about who the shooter or shooters were and where they were now.

Eventually it was decided that the Lisbon units would respond back to Lisbon. I heard multiple calls where people reported gun shots and seeing gunman at various businesses in surrounding towns. Once back in Lisbon, we got an update saying the shooter was believed to be Robert Card and that he was possibly driving a white Subaru that had a black or dark colored bumper.

I drove around for a bit looking for the Subaru but then eventually parked at New England Vending on Route 196 near the Town line with Lewiston. After awhile, I heard radio traffic that a Subaru matching the description of Card's was found at the boat launch near Frost Hill Ave. I drove over to that address and found Chief McGee and others standing by at the perimeter of the parking lot. I parked my cruiser near Ofc Kenney and other units from other agencies arrived after me.

As multiple units arrived and were preparing to breach the Subaru, I and others were asked to move to staggered areas so as to stay in sight of each other and still be vigilant looking for the suspect due to the fact he was armed with an "AR-15" style rifle and quite possibly had other guns. I moved my cruiser further up on Frost Hill Ave and monitored the wooded area and trail near the boat launch. I stood outside my cruiser for what felt like a couple hours.

Later, I cleared that position and met other units on Josephine Street checking for a suspicious vehicle. After that, I returned to the station to regroup and see what was or needed to be done as there was no updates on whether Card was on foot or had gotten in another vehicle.

I continued on answering calls that were deemed suspicious or that could possibly be related to the incident we were investigating. All Lisbon Officers met in the parking lot across from McDonalds and it was decided that myself and others would secure now (roughly 0400) and some Officers would continue on duty until we went in

service again between 0800-1000, and then those Officers would secure to rest, etc.

On 10/26/23, I went back in service around 0800 hrs. I was paired up with Detective St Amant as two man units made the most sense. I resumed Patrol and Investigation activities related to the search for Robert Card. One of my initial post assignments was being assigned to be a perimeter roadblock on Frost Hill Ave by the parking lot/boat launch [REDACTED] teams searched the wooded area towards the Lisbon Community School.

The majority of the day was spent responding to suspicious calls or anything that might be related to our ongoing investigation. One of the last things done on that day was a search of the property [REDACTED] on Wagg road. This was done as it was believed that he (Card) had been seen wearing a shirt [REDACTED] and possibly frequented [REDACTED]. The area was checked, but no signs of Card or anyone else being on the property was discovered. I secured my duties at 2200 hrs.

On 10/27/23, at roughly 550 hrs, I was told that an open door had been found at the Maine Recycling business. This was deemed suspicious as Card had been fired from that business and it had become the main focus of the investigation. I was under the belief that the business and adjoining areas had been searched by one or more [REDACTED] as we were asked to not be in those areas so as to avoid any conflicts [REDACTED]

I responded down to the business on Capitol Ave and met Chief McGee, who was standing by with other Lisbon Officers and members of the Androscoggin Sheriff's Dept. Those of us just arriving at the scene were asked to set up a perimeter and the others were going in to search the property. Ofc Bernard was next to me as the search commenced. The search completed and no one was found inside the business.

After that, I resumed Patrol and Investigation activities related to locating Robert Card. The majority of the day was spent participating in calls for service. Those calls revolved around suspicious people/noises and checking on unsecured properties or wooded areas where Card could possibly conceal himself. All of those calls were fruitless and ended up being unrelated to the manhunt that Officers were participating in. My assigned shift for this day ended at 1800 hrs.

Later, on 10/27/23, around 2025 hrs, I was at the Police Station when I heard Sgt Morse speaking with Chief McGee. I heard Chief McGee explain that upon a further search by the State Police [REDACTED], Robert Card's body was found (deceased) within one of the trailers. Apparently the door to the rear of the trailer had been pulled down and he was only discovered and visible after the door had been opened further.

I contacted Det St Amant with the news and he came into the station. We took a marked cruiser to Capitol Ave near our Public Works building. We stood by with a State Trooper and only allowed authorized vehicles to enter or exit the secured area.

I stayed down at that post until 2300 hrs, by which time the body of Card had been removed and there were enough units to maintain a perimeter until [REDACTED] in the morning.

On 10/28/23 I returned to Capitol Avenue and relieved Ofc Sean Kelly who had worked overnight. I stayed at that post until a few hours later when I was relieved by the State Police saying I was no longer needed. I resumed patrol duties until 1200 that day and partook no further in the follow up investigation into the mass casualty

event that took place in Lewiston.

On 10/25/2023 at approximately 1915 hours, I was off duty a heard of an active shooter incident which had occurred in Lewiston. I am currently employed by Lisbon PD as a full time patrol officer, [REDACTED]. I contacted Dispatch Supervisor Cathy Roy and asked what was needed of me. Cathy Roy asked if I could check on a suspicious vehicle at Dingley Press.

I responded to Dingley Press in my state issued [REDACTED] vehicle and located the vehicle in the parking lot. After determining the vehicle had no involvement in the incident, I responded to Lisbon PD where I made contact with Sgt. Morse. I acquired a department issued rifle and got into the passenger seat of the cruiser Sgt. Morse was operating. While monitoring multiple police channels, we initially responded to the area of the over pass, near Lisbon St., and Quimby in Lewiston for a motor vehicle accident. Initial reports indicated the suspect vehicle could have been involved. As we arrived, other units already on scene had determined the involved had no involvement with the mass shooting incident. During this time, numerous reports had been and were currently being recieved from area agencies regarding suspicious vehicles, suspicious subjects, and sounds of gun shots. The calls were addressed by various Lisbon units.

After clearing several calls in the Lisbon area, determined to be unrelated to the mass shooting incident, Sgt. Morse and I positions ourselves at the Lisbon/Lewiston town line to monitor traffic and await more information. A short time later, radio traffic was heard regarding an armed subject at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. We responded to the Walmart Distribution Center, through an alternate route knowing there would be a large response, avoiding traffic, and putting ourselves in the possible escape path of the assailant.

Upon arrival, we left the cruiser parked at Alfred Plourde Parkway and River Rd., taking up position on a near by hill for a better vantage point. Multiple units were already on scene upon our arrival, so we assisted in establishing a perimeter. We held the perimeter until it was determined to not be related to the incident in Lewiston. The large amount of police cruisers were seen by Sgt. Morse and myself leaving the area. No information was heard via State Wide Car to Car. This area is problematic for our radio due to poor reception. Once we watched a number of units leave, it was determined our assistance was not needed. It was at this time, information was recieved on the suspect, Robert Card. Card was said to be driving a white Subaru with a black front bumper and roof rack. Card was believed to be heavily armed.

After seeing the multiple cruisers leaving the Walmart Distribution Center, Sgt. Morse and I left heading back towards Lisbon. Once in Lisbon, we remained mobile looking for Card or his vehicle. A call was recieved for a residential area in lisbon where a white Subaru was observed loitering in the area. Several units responded, including ourselves, and it was concluded the vehicle was no longer in the area. The caller was spoke with prior to clearing and no additional information was obtained.

With the Lisbon area being heavily patrolled, we opted to move to Lisbon Falls to expand the coverage of patrol units. While travelling east on Lisbon St. and passing the intersection of Frost Hill Ave., Sgt. Morse believed he got a glimpse of something in the boat launch parking lot off of Frost Hill Ave. We pulled into the entrance of the parking lot and a white Subaru with roof rack and black bumper was observed in the far back of the parking lot near the northbound entrance of the walking trail. I immediately exited the vehicle to provide cover while Sgt. Morse notified dispatch (it should be noted we were not in the parking lot, but rather in the entrance to the parking lot closest to Lisbon St. At no time prior to [REDACTED] arrival did any officers enter the parking lot). After dispatch was contacted and units from all over began to respond, I continued to provide cover of the vehicle, Forst Hill Ave, and the northbound entrance of the walking trail and Sgt. Morse provided rear security as it was undetermined if Card was in the vehicle or had left. Additional units arrived within seconds to the boat launch. As units arrived, it was communicated by the [REDACTED] that no officer is to approach the vehicle until their arrival.

Once the Maine State Police [REDACTED]

Shortly after clearing the area of the boat launch, a report from an employee at Springworks advised of suspicious activity with a warehouse on the property. Several units, including Sgt. Morse and myself, responded. Sgt. Morse and myself took up perimeter security to await [REDACTED] respond and clear the building. We held the perimeter until it was relayed [REDACTED] had cleared the building. We continued to patrol the town throughout the night and address complaints as they were received.

Information was received by the command post of several address in Lisbon Falls that Card would have connections to and could be areas of interest. After checking several other areas where suspicious activity was reported, the residence [REDACTED] was learned to be one of these addresses. It was said to [REDACTED] but was known to be rented out. Officers moved into the area and provided perimeter security until the [REDACTED] arrival. MSP [REDACTED] moved into the area and was able to make contact with the occupants, determining Card was not present.

With all available units on duty we convened at a nearby location where Lisbon PD supervision determined there would be two shifts so some officers could get some rest while others continued to work throughout the night. I was sent home at 0400 hours and to return at 1000 hours.

These functions continued as the "man hunt" extended towards the weekend. Through 10/26/2023 I continued to patrol the area and respond to reports of suspicious subjects or vacant buildings where Card could have accessed to. I was relieved of duty at 0000 hours on 10/27/2023 and to return at 0600 hours.

Upon arrival to the station at 0600 hours, it was learned officers had located an open door at Maine Recycling (which had just been cleared the day prior by the Southern Maine Tac team). I responded and provided perimeter security while other officers cleared the inside of Maine Recycling. Nothing suspicious was located inside.

I continued to patrol the area and responding to vacant buildings and suspicious activity throughout the day of 10/27/2023. During that time, there was report of a single gun shot behind Springworks. Multiple officers from multiple agencies responded and set up along to woodline at Springworks. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. My tour of duty ended at 1800 hours.

At approximately 2030 hours, I learned Card was discovered, deceased, in a trailer at Maine Recycling, I returned to duty and was tasked with providing security for the area while MSP conducted its investigation of the scene. I remained on scene until I was relieved of duty.

End officer involvement.

Report of Ryan McGee Chief of the Lisbon Police Department:

On Wednesday, October 25th at 7:17 pm, I was off duty and I received a phone call from Sergeant Andrew Levesque. Sgt Levesque advised that both he and Officer Jeffrey Williams were en route to Lewiston, that there was an active shooter in Lewiston, and they were heading there to render any assistance they could.

I advised Sgt Levesque that I would be responding to town and would be activating the Lisbon Police Department to have everyone assist.

I arrived at Lisbon PD at the same time Lt. Picard and other staff were arriving. Officers were directed toward the Lewiston area to help contain a perimeter. Firefighter Jeff Carr, who is a member of our tactical medical team, and I responded to Lisbon Falls to close down all of our open area businesses for their safety. Because the shooter's whereabouts were unknown, and I had earlier observed many people at Frank's Restaurant, Flux Restaurant, Railroad Diner, and the Olive Pit Brewery, I asked them to close. I also closed the Rusty Lantern, Big Apple, and McDonald's as well as a few other area businesses.

While this was taking place, information about a third active shooter location came in, at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston, and I responded to Lewiston along with the rest of my department. At that time, both Topsham PD and Sag SO came into our community to help backfill and assist with calls. Lisbon Units responding were coordinating our approach to try to drive into Lewiston on any road that the suspect could be traveling.

I responded and arrived at the intersection of Alfred Plourde Parkway and Goddard Road in Lewiston, where numerous police officers were arriving. I advised everyone to go onto the Statewide Car to Car channel, so we could all talk together and get necessary info out to each other. It was believed the suspect could be inside, so I directed officers who were in the area to start setting up a perimeter around the Walmart Distribution Center. I took multiple officers from my department and coordinated them [REDACTED] distribution center area, as it was my understanding officers were already inside and on the other side of the building.

