Little long Pond is an extremely picturesque pond in the headwaters of the Tunk Stream drainage. You can get there by a walking trail that originates at the north end of the sand beach on the west end of Spring River Lake. Interesting features of Little Long Pond are its rugged, rocky shorelines, its unusually clear water, and its precipitous drop-offs. It's a fine pond to fish from shore.

Little Long Pond supports native brook trout and is known for the occasional large trout it produces. Sunapee trout (Arctic charr) were stocked here from 1975-1980, but survival was too poor to justify a continuation of the program.

The outlet should be kept free of obstructions to trout migration.
