## Executive Summary

On October 25, 2023, at 6:56 PM 911 calls were received, reporting an active shooter at Just-In-Time Bowling in Lewiston. At 7:08 PM more 911 calls were received from Schemengee's Bar and Grill in Lewiston also reporting an active shooter. These calls initiated a massive police response from all over the State of Maine and a large manhunt was initiated. As the hunt for the mass killer progressed, the operation transformed from patrol officers responding to radio dispatched information, to a coordinated tactical operation that prioritized deployment of Tactical Teams to intel-based actions. The scale of the incident was unprecedented in Maine and resulted in the suspect being located deceased, 48 hours after the initial 911 call. The response and deployment to this incident left our Tactical Teams with an understanding that many of their tactics and strategies were successful and identified several areas for learning and improvement. It should be noted that this After-Action Review (AAR) is focusing on the Tactical Operations aspect of the hunt for Robert Card. There were countless corresponding tasks being completed by patrol officers outside this process with a mission to keep the community safe and find Card as quickly as possible.

For the sake of this AAR, we will refer to all tactical based teams that responded, regardless of team name or title, as a Tactical Team. Several area Maine Tactical Teams responded to Lewiston immediately following the shootings and began to organize and initiate planning operations based on what little information they had. On October 25, 2023 at 10:05 PM the manhunt operations fully evolved into a Tactical Operation following Card's vehicle being located at a boat landing in Lisbon. Card was not located in or near his vehicle, and the following day and a half involved a combination of intel-based search operations and systematic search operations ultimately leading to Card being discovered deceased in a tractor trailer unit in Lisbon on October 27, 2023, at 7:47 PM.

AARs are a common practice in the aftermath of Tactical Operations, and these are completed by nearly every Tactical Team following each deployment regardless of the scale of the incident. This complex deployment, unlike most, involved 16 different Tactical Teams from State, County,

Local and Federal jurisdictions. A response of this magnitude will undoubtedly produce many lessons learned that are essential to document to help law enforcement throughout the country respond to future incidents.

This document is not intended for public consumption as numerous law enforcement sensitive tactics and equipment will be discussed.

## **After Action Review Description**

Following the conclusion of this incident, the Maine State Police Tactical Team began a comprehensive AAR process with the goal of learning from this significant critical incident. The Maine State Police Tactical Team began with an internal team review discussing individual operations, decision making, and lessons learned. An AAR was held with all the Maine based Tactical Teams that responded to the incident. An AAR was held with all New England State Police Tactical Teams to discuss the incident, receive feedback, and share lessons learned. Conversations were had with Federal Tactical Team leadership teams discussing their response to the incident. And finally, an independent evaluation was conducted by the Pennsylvania State Police (PASP), who were not involved in the manhunt. PASP was selected due to their similarities to the Maine State Police and vast experience in large scale manhunts. This AAR does not serve as a replacement or duplication for a fully documented incident summary which was separately prepared.

## Overall Findings and Recommendations Relating to Tactical Team Operations

The following is a compilation of the key findings and lessons learned from the review of the tactical response to the active shooter incident in Lewiston on October 25, 2023.

- Self-deployments in active shooter incidents are inevitable in the early phases of response and are essential to get resources quickly to imminent life safety events. Once the situation transitions from an active shooter incident to an organized manhunt, the goal should be to transition from resources self-deploying to being systematically assigned by command to accomplish a mission. Self-deployments come from a place of wanting to help but the overwhelming and uncontrolled influx of resources can create serious safety issues, duplication of work and confusion.
  - One example of self-deployment causing a potential safety issue occurred when Tactical Command was evaluating an incident in Durham. Two 911 hang-up calls took place from the suspect's mother's house. The Command Post was notified and began coordinating a tactical response including [REDACTED] a federal Tactical Team and a large tactical team element responding with an armored vehicle, other [REDACTED] to remotely enter and clear a residence without exposing operators to a direct threat. Prior to the arrival of advanced tactical resources, a group of US Marshal Service Task Force officers arrived and made entry clearing the residence followed by representatives from the federal tactical team as they were concerned for the safety of the Marshals. This could have led to serious safety issues and was a self-deployment of resources not directed through centralized command.
  - A second example happened shortly after the suspect's vehicle was located at the boat landing in Lisbon. [REDACTED] utilizing a bridge on a closed roadway [REDACTED] working at the boat landing. These teams were utilizing [REDACTED] and were in a dark and non-lighted area. Without warning a regional Tactical Team in a large, armored

vehicle came through the scene driving at a high rate of speed unaware of Tactical Teams working at the scene. Operators on the bridge were nearly struck by this vehicle. Later it was reported to Tactical Command that the operator of the armored vehicle may have been drinking alcohol prior to deploying to the manhunt, compounding the reckless and dangerous behavior. This observation was reported to the regional team's supervisor during an AAR shortly after the manhunt ended.

- It was later learned that a regional team was asked to go to a location in Lisbon by a local patrol supervisor and not from the Command Post. At this time, full centralized Tactical Command had not been established and what that team was dispatched to was ultimately not necessary. Had centralized command been established, this may have prevented this issue and other uncoordinated deployments.
  
- A significant discussion was had on Tactical Command and Command Post Operations. We had the following findings related to Tactical Command.
  - A Tactical Operations Chief was established for the incident which helped organize the influx of Tactical Teams and coordinated missions and assignments. This is a model for future large-scale operations involving a multi-jurisdictional response.
  - Formalized Tactical Command was established on October 26<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 AM. It would have been beneficial to have established this sooner in this operation at the Command Post. A good option would have been leaving a leadership representative from the Maine State Police Tactical Team at the Tactical Staging area before deploying to the boat landing after Card's vehicle was located. When the vehicle was located in Lisbon, the Commander of the York County SRT was left in charge of the Tactical Staging Area. While they did an excellent job facilitating resources and working with the MSP Commander who was deployed in Lisbon to organize responses, the lack of a MSP resource at Tactical Staging

led to unnecessary communication issues and organization issues with other non-tactical MSP personnel.