After some time, Lewiston and outside agency units were directed to leave the area and head over to the Colisee in Lewiston. I had my Lisbon PD units respond back to Lisbon and start searching for the suspect, as his whereabouts were unknown. At approx. 7:56 pm, I received a photo from Deputy Barr from ASO of the shooting suspect. He was wearing dark cargo pants and a brown sweatshirt and had tan boots, dark brown hair and facial hair. I forwarded this to my department. (He was later positively identified as Robert Card [REDACTED] Bowdoin Maine. It was also learned the subject was in the military, had training as a firearms instructor and possibly had a night vision scope on his rifle, and to use extreme caution. We later learned that the suspect was driving a white Subaru.)

As we were heading back to town, we learned about a call of a man wearing lingerie in the area of the [REDACTED]. We had some Lisbon PD units go check on this, as we also received a call from [REDACTED] Moody Road about hearing a gunshot. Myself, along with multiple Lisbon units, and Topsham and Sag units responded to check the business and surrounding area. We were not able to locate anyone or any evidence of a shooting (officers also spoke to the caller). There was also a call from the Winter Park area of

hearing a gunshot; however, nothing could be located in Winter Park either. Winter Park's location is not far [REDACTED].

Moments later, we were dispatched to Bartholomew Street in Lisbon for a report of a white Subaru Outback with roof racks driving around slowly. There was a time delay of 8 minutes. I responded to the area and met with the homeowner who reported he could not see the driver, but the vehicle was stopped at the intersection on Bartholomew St. for an extended period of time, and then slowly drove away. Sgt Morse and Officer Blais were also in the area checking for the vehicle during this time and were unable to locate it, and cleared.

We then started checking other areas around town. A short time later, at approximately 2152 hrs, Sgt Nathan Morse came over the radio and advised they were out with a vehicle matching the description of the suspect's vehicle at the boat ramp. I was close by and was the second unit to arrive, and pulled onto Frosthill Ave, and then pulled into the entrance directly behind the vehicle, but stayed at the entrance blocking it. K-9 Officer Lucas from Topsham PD arrived and positioned himself directly next to me on the passenger side of my cruiser. Officer Kenney then positioned her cruiser behind us to try to give us 360-degree coverage of our position, as it was unknown if he was inside the car or hiding in the nearby woods to possibly ambush us. It should be noted that NO officers entered the parking lot at the boat ramp, but setup at the entrances of the boat ramp parking lot.

Numerous outside agencies responded, as well as a New Hampshire State Police helicopter. I radioed the helicopter on statewide to have them check our walking trail, both north and south of the suspect's vehicle, and the woods around us for the suspect. The helicopter confirmed they would start checking the area. Lt Picard and multiple agencies were positioned north of us, off Mill Street at the Lisbon Community School where the walking trail comes out. We also positioned cruisers up Frosthill Ave, Rt 9, Upland Road, and Rt 196 in both directions of the boat ramp, and had area agencies at Capitol Avenue, and as far away as Rt 196/Main Street at Canal Street and Rt 196 at Mill Street, and Rt 196 at Webster Rd. Numerous agencies including Lisbon PD cleared the entire Lisbon Community School and posted up officers with long guns on the roof afterward to provide a high vantage point viewing the wood line, in case the suspect came out.

At the boat launch, Maine State Police advised us not to approach the vehicle and to continue to hold a perimeter. We stayed out of the parking lot, but were still located at the entrances. The MSP [REDACTED] arrived and requested all units to back away from the boat ramp and they would be taking over. At this time, numerous officers drove through and started [REDACTED] in the area, including the industrial park on Capitol Ave. Det St. Amant, Officer Darby and Officer Bernard reported that they had driven through and did cursory searches in the parking lots on Capitol Ave. Their searches included the Maine Recycling's overflow lots with tractor-trailers, as well as other businesses in the area. They also searched some buildings in the industrial park, before being asked by Maine State Police to pull out of the industrial park and that is when officers were stationed around the area.

At some point, we learned that the suspect, Robert Card worked at Maine Recycling and could be hiding there. This information was relayed to MSP Sgt Roy. I requested that all the businesses on Capitol Ave be shut down, and to make sure dispatch called Maine Recycling to ensure that no employees go to work that next morning.

Lisbon Public Works was contacted to completely shut down Rt 196: from Main Street at Rt 196 all the way up to Village Street, and Rt 196 and all side roadways including Upland Rd at Mill Street, and Rt 9 at Higgins

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Street and both sides of Frosthill Ave. Capitol Avenue was shut down at Rt 196, along with the entrance to the Lisbon High School. Lisbon PW employees were asked to come to the Lisbon Police Department, and Lisbon Police Officers escorted them down to get the barricades and out of the area.

Spring Works Farms located at 347 Lisbon Street, called at 2234 hrs and reported hearing a loud bang inside, the caller said when checking the building the bathroom door was now closed and locked. The caller was the only one who was supposed to be working, and nobody else was supposed to be in the building. I responded with Lisbon and ASO units and called Sgt Roy from the MSP [REDACTED]. I advised him of the complaint and he said he would be sending a [REDACTED] to respond and clear the building. Dispatch was not able to get in touch with the owner, and I called [REDACTED] Spring Works Farm, who is one of the business associates. She was able to get [REDACTED] on the phone and I asked that they bring up the cameras to the building, and requested floor plans, so I could give those to the MSP [REDACTED] that was arriving on the scene. Lisbon PD and ASO Deputies set up a perimeter around Spring Works Farm, covering all access points.

Emily was able to provide floor plans and the location of the bathroom in question. I relayed this to Sgt Roy and the MSP [REDACTED] who were on the scene at Spring Works Farm. They were not able to access the cameras before the team made entry. Later on, MSP was able to access cameras; however, there were none in the area in question where someone could be located. The MSP [REDACTED] cleared the building and did not locate anyone inside.

I spoke to Lt Picard to ensure that perimeters were set up on both sides of the walking trail, LHS, Capitol Ave, and that all areas around the Industrial Park were cordoning off.

While all of this was going on, Lisbon Communications was fielding numerous calls on suspicious complaints from the public, (please refer to the call log for more info on this).

I received information from MSP Sgt Roy that their [REDACTED] was going to check a residence of a possible [REDACTED]. While this was going on, we learned information that [REDACTED] of Robert Card [REDACTED]. The caller did not believe anyone was home, and thought Robert could be hiding there. I had Lisbon PD, ASO, and area police agencies set up a perimeter on the home. It appeared that someone was inside. I relayed all of this info to MSP Sgt Roy, he advised me to hold a perimeter, and he would be over with his team after they cleared Center Street.

A little while later, the MSP [REDACTED] arrived and made contact by calling the occupants out of the residence on the loudspeaker of their armored vehicle, the suspect was not there.

Officers continued to check buildings throughout the evening and overnight hours.

Thursday October 26th, 2023

A little before 2 am, I cleared Lisbon and headed to Lewiston PD to meet for the command meeting at Lewiston PD. I met with Chief Scott Stewart from Brunswick PD, who advised he was going to stay at Command, as his [REDACTED] was involved now as well. He advised he would keep me updated, as I was going to head back to Lisbon after the briefing to assist my department. I also spoke with Lt Keaton, Det Sgt Farley, and MSP Greg Roy briefly during this time to share info. Sgt Roy and I talked about Maine Recycling; he said that during the

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day he would see about getting a team there to check it. I cleared and headed back to Lisbon.

At approx. 6:43 am, I responded to 395 Lisbon Street ([REDACTED]) for a report of the caller hearing someone walking in the woods. I arrived with numerous officers from Lisbon PD, and started checking the wooded area. A resident who was concerned about a boiler room that was not locked also approached me; we checked the boiler room to the unit and nobody was located inside. Media outlets were on scene and were told to please not follow the officers into scenes, for their safety and ours.

At approx. 8:14 am, we responded to [REDACTED] for a report of multiple gunshots. I arrived with other agencies and we did not hear any gunshots. I spoke to a subject who was sitting in his garage near [REDACTED] and he reported that he did not hear anything and was there all morning.

Around 8:38 am, numerous officers and I responded to the area of Mill Street and Rt 196 for a report of people yelling. The caller was very concerned something was going on. I arrived on scene with officers and heard yelling; after further investigation it was found it was several goats making a noise like a female yelling. Due to concerns someone could be in the barns causing the goats to be on edge, we cleared the outbuildings and did not locate anyone.

Neighbors at the [REDACTED] approached us with concern that their outbuilding was unlocked, and asked us to clear their parking lot and outbuildings. Lisbon Officers and I cleared all of the buildings. [REDACTED] then advised he spoke to the neighbor, who was concerned because their downstairs basement did not lock. We went next door and spoke to them, and cleared their basement and did not find anything suspicious.

Throughout the morning, my officers continued to check on numerous complaints and suspicious concerns being called in throughout the community.

Just before 11:30am, we sent several officers home who had been up for multiple shifts, and started a long-range plan to rotate officers on and off duty, so they could go home and get some sleep.

At approx. 11:30 am, we received a call of a subject wearing a dark hoodie walking into the woods at the end of [REDACTED] (Houston Park area). Lt Picard and I searched the area. We were unable to locate anyone after approx. 40 minutes. The subject was reported to have blue jeans and was a similar description to someone that was checked on earlier by another Lisbon Officer nearby, we did not believe it was our suspect.

At 12:50 pm when checking the perimeter units watching the railroad tracks near the industrial park, I checked on a male subject who was sleeping in a car at [REDACTED]. The subject was all set and had been there since the night before, as he was homeless.

At approx. 1:03 pm, I went to [REDACTED], which is a residence that sits up in the woods by the walking trail entrance. I did not see anything suspicious and it did not appear anyone was home. I had dispatch call to check and make sure they were all set, as they lived so close to the industrial park.

At approx. 1:42 pm, I heard from MSP [REDACTED] Sgt Roy who advised that another tactical team would be heading to clear areas down by Maine Recycling; they would also be clearing areas from the boat ramp to Maine Recycling. I forwarded this info to my department and area agencies that were near me.

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Area departments continued to maintain a perimeter around the industrial park. I had also spoken to Topsham PD and they offered to have some units watch the walking trail and railroad tracks down by Rusty Lantern.

We received information about two empty mobile homes off Davis Street. Lisbon PD and area officers were advised to check on them to ensure no one was inside. Units were checked and no one was located.

At approx. 6:00 pm, I received info that there was a photo on social media of the suspect wearing a [REDACTED] shirt. I requested units check [REDACTED], located in Lisbon; nothing suspicious was found.

Numerous complaints continued to come in, as Lisbon PD and neighboring agencies responded to the calls for service. (See call log for further info).

Friday 10/27/2023

At approx. 3:00 am, I located a vehicle [REDACTED] parked in the Midtown parking lot with expired plates. I checked on the vehicle and nobody was inside.

At approx. 3:39 am, I located [REDACTED] at Dingley Press, I checked on the vehicle and no one was inside or around the vehicle and the RO was suspended.

At approx. 3:50 am, I stopped [REDACTED] for speeding by Angelo's Pizza. The subject advised his wife was pregnant and he was rushing home to check on her.

At approx. 4:16 am, I located a female and a dog by EZ Mart, I asked if she had seen anyone suspicious in the area, and she had not. She was identified as [REDACTED] and was from out of state. She explained she left an abusive relationship in Auburn, and was now homeless with her dog. I offered her a ride to a shelter, which she refused and provided her with some food gift cards, food for her dog, and a Safe Voices card and explained the services they have, along with my business card, and I cleared.

My officers were checking businesses and parking lots in Capitol Avenue, and we received a call at 4:38 am of a person walking on the tracks by [REDACTED]. An officer had been in that area and did not observe anyone come out on that area of the tracks.

I had officers posted up on those tracks, as well as the opposite end of the tracks by the Big Dipper and I had a team of two officers come in from Rusty Lantern towards the industrial park. I went with Sgt Levesque and Officer Cusson, entering the area in behind LHS ball fields and we used infrared cameras and checked the tracks and the walking trail from behind the industrial park, and met up with the other officers searching, we did not locate anyone.

