COMPLAINT PRESENTATION AND BOARD ACTION

2024-PHY-19870

Anderson moved to issue an emergency suspension for case number 2024-PHY-19870 pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004(3). The Licensee's ability to practice as a physical therapist will be suspended effective immediately upon issuance of the Order for a thirty (30) day period ending on May 3, 2024, at 11:59 p.m., pending further action at an adjudicatory hearing and a Notice of Hearing will be issued. Seconded by Papsadora. Unanimously voted.

Papsadora moved to schedule an adjudicatory hearing and offer a Consent Agreement for the resolution of complaint number 2024-PHY-19870 to include the following 1) Admission to 10 M.R.S. § 8003(5-A)(A)(5), 2) Censure, 3) Suspension for the practice of dry needling until the licensee

completes a Board pre-approved course on dry needling with the submission of successful completion to the Board. 4) Probation for a period of at least six (6) months to include disciplinary supervision. The Licensee will identify a candidate to act as a disciplinary supervisor. The appropriate candidate must be a licensed physical therapist in Maine. The Supervisor must be independent of the licensee's employment and must have no personal or professional connection with the Licensee. The purpose of the supervision will be to review patient charts and discuss the interventions employed by the Licensee. The Licensee agrees to provide the Supervisor with a list of all the patients to whom she has provided physical therapy in the two weeks preceding each meeting. The Supervisor will randomly select 10 patients from the list provided by the Licensee and provide reports to the Board by the first of every month evidencing the Licensee's satisfactory compliance with the supervision. All costs associated with the supervision are to be borne by the licensee. Seconded by McAuley. Unanimously voted.

Anderson moved to designate Papsadora to approve continuing education courses. Seconded by Gagnon. Unanimously voted.