- Once Tactical Command was created at the command post at 2:00 AM on October 26<sup>th</sup>, operational missions were communicated and completed smoothly. Tactical Team's involved did not self-deploy to incidents and worked together to accomplish objectives. Teams executed tasks as assigned and reported back to incident command when complete.
  - The quick coordination of a joint Tactical Staging area at the Lewiston Coliseum parking lot allowed for instant communication and accountability of resources in the early stage of this operation.
  - Overall Tactical Command should have been built out by asking representatives from each team to remain at the Command Post. Those representatives could have helped with operational tasks in the command post relevant to Tactical Operations.
  - The Command Post and staging of tactical resources was all in Lewiston however none of the work being done for the manhunt was happening in Lewiston. A plan was in place for Saturday to have forward operating posts in Lisbon and Bowdoin, but in the future this could have been done earlier.
- Tactical Teams should ensure they have the proper equipment to be prepared for response to critical incidents.
    - The [REDACTED] that the Maine State Police Tactical Team had at this time were very outdated and none of the current equipment could be used in conjunction with [REDACTED]. Prior to October 25, 2023, actions had been taken to upgrade this capability with new [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that can be used in conjunction with [REDACTED] to be used simultaneously to give the operator the best chance at picking up a threat but hadn't been purchased at the time. Some of the assisting Tactical Teams on scene at this time had no [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at all. Possessing and being proficient with this type of equipment is



essential in overcoming the threat posed by Card. At the time this report was drafted, the Maine State Police has now placed orders for [REDACTED] that would have made a night K9 track a safer option should it happen again.

- The decision not to conduct a K9 track from Card's vehicle on the evening of October 25 when it was located at the boat landing was discussed in detail in all aspects of the review. The following factors and findings were the conclusion of this review:

- The delay in the track was likely almost 4 hours old. [REDACTED]
- The contamination of the scene such as officers on the trails, in the woods and [REDACTED] in the area also was a factor discussed.
- It was the experience of the Maine State Police Tactical Team Commander that attempting a K9 track in these circumstances has an extremely low probability of success and runs the risk of tracking a fresher scent unrelated to the suspect and leading officers in the wrong direction.
- Another factor considered was a K9 track of this magnitude and under these circumstances would need to be conducted by a Tactical Team with specialized training and equipment. A track for an armed and dangerous suspect at night with access to [REDACTED] for a patrol level K9 track. A K9 track of a suspect like Card, with the training and weapons he possessed, [REDACTED] This would be required to allow enough Tactical resources to [REDACTED] and to be available to assist with officer down rescues should the incident require. This would leave no resources to respond to the business location, the ex-girlfriend's

residence or more importantly, fresher sightings of the suspect [REDACTED]

- Tactical Leadership needs to utilize their operational experience to guide decision making. The operational experience considered for this decision was over 12 years of Tactical Team experience, participating in over 60 high risk K9 tracks under a variety of circumstances with an [REDACTED]. An example of a failed track took place a few months prior to this incident where [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] resulting in a fatal (to the suspect) officer involved shooting.
  - Other agencies consulted in this AAR process reported that the danger of the track under those circumstances would lead them to attempt other means of locating the suspect first such as intel-based actions.
- Regarding the search of Maine Recycling in Lisbon, there was confusion at the Command Post on October 27 on what locations had been searched in the industrial park the day prior. Once it was confirmed what had and hadn't been searched, teams were sent to search the previously unknown overflow lot where Card was ultimately located. The Tactical Team should explore applications or resources available to track areas where team members have been and cleared. If a solution is not found, a simple map should be used to document where teams searched when deployed to avoid confusion later.
  - This incident and other manhunt the Maine State Police has been involved in, reinforce the need for the manhunt intel and investigation to be prioritized during the criminal investigation.
    - A manhunt with a public safety risk is exigent and fast paced compared to typical slow/methodical criminal investigations. In future manhunt operations it is recommended to utilize liaisons for the tactical and manhunt operations and attach them to the criminal investigation to identify which investigative/intel tasks are

priority for apprehension efforts rather than prioritizing actions solely for the criminal investigation.

- Without other driving forces, the search of the suspect's home needed to be completed ASAP. In this case, the search of Card's residence took place over 14 hours after the initial shootings occurred. Invaluable intel can be gleaned as far as future plans, weapon capabilities or other issues from searches like this.
  - Areas of interest, such as the suspect's vehicle, need to be processed for apprehension intel immediately, not many hours later. Once this is complete a full brief needs to be given to Tactical Command and Operations Command if applicable.
  - It is recommended that at a minimum there needs to be a manhunt liaison with the investigative body at all times to facilitate priorities of operation and sharing of information. This information needs to be shared with Tactical Command to inform future mission assignments.
- Consideration should be given to establishing complete mission packages of teams for deployments and having teams work with the resources they are familiar with.
    - In this case it was identified that a patrol officer or two could have been attached to each Tactical Team to deploy to assignments to work on [REDACTED] tasks such as [REDACTED] and keeping media members from interfering.
    - Media members were obstructing numerous operations throughout this manhunt by blocking roads, being too close to locations and live-streaming and broadcasting false information such as shots fired or that the suspect was surrounded. This led to confusion and distractions from the tasks at hand.
    - Tactical Teams that come with their own assets, [REDACTED] should not be separated from those assets unless essential for public safety. Those teams are used to working with those resources and the most efficient way to use those assets is to deploy them with their respective Tactical Teams.

- Numerous teams reported concerns of command post security.
  - Consideration should be given to security posts or Tactical Team coverage of the command post for the duration of the incident.
  
- A need was identified for an intake system for incoming Tactical Teams and a need for more thorough post mission briefings to Tactical Command following the completion of a task.
  - Numerous Tactical Teams from outside of Maine arrived and they brought a variety of capabilities and resources. Tactical Command needs to intake these resources and learn what equipment and capabilities they possess to ensure they are assigned tasks within those capabilities. An example is Tactical Command was not aware that some Tactical Teams were not equipped with [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] This would be a major factor when determining a team's ability to complete a mission [REDACTED]
  - A robust post mission procedure should be established, this would cover a summary of actions on target, damage done, injuries and any other issues.
  
- Prior to this incident The Maine and NESPAC Tactical Teams had made efforts to be familiar with each other's team members and capabilities which was found to be valuable.
  - The Maine State Police Tactical Team Commander was able to reach out to local commanders directly, determine what resources were responding and ensure that all the Tactical Teams staged at one location the first night of the manhunt.
  - This pre-coordination also helps establish familiarity and trust prior to a response to an emergency situation.
  - We should consider tabletop training with Maine SWAT Leadership to go over deployment of resources across jurisdictions and better learn each other's capabilities.