I followed up with the owner of 207 Edibles off Canal Street that morning to [REDACTED] review her cameras and found the subject reported near the tracks had walked out of an apartment [REDACTED], and turned around and went back to the apartment above [REDACTED]. We confirmed it was not the suspect.

At 5:17 am, Officer Shawn Kelly found a Tractor-trailer truck at Maine Recycling that looked suspicious, as the seat was leaned forward. Lisbon PD Officers searched the truck, as well as all the trucks and trailers in the parking lot. ASO deputies arrived on scene to assist us, and we then checked the Maine Recycling building and

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located an open door. We had several more officers from our department and ASO arriving to assist with clearing and containing the building. I also contacted the MSP [REDACTED] Sgt Roy, and advised him on what we found before we made entry. He advised that it had already been cleared by another [REDACTED] and it was possible it was left open that afternoon prior to when it was cleared. He advised we were good to check it. I advised if we found anyone inside, we would hold a perimeter and call for assistance.

I met with the officers on scene, and a plan was put together to clear the large building and office space. We sent two teams in at once, at two different entry points on the building. We searched the building, and no one was located inside. During the search, we found that numerous doors were unlocked or left open, except for the main office. Before clearing, all the doors, except one, were secured.

At approx. 6:48 am, it was reported that a subject was dressed in military gear while walking on the side of the road on outer Pinewoods Road. Officers went to the area and checked numerous locations in that area, as this was near the Lewiston line, a far distance from where the suspect's car was found. We were not able to locate the suspicious person.

At 7:21 am, the Lisbon Sewer Treatment Plant Superintendent asked us to clear the sewer district buildings on Summer Street near the Topsham Line. I arrived on the scene with several officers and we cleared the buildings.

At approx. 8:30 am, I Spoke to the MSP Command Post and was informed that they were going to be doing large grid searches from the boat ramp towards the school and along the walking trail with multiple teams. I offered the police department UTV for the tactical team to use and brought it to the Big Dipper area for them.

Anticipating this was going to cause media to go to this area, I had our officers use police crime scene tape to cordon off areas we did not want them to go during the search. Barricades and cones were used to shut down the breakdown lanes in the area. I spoke to MSP and they advised they were going to have the media stage in the area of the Big Dipper; I redirected them to the parking lot across the street at the entrance of Saint Matthews Church, in order to keep them away from the walking trail.

I met with members from HSI, as well as Lewiston PD and other officers who came to assist in the search and directed them to the boat ramp to meet up with the MSP [REDACTED], as they were starting out of that area. The Big Dipper was setup as an emergency point, in case EMS was needed to respond.

At approx. 11:08 am, it was reported of a single gunshot behind the construction site at Spring Works Farm on 347 Lisbon Street. Multiple multi-jurisdictional agencies and I responded to Spring Works Farm. I called Sgt Roy of MSP and he advised [REDACTED], and that was probably the reported noise. I told him I believed those units were searching towards the school and did not think they would hear it that far away, but he advised it was possible. I asked if he could have the helicopter fly over and check the area, and he advised he would. I advised him we were in the area and would check the site as well.

I had half of the responding units go along the east side of the construction site and the other half of the responding units go along the right side of the construction site. A construction worker reported that he heard the gunshot near the job site as well.

I met up with some members of the warden service, who had access to an app that showed where they were doing grid searches. We learned from the warden after he looked into it further, that the Maine Warden Service

and the MSP [REDACTED] were actually doing a grid search a very short distance from Spring Works Farm towards the river. I called all units to back out of the area, as it was confirmed [REDACTED], not far from Spring Works Farm and not a gunshot.

I went back to the area of the boat ramp, where there were numerous media outlets in the area, which I contained and monitored, so they would not enter the search areas.

At approx. 5:30 pm, Lt Picard relayed information he received to me from the supervisor of Maine Recycling. He said that trailers could be full in the overflow lot down past Maine Recycling, and the suspect could be hiding in them. I spoke to the command post about it, as it was explained to me there was crushed-up plastic and aluminum and the suspect could essentially climb up over these items and barricade himself in the trailers. This led to concern, as they did not have a way to dump out the trailers. Early on in the search, three Lisbon Officers had done cursory searches in that same overflow lot. However, knowing there were areas that the suspect could hide/barricade in the trailers I wanted to make sure that area was searched again.

I spoke to the command post in hopes we could have Border Patrol or US Customs [REDACTED] at the industrial park, in case the suspect was hiding inside of them. I was advised that they would call me back after relaying this info. A little while later, I received a call back that they were not [REDACTED]. I asked if they were able to [REDACTED] to see if they could manually search them. They advised they would call me back.

A short time later, I received a call from Sgt Roy with MSP [REDACTED]. Sgt Roy advised he was briefed on the info and would send a team down to manually search the trailers. He also advised that they would be setting up a Command Post in the morning at the Lisbon High School by 9:00 am since we were searching a large area in Lisbon.

I met with my department at approx. 6:15 pm and briefed them that The MSP [REDACTED] was going to search the trailers at Maine Recycling overflow lot, and that tomorrow morning at 9am, they would be setting up a command post at the Lisbon High School for their tactical operations.

At approx. 8:31 pm, I received a call from Sgt Roy advising that they had located Robert Card in the back of a trailer, and he was deceased. I headed to the scene and met with members of [REDACTED] on the roadway.

I did not go into the area where the trailer was parked and stayed on Capitol Avenue. Sgt Roy called me and advised they would like me to attend a press conference at Lewiston City Hall at 10:00 pm.

Maine State Police Major Crimes responded to that area to process the scene. Lisbon PD officers assisted Maine State Police with a perimeter until they were finished.

This concluded our involvement with the manhunt. It should be noted that before the October 25th incident, The Lisbon Police Department had no involvement with Robert Card [REDACTED], and this incident on October 25th was the first time we had dealt with Robert Card. I checked with my dispatch, officers, and CID Division, and no one was aware of any information on Robert Card before this incident.

NARRATIVE FOR CHIEF RYAN A MCGEE

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NARRATIVE FOR RESERVE PATROL OFFICER GLEN J BRUSHWEIN

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On 10/25/23 I was off duty and at home. Somewhere around 1930 my wife said she saw on facebook there was a shooting in Lewiston. Maybe 1/2 hour later she said there was another shooting happening in Lewiston. I turned on the news and my portable radio to see what was happening. I realized it was an active shooter and they were searching for the suspect. I got suited up in my uniform and came in to the Police station.

I arrived approximately 2100 hours. Dispatch stated that they had found the vehicle at the boat launch on Frosthill Ave. All the units were out on the road and at the scene. I took my personal vehicle and met up with several officers at the intersection of Frosthill and Ridge Rd. while the state police tact team checked the veh. I was then paired up in a cruiser and we responded to different locations in search of Mr. Card. At one point there was an open In the early morning hours myself and Ofc. Williams were assigned to take up a post at the intersection of Capitol Ave and Route 196 and not let anyone go into the industrial park. We were relieved of that post Thursday approximately 1030 to go home and get some sleep.

I returned to duty 10/26/23 at approximately 1900 hours. I was again paired up in a cruiser . We responded to several calls of suspicious activity thru out town. We also patrolled the capitol ave area and checked businesses looking for any sign of Mr. Card. I was on duty until 0600 the following morning.

I returned to work on 10/27/23 at 1800 hrs. My first assignment was stationed at the intersection of Frosthill Ave and Route 196. State police was doing a search at the boat ramp and I was there to keep people out of the area and safe from traffic on Rout 196. When relieved from there I went on patrol in the area still looking for signs of Mr. Card. I then transported a homeless female that was in town to Livermore Falls to a person she could stay with there to be safe. When I returned I was notified they had found Mr. Cards body and I was to go to Capitol Ave to help with securing the area. I stayed stationed there until I was released of duty in the early morning hours of 10/28/23.

Report from Officer Brianna Kenney with Lisbon Police Department:

On 10/25/23 at approximately 1930 hours, I was called into work due to an active shooter incident taking place in our neighboring town of Lewiston. I arrived at work and learned two shootings had occurred at Spare Time bowling alley and Schemengees Bar and Grill. There were multiple victims and the shooter was still on the loose.

I was assigned to work with Officer Wayne Drake and we started heading towards the Lewiston town line until we received further instruction. While on our way, a call came in saying there was an active shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. Officer Drake and I immediately responded to Walmart DC to assist. We arrived on scene with multiple other agencies and were told to hold a perimeter around the business. We parked at the corner of Alfred A. Plourde Pkwy and Goddard Rd. facing the distribution center with all of our spotlights facing that way. We received a photo of the shooter from video footage at the businesses that were targeted. At this time we were provided the name, [REDACTED], as a possible suspect, but no vehicle information was given. Due to a lot of different radio frequencies, we were instructed to switch to the State Wide channel so we could all hear the same updates being given.

An SUV pulled up to the intersection next to us coming off of Goddard Rd. Officer Drake and I shined our flashlights into the vehicle and saw an AR pistol style weapon laying on the front passenger seat. [REDACTED]

A little while later we were told that the Walmart DC had been swept through by officers and there was no threat determined there. We were informed that [REDACTED] had been located and he was NOT the shooter. We were advised a command post was set up the Colisee in Lewiston and all law enforcement were asked to go there. However, we started receiving separate complaints in Lisbon involving a possible shots fired call, an open door/suspicious condition call, a suspicious vehicle call and a suspicious person complaint involving a male walking around in just lingerie. We were instructed to head back to Lisbon to handle these calls and to be on alert for updates.

The complaints were handled and we were then given an update that the suspect had been identified as, Robert Card, and the vehicle he was driving was a 2013 white Subaru Outback [REDACTED] with a black front bumper. Officer Drake and I began checking various parts of Lisbon for the suspect vehicle. None of the complaints we handled were determined to be involved with the shootings. We were told that Robert Card had military training, was a firearms instructor and potentially had thermal or night vision on his gun.

At approximately 2152 hours, Sgt. Nate Morse advised us that he had just located Robert Card's vehicle at the boat launch in Lisbon Falls off of Frosthill Ave. All units immediately responded to that area. When we arrived we pulled onto the edge of the parking lot just off the road and aimed our lights at the tree line. Chief Ryan McGee and K9 Officer Lucas Shirland were next to us with their lights on the vehicle and their weapons drawn. As other responders arrived they made a perimeter around the outside of the parking lot with the cruisers and had all their lights aimed at the car. Nobody that responded entered the parking lot. Officer Drake had a

magnifying scope on his rifle and he was reportedly able to somewhat see into the vehicle through the windows and didn't see anyone inside. However, he was obviously unable to tell if anyone could potentially be laying down inside so we held the perimeter.

I went with a few officers from other agencies to the [REDACTED] to check on the homeowners and Officer Drake remained in his position. I knocked on the door and a light came on. The homeowner and his wife opened the door and had a firearm with them. I had illuminated my uniform with my flashlight and announced it was the Police. They advised they were okay and had shut the lights off in the home for protection. They advised they hadn't seen or heard anything and only knew of what had occurred through the media. They advised they would remain inside with locked doors and would report anything suspicious. I then returned to my patrol car. A helicopter had arrived on scene and began a search of the area from above.

A message was relayed to us by Chief McGee that the Maine State Police [REDACTED] [REDACTED] At this point multiple responding agencies assisted in closing down different roads surrounding the area. Officer Drake and I went to the end of Frosthill Ave. where it intersects with Ridge Rd. and remained there for a period of time. We then assisted with various calls throughout the night for suspicious conditions and none of them were deemed connected to this incident. We also assisted the [REDACTED] by setting up a perimeter while they checked a home on [REDACTED]

The [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Robert's. I was not involved with the [REDACTED] search.

Since my position at Lisbon Police Department is a School Resource Officer, I was contacted shortly after 0200 hours and asked to go let members of the Maine State Police into the Lisbon High School Gym. I let them in and shut the alarms off. [REDACTED] I grabbed a case of water and some snacks from my office and left them in the gym. I provided one of the troopers with my cell phone number so they could contact me if they needed anything and we cleared.

