#### **BRIEF SUMMARY:**

Following a public hearing held on July 12, 2022 and a comment period ending on July 29, 2022, the Board voted at its September meeting to provisionally adopt the proposed major substantive rule titled Chapter 12, Transportation of Human Remains. Subsequently and during the review required by 5 M.R.S. § 8052(7)(B) and § 8056(1)(A), it was determined that the section of Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations referenced in the second paragraph of Section 4, subsection D of the rule would need to be fully incorporated by reference pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 8056(1)(B).

In response to that specific finding, and pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 8052(5)(B), the Board is soliciting comments from the public regarding its proposal to remove this reference to federal regulation altogether. The Board had intended the citation to the federal regulation to be a helpful and educational reference, and based on the information it has received that to include the reference in the rule would require incorporating the provision entirely, proposes to omit the reference to Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations section 393.102. The other proposed changes are technical changes to correct minor errors.

#### Chapter 12: TRANSPORTATION OF HUMAN REMAINS

<u>SUMMARY</u>: This chapter contains rules regarding the transportation of dead human bodies and human remains.

# 1. <u>Generally</u>

<u>Licensees may transport dead human bodies or human remains only in vehicles owned</u> by or leased to the funeral establishment or a practitioner of funeral service.

# 2. Definitions

For this chapter, the following terms are defined as:

- A. <u>Multipurpose Funeral Vehicle</u>: "<u>Multipurpose Funeral Vehicle</u>" means a vehicle, other than a hearse, used for transporting dead human bodies or human remains.
- B. <u>Hearse: "Hearse" means a vehicle specially constructed and used for conveying dead human bodies or human remains.</u>
- C. <u>Hinge Point: "Hinge Point" means the point on a seat assembly where the vertical</u> seat back attaches to and pivots above the horizontal seat base.
- D. Platform: "Platform" means a removable or permanent rigid surface including but not limited to a casket floor, a loading deck, or wood or other material that is used to facilitate the loading and unloading of transportation equipment.
- E. Raised Platform: "Raised Platform" means a platform at a height above the hinge point.
- F. Transportation Equipment: "Transportation Equipment" means a stretcher, cot, rack, cot mate, tray, platform, casket, alternative container, or like mechanisms that are made of metal or other rigid materials and are used for transporting dead human bodies or human remains.
- 3. Dignity in the transportation of dead human bodies or human remains

<u>Licensees transporting dead human bodies or human remains must promote respect for</u> and preserve the dignity of dead human bodies or human remains by:

A. Enclosing and concealing dead human bodies or human remains from public view.

- B. Providing ample enclosed area to accommodate transportation equipment; and
- C. <u>Loading</u>, transporting, and unloading dead human bodies or human remains without excessive tilting or movement of the transportation equipment.
- 4. Safety of drivers and passengers in multipurpose funeral vehicles

<u>Multipurpose funeral vehicles used to transport dead human bodies or human remains must meet the following requirements:</u>

- A. <u>If a platform is used, the following applies:</u>
  - 1. The platform must be securely attached to the floor of the vehicle when the vehicle is in transit; and
  - 2. The platform must be on a plane level to the vehicle floor and below the hinge point to the driver and front passenger seats.
- B. If a raised platform is used, the following applies:
  - 1. The raised platform must be securely attached to the vehicle when the vehicle is in transit;
  - 2. The raised platform must be located behind the passenger seat only; and
  - 3. The passenger seat must remain empty.
- C. <u>Multipurpose funeral vehicles owned or leased by funeral establishments or funeral practitioners must comply with Sections 4(A) and 4(B) as soon as practicable but no later than five years from the effective date of this chapter.</u>
- D. To reduce the risk of driver or passenger injury, a licensee shall make a good faith effort to secure any transportation equipment and cargo stored in the back of the vehicle with tiedowns such as padded lines, rope, strapping, synthetic webbing or cordage, or other attachment or fastening devices. Funeral establishments shall be responsible for providing tiedowns for this purpose.

Containers, platforms, or transportation equipment secured in compliance with the performance criteria found in Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations section 393.102 is deemed in compliance with this subsection.

5. Transportation of Human Remains by Common Carrier

Dead human bodies that are embalmed must be enclosed in a casket or alternative container designed for this purpose when transported by common carrier.

Dead human bodies that are not embalmed or in a decomposition state must be enclosed

in a galvanized metal, sealed case (Ziegler or equivalent) or casket designed to prevent leakage of fluids and offensive odors when transported by common carrier.

Chapter 12: TRANSPORTATION OF HUMAN REMAINS

SUMMARY: This chapter contains rules regarding the transportation of human remains.

### 1. Generally

Human remains may be transported only in vehicles owned by or leased to the funeral establishment, a practitioner of funeral service, or an authorized person.

Vehicles Owned or Leased by Funeral Establishment or Practitioner

Human remains transported in vehicles owned by or leased to the funeral establishment or practitioner must be enclosed and concealed from public view. Such vehicles must:

- 1. Promote respect for and preserve the dignity of the dead human body;
- Provide ample enclosed area to accommodate a mortuary cot or stretcher in a horizontal position;
- 3. Permit loading and unloading of the body without excessive tilting of the cot or stretcher; and
- 4. Protect the body or container from excessive movement within the conveyance.
- 4. Transportation of Unembalmed or Decomposing Remains by Common Carrier

Human remains which are not embalmed or are in a state of decomposition, when transported by common carrier, must be enclosed in a galvanized metal, sealed case (Ziegler or equivalent) or casket designed to prevent leakage of fluids and offensive odors.

Licensees may transport dead human bodies or human remains only in vehicles owned by or leased to the funeral establishment or a practitioner of funeral service.

Licensees transporting dead human bodies or human remains must promote respect for and preserve the dignity of dead human bodies or human remains by:

A. Enclosing and concealing dead human bodies or human remains from public view.

- B. Providing ample enclosed area to accommodate transportation equipment; and
- C. Loading, transporting, and unloading dead human bodies or human remains without excessive tilting or movement of the transportation equipment.
- 4. Safety of drivers and passengers in multipurpose funeral vehicles

Multipurpose funeral vehicles used to transport dead human bodies or human remains must meet the following requirements:

- A. If a platform is used, the following applies:
  - 1. The platform must be securely attached to the floor of the vehicle when the vehicle is in transit; and
  - 2. The platform must be on a plane level to the vehicle floor and below the hinge point to the driver and front passenger seats.
- B. If a raised platform is used, the following applies:
  - 1. The raised platform must be securely attached to the vehicle when the vehicle is in transit;
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  - 3. The passenger seat must remain empty.
- C. Multipurpose funeral vehicles owned or leased by funeral establishments or funeral practitioners must comply with Sections 4(A) and 4(B) as soon as practicable but no later than five years from the effective date of this chapter.
- D. To reduce the risk of driver or passenger injury, a licensee shall make a good faith effort to secure any transportation equipment and cargo stored in the back of the vehicle with tiedowns such as padded lines, rope, strapping, synthetic webbing or cordage, or other attachment or fastening devices. Funeral establishments shall be responsible for providing tiedowns for this purpose.
  - Containers, platforms, or transportation equipment secured in compliance with the performance criteria found in Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations section 393.102 is deemed in compliance with this subsection.
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Dead human bodies that are embalmed must be enclosed in a casket or alternative container designed for this purpose when transported by common carrier.