## Specific Findings and Recommendations for the Maine State Police Tactical Team

- The Maine State Police Tactical Team had several internal findings related to their response.
  - The MSP Tactical Team in the late summer of 2023 began an armored vehicle driver program. Prior to this, Tactical Operators would be tasked with driving the vehicles. Having designated drivers outside of Tactical Operators was helpful to expand manpower and have redundancies of drivers to cover operational periods.
  - The MSP Tactical Team found the need to expand internal team leadership and formalize leadership roles to allow for leadership redundancy if operating in multiple operational periods.
  - The team found the need to expand specialized K9 capabilities to be able to [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] The team has since acquired a [REDACTED] specializing in more challenging K9 tracks to assist with similar future operations.
  - The Maine State Police Crisis Negotiation Team was essential for documentation of operations and overall incident management of tactical operations. Due to their efforts, all operations the Maine State Police Tactical Team conducted were thoroughly documented. Not every team had this resource, and this should be considered in future large-scale operations.
  - The current staffing levels of the MSP Tactical Team and the State Police in general needs to be increased. With an incident of this size, it is crucial for adequate manpower to complete the missions and to allow for adequate downtime. If this manhunt had continued to days, weeks or even months our resources would have been depleted. We need staffing levels increased to a level that allows us to effectively manage an incident like this for as long as it takes.

- Tactical Command in the first operational period identified the need for future coverage of Tactical Team resources and began assigning operational duty periods. In the past, we have tried to work through initial operational periods and have planned for rest cycles too late. This advanced planning would have allowed Tactical Team resources to work indefinitely.
  - Leadership needs to remain mindful of rest cycles for leadership positions and ensure leaders are rested appropriately.
  
- The manhunt was an overall success.
  - The suspect was located in 48 hours, without any further injury to the public or law enforcement officers.
  - The massive undertaking required the deployment of multiple Tactical Teams and hundreds of law enforcement officers from multiple Federal, State, County and Local agencies, many of whom have never worked before.

## **Independent Evaluation**

Following the conclusion of the incident, the Maine State Police sought out an independent evaluation of the Tactical Operations of the manhunt for Card. Many options were considered for this review, but ultimately contact was made with the PASP Tactical Team leadership to discuss this possibility. PASP was selected as Pennsylvania contains similar landscape to Maine, the agency holds a similar job function as the Maine State Police and the agency has extensive experience with large scale manhunts including the two-week manhunt for an escaped prisoner in 2023 and the 48-day manhunt for convicted murderer Eric Frein in 2014. As part of this review, members of the Pennsylvania State Police Tactical Team traveled to Maine and met in person with leadership from the Maine State Police Tactical Team.

Local police agencies directly involved in the Lewiston incident were offered the opportunity to meet with the representatives to discuss their involvement and factors surrounding the case. The Maine State Police gave PASP a tour of the area to include both shooting scenes, the initial Tactical Staging Area established, the final command post location, the boat landing scene in Lisbon and the final location where Card was located. They were provided with reports, maps and briefings on the incident and multiple meetings were had to address questions.

After reviewing all the information PASP provided the following After-Action points with the Maine State Police:

- It is essential to clearly establish what agency is in charge as early as possible. Once established, all search efforts and response to manhunt related activities needs to be coordinated through this entity. PASP provided an example, two days into one of their manhunts they experienced patrol officers responding to sightings and other manhunt

related activities that began interfering with systematic search efforts. They found sending out more experienced and equipped Tactical Teams [REDACTED] had better results than flooding areas with marked patrol vehicles, further pushing the suspect out of the search area. To accomplish this, they assigned negotiators allocated to their Tactical Team to local dispatch centers to vet any manhunt related information and prevent dispatch from pushing this information to patrol officers. This gave the command post the chance to properly coordinate resources and prevent self-deployments. PASP also found success in placing Tactical Team liaisons in key operational areas such as the Command Post and intelligence sections to have complete awareness of operations. PASP found that once command is established, outside of an emergency such as another shooting, officers should not be self-deploying to manhunt related incidents without coordination from the command post.

- Similar to what occurred in Lewiston, PASP faced challenges in larger manhunts of Tactical Teams showing up at the command post without warning. This posed challenges for planning purposes. By day 3 in one of their manhunt operations, PASP developed a system to intake these teams to document their capabilities and equipment to properly assign them tasks. It is essential to understand not every team has the same capabilities. The best practice should be checking in with the command post before responding to assist.
- Manhunt related investigative tasks need to be prioritized and completed as soon as possible. They commented that in their opinion, the search of Card's residence was completed far too late in the manhunt. Even if the systems are not ready for full homicide processing, searches should be done for intelligence related to the manhunt as soon as possible. PASP commented that the homicide investigation is important, but in cases like this, the manhunt should be the priority.
- PASP recommended keeping an active log of manhunt related tasks completed and updated to assist with briefings of oncoming Tactical Teams. A Tactical Team tasked with dayshift operations could have access to this document and immediately have awareness of what was conducted by the night shift.
- PASP advised the sooner Tactical Command can be initiated more quickly. In this manhunt they agreed that centralized Tactical Command likely should have been



established a little sooner. Although the Maine State Police had command and control of the tactical assets assigned to this incident from the start, the Tactical Team commander wasn't at the command post until 2:00 AM on October 26, 2023, formally establishing Tactical Command.

- Tactical Teams need to constantly evaluate equipment needs and ensure the teams have the equipment necessary such as [REDACTED] to conduct these types of missions.
- Discussion was had regarding the K9 track decision at the Lisbon Boat Landing. PASP advised that while K9s have their place, [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] There have been times when they have found themselves attempting tracks and traveling hours in the wrong direction. The best use for a K9 track in manhunt situations is for [REDACTED] where a witness can give a direction of travel, so you have confirmation on initial K9 track direction. PASP advised based on the situation, they would not have attempted the track from the boat landing.
- PASP recommended developing a method for using an intelligence unit to quickly gather and provide information on a suspect such as [REDACTED] and other information.
- PASP advised that while they have learned similar lessons to the MESP through manhunt their experiences, they still believed that locating the suspect in two days given the totality of the environment and terrain was significant and "pretty quick".

## Conclusion

On October 25, 2023, a mentally ill and military trained suspect shot and killed 18 people and wounded many more in two separate locations armed with a high-powered rifle and was able to flee the scene. This was a planned, orchestrated, and unprecedented attack. What followed was a massive police response to attempt to locate the suspect and protect the public from further harm. Tactical Command coordinated 29 formal tactical missions and maintained teams available to respond instantly around the clock during the 48-hour manhunt involving 16 different Local, County, State and Federal Tactical Teams from all over the country. That combined effort led to locating the suspect, deceased, 48 hours and 51 minutes after the first 911 call reporting the shootings. Tactical resources responded to leads in 3 different towns covering over 300 square miles without any known sightings or specific intelligence or information as to his location. This all occurred without any other citizens or officers being injured.