Throughout the night I learned various information about Robert Card. Within the last few weeks he had threatened to shoot up a National Guard Facility and he was still a member of the National Guard. He was taken into protective custody for mental health concerns and was reportedly hearing voices, but he was eventually released. He had recently purchased firearms and was known to own multiple prior to that. Robert had recently been fired from the Maine Recycling business located on Capitol Ave.

Lisbon PD members were asked to meet at the old [REDACTED] shop to debrief around 0400 hours. No new information in regards to Robert Card's potential whereabouts was given. At this point myself and several others were sent home to rest and told to report back at 1030 hours on Thursday 10/26/23 to relieve the officers that stayed overnight.

On 10/26/23 I arrived to work and was paired up with Officer Renee Bernard for the day. We were asked to relieve the overnight shift from their post on route 196 near St. Matthews church. We were instructed to keep the area of the boat launch cleared as it was still being processed for evidence. There were a few media crews

near us. After being there for approximately an hour or so we were told we could clear. At that point we were assigned to just patrol and handle calls as necessary.

Most of the other agencies had cleared Lisbon and were checking other surrounding towns. There were only a few Androscoggin County Deputies left assisting us with things. Officer Bernard and I responded to a domestic disturbance, a suspicious person in the woods with a reported gun on Zamore St. (which turned out to be a shovel), a check the well-being call, and we assisted with searching the Knights of Columbus area between route 196 and the walking path. Multiple check-ins were done throughout the day and no new updates were provided. We did receive information that Robert Card was wearing a [REDACTED] in the picture. The [REDACTED] is located [REDACTED] in Lisbon and is surrounded by woods. We check that area with other Lisbon PD officers and nothing was found. Officer Bernard and I were relieved at 1900 hours after a short briefing and asked to return at 0600 hours.

I arrived back to work on Friday 10/27/23 and learned the overnight shift was at Maine Recycling clearing the building after locating an open door. Lt. Picard asked that I bring a battery pack down with me as one of the cruisers was having a battery issue. He had me stay at the base of Capital Ave. where it branches off into two different directions and keep an eye on the area while they searched the building. Detective St. Amant was near me at the entrance to Lisbon Fuel Company on Capital Ave. We cleared there shortly after and went back to the PD for a brief update. Det. St. Amant, a few other officers and I checked a gravel pit and abandoned house located down a long gravel driveway at the intersection of Ferry and Pinewoods Rd. near Lewiston's Cotton Rd. which produced negative results. I spoke with the head of the Lisbon Recreation Department, [REDACTED], in regards to some game cameras that he and I installed on the walking path a few weeks earlier after repeated vandalism had occurred. [REDACTED] advised he hadn't taken them down yet. I met with him at Beaver Park and got the keys to the locks on the cameras. Det. St. Amant, Officer Bernard and I went and collected the cameras off the walking path. Both cameras had dead batteries. Det. St. Amant went back to the station with them to see if they captured anything before they died. At this point I was told multiple agencies would be returning to Lisbon to conduct a grid search of the area starting at the boat launch when Card's vehicle was found. I learned a potential suicide note had been found at Robert Card's residence during a search there.

The other agencies arrived and I learned that despite working for Lisbon PD and being familiar with the areas being searched, other Lisbon personal and I were not going to be participating in the grid search and it was being done by the Maine State Police and a few members of the Maine Warden Service. I was asked to go to various access points to the walking path and put crime scene tape up to keep people off the walking path. While putting tape up at the entrance to the railroad tracks that lead to the walking path on River Rd. I saw some of the search party going through the woods traveling deeper in the woods down the River Rd. area. I was placing tape at the entrance to the walking path by the Lisbon Community School on Mill St. when I heard a loud bang. I was later informed this was [REDACTED] during the grid search. I went back towards the area of the boat launch to see how else I could assist when a shots fired call was called in at Springworks Farm on Lisbon Street approximately a mile away. It was reported multiple workers had evacuated the farm and there were also construction workers located at the back of the Springworks property working. I responded there and met up with Lt. Picard and other responding officers. The constructions workers advised they heard the bang as well and advised it wasn't them. They were told to leave the area while we investigated it. Chief McGee arrived with more responding units and went to the opposite side of the construction site than the team of officers I was with.

██████████ 20 or so minutes earlier to Lt. Picard and he advised that the search team was over on the Frosthill Ave. side of the boat launch working towards Mill St. and he didn't think they would be able to hear ██████████. I told Lt. Picard there was a search team in the woods by River Rd too. Lt. Picard advised he wasn't aware of a team being in that area and I told him I saw them in there while putting tape up so they very well could be in the woods we were now focusing on. I asked if he could check with the Chief so we didn't end up in a potential crossfire situation. Lt. Picard put his hand on his radio to check, but the Chief came over the radio saying he was looking into whether or not a team was in the woods there. Chief McGee then advised there was in fact a search team in there and they had ██████████. This was done at the same time the reported single shot was heard by Springworks employees. At this point we cleared the area. I was asked to return to the boat launch area to assist with crowd control as a heavy media presence showed up and was circling the area where divers were trying to work at the boat launch. I was asked to clear the media from the riverbank and have them stand beyond the guardrails on the opposite side of the road. A few media members climbed over the police line do not cross tape and attempted to run under the railroad bridge area to the water where the divers were. They were redirected again and eventually lost interest with the place they were provided for media coverage. Most of them cleared my area and went over to the opposite side of the bridge where Officer Darby and Officer Ouellette were. I cleared after an hour and a half or so and returned to the PD for the end of shift briefing. I was told to be back again at 0600 hours on 10/28/23 and I, along with the other Lisbon Officers would be paired up with an outside agencies' as we know the towns layout. We would be briefed coming in and would know more about assignments then. My shift ended at 1800 hours.

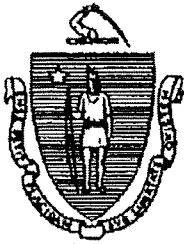
I was at home when I received a call from Sgt. Andrew Levesque saying Robert Card had just been found deceased ██████████ in one of the trailers in Maine Recycling's overflow lot. I hung up with him and was then asked by Sgt. Nathan Morse if I was available to come back in and assist with scene control due to the heavy media presence at the crime scene. I went back in and was stationed ██████████ on Capital Ave. I maintained the perimeter with no issues until I was released around 0130 hours.

This concludes my involvement with this case.

On 10/26/23 around 0600 hours, I, Officer Kelly was working the day shift and was a "fresh body" as I was not called in Wednesday night when this incident unfolded. I was the duty officer, working day shift on this day. Around 0700 hours, I was assigned to the area of Lisbon Rd and River Rd to detour traffic, as Lisbon Rd (aka Rte196) was shut down due to searching for Robert Card. The perimeter was secured until we were released. We were also responsible for keeping the media out of the restricted area. I cleared this area just before 1400 hours. I secured for the day at 1400 hours.

On 10/27/23 around 0200 hours, I came back to work where I was the duty officer and handled calls for a while. Around 0400 hours, I was assigned to work with Officer Jeffrey Williams. Officer Williams and I checked businesses and handled any calls that came in. Around 0517 hours, Officer Williams and I checked Maine Recycling. At this time we observed the driver's seat in a sleeper cab truck to be forward. We called for additional units to clear this truck and the area. While waiting, it was observed one of the main doors was open. Once enough units from Lisbon P.D. and A.S.O. had arrived we cleared the main building, trucks, and trailers that were on the main lot. Nothing was located or found to be out of place to include Card.

On 10/27/23, I was called back into work as Card had been located in a Maine Recycling trailer in the lower rear lot, deceased. I arrived to work around 2300 hours. I was assigned to cover the road and handle calls that came in. Around 0200 hours, I relieved Officer Brushwein who was on station on Capital Ave just before Enterprise Electric. Officer Brushwein was assigned to this area to make sure nobody walked up the walking trail and contaminate the crime scene. I took this post from 0200 ish to-0700 hours. At 0700 hours, Det Sibley from L.P.D took over. I returned to the P.D. and then secured 0800 hours.

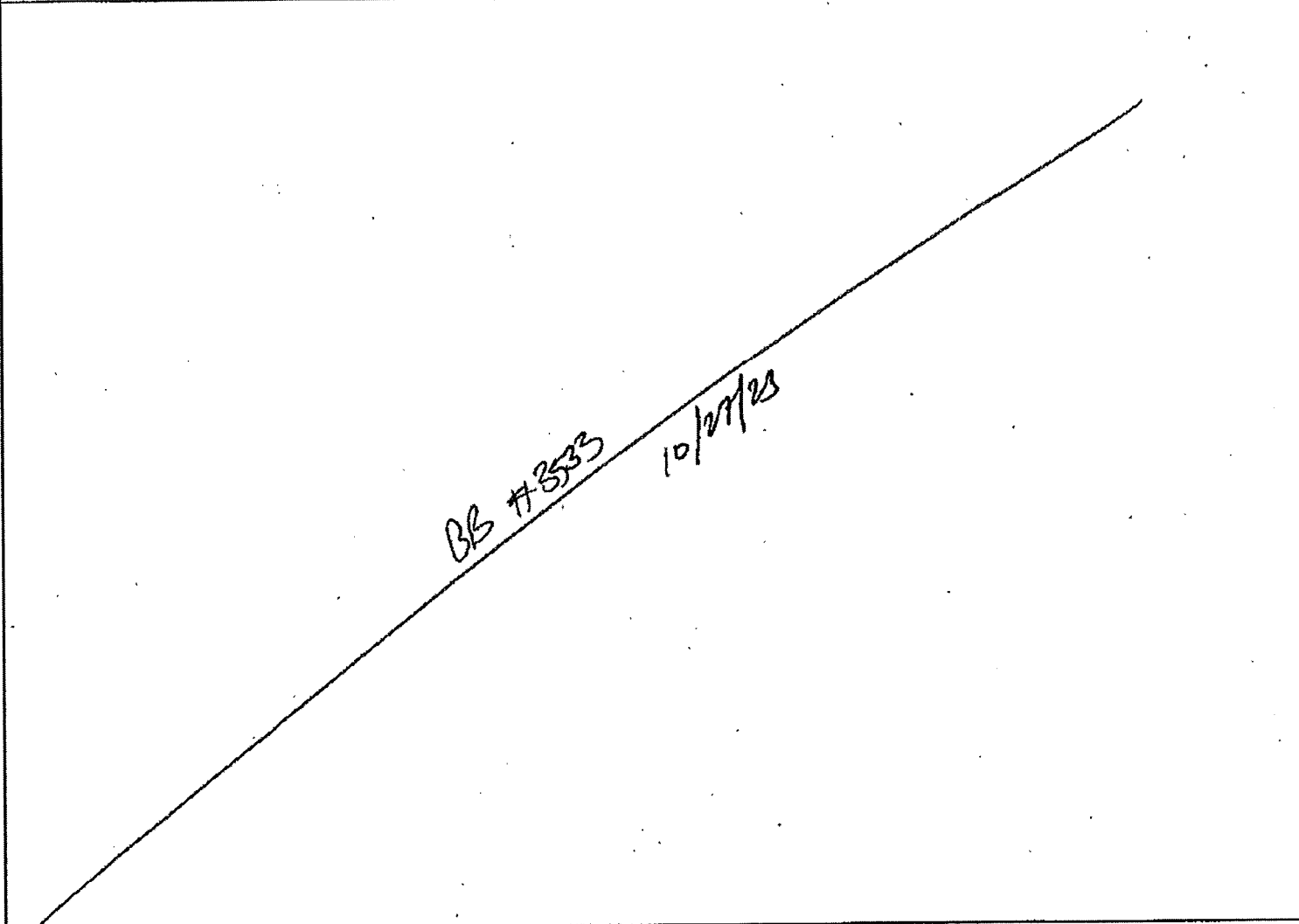

NARRATIVE FOR PATROL OFFICER MICHAEL S ROBB

On 10/25/2023 at approximately 19:19 hrs., I Officer Robb, was operating a fully marked police cruiser on Pigeon Hill Rd. in Mechanic Falls. Officer Streeter was currently in Field Training and riding passenger. I heard dispatch say there was another active shooter at Schmengee's in Lewiston. I started to head that direction and heard Deputy Guay say that he needed every unit available over the radio. I activated my lights and siren and began calling Sgt. Schroeder to notify him of the ongoing situation.

