The goal of ICS 100 is to introduce the Incident Command System and provides the foundation for higher level ICS trainings. ICS 200 discusses the Incident Command System for first responders and provides training for personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory positions within ICS.

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Describe how the National Incident Management System Management Characteristics relate to Incident Command, Unified Command, and the foundation of ICS and its roles.
- Describe the delegation of authority process, implementing authorities, management by objectives, and preparedness plans and objectives.
- Identify ICS organizational components, the Command Staff, the General Staff, and ICS tools.
- Describe different types of briefings and meetings.
- Explain flexibility within the standard ICS organizational structure.
- Explain transfer of command briefings and procedures.
- Use ICS to manage an incident or event.
- Explain the principles and basic structure of ICS.
- Describe the ICS functional areas and the roles of the Incident Commander and Command Staff.
- Describe the General Staff roles within ICS.