As expected in such an unprecedented event, there are numerous lessons learned that should be applied to future operations. It should be noted that not every lesson learned would be applicable to every future operation as circumstances, environment and resource factors will undoubtedly impact the needs of those operations.

On 10/25/23 I was made aware of a large scale incident in the Lewiston, ME area via social media and numerous other sources. At approximately 2018 hours Sgt. We stood by at the Lewiston High School staging area until Sgt. Roy arrived and briefed us on known information and our task for the night. [REDACTED]

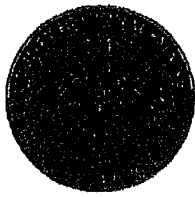



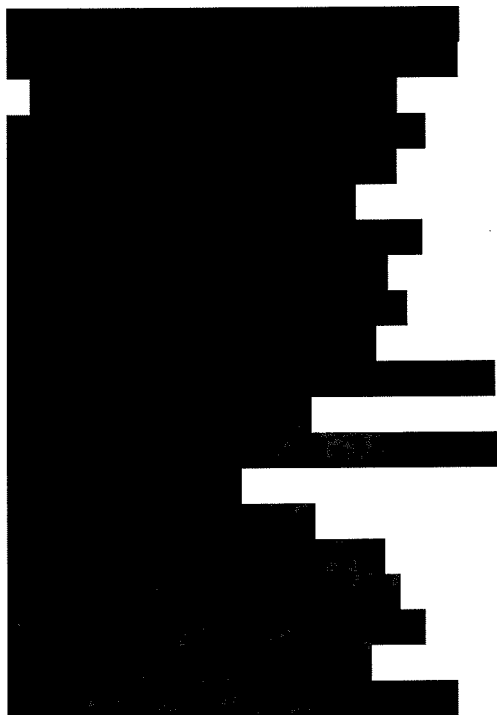

1. After arriving at Lewiston PD, I met with several other ESU team members. Eventually we were briefed by ATL Matt Tufts and given various assignments. Myself and other operators were assigned to providing external security to the Lewiston PD building. Specifically, I was assigned [REDACTED] the building and began doing so at approximately 2100 hours.
2. Over the course of the next several hours we received additional updates regarding the incident to include a picture of the suspect, his name and the registration of a vehicle that he was possibly driving. Later into the evening / early morning, I learned via radio traffic that the suspect's car had been located on a boat launch in the Town of Lisbon, however it was unoccupied.



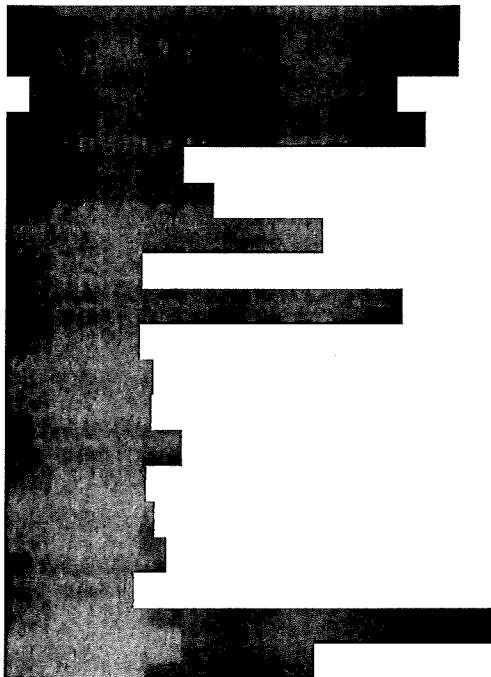



### Synopsis:

All times are to be considered approximate.

On October 25, 2023, at approximately 1900 hours, I was travelling home, off duty in my patrol vehicle when I heard radio traffic from Augusta Regional Communications Center advising of an active shooter incident in Lewiston. I started in that direction and advised Sgt. Gregory Roy of this information.

I arrived in the area of the Lewiston Colliseum and met with other members of the Tactical Team. We immediately started triaging what we had and trying to figure out where the suspect was. We got periodic updates from Augusta RCC and our commanders, Sgt. Greg Roy and Cpl. Dave Coflesky with photos of the suspect, vehicle, and armament that was used.

I was eventually deployed to Walmart, and then over to Auburn briefly before we were assigned to attempt to make contact at a residence. We deployed to this residence, however, we were advised after arriving that it was the incorrect residence.

We then met at a school, where we were advised to stage until further information could be gathered.

On October 26, 2023, I was assigned to a joint Team with the FBI and we were tasked with clearing a patch of woods near where the vehicle was found in Lisbon. We spent the morning clearing this area and noting of interest was found. We did find some cell camera's and I took a sim card out of 1, which was later checked and nothing of evidentiary value was discovered.

Later that afternoon, I was assigned with Tr. Miles Carpenter [REDACTED] behind the redemption center as a perimeter while another combination of Teams cleared this location. I remained in this position until I was advised that we could clear.

On October 27, 2023, I was assigned to a Team with New Hampshire State Police and ATF and we [REDACTED]

## DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION:

Note: This report shall serve as a summary of Maine State Police Tactical Team actions, Manhunt Tactical Operation assignments and my actions during the events following the active shooter incident on October 26, 2023, in Lewiston, Maine.

**October 25, 2023**

### 1920 Hours

I began receiving calls and text messages from officers aware of an active shooter incident in Lewiston but were not immediately involved with the response or requesting the Tactical Team. I moved to my office and began looking at our computer dispatch screen and reviewed the call notes for this incident. I noted the incident seemed to be a legitimate report and was confirmed. I then received a call from Sgt. Chris Farley of the Major Crimes Unit. Sgt. Farley advised me it was a confirmed incident with multiple fatalities. The suspect's location was unknown, and they were requesting Tactical Team assistance.

### 1926 Hours

I sent out a Tactical Team activation for all available members to respond to Lewiston for staging. I eventually updated the staging location for all Tactical Team and Crisis Negotiation Team members to the Lewiston Colisee parking lot. This location will be referred to as the Tactical Staging Area. Based on local knowledge and operational experience in Lewiston, I knew that the Lewiston Police Department would be overwhelmed with vehicles and did not have enough space to accommodate the resources responding. While responding I received a call from Sgt. Chris Farley advising me the suspect was located at the Walmart Distribution Center in Lewiston and was actively shooting. I re-routed all Tactical Team members to this location. By 2040 hours, I had numerous team members at this location searching the facility with other responders and there was no confirmation the shooter was at this site. I re-routed all members still responding to the Tactical Staging Area. This was later to be one of several unfounded reports in the hours immediately following the shootings.