I arrived at Schmengee's at 19:53 hrs. and grabbed my patrol rifle. I handed my med kit to Officer Streeter and we began running towards Schmengees. I entered Schmengees and saw three bodies on the ground and several officers already in there. I walked outside towards the rear exit to establish a perimeter with Deputy Pealaterre. [REDACTED]

The field beside Schmengee's was clear and I returned to my cruiser. I drove to Stetson Rd. where there were other Officers gathering to begin a grid search. At this time, dispatch said there were two males at Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston with rifles inside the building. I returned to my cruiser and followed the other police cruisers to the distribution center. There were already several units clearing the distribution center upon arrival. I parked my cruiser near the woodline and watched for anything suspicious.

I was told by a Maine State Trooper that available units will be meeting at Lewiston Police Department [REDACTED]. I returned to my cruiser and relocated to Lewiston Police Department. I stood by with other Officers while I awaited further instructions. The Command Post instructed all of the units to meet at the Colisee in Lewiston until more information was given. I met with Sgt. Schroeder and other ASO units at the Colisee. The suspect was identified through dispatch as Robert Card [REDACTED].

Dispatch advised the suspect's car was seen at a boat launch in Lisbon. Officer Streeter and I headed in that direction to patrol the surrounding area. I followed other units to the boat launch in Lisbon and parked my cruiser. The Maine State Police Tactical team was currently at the vehicle at the boat launch. Myself and other units were standing by and watching the wood lines. Deputy Pealaterre and I parked our vehicles farther up the road to turn away oncoming traffic. Several media personnel were showing up and were instructed to stay behind the police cruisers.

After a couple hours, Deputy Pealaterre and I headed back to the Colisee to meet with the other units. I met with Sgt. Schroeder and waited for further instructions. The radio traffic had come to a standstill and Sgt. Schroeder said he was going to head home if nothing surfaced by 1 am. I stood by with Officer Streeter and at approximately 01:00 hrs. I returned to Mechanic Falls.

I Jeffrey Goss the Chief of Police for the Mechanic Falls Police Department was called at my residence on 10/25/2023 at approximately 1900 hrs. The calls were from Sergeant Schroeder of the Mechanic Falls Police Department and another immediately followed from Chief Deputy William Gagne of the Androscoggin Sheriffs Department. Both notified me of the active shooter situation and the need for help. I suited up and called dispatch to inform them that I was responding. They instructed me to go to Schemengees. While enroute I heard radio traffic that that location was secured and they were all set with manpower. I diverted to the Lewiston Police Station and met with those in charge at that command post at approximately 1950hrs. After a short time it was decided that we needed Law Enforcement presence at the hospitals and I stated that I would take Central Maine Medical Center. An officer from a southern Maine agency who was in plain clothes went with me. We set up at the main entrance to the hospital at approximately 2004hrs. As helicopters began to arrive the officer that was with me went up to the helipad. He returned a short time later and we discussed that where the Security at the main entrance was aware that he was a Law Enforcement Officer in plain clothes he would remain there and I would go to the helipad so that there was a uniformed officer at that location. I was at the helipad at approximately 2045hrs. I remained at the hospital helipad until 0025 when the aircrews were securing for the night. The helipad area was locked up and I returned to the Lewiston Police Department. I was told that I could secure and at 0050hrs I was clear.

On October 25th 2023 at approximately 19:17 I, Officer Streeter was in the passenger seat of MEC2 with my FTO Officer Robb on Pigeon Hill Rd. in Mechanic Falls.

We heard the call over the radio of "Active Shooter" and made the determination to head to Schemengee's on Lincoln St in Lewiston. Officer Robb drove and I called Sergeant Schroeder to let him know we were on our way to Lewiston for the active shooter.

We arrived at Schemengees at 19:29 and parked along Lincoln St. We went to the front entrance to see if there were injured people who needed transport, as that was the last radio call. When we got to the doorway, we were informed by an officer that "only the dead is left in there." Deputy Nadeau asked if I had a weapon other than my pistol and I did not. I was not qualified with a rifle yet; Deputy Nadeau gave me the shotgun from his cruiser.

We went and secured the West side of the Schemengees parking lot with Deputy Pealatore of Androscoggin Sherriff's Office (ASO).

After holding that position, we received a radio call that there may be more deceased bodies in the field to our right. Officer Robb, myself, and another officer went to check the field. As we did a sweep, we did not notice any bodies, blood, or anything to suggest shooting had occurred there.

We went over to the wood line and called out to see if there was anyone hiding in the woods. [REDACTED]

Officer Robb and I made our way to where the fence and wood line met, and directed the subject to keep his hands visible and to climb up the hill toward us. The subject said there may be more people down there, but that he didn't know. The subject climbed up and was frisked and then taken away by the other officer. Officer Robb and I continued all the way down the wood line shining flashlights and calling out to other potential victims to see if they were alright. We found no other victims.

After being told to "set up somewhere in the middle of the city" Officer Robb and I got back into the cruiser and drove to Lewiston PD to await further instructions.

While waiting outside the PD we received a picture of the alleged shooter via text from Chief Goss of Mechanic Falls PD at 19:56.

We received a radio call to head to the Lewiston Veterinary Hospital to participate in a search. Officer Robb and I were to work with two Lewiston Officers and head down the tracks [REDACTED] located a suspicious subject outside a trailer home.

We then received a dispatch call at 20:12 that the Wal Mart Distribution center had an active shooter. Officer Robb and I went to that scene. We waited outside and looked at the wood line with our lights.

We then went to the Lewiston PD to await being assigned [REDACTED] At this time, we received a BOLO of the alleged shooter and his vehicle.

Officer Robb and I went back to the Lewiston Colisee and met with Sergeant Schroeder. We stayed there until about 01:00 on October 26th before returning back to Mechanic Falls PD.

On 10/25/23 at approximately 1920 hrs., I Sergeant Schroeder received a call from Officer Robb informing me of an active shooter situation was occurring in Lewiston. I cleared both Officer Robb and Officer Streeter to head to Lewiston to assist with the active shooter situation which was in-progress.

I left my residence with all my equipment and headed to the station. I contacted Chief Goss and informed him of the situation. Once at the office, I signed into Cruiser 1 and posted myself at the border of Minot and Auburn. I contacted Chief Goss, who at this time was at the command post in Lewiston with other senior law enforcement officials to see if I was needed elsewhere. Chief Goss informed me to stay at the border and would advise me where to deploy if needed.

At 2012 hrs., I heard radio traffic informing us that there was another active shooter incident being reported at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. I informed dispatch that I would be in route and responded lights and sirens. Once in Lewiston, I came across multiple homeland agents and Sabattus PD on Lincoln St which was blocking my route. At this time multiple ASO units had already arrived at the Walmart Distribution Center and began clearing out the center.

At this time, dispatch informed all remaining units to return to LPD to stage. Prior to leaving, I provided the Homeland Agents a photo of the suspect (later identified as Robert Card [REDACTED] and headed over the LPD to stage.

At the staging point, both Deputy Pinkham and I were dispatch to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Once we were cleared from the scene, both Deputy Pinkham and I return to LPD but was redirected to the new staging area at the Collsee in Lewiston.

Once we arrived at the Colisee, I meet up with both Officer Robb and Officer Streeter who informed me of the scene they dealt with at Schmengees. All three of us remained with the ASO units and stood by for orders. It was decided that we would pair up and search the surrounding areas including the backroads. I again paired up with Deputy Pinkham. As we were beginning to load into the cruisers, we received word that a vehicle matching the description used by Robert was located at the boat launch off Frost Hill Ave in Lisbon.

As we were responding to the area, it was noted over the air that there was a possibly that Robert could be on the Paper Mill Trail possibly heading towards the Lisbon Community School. Both Deputy Pinkham and I searched the back roads off Mill St. and then joined the perimeter team at the Lisbon Community School. We remained on scene until Deputy Pinkham was advised to stand down, since he was returning later on for his shift. At which time, he brought me back to my Cruiser at LPD.

I returned to the staging area and again meet up with both Officer Robb and Officer Streeter who had just returned from the Boat Launch scene. Chief Goss contacted me informing me that he had been secured from CMMC scene and was heading back to town. I advised him that I would remain at the staging area until 0100 hrs., and at which time I would also be returning back to the town with both Officer Robb and

On October 25th, 2023 at approximately 1910hrs I was on duty, in uniform and operating a fully marked Monmouth Police Crusier. I overheard radio traffic about an active shooter at a Bowling facility in Lewiston.

At 1912 Hrs I texted Lt. Dana Wessling informing him of the situation. I updated Lt. Wessling as I heard the updates over the radio to include casualties and the second location involved.

At 1938 Hrs I was informed by Lt. Wessling that all available Monmouth officers would be meeting at Mardens in Lewiston.

While enroute to Lewiston I received a phone call from Chief Paul Ferland asking what was going on, I updated him on the incident so far.

I arrived at Mardens in Lewiston and met with Officer Zachary Roy from Monmouth Police Department. Officer Kirk Barkman and Lt. Wessling would arrive shortly after.

The radio traffic was stating many law enforcement officers were meeting at Lewiston Police Department and would be given tasks then.

While enroute to Lewiston PD, we diverted back to the location of the first location, Just-in-time Recreation, a bowling alley. I arrived on scene and then heard radio traffic about a possible sighting at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. Myself and Officer Roy headed to the distribution center.

Officer Roy and I provided scene security while the possible sighting was investigated. Officer Roy dealt with [REDACTED]

I received a call from Lt. Wessling asking Officer Roy and I to meet him and Officer Barkman at Lewiston Police Department.

We were given a vehicle description of a white Subaru Outback and sent a picture of the male suspect who was identifeid as Robert Card.

Officer Roy and I met with Lt. Wessling and Officer Brkman at Lewiston Police Department and waited for an assignment. While at Lewiston PD, Winthrop Officer's Cody Perkins, Lt. Josh Hammond and Dt. Cpl. Savannah Brennan arrived at Lewiston Police Department.

I am not sure how long we were at Lewiston Police Department, probably 45 minutes to an hour, before we received a task, a reported sighting of the described vehicle. There was no vehicle there when we arrived.

We continued to drive around town looking for the vehicle. Myself, Officer Barkman, Winthrop Officer Andrew Delaney, Lt. Hammond, Dt. Cpl. Brennan pulled into The Rusty Lantern in Sabattus. We decided to stay in pairs, Officer Barkman and I decided to drive further down RTE 126 towards Monmouth in case the suspect tried to go home.

At approximately 2000 hrs I heard radio traffic stating the vehicle had been located in Lisbon, at a boat launch off of Frost Hill Ave. I also received a phone call from Lt. Wessling stating he was headed to where the vehicle had been

located. Officer Barkman and I responded as well..


Officer Barkman and I arrived on scene at approximately 2010 hrs and met with Lt. Wessling and Officer Roy. Officer Barkman was tasked with shutting down Lisbon St.

The remaining Monmouth Officers provided scene security [REDACTED] cleared the vehicle and confirmed the suspect was not in the vehicle.

At approximately 0100 on 10/26/23 I cleared the call along with Officer Roy. I returned to Monmouth for the remainder of my shift while Lt. Wessling and Officer Barkman remained on scene.

On October 25th, 2023, 1912 I received a text message from Officer Mora of the Monmouth Police Department informing me of the active shooter situation in Lewiston. She updated me as she heard the updates over the radio to include casualties and the second location involved. Chief Paul Ferland was on vacation and out of cell phone coverage. I called Lt. Hammond of the Winthrop Police Department and advised him of the situation. Lt. Hammond decided to keep the Winthrop Officers on Station to include covering the Town of Monmouth for calls for service. At this time, I decided to deploy all Monmouth Officers. I instructed them to meet at the parking lot of Mardens.

Upon my arrival Officers Mora, Barkman and Roy were there and awaiting instructions. The radio traffic was stating many law enforcement officers were meeting at Lewiston Police Department and would be given tasks then, so we started to head that way. While enroute to Lewiston PD, we diverted back to the location of the first location, Just-in-time Recreation, a bowling alley. We arrived on scene and then heard radio traffic about a possible sighting at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston. Officer Barkman and I headed to the distribution center as I had been separated from Officer's Mora and Roy. Upon our arrival I was there only a few minutes when another possible sighting came over the radio. Officer Barkman and I went to that address and met with Fire Marshall Tabor. That ended up being a dead end, so I made the decision to rendezvous with the Lewiston Police Department for assignments. I called Officer Mora and instructed her and Officer Roy to meet us there.

Upon our arrival we stood in the parking lot at the Lewiston Police Department as Officers from many agencies went in and out of the building. After a short amount of time Lt. Hammond and several Officers from the Winthrop Police Department arrived at the Lewiston Police Department. While there we were able to get a picture of the suspect and eventually a picture of the vehicle he was operating. We were also advised that the suspect was identified as Robert Card. Communications was sparse as Statewide car to car was not used or our radios did not pick it up. We all stood around for a while and I decided to deploy. I had Officer Roy with me as his police vehicle was low in gas. Officer Roy and I would listen to the radio for sightings and attempted to follow up. We ended up parking on Lisbon Street with our lights out, looking for the suspect vehicle.

At approximately 2000 hrs. I heard radio traffic stating the vehicle had been located in Lisbon, at a boat launch off of Frost Hill Ave. Myself and Officer Roy as a passenger responded. Upon our arrival I tasked Officer Barkman with shutting down Lisbon St. The remaining Monmouth Officers provided scene security [REDACTED] cleared the vehicle and confirmed the suspect was not in the vehicle. While there all Officers (approximately 50 cruisers) were all told my Lewiston Police Chief to back up and let the Maine State Police [REDACTED] as they did not want to give the suspect targets. Officer Roy and I and Mora positioned our cruisers just down the road and awaited instructions. I knew that Officer Barkman was in Lisbon blocking the road.

At approximately 0100 on 10/26/23 I cleared both Officer Mora and Officer Roy from the scene and I headed to the intersection where Officer Barkman was stationed. I remained on scene till approximately 5am. During that time, I knew that the multiple tactical units were posting up at the local high school. I also observed several searches overhead as the helicopter was circling and there were tactical units going through yards not very far away from me. I went to speak with some of the Lisbon police Officers when I was invited to sit in while their Police Chief debriefed them. Chief McGee advised his officers that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Lisbon Police had the road leading to Maine Recycling

blocked off. I then spoke to Lieutenant Picard and advised him that I had an Officer posted up at the intersection of Route 196 and Route 9 blocking through traffic. He asked if I could hold him there for a short time until he could get an officer there and I agreed.

I did speak with Chief Ferland and apprised him of the situation. I cleared the scene around 4:30AM and Officer Barkman remained on scene.

On 10/25/2023 I, Zachary Roy of the Monmouth Police Department was at home off duty when I received a text message from Officer Mora around 1912 hours, relating to the shootings in Lewiston, Maine. Officer Mora advised me of the situation at hand and I immediately turned on my radio the Androscoggin Country frequency. I texted Monmouth Police Department Lieutenant, Dana Wessling, and advised him the I was approximately 5 minutes away from where the shootings took place, and that I was ready and available should they need my assistance. Lt. Wessling advised me to get suited up and to meet in the Marden's parking lot at 750 Main St in Lewiston, Maine. I put on my Monmouth Police Department uniform and made my way to Marden's in my marked Monmouth Police cruiser.

I was the first of the Monmouth Police units to arrive at the meet-up location but was soon met by Officer Mora who was on duty at the time. Soon after, Officer Kirk Barkman arrived, as well as Lieutenant Dana Wessling. Not aware of the situation at hand, Lieutenant Wessling advised the Monmouth units to make our way to the Lewiston Police Department so we could receive an assignment. The Monmouth units made their way to the Lewiston Police Department. Officer Mora and I were the first to arrive. Upon arrival, we heard over the radio that units were responding to Just-In-Time Recreation to assist the victims. Officer Mora was on the phone with Lieutenant Wessling, and he advised us to respond to assist. Officer Mora and I responded to Just-In-Time Recreation from the Lewiston Police Department.

Upon arrival at Just-In-Time Recreation, a request for units for the report of an active shooter at the Walmart Distribution Center came in. I, Officer Mora, and approximately a dozen other units responded to the Walmart Distribution Center from Just-In-Time Recreation. I arrived at the intersection of Alfred A. Plourde Parkway and Goddard Rd and assisted the Lewiston Police Department, Maine State Police and the Lisbon Police Department with traffic control. I was directed by Lewiston Police and Lisbon Police to position my cruiser to block traffic from entering Goddard Rd from Alfred A. Plourde Parkway. Officer Mora and I stood guard blocking the roadway [REDACTED]

An unknown bystander approached Officer Mora and I and requested information on the situation. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] subject was approaching Officer Mora and I and we advised that we couldn't give out any information and [REDACTED] needed to vacate the area. [REDACTED] refused to leave after several commands from Officer Mora, a Lisbon Police Officer and I. [REDACTED] ultimately ended up leaving on foot heading northbound on Alfred A. Plourde Parkway toward I-95.

Officer Mora and I were there for approximately 30 to 40 minutes when Lieutenant Wessling met up with us and advised us to return to the Lewiston Police Department to wait for an assignment. Officer Mora, Lieutenant Wessling, Officer Barkman and I responded back to Lewiston Police Department and waited for an assignment in the parking lot. While in the parking lot, we were advised that the subject may be heading to an address at Arkwright Ave and Thompson St. I hopped in Lieutenant Wessling's cruiser and both Lieutenant Wessling, and I responded to the area. There was no suspicious activity when we arrived, so Lieutenant Wessling and I continued to Lisbon St. On Lisbon St, the Maine Warden Service and Androscoggin County were interviewing and searching a gentleman who was walking on Lisbon St that fit the description of the shooter. Lieutenant Wessling and I stood by while the male was searched. The male was released without incident and was not the shooter.

Lieutenant Wessling and I stationed on Lisbon St as we thought it would be a

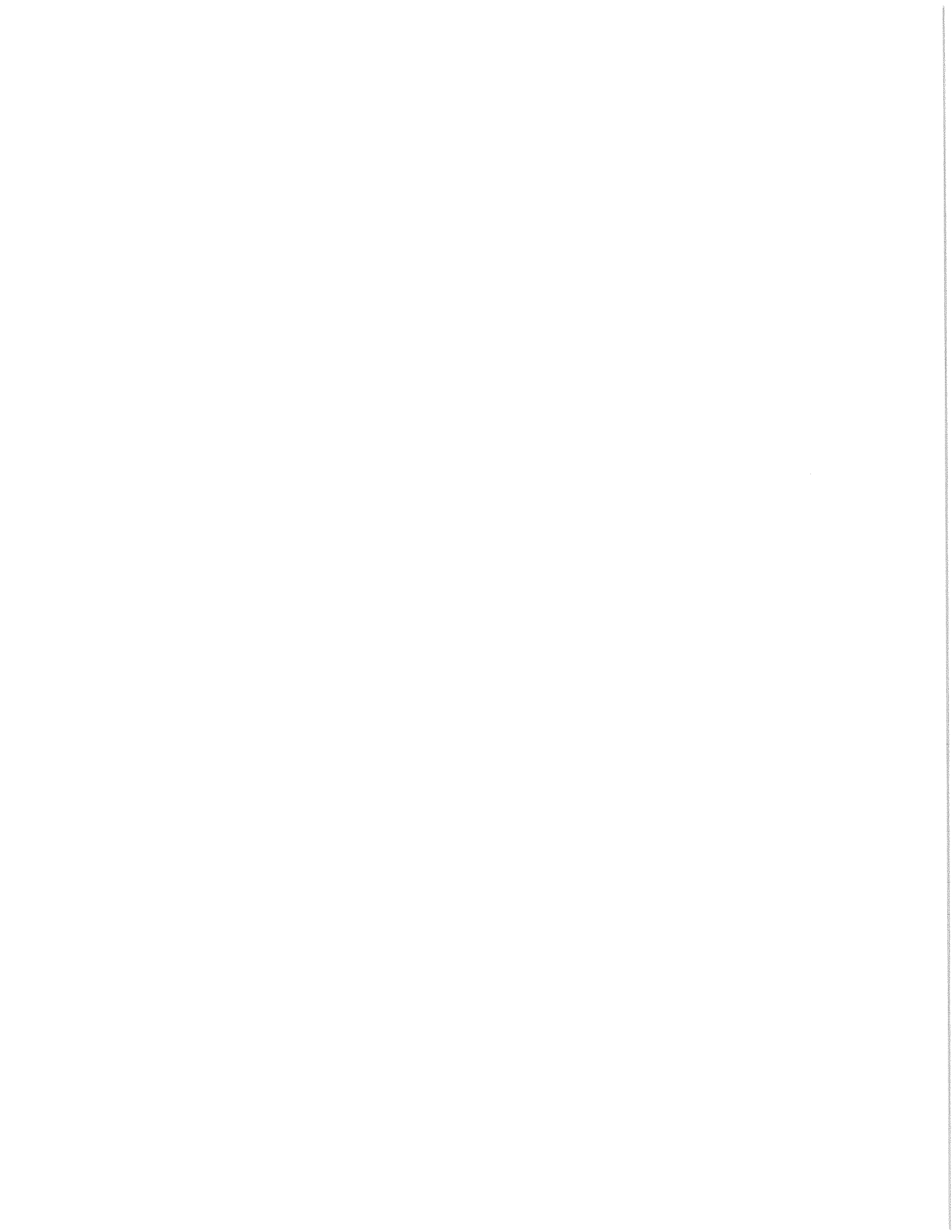
good idea to try to locate the getaway vehicle heading outbound on Lisbon St. Lieutenant Wessling and I were stationed on Lisbon St near the Golden Nozzle Car Wash for approximately 15-20 minutes. Lieutenant Wessling made contact with Officer Mora over the phone and was advised that she and Officer Barkman were stationed at or near the Rusty Lantern in Sabattus. Lieutenant Wessling and I started to make our way to meet up with the other Monmouth units in Sabattus, when we heard over the radio that the Lisbon Police Department had located the suspect vehicle in the parking lot of the Papermill Trail off Frost Hill Ave in Lisbon, Maine. Lieutenant Wessling and I responded and arrived with approximately 30-40 other responding units.

I, along with various other agencies, had my patrol rifle drawn and pointed at the vehicle. We all held our position until the Maine State Police arrived.

Lieutenant Wessling, Officer Mora and I cleared the area and positioned ourselves down the road near the Big Dipper ice cream shop at 501 Lisbon St. We stood by and waited for further commands for approximately 2 hours or more. It was then that we heard over the statewide radio that the State Police helicopter was making its way to an address in Lisbon to search the surrounding area. Lieutenant Wessling, Officer Mora and I repositioned ourselves and assisted units blocking the roadway on Lisbon St near Lisbon High School.

At approximately 0230 hours, Lieutenant Wessling advised me to have Officer Mora bring me back to my cruiser at the Lewiston Police Department and told me to go off duty and get some rest as I had a scheduled shift at 0400 that same day. Officer Mora brought me to my cruiser, and I went off duty around 0300 hours.

On 10/25/2023 at approximately 1920 I was at home off duty when my wife received a call from her sister saying her husband, who is a Leeds firefighter, had gotten an alert on his cellphone about a mass shooting in Lewiston. I texted Officer Mora, who was on duty at the time, to see if she could confirm the report. She replied that she had heard about it and there were two shootings. I got my police radio from my home office and turned it on. I could hear multiple ambulances being dispatched to the area.