### 2045 Hours

I arrived in the Lewiston area and after speaking to Cpl. Coflesky and witnessing officers responding in all directions, I decided to respond direct to the Command Post [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] We discussed we need to have as organized of a response to sightings as possible and should try to refrain from dumping all resources into unconfirmed sightings. [REDACTED]

I arrived at Lewiston PD and was updated by Sgt. Farley and Lt. Randy Keaton of the Major Crimes Unit. Robert Card [REDACTED] had just been identified as a suspect based on video images of the shooter. I learned that shootings had happened at both Just-In-Time Recreation and Schemengees Bar and Grill. I learned there were numerous fatalities and numerous injuries from what appeared to be an AR-10 style rifle. I learned that Robert Card had military training, was believed to be equipped with a thermal imaging scope and [REDACTED]. I learned that he was believed to be operating a 2013 White Subaru which he fled the scene in. His location was unknown.

I met with Det. Cpl. Lenny Bolton who advised they had a cell phone number for Card [REDACTED] location came back in the general area of an address of interest, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]

### 2120 Hours

I called Cpl. Coflesky and requested he organize [REDACTED] location information to look for the suspect's vehicle. Det. Duff, Sgt. Casey, Det. Reny and Cpl. Lane were dispatched to conduct this operation.

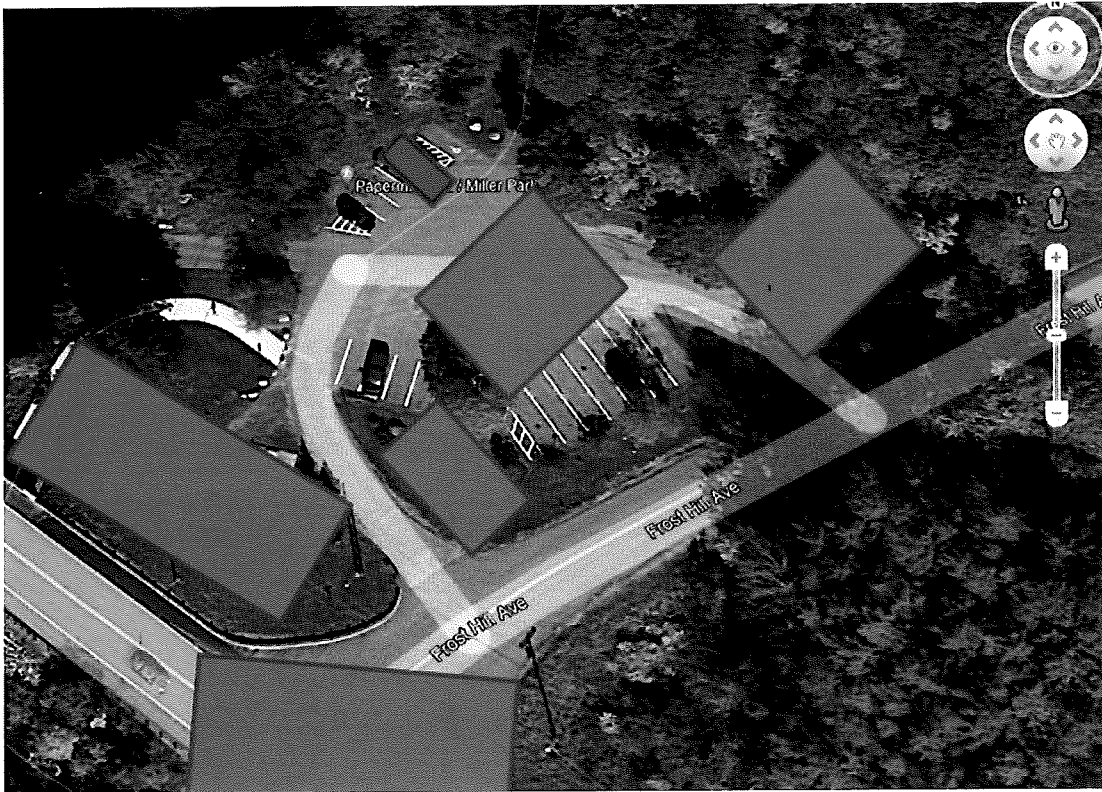

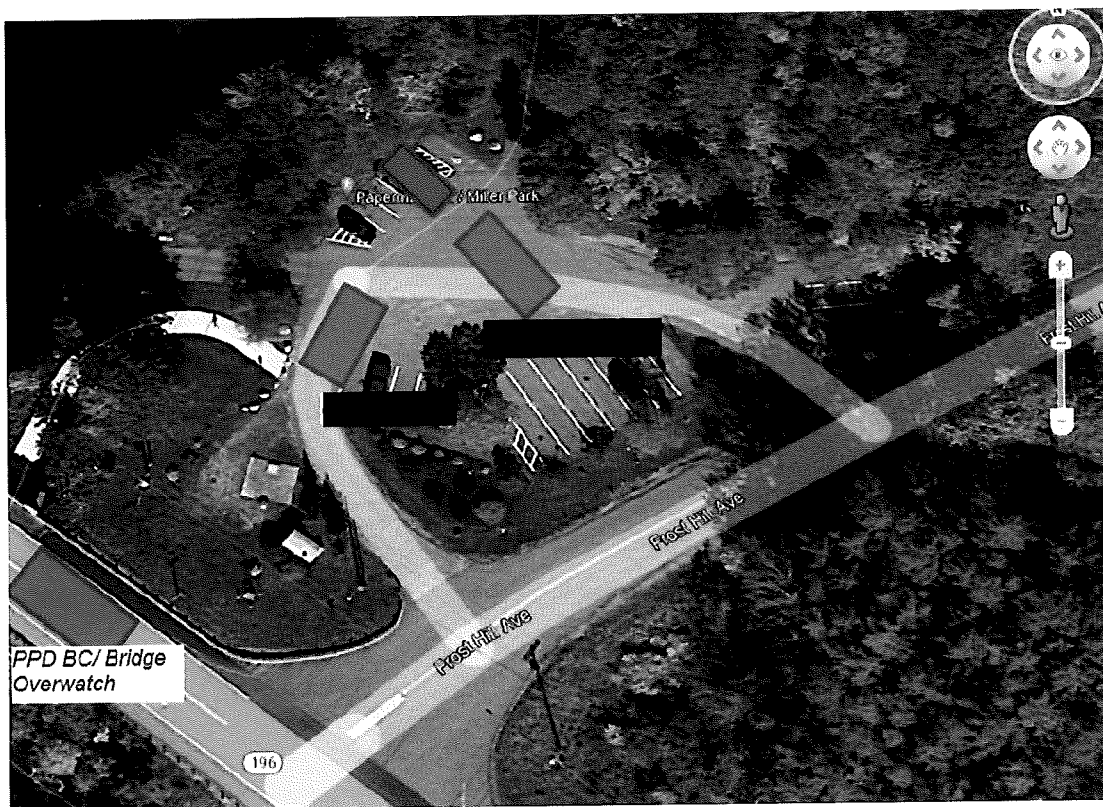
We arrived at the boat landing site. I noted the area was saturated with over 20 first responders and cruisers and the roads were completely blocked. [REDACTED]