I texted Lt. Wessling at 1931 to ask if he was aware of the shootings. He texted back that he was and to get suited up and meet him at Marden's. I dressed in my uniform as quickly as I could, got in my fully marked Monmouth police vehicle and drove to Marden's.

At approximately 1953 I arrived at Marden's and found Officers Mora and Roy already there. Lt. Wessling arrived a few minutes later. We left the Marden's parking lot at approximately 2000 enroute to Lewiston PD. Off Roy was in the lead, followed by Off Mora, then myself and finally LT Wessling. Prior to reaching our turn off Main St. a call came out on the radio for units to assist at Stetson Rd.

LT Wessling called on the radio for Monmouth units to turn around and go there. We turned around and proceeded to Stetson Rd. I arrived at Stetson Rd in front of the VCA Lewiston Animal Hospital at 2007. I saw many officers gathered in the parking lot, so I went over to see what I could do to assist. Det. Philippon of Lewiston PD was organizing officers into teams, from what I gathered to search for a heat signature that had been seen in the woods south of Stetson Rd. As this was happening a call came out on the radio that the shooter was possibly seen at the Wal Mart Distribution Center. Det Philippon told us to go there. We got in our cruisers and drove to the area of the Distribution Center on Alfred Plourde Pkwy.

When I arrived at the area of the Distribution center there were so many police cars there that I parked 3 businesses up at the Brinks facility and ran down the hill toward the Distribution Center. Part way down the hill I ran into Lt. Wessling and there were officers who had already been to the Distribution Center coming up the hill saying there was no threat there.

Information was not totally clear to me at this point, but I believe another threat had been called out and I followed Lt. Wessling back up Alfred Plourde Pkwy to the off ramp to Lisbon St. We took Lisbon St all the way out to Main St, took a right and drove up to the parking lot behind Aspen Dental. I arrived at the parking lot behind Aspen Dental at 2034. My understanding at this point was that there was an address in that area that they wanted us to check. While at that location Lt. Wessling and I exited our cruisers and went and talked to Troopers Elgin Physis, Haley Flemming and Fire Marshal Ken Tabor. The need for us to check the address in question had apparently been determined not to be necessary, so I then followed Lt. Wessling to Lewiston PD where we were to await further assignments.

I arrived at Lewiston PD at approximately 2045. I parked and made my way to the parking lot at the corner of Park St and Spruce St where I found Lt. Wessling, Off Mora, and Off Roy. Soon after we arrived Lt. Hammond, Det Brennan, Officer Delaney and Officer Perkins from Winthrop PD arrived. We were told Monmouth and Winthrop units would [REDACTED] be given an assignment. While at Lewiston PD, I was given a picture of the suspect and a description of the vehicle he had been operating.

After being there for a while I went back to my cruiser to get my rifle in case, I was asked to ride with someone else. As I returned, I saw Monmouth and Winthrop units leaving. I returned to my cruiser and followed. I was a distance behind them and lost sight of them for a few minutes. I took Birch St and then Jefferson, turning right onto Sabattus St where I saw the Winthrop pickup truck operated by Officer Perkins. I fell in line and followed them out to the Rusty Lantern in Sabattus, where there had been a possible sighting of the suspect vehicle. On arriving at the Rusty Lantern, we found no sign of the suspect vehicle.

We took the opportunity while in the Rusty Lantern parking lot to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Then we were instructed to pair up, go to intersections on 126, [REDACTED] and look for the suspect vehicle. Officer Mora and I went to the intersection of 126 and 197 and parked beside the road at Waterman Equipment. While there, Officer Mora received word from Lt. Wessling that the suspect vehicle had been located at the boat launch off Frost Ave near Rte. 196. At approximately 2201 Officer Mora and I left Waterman Equipment and drove to the area of the boat launch, arriving there at approximately 2212. On arriving there I was tasked with going back to the intersection of Rte. 196 and Rte. 9 and creating a checkpoint there to stop all non-law enforcement vehicles from entering the area.

I arrived back at the intersection at approximately 2217 and maintained that position until approximately 0600 on 10/26/2023. While I was there Chief Ferland, Lt. Wessling, Det. Brennan, Officer Mora, and Officer Roy were all there with me at various times. We stopped all non-LE traffic and attempted to give folks directions to reroute to their destinations. While there I observed the MSP, Portland and Brunswick [REDACTED] coming and going from the Lisbon HS rear parking lot to search locations in the immediate vicinity. I also observed police helicopters circling the area to assist in the search for the suspect. At approximately 0600 the Lisbon Police Chief stopped at my position to tell me that Lisbon Public Works had blocked off 196 further to the east and that I was relieved.

Supplement

On October 25, 2023 I was on a moose hunt in Oxbow Maine and at apprx. 1937 hrs. I received a text message advising of a mass shooting in Lewiston. I then made a call to Officer Mora of the Monmouth Police Department to update me on the situation. Officer Mora stated that she was in route to Lewiston and would be meeting up with Lt. Wessling and the other Monmouth Officers at Mardens in Lewiston. She told me that there had been two mass shootings in Lewiston, one at the bowling alley and the other at a bar in Lewiston.

I then contacted Lt. Wessling and told him that I would be in route, as soon as I got off the phone with him I contacted Lt. Hammond of the Winthrop Police Department and instructed him to deploy all our resources to the Lewiston Police Department and to take direction from their command staff. I told Lt. Hammond that I would be in route to his location.

At approx. 1145 hrs. I arrived in Lisbon and met up with Lt. Wessling he updated me on the status of events. I was stationed at the intersection of Route 196 and Route 9 in Lisbon. It became obvious to me that there was a lack of communications between agencies and no one knew what was going on. I approached a member of the Marshall Service and asked him about new details and he stated that they have been given no updates and no details and that they were going to start following up on their own leads. I then approached the Lisbon Officers and was told that they too had no information and that they were awaiting instruction. I observed that there were at least 60 to 70 Officers standing around in this parking lot awaiting instruction or deployment, this never came. I then sent Officer Mora back to Monmouth as she was the assigned Duty Officer, and I sent Officer Roy home as he was scheduled to work at 0400 hrs. I then cleared Lisbon and headed to Lewiston to assist Lt. Hammond and the Winthrop Officers. Along the way I stopped at a roadblock which had been set up by Androscoggin Sheriff's Office in Lisbon Falls. I asked if they had any updated information on the event and I was told that they have received no information from either Lewiston PD or Maine State Police. I then continued to Central Maine Medical Center to assist units at this location.

I then met up with Lt. Hammond, an Officer from Lewiston PD, a Fire Marshall, an MDEA Agent and CMMC Security. All reported that they have not received any updates in over 2 hours and that they were just keeping a perimeter around the hospital as all the casualties had come here. I observed several members of the press set up on the opposite side of Maine St. from the Hospital reporting on the events. I was able to go speak with them and was able to get information from them that had not been made available to the law enforcement that should have had the information. I was deeply troubled by the lack of information that was made available to all law enforcement on scene and the fact that this lack of information was placing my staff at risk. It became apparent to me that the Command of this event was fractured between the Lewiston PD and the Maine State Police as two separate Command Posts had been established and did not appear that they were communicating well with each other, or any other agency that had deployed manpower and resources to this tragic event. At approx. 0600 hrs. I cleared all of my personnel from the scenes due to concerns for their safety as a result of poor communications amongst Agencies.

On 10/26/23 at apprx. 0815 hrs. I started receiving calls from our Communications Center of suspicious activity in the area of Gilman Rd. in Monmouth. I respnded and found a Portland ██████████ deploying in the Gilman Rd. area, at no time did the Winthrop Communications Center or the Monmouth Police Department receive information that a team was being deployed to this


area. The citizen complaints received stating that there was a man in camo clothing carrying a rifle walking through there back yard.

I then contacted the tip line that had been set up by State Police and spoke to the Supervisor, he stated that he would pass my concerns to the Operations Lt. who would be calling me back. At apprx. 1027 hrs. I received a call back from the operations Lt. advising me that he was unaware of any teams deployed in our area. He told me that there were several [REDACTED] assisting and that they were being deployed to areas that they had received tips on and that he was unaware of the locations of these teams. I was told that if they should return to the Monmouth/Winthrop area that he would let us know in advance. I thanked him for the return call and discontinued the conversation.

From this point on we chased many sighting calls and worked jointly with the [REDACTED] until its conclusion on Friday evening when Mr. Cards body was located. I had received a text message from Lt. Aaron Turcotte of the Maine State Police advising of there locating Mr. Card.

We arrived at Lewiston High School, where investigators tasked us with reviewing dispatch calls for Lewiston and Auburn police departments from the evening of 10/25/2023 and the morning of 10/26/2023. The task was to sift through the calls and enter them into an Excel spreadsheet as worthy or not worthy of a follow-up. These were later to be reviewed by other investigators.

Another task was to contact Auburn Walmart to inquire about all Tracfone purchases in the past ten days. Auburn Walmart was closed for the day, so I contacted Detective Matt Yeaton of the Falmouth Police Department to send me his contact number for Walmart because they often deal with thefts at their local store. Detective Yeaton sent me the contact number for [REDACTED].

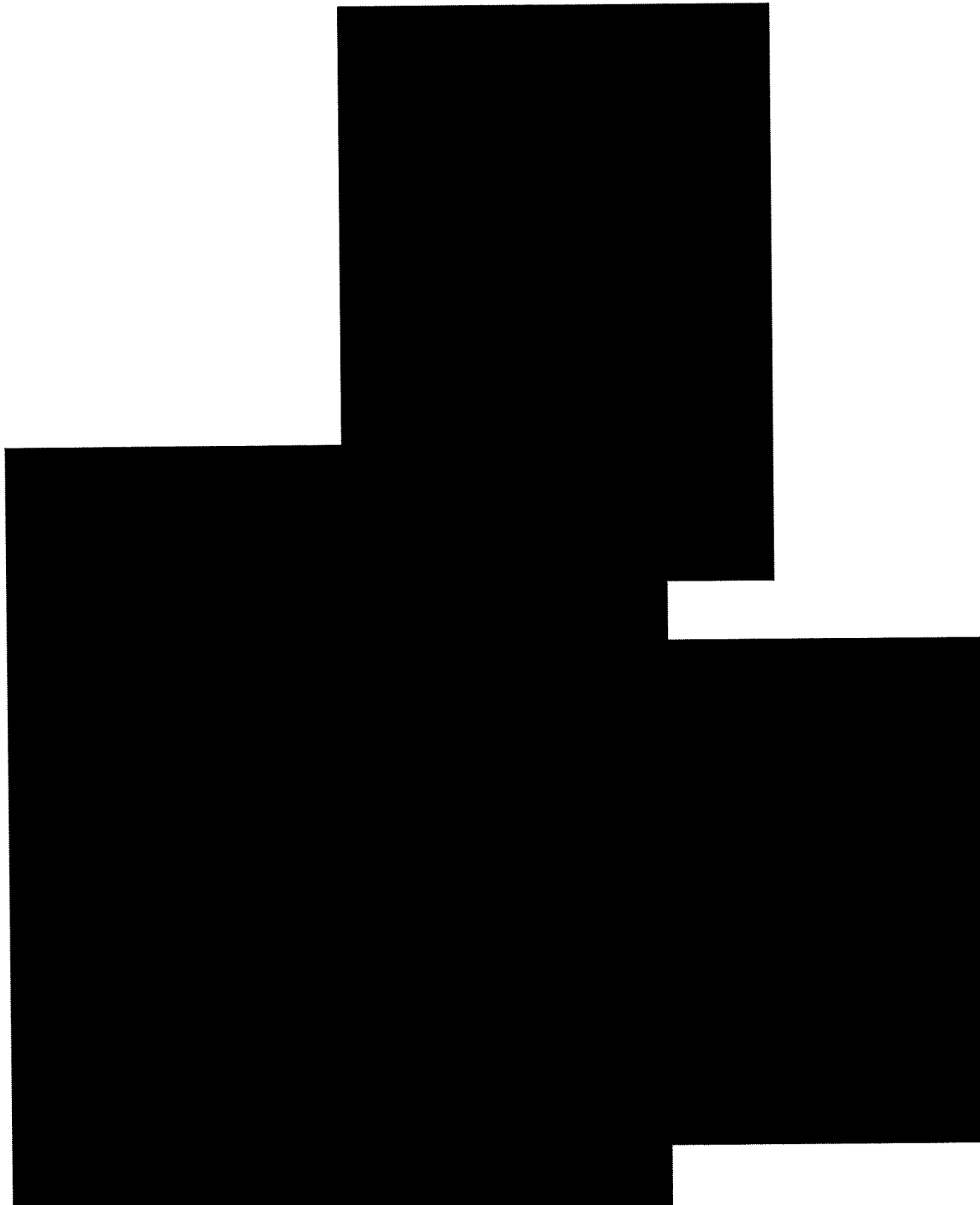

On 10/25/2023 at 1900 hours, I received a call via telephone from Chief Erik Baker asking if I had heard what was going on in Lewiston, at which time he informed me that there was an Active Shooter in the city and that two establishments had been hit at that time. It was determined at that time that we would be responding to the second shooting scene located at Schmenge's Billiards located at 553 Lincoln St.