This diagram notes the approximate location of the suspect vehicle in the red box and the approximate general location of first responders in the blue boxes. The guard rail can be observed in the southwest corner and is the location for which responders in the area were moved behind. It should be noted the vehicles in this image were not present during the operation. At this boat landing there is a paved walking trail to the north and a paved walking trail to the southwest.





The suspect vehicle's window were dark and tinted and we were not able to see inside.

### 2226 Hours

[REDACTED] We breached the windows and could see a rifle inside but did not locate Card.

I requested the York County SRT respond to the Lisbon Community School which is the location that the walking path to the north ends at. I requested Brunswick PD SRT move to the intersection of Rt. 9 and Rt. 196 for area response for that side of the town.

When Det. Duff's [REDACTED] [REDACTED] They observed a 5.11 belt and leather search glove on the side of the road. This was attributed to first responders.

At this point I requested Bangor PD [REDACTED] [REDACTED] They were sent to the Tactical Staging Area.

## 2252 Hours

I received a call from Chief Ryan McGee of the Lisbon Police Department advised a business owner at Springworks Farm in Lisbon had heard about what was happening in proximity to his business which was closed at this time. He went to check his business and there was an unsecured door. He went inside and heard movement and a door slam inside. He went inside and checked a bathroom door that was locked from the inside and should not have been. Lisbon PD was establishing a perimeter. See diagram below indicating proximity to the boat landing.

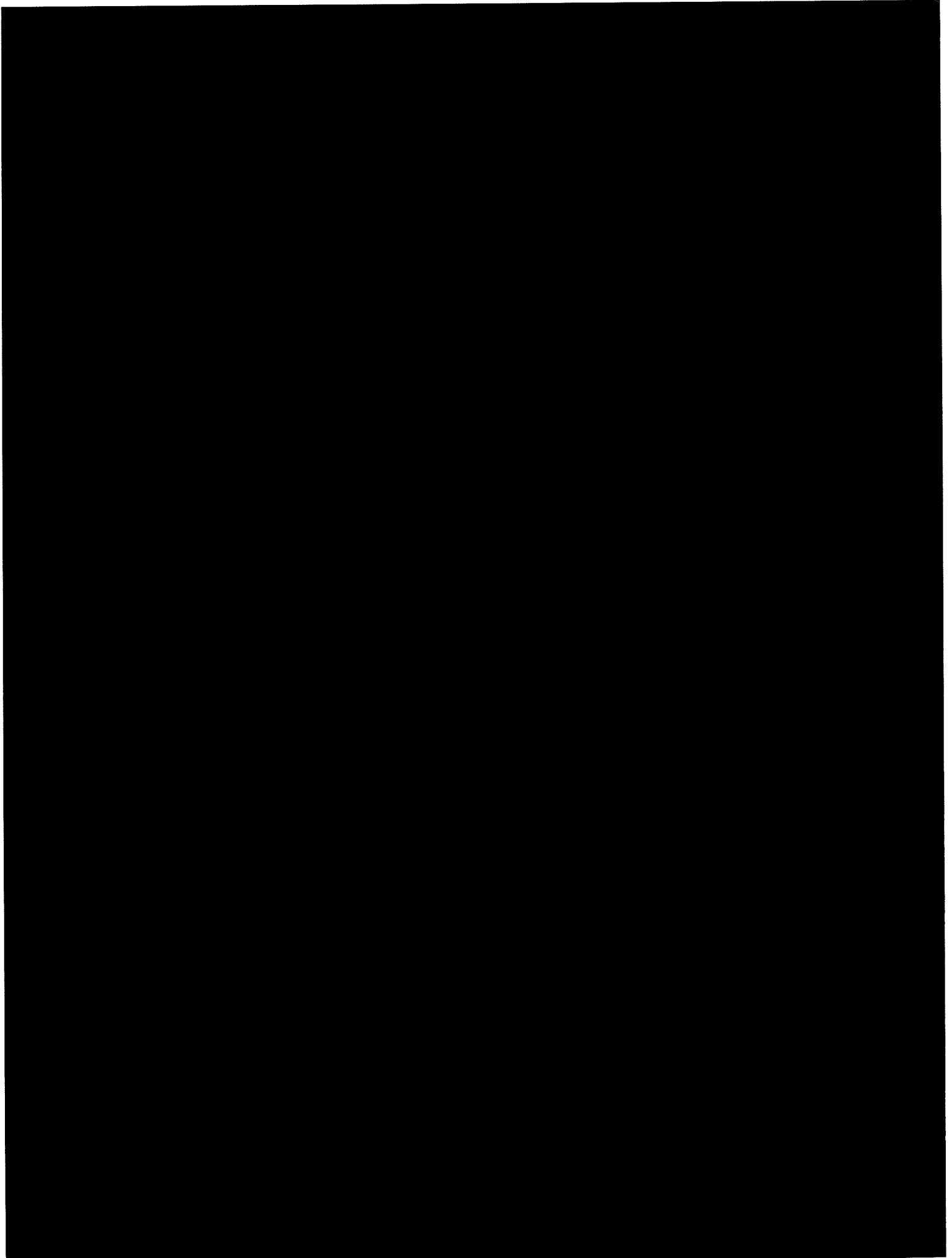

### DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION:

On Wednesday, October 25, 2023, at approximately 1926 hours, I was off duty and received a tactical team activation and was told to report to the Lewiston Colisee parking lot to stage, as there was an active shooter with multiple victims in Lewiston. I immediately responded to the City of Lewiston.

As I was exiting the Maine Turnpike in Lewiston at approximately 2025 hours, I copied radio traffic that the shooting suspect was now at the Wal-Mart Distribution Center and dispatch had received 911 calls that he was inside shooting. I was aware that the distribution center was just off Exit 80 therefore I responded to the location with multiple cruisers I encountered on the road while exiting the turnpike. I arrived at the distribution center at approximately 2030 and ultimately entered through the front door with several unknown officers as well as my Teammate, Cpl. Eric Sucy, who I happened to come across in the parking lot.

Cpl. Sucy and I entered through a shattered glass door and immediately began clearing a large portion of the warehouse [REDACTED]. I could not hear any gun shots therefore we were all in search mode and encountered 15-30 employees throughout our search area and directed them to run to the front door.

[REDACTED]. Once it was deemed safe with no active threat, I departed from the warehouse and responded to the Colisee.

I arrived at the Colisee staging area at approximately 2100 hours. From this point through 2030 hours on Friday October 27, I participated in manhunt operations as a member of the Maine State Police Tactical Team. I worked overnight with other members of our team on October 25 until 0900 on October 26, and was then assigned to the nightshift team on October 26 and October 27.

## DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION:

**Wednesday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023**

At approximately 7:26 P.M., I was instructed by Maine State Police Tactical Team Commander, Sergeant Gregory Roy, to respond to the City of Lewiston to stage for an active shooter event. I received information there were multiple people deceased in two separate locations and the shooter was unaccounted for.

While enroute, I was specifically directed to stage at the Colisee parking lot, located on Birch Street in the City of Lewiston. I received information about the shooter, identified as Robert Card, [REDACTED], and a description of him and what he was wearing.

During my response, another report came in of an active shooter incident at the Walmart Distribution Center, located on Alfred A Plourde Parkway in the City of Lewiston. I immediately diverted my response from the Colisee to this area. While enroute, I learned it was a hoax report and no active shooter existed on scene. This was confirmed by first responder units on scene and hearing radio reports confirming no threat existed.

At this point, I continued to the Colisee to stage. At approximately 9:00 P.M., I arrived at the Colisee [REDACTED].

At approximately 9:30 P.M., Sergeant Roy advised that intelligence was being gathered into the whereabouts of Card and that it was thought he was in a described vehicle. [REDACTED].

Assistant Tactical Team Commander, Corporal David Coflesky, assigned Detective Scott Duff, Detective Marcus Reny, Corporal Michael Lane and I [REDACTED].

At approximately 10:20 P.M., Sergeant Roy advised that the vehicle Card had been suspected of operating had been located at the boat launch on Frost Hill Avenue in the Town of Lisbon Falls. Sergeant Roy requested [REDACTED]

At approximately 12:30 P.M., I cleared from this location and arrived at the Lisbon High School [REDACTED]

## DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION:

1. On 10/25/2023 at approximately 19:11 hours, I Trooper Nilsen was patrolling the town of Gray. At this time, I heard the Augusta Regional Communications Center (ARCC) relay that there was an active shooter at Sparetime Recreation, located at 24 Mollison Way in Lewiston. I activated my blue emergency lights and siren and drove towards the scene.
2. As I was in Auburn, I heard the ARCC relay there was another active shooting occurring at Schemengees Bar located at 551 Lincoln Street. I started to drive towards Schemengees.
3. I arrived about 50 yards away from Schemengees Bar and I saw dozens of first responders and numerous ambulances already on scene. Numerous patients were already being triaged. I heard Androscoggin County's radio state the suspect had fled towards river street. The suspect was last seen wearing a dark colored jacket and blue pants. I scanned the area with numerous Law Enforcement Officers, from multiple agencies with negative results.
4. I then heard Androscoggin County's radio request more units at Sparetime Recreation and they may have seen the suspect. At the time, we were unsure if there was more than 1 shooter.
5. I arrived at Sparetime Recreation and met with Corporal Dunn and tried to gather information as to where the shooter or shooters went.
6. At 19:26 hours, I was notified by Sergeant Roy of the Maine State Police Tactical Team to report to the Collisee Parking Lot to stage. 

I arrived at the Sanford Police Department [REDACTED]. Shortly before 2100 hours, we left the Sanford Police Department. We arrived in Lewiston shortly before 2300 hours. I met with Commander Ernenwien, [REDACTED].

I had operator Bennett, Jourdain, Riddle, Jarrett, and Medic Sargent. [REDACTED]. We then cleared and headed back to the Sanford Police Department.

Lieutenant/Team Leader Eddie H. Murphy

On October 27, 2023, at approximately 0730 hours, Command Ernenwien notified the SRT that we would be assigned a shift from 1200 hours to 2200 hours, possibly to 2400 hours. We were to report to the Lewiston High School, which was the staging area [REDACTED].

We arrived in Lewiston just before noon. We got our first mission approximately 5 hours later. [REDACTED]. They were conducting a K9 cadaver search.

Once we got on the scene, [REDACTED]. We reported back to the Lewiston High School. Shortly after 2000 hours, we were instructed to meet in the cafeteria. We were given a brief that the suspect, Robert Card, was found deceased [REDACTED].

Shortly after, units packed up the gear and left Lewiston. That concludes my involvement.

On October 25th, 2023, at approximately 2000 hours, I finished eating dinner at Davinci's restaurant [REDACTED]. While standing in the parking lot saying goodbye, we heard a crescendo of sirens passing us. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] While on Canal St. I was passed by various agencies, and realized something serious was occurring. I sent a message to the SRT team asking what was going on. I received word that an active shooter was in Lewiston. I immediately responded to the Lewiston PD and donned my badge, I attempted to make contact with anyone inside. I did not find anyone. I stepped back outside and saw high ranking officials walking toward me. I informed them of who I was, and asked to help. They agreed and escorted me to the rear of the building where command was setting up a hasty CP. CP began trying to coordinate units. I offered my assistance, and my teams. Initially the CP was overwhelmed and was unsure what they needed for assistance. I began updating the team with information in case of possible activation. Lewiston Deputy Chief approached me, I informed him that the team was on standby and ready to deploy. [REDACTED]

As we moved to his vehicle I asked if he had an additional firearm. Chief Goss informed me that he did and we got into his truck. Chief began driving offered me several firearms. [REDACTED]. Unfortunately, the rifle did not have a sling. I charged the weapon and readied myself for duty.