I arrived on scene at Schmenge's in Lewiston at approximately 1930 hours, I parked my police vehicle at the Lincoln Street and South Ave and walked down to the crime scene. Upon approaching the scene, I was contact with Lewiston Police Officer James Avery who advised that they had "bodies in the field." He asked if I knew what field they were referring to, however I did not as I was unable to hear radio traffic from L/A Comm. I told him that from what I could gather was that it was most likely the field just behind that parking area. We both proceeded in that direction.

As we approached the scene Sgt. Dave Levesque was standing at the perimeter of the location, and placing yellow caution tape. At that time I asked him what was needed. At this time, the last living victims were being transported to area hospitals, and all those left behind were those that were not physically injured and the deceased. Sgt. Levesque asked to be shut down Lincoln St in its entirety and to not let anyone through unless they were Law Enforcement. I proceeded to the intersection of Lincoln St and Westbury St. I positioned my police vehicle across the road way, and blocked any and all traffic attempting to enter the scene from 2000 to 0230 hours, when I was cleared by Auburn Police Chief Jason Moen who was located at the Command Post. At this time I proceeded back to the Town of Lisbon where the vehicle of Suspect Robert Card was located. I patrolled the general area of Webster Rd in Lisbon and patrolled that area until 0300 hours, when I was released from duty by Chief Baker.

On 10/26/2023 I reported back for duty at 0600 hours. I met with Chief Baker and we discussed a plan for the day. I was determined that we would remain mobile between the Town of Sabattus, Lisbon and Bowdoin where it borders Sabattus, in the Event that Robert Card had left on foot from the boat launch, and was traveling back roads on foot. On this date we received several suspicious condition calls in the Town of Sabattus, we followed up on each call and were able to determine that none we involved in the active man hunt. At 1400 hours, I responded to the town of Lisbon and helped handle suspicious condition calls, as well as assist what any leads they received via their communication system. I clear Lisbon around 2000 hours per Chief Baker.

On 10/27/2023 I reported back for duty at 0600 hours, We had a quick briefing with Chief Baker again, at which time he shared the minimal information he had received. A majority of the day I remained in the town of Lisbon again helping answer calls for service as well as following leads they received at intake to their Communication Center. All leads were followed up on and were eventually determined to not be involved in the active man hunt. I was released from duty at 1730 hours on this date after a briefing with Chief Ryan Magee addressing what was potentially to come in the coming days and weeks.

At 2045 hours, I received a text message from a Lisbon Police Officer advising that they had located the body of Robert Card in a Trailer at Maine Recycling. Once confirmed I was asked to respond back to the Town of Lisbon to help with crowd control with the media. Officer Ben Gormely and I responded to Lisbon St and Capital Ave, and remained there until 0000 hours. We were cleared by LT Jeff Pickard at this time.

On October 25th, 2023 I was advised of an active shooter in the City of Lewiston. I responded to the Sabattus Police Department and met others that had been called in. We knew two places had been targeted but were unsure how many suspects were involved and if there were other locations that were next. I had Officer Mike Mayer stay near Mixers Lounge and told others as they arrived to meet with Officer Mayer and stay in town.

Officer Magan Brown and I responded to the City of Lewiston and went to River Road. Officer Brown went past Schemenges Bar and Grille towards into Lewiston to conduct traffic control. Please see her attached narrative for details.

When I arrived at the intersection of Lincoln Street and South Avenue I started blocking traffic from going down towards Schemenges. Several people stopped and tried to get through stating their family member was at the bar and they could not get hold of them. I directed them to go to Central Maine Medical Center.

At point we were told the suspect vehicle had just crashed off Exit 80 of the Maine Turnpike. Myself and multiple units went to the area and found out the crash had nothing to do with the active shooter. I returned to my post and shortly after we were told the shooter(s) was at the WalMart distribution center.

I arrived with several units to the main parking lot and did not see any movement. We parked a ways back and started looking inside cars to make sure we were not being ambushed. Multiple units started arriving on scene. We made our way to the main entrance. The first door was a double sliding glass door and open from right to left. This door opened automatically. We stepped into this area and realized we had to be "buzzed" in through the next sliding glass doors. It appeared the security guard area was empty.

An unknown officer stated we needed to get inside and Deputy Chaloux from Androscoggin SO broke the lower left window pane out so we could make entry. Deputy Chaloux and I started clearing all the office rooms [REDACTED] entry way. Once that area was cleared we met up with multiple officers and made a quick plan to start clearing towards the warehouse area. Two of the State Police [REDACTED] were with us and asked that we hold [REDACTED]

While I held my area I realized they area had multiple cameras. I asked for someone to take my location and made my way back to the entry way. I asked Sgt. Dumond from Lewiston PD if we had access to the camera system. I was directed to [REDACTED] could get us to the video access for the entire structure. Myself and two other Deputies made our way to an office. [REDACTED] was able to pull up the video from approximately 8:10PM. The video shows a red or maroon passenger car come into the parking lot. It drove around a minimum of two times and then stopped directly in front of the main entry. A white male wearing a jacket and light colored pants got out and left his drivers door open. He had brown hair and a beard. He was dressed casual. The male came into the front door and looked at the security guard area. It appears there were two guards and they took off running down a hall. You can see the male jump back in his car and take off.

I had received a test with the picture of the possible offender and could tell this was not the same person. We then left the officer and met back up with Sgt. Dummond and I advised him this was not the shooter. It was a suspicious incident. All units then cleared the area.

I returned back to the town of Sabattus for a short time. I copied radio traffic that the suspect vehicle had been

The next several days we stayed in the town of Sabattus and had patrols saturate the areas that bordered with Lewiston, Lisbon, and Bowdoin.

There was no further interaction with the Town of Sabattus.

On 10/27/2023 at or about 1002, I, Officer John Sprouse (208), Active duty sworn, and fully qualified police officer of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy (MCJA) employed by the South Berwick police department responded to call 23-97843. This call was with regard to the Lewiston shooting incident which witnesses stated was committed by Robert Card [REDACTED] opening fire in a public establishment and killing multiple occupants and then fleeing the scene.

Upon committing the forementioned crime and fleeing the scene Robert then became the lead suspect in a statewide manhunt which began on the evening of 10/26/2023. As manpower and resources were being invested, I volunteered my services in an effort of supporting the search.

I was informed via my Chief that extra resources were needed for efforts taking place in Lewiston and was asked if I wanted to assist. I agreed. My information was then passed to Officer Ryan Sanford of the Kittery police department with regard to my intent and willingness to be of service. We then travelled together to the command center at Lewiston High School where we both checked in with the on-scene commander of the Southern Maine component.

The Southern Maine component was eventually given a tasking via the Maine State Police to split up the team's resources in efforts of relieving several of the watch teams that had been on duty for an extended amount of time [REDACTED]

Our team of eight officers were specifically tasked with relieving the officers that were located [REDACTED]

Upon the tasking our team then traveled to [REDACTED]

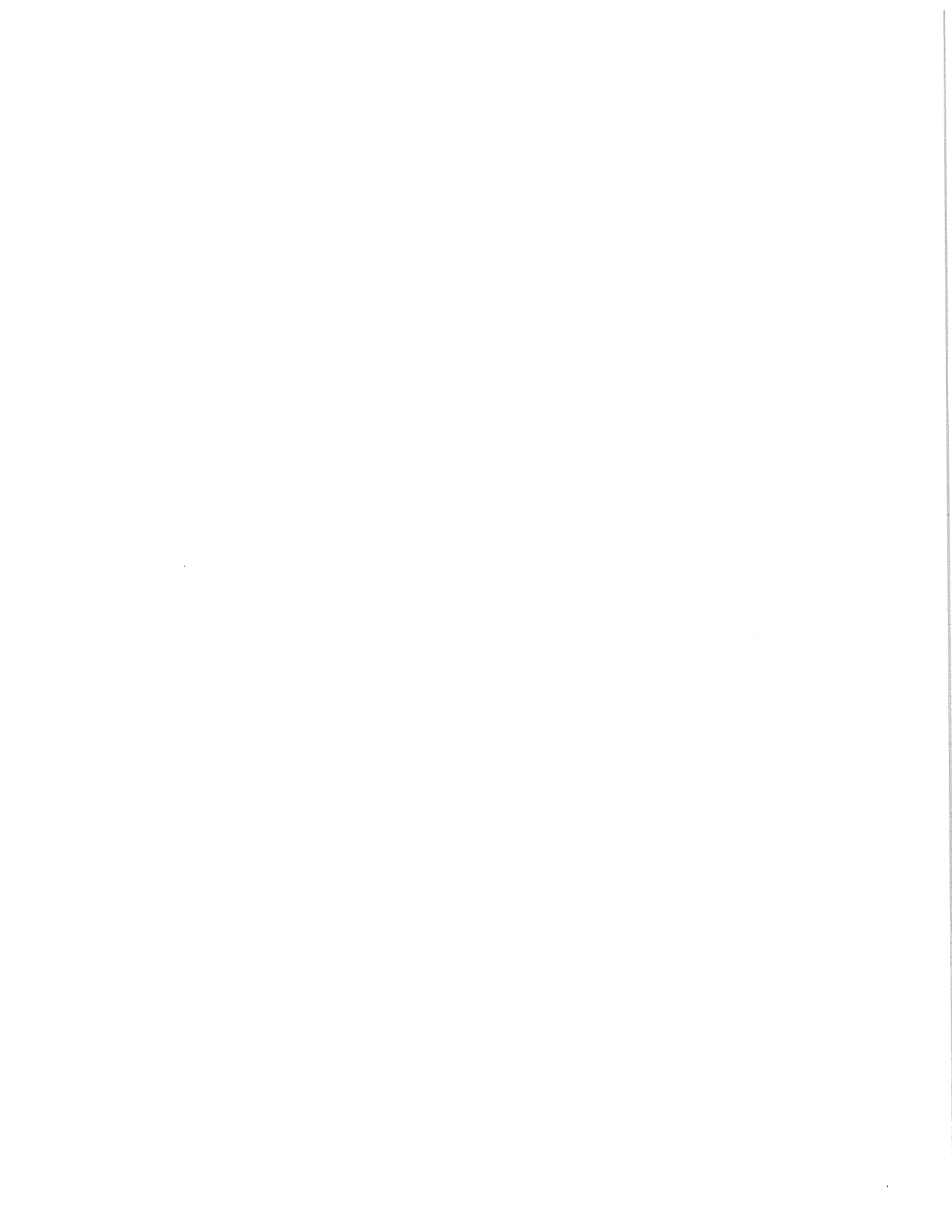