We arrived at CMMC on the Main Street side. This appeared to be the entrance where they had set up a casualty collection point. I met with the medics on site. [REDACTED]

This entrance was for family and friends of those affected by the gunman, as well as critical medical supplies. [REDACTED]

The helicopters eventually began arriving landing on the helicopter pad. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] They informed me that they did not need escorts. I returned to my original location and informed Chief Goss who was assisting me at the entrance. [REDACTED]

Eventually chief returned and provided me the shooters picture. I provided the picture to Lt. Allen to distribute to the other team members. I spoke to him and Chief Anderson on the phone and gave them a brief [REDACTED] I had learned at the CP.

Sometime after that Game Warden Dyer approached me with a female asking if I could use some

assistance [REDACTED]. Game Warden Dyer provided me [REDACTED].

At this time, it was unknown to me if the gunman was still mobile. I requested the media who was staged on the Main Street sidewalk relocate to the handicap ramp. The ramp offered protection from both from the road, and any aggressors from the hospital parking lot.

I was informed via my Chief that extra resources were needed for efforts taking place in Lewiston and was asked if I wanted to assist. I agreed. My information was then passed to Officer Ryan Sanford of the Kittery police department with regard to my intent and willingness to be of service. We then travelled together to the command center at Lewiston High School where we both checked in with the on-scene commander of the Southern Maine component.

I am the commander of the Southern Maine Special Response Team. On 10/25/2023 I was aware of the report of an active killer in the Lewiston, Maine area. SMSRT was requested by Adam Higgins, the Deputy Chief of Lewiston PD, at 2002 hours.

Our involvement in that incident on 10/25/2023 is detailed in report 23-667-OF. This report is about the second deployment to Lewiston on 10/27/2023 while the man hunt for Robert Card was still underway.

On 10/27/2023 Commander Greg Roy from Maine State Police Tactical Team called at 0800 hours and Requested SMSRT to respond to Lewiston HS at 1200 on 10/27 and provide assistance as needed from 1200 – 2200 (possibly 0000). Commander Roy had multiple tactical teams from around New England already at the Command Post (CP). He told me he was looking to ensure he had enough teams to respond when information was received.

1200 hours I stopped at CP at Lewiston HS and checked in with Commander Roy. Advised that SMSRT had one armored MRAP at scene, 18 operators, 3 tactical medics, 6 drone pilots, standard equipment, two operators are K-9 handlers. Unmarked vehicles or marked vehicles available to respond.

At 1710 hours SMSRT was tasked to relieve a team currently securing [REDACTED]. Two teams in unmarked vehicles were needed. Team one, Allen, Markellos, Riddle, and Begin. Team two, Sanford, Spruce, Bennett, and Bacchi.

At 1715 hours SMSRT was requested to run security for Warden K-9's cadaver dogs.

At 1730 hours SMSRT team on house security had to split to cover two locations [REDACTED].

At 1730 hours, upon arrival SMSRT was not needed with cadaver dogs as it was getting dark and the wardens to not perform cadaver searches at night.

At 1842 hours SMSRT returned to the CP from cadaver dog assignment. SMSRT meet up with Cumberland County Emergency Response Unit. MSP tactical command wanted SMSRT and CCEU available to respond together if a larger group is needed.

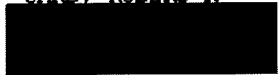

On 10/25/2023 I responded to Lewiston Maine for a reported active shooter, where the shooter was at large. I responded with the Southern Maine Special Response Team where I am an ATL and canine handler.

I arrived at the CP staging area and met with other team members. I prepared my equipment and went over to a new staging area at the Colliseum. There I met with team commander Ernenwein. Myself, Deputy Markellos, Detective Kassa, and a team medic were tasked with taking up a QRF position on Route 196. We were stationed near O'Reilly's auto parts store.

During this time our team monitored road traffic as we looked out for a white Subaru with a black bumper. During this time we contacted 2 white males who were walking in the area and IDed them. We asked them to go home and shelter as the area was not safe.

Our QRF position moved further down 196 as the suspect's vehicle was located and our armored vehicles were tasked with holding trail heads near a school. We moved closer to their position, but remained in a QRF capacity, in case they had any contact with the shooter.

Eventually as the perimeter collapsed our QRF returned to Lewiston PD to obtain another patrol car. Det. Kassa and our medic had been riding in the trunk of my cruiser with the hatch open. We checked in at CP and then picked up Ptlwm. Ochs. From there we moved to a support position near where the suspect's vehicle was found. While stationed near the scene of the vehicle we ran into a group of US Marshals, local PD and elements of Brunswick Swat. We learned that the suspect had been recently fired from a recycling facility nearby and that many of the workers frequent one of bars targeted. The facility was set to accept trucks starting around 0500 hours.

Eventually our team collapsed back to the command post, some time after 0300 hours, and were released from duties. We were unsure if we would be requested to return.

I am the commander of the Southern Maine Special Response Team. On 10/25/2023 I was aware of the report of an active killer in the Lewiston Maine area. SMSRT was requested by Adam Higgins, the Deputy Chief of Lewiston PD, at 2002 hours.

SMSRT originally planned to stage at Lewiston PD. I was contacted by Commander Greg Roy of the Maine State Police. He advised that Tactical Staging would be at the parking lot of the Androscoggin Bank Colisee in Lewiston.

At about 2043 hours a photo of the suspect was shared with all SMSRT members.

At 2102 I learned that other SMSRT members were en route with armored vehicles from Sanford Maine.

I arrived at the staging area at about 2115 hours and located other SMSRT members already at that location. I met with Maine State Police Tactical Team Members. I was asked to coordinate quick reaction teams around the area of Lewiston in case the shooter popped up in another location.

At 2118 I learned the identity of the suspect involved was Robert Card.

Members of the Southern Maine Special Response team were sent as a QRF to Route 196 near O'Reilly's auto parts store, Sgt Jon Rogers with K-9 (YORK PD), Deputy Alex Markellos (YCSO), Detective Kassa (YCSO), and team medic Justin Cooper.

Another group of SMSRT members were tasked with a QRF at East Ave and Lisbon St. (Rt 196). I was assigned TL of a quick reaction force (QRF). Detective Ryan Sanford (Kittery PD), Deputy Steve Broy (YCSO), Sgt. Heath Mains (Buxton PD), and Team medics Lucien Gendron and Jimmy Lamie.

The QRF's occasionally moved positions as needed and locations are detailed in their reports.

When SMSRT armored vehicles arrived at the tactical staging area, they were given an assignment to stage and monitor the area of a foot path near a primary school. The Lisbon Community School is the location of one end of this foot path and that is where the armored vehicles were directed.
